

# LETTER from the PRESIDENT

Dear friends,

I recently had the honor of speaking at an event in support of the United Negro College Fund, which gave me an opportunity to reflect on the value of education and my own time at Spelman College. In my remarks, I recalled that before I attended Spelman, I heard graduates talk about the sense of family among alumni that was a defining characteristic of the school, and how I later got to experience that firsthand.

Since that evening, I've thought about how much that same sense of family drives the Turn 2 Foundation. And yes, this is a family endeavor in the literal sense. But it is so much more than the father and son who started this organization in 1996. It's the extended family we all have grown to become in the 23 years since.

One of Derek's favorite pieces of advice to youth is to surround yourself with a strong supporting cast. That is what a family is. The success we have achieved is only possible because of the collective strength that comes from this incredible network of people who are looking out and rooting for one another.

Our Jeter's Leaders are the perfect representation of this. These are incredible, gifted young people who, despite their individual talents, put their egos and interests aside for the benefit of the group. I'm always astonished at how hard they push each other and how invested each is in the success of the next.

That spirit was on display at the Jeter's Leaders Leadership Conference Presented by Goldman Sachs in August. The Jeter's Leaders planned and organized this event over the course of many months, hosting youth leaders from across the country for four days of activities intended to address and identify solutions to the challenges facing young people today.

I cannot tell you how proud I am of what our Jeter's Leaders accomplished. And it was more than the Conference. In the last year, we welcomed 20 new high school freshmen from New York and West Michigan, and awarded scholarships to our 17 graduating Jeter's Leaders. For the 14th straight year, 100% of our graduating Leaders went on to attend college.

Our Jeter's Leaders know as well as I do that you all helped make this possible, too. And the results we achieved together don't end there.

In April, the 2019 Derek Jeter Celebrity Invitational returned to Las Vegas and contributed more than \$1 million to Turn 2. In August, we donated \$100,000 to the UNCF in honor of its 75th anniversary, which will help fund scholarships for eligible high school graduates attending Historically Black Colleges and Universities, reinforcing our commitment to academic excellence.

There's so much more, and you can read about Turn 2's exciting moments in our magazine. All of this speaks to what is possible when we work together with committed, passionate, likeminded individuals toward something greater than ourselves. That is the strength of family. And a family is what the Turn 2 Foundation has always been.

I thank you all for being part of this journey, and look forward to continuing to be amazed by what we all accomplish together.

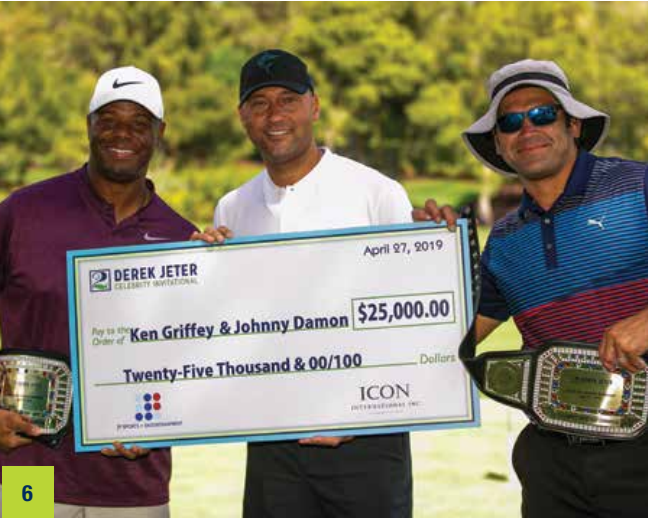
