SEATTLE MARINERS (41-39) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (39-40)

June 24, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #80/Home #41

RHP Bryan Woo (6-5, 3.94 ERA) vs. RHP Braxton Ashcraft (6-3, 3.18 ERA)

THE PIRATES: began this six-game homestand vs. Seattle (Tuesday-Thursday) and Cincinnati (Friday-Sunday) with a 3-2 loss on Tuesday at PNC Park...Went 3-3 on their recent six-game, seven-day road trip against the Athletics (2-1, June 15-17) and Colorado (1-2, June 19-21)...Have scored the fifth-most runs (393) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (429), Los Angeles-NL (419), Milwaukee (401) and New York-AL (396)...Have struck out the fourth-most batters (720) in Major League Baseball, behind Milwaukee (763), Philadelphia (750) and Cleveland (734)...Have the fourth-best batting average (.255) in Major League Baseball, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (.261), San Francisco (.258) and Tampa Bay (.256).

AMERICAN SPIRIT: Pittsburgh has won three straight series against American League teams (swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota, won two of three games from June 2-4 at Houston and won two of three games from June 15-17 at the Athletics)...The Pirates have won four straight interleague series (within a single season) twice since interleague play began in 1997, coming from June 15-July 5, 2015 and April 25-July 25, 2018...Pittsburgh has also won six straight interleague series at PNC Park, dating back to last season (swept a three-game series last year from July 21-23 vs. Detroit, won two of three games from August 18-20 vs. Toronto, won two of three games from Sept. 19-21 vs. the A's, swept a three-game series from April 3-5 vs. Baltimore, won two of three games from April 17-19 vs. Tampa Bay and swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota)...The Pirates have won seven straight interleague series at home just once since interleague play began in 1997, coming from June 18, 2010-June 24, 2012...During that stretch, they won two of three games from June 18-20, 2010 vs. Cleveland, won two of three games from May 20-22, 2011 vs. Detroit, won two of three games from June 20-22, 2011 vs. Baltimore, won two of three games from June 24-26, 2011 vs. Boston, swept a three-game series from June 8-10, 2012 vs. Kansas City, won two of three games from June 19-21, 2012 vs. Minnesota & won two of three games from June 22-24, 2012 vs. Detroit.

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds singled and walked on Tuesday night vs. Seattle and has now reached base safely in 28 straight games, dating back to May 23 at Toronto...It is the longest active streak in Major League Baseball and the third-longest such streak in Major League Baseball this season, behind only the Athletics' Nick Kurtz (48 games, April 3-May 25) and Chicago (NL)'s Ian Happ (30 games, April 5-May 9)...Reynolds is 37-for-101 (.366) with 10 doubles, seven home runs, 19 RBI, 16 walks, a 1.131 OPS and 22 runs scored during the streak...He has also hit safely in 13 straight games (since June 9 vs. Los Angeles-NL), going 20-for-50 (.400) with five doubles, five home runs, 12 RBI, a 1.255 OPS and 10 runs during the streak...It is the fourth-longest hitting streak (within a single season) of his career, behind a 25-game streak from June 1-29, 2024, a 17-game streak from May 23-June 9, 2019 and a 14-game streak from June 14-30, 2021...His .401 OBP this year is the third-best mark in the National League (sixth in Major League Baseball).

GOOD AS GONZO: Nick Gonzales went 2-for-4 on Tuesday vs. Seattle, marking his second straight multi-hit game (also Sunday at Colorado)...He has recorded multiple hits in at least three straight games just once in his career, coming from July 2-5, 2023 (four straight games)...Gonzales' 28 multi-hit games this season are the third-most in Major League Baseball, trailing only Miami's Otto Lopez (32) and San Francisco's Luis Arraez (29)...His .296 average (81-for-274) ranks ninth among all National League batters.

LOWE OR NEVER: Brandon Lowe went 2-for-5 with a double and a run on Tuesday vs. Seattle and has now hit safely in seven straight games (since June 15 at the Athletics)...He has gone 9-for-30 (.300) with three doubles, a home run, three RBI, two walks, an .833 OPS and five runs scored during the streak.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Pirates pitchers have at least seven strikeouts in 26 of their last 27 games (since May 24 at Toronto), including a nine-strikeout game on Tuesday vs. Seattle...Their only game with fewer than seven strikeouts came on June 19 at Colorado (two)...Their 256 strikeouts in that span rank third in MLB, behind only Milwaukee (287) and Philadelphia (257).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 24, 2021: The Pirates kicked off a seven-game road trip to end the month of June with an 8-2 victory over the Cardinals at Busch Stadium. Bryan Reynolds led the way offensively, going 3-for-4 with a home run, four RBI and a walk. Phillip Evans hit his first career pinch-hit home run. Starter Chad Kuhl improved to 2-4 after allowing one run on three hits and three walks over his 6.0 innings of work.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Ashcraft won a 12-4 decision after allowing two runs (one earned) and striking out seven batters over his 6.0 innings of work on June 17 at the Athletics.

