#### STAY INFORMED

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**RAY REPORT**—The Rays conclude a five-game, six-day, rain-shortened road trip against the Yankees (1-1) and Orioles (0-2, one to play) tonight in Baltimore...following tomorrow's off day, will open a six-game homestand against the Angels (3G) and Tigers (3G) on Friday night...despite a three-game losing streak, have still won nine of 14, 16 of 22, 22 of 29, and 29 of their last 40 games...have owned the AL's best record for each of the last 18 days (May 9-pres.), including eight consecutive days leading the majors (May 18-25), their first time holding MLB's best winning pct. since June 30, 2023 (57-28)...have the easiest remaining schedule in MLB (.474 opp. winning pct.)...have a 90.1 pct. chance to make the postseason, per FanGraphs, fourth highest in the majors to the Dodgers (99.6%), Yankees (98.5%), and Braves (97.0%) and an MLB-leading 60.6 pct. increase from their Opening Day odds (29.5%)...have spent 24 days leading the AL East, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...are 13-6 on a stretch of 20 games (May 4-27) that includes 17 meetings with divisional opponents, after which only two of their 13 series before the All-Star break will come vs. AL East teams, both at Tropicana Field: June 8-10 vs. BOS and July 6-9 vs. NYY.

✦ The Rays committed three errors that led to six unearned runs in last night's 6-1 loss, securing their first series defeat since April 20-22 vs. CIN...it snapped an 8-0-1 run, tied for the sixth-longest streak of unbeaten series in club history.

✦ The six unearned runs were tied for seventh most in team history and their most since April 26, 2022 vs. SEA (7)...it was the most unearned runs the Rays have allowed in a game they yielded 0 ER, surpassing the previous mark of five (2x: June 13, 2025 at NYM & April 19, 2024 at NYY)...for more information, see the 'Nothing Earned, Everything Given' note below.

✦ The Rays have lost three straight games for the first time since April 19-21...all three losses have come vs. AL East opponents on the heels of a 14-2 start against the division...their 14-5 (.737) intradivision record is still the best in the majors, ahead of the Brewers (7-3/.700).

✦ The Rays need to win tonight to avoid being swept for the first time since their final series of 2025 (Sept. 26-28 at TOR)...it would mark their 17th time being swept by the Orioles (12th at BAL), first since June 7-10, 2024 at Tropicana Field and first on the road since July 31-Aug. 2, 2020.

✦ Entering play tonight, the Rays, Braves, Dodgers, Guardians, and Padres are the only clubs who have not been swept this season...the Padres could be swept by the Phillies with a loss today.

**RECENT TRANSACTIONS**—Today, the Rays selected RHP Jon Heasley from Triple-A Durham and optioned RHP Trevor Martin to Durham...to make room on the 40-man roster INF Gavin Lux (left shoulder inflammation) was transferred to the 60-day IL...Heasley, 29, has gone 5-12 with a 5.89 ERA (139.0IP, 91ER) in 40 career appearances (24 starts) between the Royals (2021-23) and Orioles (2024)...he returned to the Royals organization last season, making 12 relief appearances between Triple-A Omaha (4) and Double-A Northwest Arkansas (8) before being released earlier this year on March 28...he signed a minor league contract with the Rays on April 11.

✦ Heasley has gone 3-2 with a 3.90 ERA (27.2IP, 12ER), 18 SO, 6 BB, and a 1.19 WHIP over seven appearances (four starts) with Triple-A Durham...he earned the win in each of his last three outings with the Bulls and has thrown 10.2 consecutive scoreless innings.

**BLOWN AWAY**—The Rays have suffered back-to-back blown lead losses for the first time since March 31-April 3 (three straight)...they have led in four of their last five losses (May 13-pres.) compared to one of their previous eight defeats (April 7-May 8)...the club's 10 blown lead losses are still tied with the Guardians for third fewest in the AL, more than only the Orioles (9) and Rangers (7)...the Rays have held a lead at some point in 20 of 22 games during May, with the exceptions being 2-0 shutout losses on May 8 at BOS and May 24 at NYY...the club's pitching staff has six blown saves in the last 12 games (May 12-pres.), most in MLB over that span, after converting 11 straight save opportunities between April 18-May 14...among AL teams, only the Tigers (12) and Athletics (11) have more blown saves than the Rays (10).

