METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Reds, 7-2, yesterday at Citi Field...The Mets are 12-11 over their last 23 games...The team is in a stretch of 17 straight games (7-7)...The Mets continue a six-game homestand (0-1) against Cincinnati (0-1) followed by the Marlins (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves - LHP A.J. Minter has been returned from rehab assignment and reinstated from the 60-Day Injured List... INF/OF Jared Young has been returned from rehab assignment and reinstated from the 10-Day Injured List... OF Nick Morabito and RHP Jonathan Pintaro were optioned to Triple-A following yesterday's game...OF Tyrone Taylor has been placed on the 10-Day Injured List with a right hip flexor strain...INF Eric Wagan has been selected to the Major League roster...A corresponding 40-man roster move will be announced prior to the game.

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have dropped four straight games...The team has posted a 4.59 ERA (17 ER/33.1 IP) in that span, while batting .164/.244/.230...The team has been outscored 17-4 over the four game stretch.

TWO LOW: The Mets have been held to two or fewer runs in five straight games...That is the longest streak since a five game span from July 8-16, 2023...The last time the team owned a longer streak was a six-game stretch from June 21-27, 2016...The Mets have scored six runs over their last five games, batting .169/.251/.221.

HOME COOKING: The Mets are 11-13 at home this year...They have posted a 4.29 ERA, while batting .235/.304/.354 at Citi Field.

MAY FLOWERS: The Mets are 12-11 in May...The team has posted a 3.54 ERA (81 ER/206.0 IP) with 213 strikeouts...Their 213 strikeouts are the fifth-most in the majors this month...Their 3.54 May ERA is 13th in the majors...They are hitting .228/.299/.360 in the month of May...Their .228 average is 21st in the majors.

THE DAVID: Over his last four appearances, David Peterson has posted a 2.50 ERA (5 ER/18.0 IP) with six walks and 20 strikeouts... This compares to his first four appearances where he went 0-2 with a 6.89 ERA (12 ER/15.2 IP) with eight walks and 15 strikeouts.

BENGE WATCH: Carson Benge has hit in seven of his last 10 games (13-43, .302) and 11 of 15 (21-65, .323) and 16 of his last 21 with a .325/.398/.422 slashline with one home run, five doubles, 12 RBI and 16 runs during that span...He has recorded multiple hits in six of his last 13 games, including three hits in three of his last 10 contests...In 24 games at Citi Field this year, Benge is batting .286/.341/.381...He is batting .307/.376/.398 in 23 games in the month of May.

CARSON CONNECTS: Benge has a .313 (35-112) batting average since April 23, ranking 10th in the majors (min. 92 PA)...He also is tied for 16th in the majors with 19 runs during that stretch...Over 26 games during that span, Benge is batting .313 (35-112) with 19 runs, six doubles, two homers, 14 RBI, seven walks, two stolen bases and an .788 OPS.

SOLO SLUGGING: Juan Soto has six homers and 10 RBI in his last 10 games...He has four homers in his last five games...He is tied for fourth in the majors with seven homers this month.

REALLY RARE: Juan Soto stole his 100th career base Thursday in his 1,131st career game...That is the fewest games to 100+ SB, 200+ HR & 900+ walks...The previous fewest: 1,257 games by Mickey Mantle...Research courtesy of Sarah Langs.

250: Juan Solo hit his 250th career homer on May 14...He is the fifth-youngest player to reach 250 home runs, only Alex Rodriguez, Jimmie Foxx, Eddie Matthews and Albert Pujols reached the milestone at a younger age...He reached the milestone in his 1125th career game making him the seventh-quickest active player to accomplish the feat, only trailing Aaron Judge, Shohei Ohtani, Pete Alonso, Kyle Schwarber, Matt Olson and Mike Trout...Overall, he is the 16th player to reach 250 homers before turning 28...Per *Elias*.

BO KNOWS: Bo Bichette has three homers, nine RBI, one double, five runs scored and one walk while slashing .308/.325/.564 over his last nine games...Bichette has hit in seven of his nine games... His two home run game last Tuesday was his 10th career multi-homer game...His last game with two long balls was August 4, 2025 against the Rockies.

