TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the road trip with the 1st of 3 games against the Cleveland Guardians...Seattle is coming off a 3-game series at Pittsburgh (1-2) on the trip...following Sunday's game, Seattle will return home for a 7-day, 6-game homestand against the Angels (3 G, 6/29-30 & 7/2) and Blue Jays (3 G, 7/3-5)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** as sideline reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Shannon Drayer** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners fell to the Pirates yesterday by a 5-1 final score...despite the loss, Seattle is 16-12 (.572) over its last 28 games since May 25.

- **Still In First** - The Mariners (41-41) are in first place in the American League West Division, 1.5 games ahead of the second place Astros (40-43).
- **Ohio Trio** - Three players on the Mariners active roster hail from the Buckeye State: **Dominic Canzone** (Cleveland), **Colt Emerson** (Zanesville) and **Luke Raley** (Hinckley).
- **ASG Voting Update** - The results from Phase 1 of All-Star voting were announced yesterday...a pair of Blue Jays outfielders leap frogged **Julio Rodríguez** and **Randy Arozarena** to advance to Phase 2 of voting...the full All-Star Game squads will be announced on July 4.
- **Minor Roster Move** - Yesterday INF/OF Miles Mastrobuoni cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple-A Tacoma.
- **Cycle!** - Last night, Mariners No. 7 prospect (*MLB Pipeline*) Felin Celesten hit for the cycle in a 7-inning game for High-A Everett.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...following Sunday's game, Seattle will return home for a 7-day, 6-game homestand...Seattle will host the Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 6/29-30, 7/2) in a series that features a rare mid-series off-day, and the Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, 7/3-5)...key promotions on the homestand are the **Cal Raleigh 3-day Pop! Collectible Giveaway** during each game of the Angels series, **Patriotic Fireworks Night** on July 3, **Fourth of July Patriotic Bucket Hat Giveaway** on July 4 and Kids Run the Bases on July 5.

MUÑOZ NEARING 100 & HISTORY...closer **Andrés Muñoz** recorded his 14th save of the season on Tuesday in Pittsburgh, his 92nd career save and 91st save with Seattle...with his next save, "Munry" will tie Aurelio López for the 3rd-most saves by a Mexican-born pitcher, behind only Roberto Osuna (155 SV) and Joakim Soria (229 SV)...his 91 saves with the Mariners also rank 5th in franchise history, trailing the next closest Mike Schooler (98 SV) and also behind J.J. Putz (101 SV), Edwin Díaz (109 SV) and Kazuhiro Sasaki (129 SV)...Muñoz is also 2 strikeouts away from reaching 400 career strikeouts.

RANDY IS BACK...**Randy Arozarena** was activated from the 10-day Injured List (left hamstring strain) prior to Tuesday's game...in 73 games this season, Arozarena is batting .284 (77x271) with 47 runs, 18 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs, 33 RBI and 19 stolen bases, getting on base at a .371 clip and slugging .435 for an .806 OPS...among qualified AL outfielders he ranks T-1st in stolen bases, 3rd in average, 5th in OBP and 8th in OPS.

LOGAN GILBERT NAMED AL PLAYER OF THE WEEK...Major League Baseball announced on Monday that right-handed pitcher **Logan Gilbert** was named American League Player of the Week for the week of June 15-21...it is the second Player of the Week honor for Gilbert (also: July 3-9, 2023)...during his two starts during the week, he went 2-0 tossing 13.1 IP allowing 5 hits, 2 runs, 3 walks and 18 strikeouts...holding hitters to a .116 (5x43) average with only 1 extra-base hit and a .401 OPS.

DOM CANZONE: GOOD BASEBALL PLAYER...in 20 games this June, **Dominic Canzone** is batting .328 (19x58) with 10 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 10 RBI and 5 walks in 64 plate appearances...among AL batters with at least 60 plate appearances this month, Canzone ranks 9th in batting average, 5th in slugging percentage (.655) and 6th in OPS (1.046).