✦ The Rays have split the last eight games in which they scored first on the heels of a 17-game winning streak in such contests (April 4-May 12)...four of their last five losses have come in the final at-bat, including three extra-inning defeats.

**NOTHING EARNED, EVERYTHING GIVEN**—The Rays six unearned runs allowed last night were their most in any game they permitted 0 ER...they became the first team to allow six unearned runs or more and 0 ER since the Nationals (6) on May 29, 2023 at LAD...11 of the 15 runs against the Rays staff this series have been unearned, surpassing their total from their previous 39 games combined (10 from April 8-May 24)...the 11 UER are tied for their most in a single series in franchise history, matching a three-game set from May 7-9, 1999 at CLE...the Rays are the first team to allowed 11 UER or more in a series since the Angels permitted 12 in a four-game series against the Rays from Aug. 22-25, 2022 at Tropicana Field...since 2013, the Rays are the second club to yield 11 UER or more in a series of three games or fewer, joining the Giants (12) from June 24-26, 2022 vs. CIN...they have allowed 31 UER this season, third most in the majors behind the Nationals (41) and Orioles (37) and their fifth most before the end of May, trailing 2001 (46), 1999 (40), 2007 (34), and 2022 (32).

✦ The Rays AL-leading 39 errors are second most in MLB to the Nationals (50)...they have committed three errors or more in back-to-back games for the eighth time in franchise history and second time over the last 14 seasons (2013-26), joining Sept. 19-20, 2025 vs. BOS.

✦ Their seven errors this series are their most since Sept. 17-20, 2012 vs. BOS (7) and most in a three-game set since May 11-13, 2012 at BAL (7)...the club record for errors in a single series is eight, done twice, both in three-game series: Aug. 21-23, 2001 vs. BAL and July 19-21, 2002 at TOR.

✦ Their five games with three errors or more lead the majors, and the Pirates (4) are the only other club with more than two games...the Rays had five such games over the last two seasons combined (3 in 2025, 2 in 2024)...the five three-error games are already their most since 2017 (6).

**ROTATIONAL DOMINATION**—Rays starters have not allowed an earned run in their last 15.1 IP and have yielded 1 ER in their last 22.1 IP and 2 ER in their last 28.1 IP...they have permitted 1 or 0 ER in six straight outings, their longest streak since another six-start run from Aug. 21-26, 2022...they haven't had a longer streak since an 11-start stretch from Sept. 21, 2021-April 8, 2022, which included 10 straight starts to end the 2021 season...they used openers twice during that streak, and only five of the 11 starts were 5.0 IP or more compared to four of six starts during the current streak...Rays starting pitchers have yielded three runs or fewer in 28 of their last 29 outings (April 22-pres.) and 44 of 52 starts this season...they lead MLB in ERA (2.80) and opp. on-base pct. (.278) while ranking highly in hard-hit rate (2nd, 35.5%), average exit velocity (2nd, 87.8 mph), opp. slugging pct. (3rd, .341), opp. OPS (3rd, .618), walk rate (4th, 7.2%), opp. average (5th, .218), home runs per 9 IP (5th, 0.86), and FIP (6th, 3.59).

**JONNY BASEBALL**—Jonathan Aranda tallied his second consecutive three-hit game and fourth of the season last night, tying Yandy Diaz and Chandler Simpson for the club lead, and has gone 5-for-8 (.625) with 2 XBH, 3 RBI, and 1 BB this series...he is 8-for-19 (.421) with 3 2B, 1 HR, and 6 RBI over a five-game hitting streak and is slashing .359/.436/.500 (28-for-78) with 5 2B, 2 HR, 16 RBI, and a .936 OPS over 22 games during May...Aranda leads the majors in average this month and ranks third in on-base pct. behind ATH Nick Kurtz (.454) and CHC Michael Busch (.438)...min. 75 AB, the .359 average would be the highest by a Ray during May since Avisail Garcia (.360) in 2019 and would mark Aranda's highest average in any calendar month of his career, surpassing May, 2025 (.341).

✦ He has hit safely in nine straight road games (.452/14-for-31), the third-longest active streak in MLB behind CHC Alex Bregman (12G) and ATL Mauricio Dubón (10G) and one game shy of the longest streak by a Ray this season, a 10-game run by Nick Fortes from March 30-April 27.

