RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals and division-rival Chicago Cubs kick off a season-ending three-game series this weekend at Wrigley Field ... St. Louis concluded the first leg of its six-game road trip by taking two-of-three from the Giants at Oracle Park, but were eliminated from postseason contention with Wednesday night's loss ... This series marks the 13th time that the Cardinals have ended a regular season against the Cubs and 5th time at Wrigley Field (first since 2018).

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters today in 4th place in the NL Central and eliminated from postseason contention for the third straight season The Cardinals need to win all three remaining games to finish at .500 (81-81) ... The last time St. Louis experienced two losing seasons over a three-year span was 1997 (73-89) and 1999 (75-86).

GAMES THAT MATTER: Since 2011 Opening Day, the Cardinals will have played 2,301 out of a possible 2,326 regular season games (98.9%) during which they still maintained playoff aspirations and had not yet been eliminated.

MISSOURI LOVES COMPANY: St. Louis and Kansas City are the only two MLB teams to have not hit a grand slam this season ... In the Expansion Era (1961-present), seasons in which the Cardinals hit zero grand slams include 1988, 1989, 1991, 2005, and 2025 ... The latest into any season that St. Louis hit its only grand slam is Game No. 158 (Sept. 24, 1971), a walk-off bases-loaded blast by Joe Hague in the 10th inning of a 10-6 win over the Expos at Busch Memorial Stadium.

DID YOU KNOW: The Cardinals have hit 20 grand slams at Wrigley Field since it opened in 1916, 2nd-most among visitors (Pittsburgh 22) and their most at any road venue in franchise history.

PLAYERS USED: Forty-four different players have appeared for the Cardinals this season, fewest in Major League Baseball (Atlanta leads with 71 players) ... The 44 Cardinals match last season's total, while the 52 different Redbirds in 2023 set a franchise record ... Seven Cardinals have been active for every game: catcher Pedro Pagés and pitchers Miles

Mikolas, Andre Pallante, Sonny Gray, Matthew Liberatore, Kyle Leahy, and JoJo Romero.

OUCH!: The Cardinals and Twins have both been plunked 88 times this season, most in MLB ... The last time St. Louis led MLB in hit by pitches was 2014 with 86 ... The 1901 Cardinals hold the franchise single-season record with 90 HBP (142 games).

1B Willson Contreras (23) ranks 2nd in MLB to Randy Arozarena (27), while DH/C Iván Herrera (15) ranks T-9th ... The last time multiple Cardinals finished in MLB's Top 10 in HBP was 2014: Jon Jay (20, 1st) and Matt Holliday (17, T-3rd) ... Jay in 2014 was last Cardinal to lead the NL in HBP.

I DECLARE WAR: St. Louis is the only Major League team to have a different player lead their club in Baseball Reference's Wins Above Replacement in every season since 2011: Brendan Donovan (2.8 in 2025), Masyn Winn (4.3 in 2024); Willson Contreras (3.4 in 2023); Nolan Arenado (7.7 in 2022); Tyler O'Neill (6.1 in 2021); Paul Goldschmidt (2.1 in 2020); Jack Flaherty (5.9 in 2019); Miles Mikolas (5.3 in 2018); Tommy Pham (6.2 in 2017); Carlos Martínez (6.1 in 2016); Jason Heyward (6.9 in 2015); Adam Wainwright (6.4 in 2014); Matt Carpenter (6.6 in 2013); Yadier Molina (7.2 in 2012); and Albert Pujols (5.3 in 2011).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Happy 80th birthday to Cardinals Hall of Famer Dave Duncan and 100th birthday to former Cardinals pitcher Bobby Shantz ... Other notables born on this date include former Nationals manager and Cub Dave Martinez (61), former All-Star pitcher Chris Archer (37), and tennis superstar Serena Williams (44).

TEXAS LEAGUE CHAMPIONS: The Springfield Cardinals (AA) captured its 2nd overall Texas League championship (also 2012) by beating the Midland Rockhounds (Athletics) by a 13-1 score in the winner-take-all Game 3 on Wednesday at Momentum Bank Ballpark ... Piloted by Texas League Manager of the Year Patrick Anderson, Springfield set a franchise record in regular season victories (88-50, .638), while winning both halves in the same season for the 2nd time in franchise history (also 2007).