NOW OR NAYLOR...**Josh Naylor** last night went 1-for-3 with a walk...in 55 games since April 17, Josh is batting .306 (67x219) with 24 runs, 10 doubles, 6 home runs, 26 RBI and 14 stolen bases, getting on base at a .363 clip and slugging .434 (.796 OPS)...during that span, he ranks 5th in the AL in average and 3rd in lowest strikeout rate (11.4%).

THE J-ROD SHOW...**Julio Rodríguez** is batting .247 (80x324) with 15 doubles, 14 home runs, 38 RBI and 11 stolen bases with a .731 OPS...he recently became the 3rd-fastest player in MLB history (665 G) to record 125+ 2B, 125+ HR and 125+ SB, trailing only Ronald Acuña Jr.-ATL (591 G) and Alfonso Soriano-NYY/TEX (643 G).

CY, HE'S PRETTY GOOD...over his last 26 games since May 27, **Cole Young** is batting .277 (28x101) with 12 runs, 2 doubles, 4 home runs, 10 RBI and a .731 OPS, reaching base safely in 21 of the 26 games...his defense has remained among the top infielders in MLB, with his 11 defensive runs saved (*Sports Info Solutions*) trailing only JJ Wetherholt-STL (12 DRS) and Matt Chapman-SF (13 DRS) among MLB infielders...Young leads AL second basemen with 2.4 wins above replacement (*Baseball-Reference*).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Eduard Bardo** has been excellent out of the Mariners bullpen in 2026, holding a 1.98 ERA (8 ER, 36.1 IP) in a team-high 38 appearances...Bardo was also excellent last season, holding a 2.52 ERA in 73 regular season games, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Bardo is on pace to be 1 of 5 relievers in Mariners history to make at least 35 appearances and hold an ERA of 2.60 or lower in back-to-back seasons?...he would join teammate **Andrés Muñoz** (2024-25), J.J. Putz (2006-07), Arthur Rhodes (2001-02) and Bill Swift (1990-91).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JUNE 26

- **1984** - Mark Langston tossed his first Major League shutout as the Mariners downed Chicago, 5-0, at Comiskey Park.
- **1998** - Ken Griffey Jr. hits his 31st home run of the season. The blast marks his 11th consecutive series with a round-tripper.
- **2002** - Kazuhiro Sasaki becomes the fastest pitcher to reach the 100-save plateau in Major League history in his 160th game.
- **2003** - Edgar Martinez belts a two-run homer in Anaheim to give him 1,153 career RBI's, passing Ken Griffey Jr. (1,152) for the Mariners all-time record. Martinez finishes the game 3x4 with two runs and two RBI.
- **2022** - Mariners and Angels are involved in benches-clearing brawl after Jesse Winker is hit by a pitch in the 2nd inning. Winker, **J.P. Crawford**, **Julio Rodríguez** and Scott Servais are ejected for their actions.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 16th appearance (13 starts) this season and his 259th career appearance...is making his 1st appearance against Cleveland this season and is facing them for the 11th time in his career.
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on Dec. 23, 2011.
- Made MLB debut on June 23, 2017 vs. Washington (w/ CIN).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
- Named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).

LAST TIME OUT...ND on June 19 vs. the Red Sox, entering the game in the 6th inning after Bryce Miller's start...he threw 4.0 innings, allowing 5 runs (4 ER) on 7 hits with 4 strikeouts and no walks...threw 63 pitches (48 strikes) in his 15th appearance of the season.

MILESTONE MARKERS...with his 2nd strikeout in his last appearance, he become the 11th pitcher in Mariners history to surpass 700 strikeouts with the club...is 8 wins away from 50 wins with the Mariners...would become the 14th pitcher with 50+ wins with Seattle, joining **George Kirby** and **Logan Gilbert** who also recently reached 50 wins with the club.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...is making his 9th appearance on the road this season...is 1-1 with a 2.57 ERA (6 ER, 21.0 IP) with 21 strikeouts across his last 4 road starts (5/14-c).