**FEELING HOT, HOT, HOT**—AL batting average leader Yandy Diaz (.312) has an 11-game on-base streak, batting .341 (15-for-44) with 5 2B, 3 HR, 10 RBI, and a 1.067 OPS in that span...it marks his second-longest streak this season behind April 1-18 (15G) and is tied with three other players for the third-longest active streak in the AL, trailing MIN Byron Buxton (12G) and BOS Cedanne Rafaela (12G)...Junior Caminero is 12-for-34 (.353) with 2 2B, 2 HR, and 8 RBI during a nine-game hitting streak, tied with TOR Ernie Clement and BOS Willson Contreras for the longest active streak in the AL and the second longest of his career...one shy of his career-best 10-game run earlier this season (April 15-25)...Cedric Mullins has gone 11-for-32 (.344) with 2 XBH, 2 RBI, 6 BB, and a .447 on-base pct. his last nine games.

✦ Ryan Vilade has reached base safely in 12 of his last 18 PA (.667 OBP - 4 1B, 2B, 3B, HR, 5BB), two of the six outs he has made in that span were sacrifice flies...he is batting .362/.426/.552 (21-for-58) with 6 XBH, 14 RBI, 8 BB, and 8 SO over his last 25 games (April 7-pres.), pacing the majors in average over that span while ranking fifth with a .987 OPS (min. 50PA).

**BIRDLAND**—The Rays and Orioles wrap up a stretch of six meetings over a 10-day span (May 18-27) tonight...the Rays won the first three meetings, tying 2022 for their second-longest season-opening streak vs. Baltimore behind a six-game run to open 2021, but have dropped the last two...the Rays have lost 11 of their last 16 games at Oriole Park (Sept. 16, 2023-pres.) and are 10-19 (.345) in their last 29 (May 22, 2022-pres.)...it marks the third-worst record by any club in Baltimore over that span (min. 10G), ahead of the Angels (3-11/.214) and White Sox (3-9/.250), on the heels of a 14-2 run in this venue (Sept. 17, 2020-May 21, 2022)...they are 1-8-1 in series play over the 10-19 stretch, with the lone win coming from Sept. 6-8, 2024...the Rays have lost the last three season series (2023-25) on the heels of six straight wins (2017-22).

✦ In his last 16 games vs. the Orioles (Sept. 7, 2024-pres.), Yandy Diaz is batting .460/.534/.746 (29-for-63) with 6 2B, 4 HR, and 16 RBI...Junior Caminero has reached base safely in 11 straight games against the Orioles, batting .367/.436/.592 (18-for-49) with 2 2B, 3 HR, and 10 RBI in those contests.

**TONIGHT'S START**—Steven Matz makes his ninth start of the season and fifth on the road tonight...marks his 181st career start and seventh (10G) opposite the Orioles...is in his 12th major league season and first with the Rays...is one of 15 active left-handed pitchers to cross the 1,000-inning mark for his career (1,045.2)...signed a two-year deal with the Rays on Dec. 16, 2025, 2022.

- ✦ Tonight's start marks Matz's highest single-season total since 2023, when he made 17 starts for the St. Louis Cardinals.
- ✦ A win tonight would give Matz his fifth victory of the season, matching his highest win total since 2021 after going 5-3 in 2022 and 5-2 in 2025...his top mark remains a 14-7 campaign with Toronto in 2021.
- ✦ Among active left-handed pitchers, Matz ranks 15th in quality starts since his rookie season in 2015, recording 67 over his career...has three this season, third most among Rays behind Nick Martinez (6QS) and Drew Rasmussen (5QS).
- ✦ Ranks highly among AL southpaws (min. 30.0IP) in wins (T3rd, 4), opp. AVG (6th, .208), walks (7th, 15), WHIP (7th, 1.11), and ERA (11th, 3.70).

**LAST TIME OUT**—In his first outing since returning from the 15-day IL after missing 13 games with left elbow inflammation, tossed 4.0 innings of one-run ball in a 5-3 win on May 20 vs. BAL (ND, 4.0IP, 3H, ER, 2BB, 5SO)...retired eight of his first 12 batters faced before allowing an RBI-single to Pete Alonso in the 3rd inning...threw a season-low 67 pitches...the Rays have won seven of his eight starts.