CHICAGO CUBS CONNECTIONS

Willson Contreras played parts of seven seasons with the Cubs (2016-22)...was a three-time All-Star and member of the 2016 World Series Champions...originally signed as an international free agent with Chicago (July 2, 2009).

Carson Kelly was drafted by St. Louis in 2012 and played three seasons (2016-18) for the Cardinals.

Andrew Kittredge pitched the 2024 season in St. Louis...set the Cardinals single-season holds record (37)...originally traded by Tampa Bay to St. Louis for OF **Richie Palacios** (Jan. 5, 2024).

Sonny Gray was originally selected by the Cubs in the 27th round of the 2008 MLB Draft, but did not sign to attend Vanderbilt University.

Yohel Pozo's father, also named Yohel, played 36 games for the Rockies/Cubs partner team in the Arizona Rookie League in 1992.

Jon Jay played in 141 games for the Cubs in 2017 and was part of their playoff run to the NLCS.

Daniel Descalso played his final MLB season with the Cubs in 2019.

Matt Svanson was born in Lake Zurich, III...graduated from Luke Zurich (III.) High School.

Cardinals Hall of Famer Jim Edmonds played part of 2008 with the Cubs.

Chris Roycroft was born in Dundee, III. and graduated from Willowbrook High School in Villa Park. III...played college baseball and basketball at Aurora, III. University.

Brant Brown was the Cubs 3rd round draft pick in 1992 and played parts of four seasons (1996-98 & 2000) with the North Siders

Stubby Clapp (June 18, 2001 at Busch II) made his MLB debut vs. the Cubs.

Cubs Scouting VP Dan Kantrovitz previously was Cardinals Scouting Director (2012-14)...2001 Cards 25th Rd. draft pick from Brown Univ...first MLB job was Cardinals Scouting Coordinator.

Lars Nootbaar and Shota Imanaga were teammates on Gold Medal winning Team Japan in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.

Drew Pomeranz's older brother, Stu. was selected by St. Louis in the 2nd round of the 2003 MLB Draft and pitched five minor league seasons with the Cardinals (2003-07).

Nolan Gorman won the 2017 Under Armour High School All-America Game HR Derby at Wrigley Field.

Chip Caray served as the Cubs play-by-play announcer for seven seasons (1998-2004) on WGN...his grandfather, **Harry Caray**, spent the final 16 years of his career broadcasting Cubs games (1982-97).

Marquee Sports Network Analyst Rick Sutcliffe played for St. Louis in 1994.

Cardinals VP/Special Projects Michael Girsch is a Chicago native...graduated from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Chicago.

MILES MIKOLAS'S HIGHS

NL Rankings: HR Allowed (26, 4th)

TODAY'S GAME:

- Makes his 31st start of the season and 213th career; It's his 203rd career start with the Cardinals (2018-present) in addition to the 10 made with the Rangers in 2014.
- Needs four strikeouts for his 6th season with 100 or more strikeouts, and is nine strikeouts away from reaching 900 career.
- Is 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA over his last five starts dating back to Aug. 28.
- Leads Cardinals (3.00) with lowest ERA in September and 12th in the National League (min. 4 GS).
- Has 30+ starts in six seasons over his career each of those while with the Cardinals, T-2nd-most in MLB since 2018. Only **José Berríos** (7) has more.
- One of 6 pitchers (Chris Bassitt, Jose Berrios, Dylan Cease, Kevin Gausman & Logan Webb) in MLB with 30 starts each of the last four seasons.
- Since joining the Cardinals in 2018, ranks T-9th among MLB pitchers in games started with 202 (Kyle Freeland).
- Became the 12th pitcher in Cardinals franchise history to make 200 starts, joining most recent Redbirds to accomplish the feat Adam Wainwright and Matt Morris.
- Has held his opposition to four hits or fewer in 14 starts this season, most of any Cardinals starter and T-8th most in the National League (Peralta, MIL, 21).
- At age 37 is the oldest player on the team's active roster.
- Has not received more than three runs of support in any of his last 17 starts. Has 30 runs total runs of support since June 15, 2nd-fewest on Cardinals behind Andre Pallante (22).
- Receiving an average of 3.33 run support per game; 2nd-lowest in the National League behind Yoshi Yamamoto (3.22).
- Has surrendered 7 HR in 81.2 innings at home, but 19 homers in 69.2 innings on the road.
- Has hurled 6.0+ innings in 9 of his 30 starts (8 quality starts); fewest in any season with the Cardinals (16 in 2024 2nd fewest).
- Mikolas is one of just 3 MLB pitchers to have made as many as 200 starts <u>exclusively with one team</u> since he joined the Cardinals in 2018; also Philadelphia's **Aaron Nola** (224) & Colorado's **Kyle Freeland** (202)
- Opened the season with 29.0 homerless IP (March 31-April 30), but averaging MLB-leading 2.01 HR/9 IP since May 1.
- Is closing out his 8th season (was injured for all of 2020) with the Cardinals in 2025; Leads active Cardinals pitchers in wins (67), innings pitched (1,143.1), strikeouts (820) and games started (200).
- The Cardinals are 109-93 in his 202 career starts with St. Louis and Miles holds a 68-68 mark as a Cardinal.
- Since joining St. Louis in 2018, Mikolas leads MLB in first strike percentage (68.2) and lowest walk percentage (4.4%).

LAST TIME OUT (Saturday, Sept. 20 vs. Milwaukee): Received a no decision allowing two runs over 5.0 innings. His 5th straight starts holding the opposition to two runs or less.

2025 NOTES:

- St. Louis is 14-16 in his starts this season. The Cardinals lost each of his first 5 starts to begin, then won 7-straight from April 30-June 5.
- Pitched 3 scoreless starts this season (22nd career since joining STL in 2018). Posted two in July (7/10 vs. WSH & 7/25 vs. SD).
- Surrendered a franchise record six home runs vs. CHI (7/4) at Wrigley Field en route to a franchise record eight total home runs (King 2) allowed by the Cardinals. Five of the six home runs allowed were solo. Of pitchers who have allowed six home runs in MLB history, pitched the longest outing (6.0) since Tommy Thomas of the St. Louis Browns (6/27/1936) vs. NYY.
- Blanked the Reds over 5.1 IP (77 pitches) on April 30 in Game 1 of double header at Great American Ball Park. Was credited with his 1st win of
 the season as he and three relievers combined on the 6-0 shutout win. The Cardinals got back/back/back HR's from Scott II, Nootbaar and Winn
 to break the game open in the 9th inning.
- Fanned a season-high 7 batters in his 6/15 start at MIL over 6.0 IP.
- Threw a 3-pitch inning in 4th inning on 9/2 vs. ATH, just the 4th by a Cardinals pitcher since pitch tracking became official.

MIKOLAS VS. CHICAGO CUBS

- Makes his 22rd career start (25th appearance) vs. the Cubs. The 23 starts will be his most against any team during career (22 vs. Pirates).
- Surrendered a career-high and franchise record 6 HR in an 11-3 loss at Wrigley Field on July 4. Pitched 6.0 innings to save the bullpen. Once went 6 starts withouth allowing a HR vs. the Cubs (9/4/22-6/16/24 30.1 IP).
- 3-4 with a 4.55 ERA in 11 career starts (13 app.) at Wrigley Field during his career including two relief app. with San Diego in 2012.
- Is 3-2 with a 4.60 ERA in 8 career starts at Wrigley Field during day games as a member of the Cardinals.
- Has lost his last three starts against the Cubs. Last win was June 16, 2024 (Father's Day) at Wrigley Field.
- Held the Cubs to 2 runs of less in 13-of-22 starts (including one start of 0.2 IP after an ejection).
- With his 14th appearance today, will have pitched at Wrigley Field more than any other ballpark than Busch Stadium.
- St. Louis has won 13 of his 22 career starts vs. Chicago as a member of the Cards, with Miles posting a 1.98 ERA (81.2 IP/18 ER) in the 13 wins.
- Held the Cubs to three runs or fewer in 16 of 22 career starts since 2018, most in MLB with Freddy Peralta (15) trailing.
