Jacob Misiorowski will be celebrating his 24th birthday on Friday with the Brewers visiting Kansas City....he was born and resides in Blue Springs, MO, about 19 miles from Kansas City, and grew up a Royals fan.

They're Out of Our League

The Brewers are 106-59 (.642) since 2022 during Interleague Play, which marks the best record in the majors.

What's Glove Got to do With It

The Brewers have yet to commit an error through 5 games, which ties the franchise record for most games into a season without an error....the team also went 5 straight games without a miscue to start the 2000 season.

Smooth Criminals

The Brewers have gone 13 for 14 in stolen base attempts through their first 5 games....the team's 13 steals lead the majors with the Rockies (8) a distant second.

All or Nothing

Of the 15 runs allowed by Brewers pitching this season 13 have scored via the home run.

The Brice Is Right

Brice Turang has hit safely in each of the team's 5 games this season while batting .400 (8-for-20, 3rbi)....he has recorded 4 doubles and has posted a .478 OBP/.600 SLG/1.078 OPS....Turang is the only player on the team to hit safely in every game.

El Gary

Gary Sánchez smacked his second home run of the season last night and is now 9 HR away from 200 for his Major League career.

Body By Jake

Jake Bauers has hit .354 (28-for-79) with 5 HR and 16 RBI over his last 32 games dating back to last season, including the postseason....Bauers has a .427 OBP/.608 SLG/1.035 OPS during this stretch.

THIS AFTERNOON'S GAME: Is the sixth game (4-1) a 6-game, 7-day homestand against Chicago-AL (3-0) and Tampa Bay (1-1) to open the 2026 season....following this homestand and an off day tomorrow, the team begins its road schedule with a 6-game trip to Kansas City (3g) and Boston (3g).

MANAGER: **Pat Murphy** (329g, 194-135, .590) is in his third season as Brewers manager....he was voted NL Manager of the Year in 2024 and 2025....he is one of four managers ever to win Manager of the Year in consecutive seasons, joining the Braves' Bobby Cox (2004-05), Rays' Kevin Cash (2020-21) and Guardians' Stephen Vogt (2024-25)....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he signed a multi-year contract extension on 2/20/26.

COACHES: Returning from the 2025 staff is offense & strategy coordinator **Jason Lane** (11th season/1st in current role), pitching coordinator **Jim Henderson** (5th season/1st in current role), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (4th season/3rd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (8th season), bullpen coach **Charlie Greene** (3rd season), lead hitting coach **Eric Theisen** (2nd season/1st in current role) and third base coach **Matt Erickson** (3rd season/1st in current role)....assistant pitching coach **Juan Sandoval**, hitting coach **Guillermo Martinez**, hitting coach **Daniel Vogelbach** and first base coach **Spencer Allen** are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made three replay challenges this season, going 3-0....their challenge came on 3/31 vs. Tampa Bay as an out call at first base involving Jake Bauers was overturned.

2025 IN REVIEW: The Brewers went 97-65 to finish in first place in the NL Central, 5.0 games ahead of the Cubs....Milwaukee had the best record in baseball for only the second time in franchise history (1982) and set a franchise record for regular-season wins....the team beat the Cubs, 3 games to 2, in the National League Division Series before getting swept by the Dodgers in the National League Championship Series.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have qualified for the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and three seasons in a row....the team was just two games away from making the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing out in both 2017 and 2022 by a single game....Milwaukee has won the NL Central in four of the last five seasons and three seasons in a row.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons (2017-25)....this does not include the shortened 2020 season....the Brewers have 767 wins since 2017, which ranks fourth in the majors behind the Dodgers (857), Astros (810) and Yankees (792).

TODAY'S STARTER: #32 - RHP JACOB MISIOROWSKI (1gs, 1-0, 1.80)

MISIOROWSKI AT A GLANCE: Jacob Misiorowski, who turns 24 this Friday, is making his second start of the season....Misiorowski earned a 14-2 victory vs. Chicago-AL on Opening Day (5ip, 2h, 1r, 1er, 3bb, 11k, 1hr, 94 pitches)....his 11 strikeouts set a franchise record for any pitcher on Opening Day....he became the third-youngest pitcher in franchise history to start on Opening Day (23.357) behind only Bill Parsons (23.242 in 1972) and Ben Sheets (23.258 in 2002)....Misiorowski was selected by Milwaukee in the second round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft from Crowder (MO) College, where he pitched one season (2022) and became the highest drafted player in school history....name is pronounced "miz-uh-RAO-skee."

LAST SEASON: Misiorowski made his Major League debut and went 5-3 with a 4.36 ERA in 15 games/14 starts....the team went 9-5 in his starts....he had 3 quality starts....opponents batted .213 (51-for-239, 8hr)....he recorded 87 strikeouts in 66.0 innings....his 202 pitches of 100+ MPH ranked fifth in the Major Leagues....Misiorowski was named an All-Star after just five games under his belt, the fewest in Major League history....he was on the 15-day injured list from 8/3-8/14 with a left tibia contusion, retroactive to 7/31....he went 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA in 2 games in the NLDS against the Cubs with both outings coming out of the bullpen (7ip, 4h, 1r, 1er, 2bb, 7k, 1hr)....he appeared in Game 3 of the NLCS against the Dodgers and took the loss (5ip, 3h, 2r, 1er, 1bb, 9k).

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 4-0 with a 3.24 ERA in 9 games/8 starts (41.2ip, 15er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 2-3 with a 5.52 ERA in 7 starts (29.1ip, 18er).

CAREER vs. RAYS: Misiorowski has not faced Tampa Bay.

ODDS & ENDS: Misiorowski graduated from Grain Valley (MO) High School....he got engaged to his fiancée, Elle, this past January and is scheduled to be married this coming winter....he is a supporter of the Wisconsin Parkinson Association....his father, Tom, was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease when Jacob was growing up....Misiorowski enjoys hunting, fishing and collecting baseball and Pokémon cards....he is a Kansas City Chiefs fan.