**BATTLE OF THE BAYS**—Matz will be making his seventh career start (11th appearance) opposite the Orioles...is 3-2 with a 3.93 ERA (38.1IP, 16ER) and 37 strikeouts across his previous 10 appearances...faced the Orioles in his most recent outing, a 5-3 win on May 20 at Tropicana Field.

- ✦ Has gone 9-8 with a 4.59 ERA (129.1IP, 66ER) and 126 strikeouts in 33 career appearances (21 starts) against AL East opponents...has allowed 3 ER or fewer in each of his last 14 appearances vs. AL East clubs dating back to Oct. 1, 2021 vs. BAL (w/TOR)...over that span, he has pitched to a 3.27 ERA (41.1IP, 15ER) with eight walks and 39 strikeouts.
- ✦ As a starter against the AL East, he holds a career 8-8 record with a 4.83 ERA (113.2IP, 61ER), 33 walks, and 111 strikeouts...in his two starts against AL East clubs this season, Matz is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (9.0, 3ER), 4 BB, 12 SO, and a .161 (5-for-31) opp. AVG.

**AL GREATNESS**—Against AL opponents, Matz is 24-15 with two saves, turning in a 3.68 ERA (340.0IP, 139ER) with 306 strikeouts across 88 career games (54GS)...in five starts against AL clubs this season, Matz is 3-0 with a 2.63 ERA (27.1IP, 8ER), 26 SO, and a .177 (17-for-96) opp. AVG...min. 25.0 IP, the 2.63 ERA vs. AL teams ranks fifth among MLB left-handed pitchers behind only TB Shane Bieber (1.74), BOS Ranger Suarez (2.43), BOS Payton Tolle (2.51), and CWS Anthony Kay (2.54)...min. 90 AB, his opp. AVG ranks third behind McLanahan (.152) and Tolle (.167).

**ROAD WARRIOR**—In Matz's four starts on the road this season, he is 3-0 with a 3.47 ERA (23.1IP, 9ER), 16 SO, a 0.99 WHIP, and a .212 (18-for-85) opp. AVG...his teams have won each of his last six road starts dating back to Sept. 3, 2024 at MIL (w/STL)...in that span, he has posted a 3.38 ERA (32.0IP, 12ER) with 29 SO, and has limited batters to a .218 (26-for-119) clip.

**MATZ-TER OF MAY**—Matz is 10-10 with a 3.44 ERA (178.0IP, 68ER) and 161 strikeouts over 39 appearances (32 starts) in his career during the month of May...it marks the lowest ERA of any month in his career (min. 10.0IP).

- ✦ His 10 wins in May are tied with July for his second most of any month behind April (19).
- ✦ Over his last 10 starts in May since May 12, 2022, Matz has allowed three runs or fewer six times, logging a 4.11 ERA (46.0IP, 21ER) with 38 strikeouts in that span.

**LIMITING LEFTIES**—This season, Matz has held left-handed hitters to a .234 OBP, the ninth-lowest mark among AL lefties (min. 40PA), while limiting them to a .205 average (9-for-44) (min. 40AB), ranking ninth...over his 12-year career, he has limited LHB to a .253 average (238-for-942) and a .320 on-base pct.

**OLDER & WISER**—Matz became the third-oldest pitcher (34.327) to strike out 25 batters or more in his first five starts as a Ray to begin a season, younger than Corey Kluber (36.024, 25SO in 2022) and Charlie Morton (35.159, 34SO in 2019).

- ✦ The southpaw is the only Rays pitcher age 34 or older in franchise history to pick up a win in four of his first seven games (4-1) with the club and is the first AL left-hander to turn the trick since J.A. Happ earned four wins with Toronto from March 29–May 4, 2018.

**BEEN AROUND THE BLOCK**—At 34 years and 322 days old, Matz became the oldest Rays pitcher to earn three wins in the span of his first four games with the franchise to begin a season, becoming the 11th-oldest MLB arm to turn the trick since the Rays inaugural season (1998)...Matz entered the 2026 season with 10 years, 99 days of service time, most among Rays...he reached the 10-year mark last June and was one of 16 left-handed pitchers to appear in the majors last season to conclude the year with a decade of service time.