BATY BALL: Brett Baty has at least one hit in 12 of his last 15 games with an at-bat...During that span, Baty is batting .302 (16-53) with two home runs, three doubles, five runs scored and nine RBI...In his last 30 games dating back to April 19, has a .255/.358/.404 slashline.

DREAM WEAVER: Over his last 14 games, Luke Weaver is 1-1 with a 1.15 ERA (2 ER/15.2 IP) allowing 10 hits, five walks and striking out 19...He has stranded all seven inherited runners in that span.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets enjoyed a day off on this day in 1986...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at [Mets.com/1986](https://mets.com/1986).

METS HALL OF FAME CEREMONY: Outfielder Lee Mazzilli and manager Bobby Valentine will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in a pre-game ceremony on Saturday, May 30 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Mazzilli had two stints with the Mets (1976-1981 and 1986-1989) and combined to slash .264/.357/.396 during his 10 years in Queens...The Brooklyn native was named to the 1979 All-Star team and hit the first home run by a Met during the Midsummer Classic...Mazzilli ranks sixth in franchise history with 152 stolen bases and is tied for fifth in team history with 38 pinch-hits...Valentine ranks third in team history with 536 wins guiding the Mets from 1996-2002. In 1999, he led the Mets to the Postseason for the first time since 1988...The following year, Valentine took the team to the World Series, becoming the first manager in Mets history to lead the team to consecutive playoff appearances...Valentine was a key contributor to the club's immediate volunteer response to the 9/11 attacks.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his third win of the season after allowing one earned run over 5.0 innings at Washington on May 21 (5.0 IP, 4 H, ER, 3 BB, 3 K)...Marked his sixth start of the season and was only the second time this season he's completed 5.0 innings and allowed one or zero runs in a start...The only other time he has done so was in his first start of the season vs. Pittsburgh on March 28 (5.1 IP, 6 H, 2 BB, 3 K), when he tossed 5.1 scoreless innings.

RIGHTING THE SHIP: Over his last four appearances (one start), he is 3-0 while posting a 2.50 ERA (5 ER/18.0 IP) and recording 20 strikeouts...He has completed at least 4.0 innings and allowed two or fewer earned runs in each of his last four appearances and has posted a K/9 of 10.00 in those appearances...Over his last four games, opposing batters are hitting just .230 (17-74) with a .621 OPS against Peterson...In comparison, over his first seven appearances (five starts) this season he went 0-4 and pitched to a 6.53 ERA (22 ER/30.1 IP)...He allowed four or more earned runs in four of those outings and opposing batters were hitting .309 (38-123) with a .809 OPS against him during that stretch.

WHAT A RELIEF: Five of his 11 appearances this season have come as a bulk reliever...Over those five appearances, he has pitched to a 2.25 ERA (5 ER/20.0 IP), opposed to an 6.99 ERA (22 ER/28.1 IP) as a starter...Each of his relief appearances this season has been for at least 3.1 innings, and he hasn't allowed more than two earned runs in any of those appearances...In his career, he has made 21 career relief appearances, and he is 5-0 with two holds and a 2.51 ERA (13 ER/46.2 IP)...He struck out eight on May 16 against the Yankees (4.0 IP, 6 H, 2 ER, 3 BB, 3 K)...His season-high eight strikeouts were a career high coming out of the bullpen...He joined Tug McGraw (3x, last, 8/10/71), Ray Sadecki (7/1/73) and Trevor Williams (9/14/22) as the only Mets relievers to record eight or more strikeouts in an outing.

VS. CINCINNATI: Has made five career appearances (all starts) against the Reds, he is 1-1 with a 4.88 ERA (13 ER/24.0 IP) and 29 strikeouts against his NL Central foe...His last start against them came on September 5, 2025 at Cincinnati and he earned the win after allowing four runs over 5.1 innings (5.1 IP, 7 H, 4 ER, BB, 4 K).

