## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (42-42) vs. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (47-37)

June 29, 2026 - Citizens Bank Park - Philadelphia, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #85/Road #40

RHP Braxton Ashcraft (7-3, 3.07 ERA) vs. RHP Aaron Nola (3-4, 5.58 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** are starting a seven-game road trip (their final road trip before the All-Star break) to Philadelphia (Monday-Thursday) and Washington (July 3-5) tonight... Won three of six games on their recent homestand vs. Seattle (2-1, June 23-25) and Cincinnati (1-2, Friday-Sunday), including a 9-4 win on Sunday vs. the Reds at PNC Park... Will host Atlanta (July 7-9) and Milwaukee (July 10-12) for six games on their final homestand before the All-Star break... Have scored the third-most runs (429) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (449) and Los Angeles-NL (443)... Have struck out the fifth-most batters (768) in all of MLB, behind Milwaukee (800), Philadelphia (798), Cleveland (769) and New York-NL (769).

**GOT THE RUNS:** Pittsburgh has not been shut out in 37 straight games (streak began on May 19 at St. Louis), its longest such streak (within a single season) since a 38-game streak from August 21-October 1, 2023... The Pirates have scored at least five runs in 19 of the 37 games during the current streak... They were last shut out in back-to-back games from May 16-17 vs. Philadelphia.

**THE MAGICIAN:** Esmerlyn Valdez finished a triple shy of the cycle after going 3-for-4 with a ground-rule/run-scoring double and a solo home run on Sunday vs. Cincinnati... He has homered in three straight games (also Friday and Sunday vs. Cincinnati), making him the second Pirate to homer in three straight games this year, along with Brandon Lowe from April 12-14... The last Pirate to homer in four straight games was Corey Dickerson from July 15-22, 2018 (Valdez was also the first Pirate to homer in each game of a three-game series since Dickerson did that in a three-game sweep from July 20-22, 2018 at Cincinnati)... The only Pittsburgh rookies to homer in four consecutive games during the Modern Era (since 1901) were Dick Stuart from August 16-20 (G1), 1958 and Garrett Jones from July 10-17, 2009... Eight of Valdez' first 11 Major League hits have been extra-base hits (he has posted three doubles and five home runs)... He has hit safely in five of his last six games (since June 19 at Colorado), going 9-for-18 (.500) with three doubles, three home runs, five RBI, a 1.693 OPS and six runs during that time.

**O'YEAH:** Ryan O'Hearn posted the third multi-home run game of his career after hitting a solo blast (fifth inning) and a three-run shot (eighth inning) on Sunday vs. Cincinnati... He also did that with Kansas City on September 3, 2018 at Cleveland and August 25, 2019 at Cleveland... O'Hearn has gone 19-for-61 (.311) with five doubles, three home runs, 16 RBI, an .864 OPS and seven runs scored in his last 14 games, dating back to June 13 vs. Miami (he has posted at least three hits in four of those games, including Sunday)... His 16 RBI in that stretch rank third in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only Tampa Bay's Junior Caminero (19) and Chicago (NL)'s Dansby Swanson (18).

**LET'S GO REYNOLDS:** Bryan Reynolds drew two walks and scored a run on Sunday vs. Cincinnati, extending his on-base streak to 33 straight games (since May 23 at Toronto)... It is the longest active streak in Major League Baseball and the second-longest such streak in Major League Baseball this season, trailing only the Athletics' Nick Kurtz (48 games, April 3-May 25)... Reynolds has gone 42-for-120 (.350) with 11 doubles, seven home runs, 20 RBI, 21 walks, two stolen bases, a 1.068 OPS and 26 runs scored on the streak.

**BACK-TO-BACK BUCS:** Ryan O'Hearn (three-run) and Esmerlyn Valdez (solo) hit back-to-back home runs in the eighth inning on Sunday vs. Cincinnati (it was O'Hearn's second of the game), marking Pittsburgh's third set of back-to-back home runs this season... O'Hearn and Bryan Reynolds also did that in a win on March 31 at Cincinnati and in a loss on June 9 vs. Los Angeles (NL)... Tyler Callihan also hit a three-run home run in the second inning on Sunday, giving the Pirates their third game with at least four home runs this season (also March 31 at Cincinnati and May 1 vs. Cincinnati)... Pittsburgh had one game with four homers all of last year, coming on June 29 vs. New York (NL).