WELL TRAVELED...his 124 career road starts are 5th-most in MLB since 2017...has thrown 5.0+ innings in 102 career road games which are 7th-most such games in MLB since 2017, 6.0+ in 63 road games, and 7.0+ in 18 road games...his 691.1 career innings pitched on the road ranks 7th-most in MLB since 2017 while his 672 strikeouts are 10th-most.

AGAINST THE GUARDIANS...Cleveland is 1 of 10 teams that Castillo has made 10+ career starts against (also: ATH, CHC, HOU, LAA, MIL, MIN, PIT, SD, and STL)...is 1-2 with a 3.12 ERA (12 ER, 34.2 IP) and 38 strikeouts across 6 starts against the Guardians while playing for the Mariners...in his last appearance vs. Cleveland, he threw 6.0 innngd and allowed 2 runs (2 ER) on 3 hits (2 HR) with 3 walks and 7 strikeouts...he has tossed a quality start in 4 of those 6 starts w/ Seattle.

LA PIEDRA...among qualified pitchers since 2017 (his debut season), he ranks 5th in games started (255), 6th in quality starts (136), 6th in innings pitched (1481.1), 7th in total strikeouts (1562) and 13th in wins (86).

IN EXCLUSIVE COMPANY...surpassed 1,550+ career strikeouts on June 7 at Detroit...is 1 of just 3 pitchers with 250+ career starts and 1550+ strikeouts since 2017, joining Aaron Nola-PHI (2686 GS, 1769 SO) and Kevin Gausman-5Tms (266 GS, 1629 SO).

WHIFF LEADER...has recorded 10+ swings and misses in 11 of his 15 appearances this year...registered a season-high 18 swings and misses plus 5 swinging strikeouts on May 9 at Chicago White Sox, surpassing his previous season-high 17 swings and misses in his first start of the season (3/30 vs. NYY)...his 3,556 career swings and misses are tied for most in MLB since 2017, alongside Kevin Gausman-5Tms while his 1,302 career swinging strikeouts are 3rd-most in MLB since 2017, trailing Gausman (1,343) and Max Scherzer-5Tms (1,323), and ranking ahead of Gerrit Cole-3Tms (1,284).

FEAR THE FASTBALL...among pitchers with 5,000+ pitches thrown since 2023, his 29.0% whiff rate on his 4-seam fastball ranks T-4th best in MLB, alongside Logan Webb-SF and ranks ahead of teammate **Bryan Woo** (T-6th, 28.2%)...his 750 whiffs on his 4-seamer since 2023 are also most in MLB, ranking ahead of Joe Ryan-MIN (710 whiffs).

KEEPING IT 100...threw season-high 108 pitches on May 14 at Houston...has thrown 100+ pitches in 3 starts this season, which leads the Mariners rotation...has thrown 100+ pitches in 103 career games, 5th-most such games in MLB since 2017.

SEASONED VET...made his **250th career start** on May 2nd vs. Kansas City...became 1 of 5 pitchers with 250+ starts since 2017, joining Patrick Corbin-4Tms (279 GS), Aaron Nola-PHI (268 GS), Kevin Gausman-5Tms (266 GS) and José Berríos-MIN/TOR (259 GS)...among 20 active pitchers with 250+ career starts, his 3.63 ERA and 9.5 strikeouts-per-nine innings each rank 8th-best.

AMONG MARINER GREATS...his 3.64 ERA with Seattle is the 7th-lowest ERA in franchise history (min. 500.0 IP), trailing Félix Hernández, Randy Johnson, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton (all 3.42 ERA), **Logan Gilbert** (3.55), and **George Kirby** (3.63)...his 702 strikeouts with the Mariners are 11th-most in franchise history, just behind **George Kirby** (705 SO)...his 1.170 WHIP and 9.2 strikeouts-per-nine innings each rank 4th-best among Mariners with 500.0+ innings pitched.

ALL-DECADE ACCOLADES...is 1 of 5 pitchers in the last 10 seasons (2017-c) to have at least 1,500 strikeouts and a WHIP below 1.20, joining Gerrit Cole-3Tms, Aaron Nola-PHI, Max Scherzer-5Tms, and Zack Wheeler-NTM/PHI.