GROUND AND POUND: This season, he has generated a 53.3% groundball rate, which is the seventh-highest mark in the Majors and the fourth-highest mark in the NL (min. 200 BF)...Last season, he posted a 54.7% groundball rate, which was the fourth-best mark among qualified NL pitchers...Among NL qualifiers since 2021, Peterson's 52.3% groundball rate is the fifth-best mark, only trailing Christopher Sanchez, Logan Webb, Max Fried (21-24 w/ATL) and Ranger Suarez (21-25 w/PHI).

SLIDE TO THE LEFT: This season, he has thrown his slider 23.1% of the time and generated a 34.0% whiff rate on the pitch...23 of his 49 strikeouts this season have come via the slider and opposing batters are hitting just .179 (10-56) in at-bats ending with his slider...His slider has a 6-run value according to *MLB Statscast*, which is tied for the seventh-highest mark among all qualified sliders in the majors.

2025 YEAR IN REVIEW: Over a career-high 30 starts in 2025, he went 9-6 with a 4.22 ERA (79 ER/168.2 IP), 65 walks and a career-high 150 strikeouts...He allowed three earned runs or less in 22 of his 30 starts this season and one or zero earned runs in 10 starts...He picked up at least eight strikeouts in five of his 30 starts this season...Allowed four or more earned runs in eight of his last 16 starts after not allowing more than three earned runs through his first 14 starts of the season...Among qualified Major League pitchers, he finished third in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.59) and tied for fourth in opponent GIDP (20).

LEFTY LEADERBOARD: His 663 strikeouts are the sixth-most by a left-hander in franchise history...Jon Niese is next on the list with 838 strikeouts...His 121 career starts are the eighth-most in franchise history by a southpaw...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

APPLE PICKING: Peterson has recorded 18 career pickoffs, which is tied with Sid Fernandez for the seventh-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20)...According to *OPTA*...Last season, Peterson recorded a net bases prevented of eight (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which was tied for the third-best in the majors with six others, trailing Matthew Boyd and Max Fried...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 32 net bases prevented is the most among qualified Major League pitchers...Max Fried is next on the list at 26.

GOING THE DISTANCE: Completed at least 7.0+ innings in six of his 30 starts last season...Mets starters completed 7.0 innings 10 times in 2025, six of those starts came from Peterson...Him and Nolan McLean were the only Mets pitchers to complete 8.0 innings lastseason...His two 8.0+ innings pitched starts were the most by a Mets southpaw in a single season since Jon Niese (2014)...He completed pitched 5.0 or more in 24 of his 30 starts, and 6.0+ innings in 16 of those starts...His 24 such starts were the most on the team and his 16 such starts of 6.0 or more

innings were the most on the team...He became one of 13 left-handed starters this season to record at least 16 starts with 6.0+ innings pitched...He joined Sean Manaea (16 in 2024) as the only Mets lefties to record as many 6.0+ IP starts since Steven Matz (16 in 2016 and 2019)...Peterson's 24 starts of 5.0+ innings pitched, his 16 starts of 6.0+ innings pitched, six starts of 7.0+ innings pitched and two 8.0+ innings pitched are all his most in a single season.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR: On July 10, 2025, Peterson was named to his first career All-Star Game after posting a first-half career-best 3.06 ERA and 93 strikeouts (previous: 3.09 ERA in 2024 and 84 K in 2022)...He became the first Mets starting pitcher to be named an All-Star since Kodai Senga in 2023 and is the first left-handed Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Johan Santana (2009)...He threw 1.0 scoreless inning in the Midsummer Classic on July 15, becoming the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom in 2019 and the first left-handed Mets pitcher to do so since Tom Glavine in 2004.

CAREER NOTES: Set new career highs in strikeouts, innings pitched and starts last season...Had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from June 5-17...He threw at least 5.0 innings in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career.....Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.

- Threw 1.1 scoreless innings as the opener on May 16 vs. New York-AL (1.1 IP, 2 K)...Over 7.1 career innings as an opener, he hasn't surrendered a hit and has only allowed two earned runs.