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 29, 2025: The Pirates completed a three-game sweep of the Mets with a 12-1 win at PNC Park. Pittsburgh's +26 run differential (30-4) in the series was tied for its fourth-best in a three-game series in franchise history. The Pirates plated five runs in the first inning, highlighted by back-to-back home runs from Oneil Cruz and Tommy Pham (Cruz also went deep in the seventh inning of the Bucs' win).

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Ashcraft won an 11-1 decision after allowing one run and striking out 10 batters (did not issue a walk) over 6.0 innings on June 24 vs. Seattle...It was his second start with at least 10 strikeouts and zero walks this season (he also had a career-high 11 strikeouts and zero walks on May 31 vs. Minnesota), making him the first Pirates pitcher with two such starts in any season during the Modern Era (since 1901)...He has a 2.12 ERA (17.0ip/4er) in his last three starts (since June 12 vs. Miami).

**AGAINST THE PHILLIES:** Ashcraft has a 4.50 ERA (8.0ip/4er) in two career appearances (one start) against Philadelphia...He earned his first Major League win after tossing 1.1 scoreless innings of relief on June 8, 2025 at PNC Park...Teammate Isaac Mattson earned his first Major League win on June 7, 2025 vs. the Phillies, making the two the second pair of Pirates relievers since at least 1893 to earn their first career win in back-to-back team games, joining Rick White and Ravelo Manzanillo from April 15-16, 1994 (courtesy of Elias)...Ashcraft also had a no-decision after allowing four runs over 6.2 innings in Pittsburgh's 11-9, 10-inning loss vs. the Phillies on May 15 at PNC Park.

**ON THE ROAD:** Ashcraft is 3-2 with a 2.93 ERA (43.0ip/14er) and 44 strikeouts in seven starts away from PNC Park this season...Pittsburgh is 5-2 in the seven starts, with the team's only losses coming on March 30 at Cincinnati (2-0) and June 6 at Atlanta (6-3).

**RISPY BUSINESS:** Ashcraft has limited opposing hitters to a .127 batting average against (9-for-71) with runners in scoring position this season...He has also allowed just three hits in 33 at-bats (.091 average) with runners in scoring position & two outs.

**MR. CONSISTENT:** Ashcraft pitched at least 6.0 innings, struck out at least five batters and walked two or fewer batters in six consecutive starts from May 3-May 31...He became one of five Pirates (six instances) during the Modern Era (since 1901) to do that, joining Rick Reuschel (six starts, September 4-October 1, 1985), Jon Lieber (six starts, June 15-July 13, 1998), Gerrit Cole (six starts, April 14-May 11, 2017 and six starts, July 30-August 26, 2017) and Paul Skenes (seven starts, June 11-July 23, 2024).

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** Ashcraft did not allow a first-inning run in any of his first 20 Major League starts (from last year on June 23 at Milwaukee to May 31 vs. Minnesota)...The streak was snapped on June 6 at Atlanta (allowed two runs in the first inning)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he was one of three Major League pitchers in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to allow zero first-inning runs in at least each of his first 20 career starts, along with Rollie Sheldon (20, 1961) & Dennis Rasmussen (22, 1983-84).

**PITCH EFFICIENCY:** Ashcraft had a career-high 11 strikeouts (issued zero walks) while throwing just 80 pitches over 6.0 innings on May 31 vs. Minnesota...He became the 12th Pirate (13th instance) in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing, the first since Mitch Keller (13k) on May 14, 2023 at Baltimore...Ashcraft also became the 11th Major Leaguer (since pitch tracking began in 1988) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing of 80 or fewer pitches, the first since Tampa Bay's Ryan Pepiot (12k, 76 pitches) on Sept. 18, 2024 vs. Boston.

**HISTORIC STRETCH:** Ashcraft had at least eight strikeouts while issuing one/zero walks and allowing one/zero runs in back-to-back starts on April 5 vs. Baltimore and April 11 at Chicago (NL)...He joined Bob Friend (Aug. 20-24, 1959), Rick Rhoden (June 21-27, 1986), Joe Musgrove (Sept. 20-26, 2020), Mitch Keller (May 8-14, 2023) and Paul Skenes (Sept. 4-10, 2025) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have consecutive starts with at least eight strikeouts, one/zero hits and one/zero walks.

 Has started in three of the Pirates' six shutouts...Has homered four times in his last 18 contests after hitting two over his first 35 games of the season.