AGAINST THE MARINERS: Ashcraft allowed two runs over 2.1 innings of relief in his only career outing against Seattle, which came last season on July 4 at T-Mobile Park.

AMERICAN DREAM: Ashcraft is 3-0 with a 2.16 ERA (25.0ip/6er) and 31 strikeouts in four starts against American League opponents this season...He earned wins on April 5 vs. Baltimore (8-2), May 31 vs. Minnesota (9-3) and June 17 at the Athletics (12-4)...The Pirates also won when Ashcraft pitched on April 22 at Texas (8-4)...He has a 2.59 ERA (41.2ip/12er) and 52 strikeouts in 12 career interleague appearances (four starts).

CASHING IN AT PNC: Ashcraft is 3-1 with a 3.40 ERA (47.2ip/18er) and 53 strikeouts in eight home starts this season...He has allowed two or fewer earned runs in six of the eight starts (gave up six on April 28 vs. St. Louis and four on May 15 vs. Philadelphia).

RISPY BUSINESS: Ashcraft has limited opposing hitters to a .125 batting average against (8-for-64) with runners in scoring position this season...He has also allowed just three hits in 30 at-bats (.100 average) with runners in scoring position & two outs.

MR. CONSISTENT: Ashcraft pitched at least 6.0 innings, struck out at least five batters and walked two or fewer batters in six consecutive starts from May 3-May 31...He became one of five Pirates (six instances) during the Modern Era (since 1901) to do that, joining Rick Reuschel (six starts, September 4-October 1, 1985), Jon Lieber (six starts, June 15-July 13, 1998), Gerrit Cole (six starts, April 14-May 11, 2017 and six starts, July 30-August 26, 2017) and Paul Skenes (seven starts, June 11-July 23, 2024).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Ashcraft did not allow a first-inning run in any of his first 20 Major League starts (from last year on June 23 at Milwaukee to May 31 vs. Minnesota)...The streak was snapped on June 6 at Atlanta (allowed two runs in the first inning)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he was one of three Major League pitchers in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to allow zero first-inning runs in at least each of his first 20 career starts, along with Rollie Sheldon (20, 1961) & Dennis Rasmussen (22, 1983-84).

PITCH EFFICIENCY: Ashcraft had a career-high 11 strikeouts (issued zero walks) while throwing just 80 pitches over 6.0 innings on May 31 vs. Minnesota...He became the 12th Pirate (13th instance) in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing, the first since Mitch Keller (13k) on May 14, 2023 at Baltimore...Ashcraft also became the 11th Major Leaguer (since pitch tracking began in 1988) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing of 80 or fewer pitches, the first since Tampa Bay's Ryan Pepiot (12k, 76 pitches) on Sept. 18, 2024 vs. Boston.

HISTORIC STRETCH: Ashcraft had at least eight strikeouts while issuing one/zero walks and allowing one/zero runs in back-to-back starts on April 5 vs. Baltimore and April 11 at Chicago (NL)...He joined Bob Friend (Aug. 20-24, 1959), Rick Rhoden (June 21-27, 1986), Joe Musgrove (Sept. 20-26, 2020), Mitch Keller (May 8-14, 2023) and Paul Skenes (Sept. 4-10, 2025) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have consecutive starts with at least eight strikeouts, one/zero hits and one/zero walks.

 Is 8-for-21 (.381) out of the No. 7 spot of the lineup...Is 7-for-17 (.412) with a double, a triple, two homers and five RBI in his nine games at PNC Park.
 Became the 12th player in Pirates history (since 1887) to hit each of his first two Major League home runs in the same game (last Ryan Doumit, 2005).
 Hit his first two Major League homers, including a go-ahead, three-run home homer in the eighth inning, in the 9-8 win on 6/10 vs. Los Angeles (NL).

 Has made three starts in center field, two starts in right field, one start at first base and one start in left field (last in center field on 6/19 at Colorado).

 His 28 multi-hit performances (last on Tuesday vs. Seattle) are the third-most in MLB...Is hitting .340 (32-for-94) out of the No. 5 spot of the lineup.
 Is 66-for-212 (.311) in his last 55 games (since 4/19 vs. Tampa Bay)...His 31 RBI w/RISP are tied with Brandon Lowe for the third-most on the team.

 Ranks first among National League first basemen/second among Major League first basemen with a .391 OBP, behind only the A's Nick Kurtz (.433).

 Ranks tied for fifth in the National League in home runs (18) & tied for 10th in RBI (49)...His 38 extra-base hits rank eighth in Major League Baseball.
 His 18 home runs this year are already the most by any Pittsburgh second baseman in a single season since Neil Walker (23) during the 2014 season.

 His .954 career OPS during the month of June ranks second in Bucs history among those w/at least 675 plate appearances, behind Ralph Kiner (.992).
 Is 20-for-50 (.400) with five doubles and five homers during his 13-game hitting streak...Has five hits in his last seven at-bats with RISP (since 6/17).
