The Rays are AL East champions for the fifth time in franchise history (2021, 2020, 2010, 2008) and are the No. 1 seed in the AL for the fourth time in team history (2021, 2020, 2010).

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final road trip of the regular season against the Yankees (1-1, two to play) and Phillies (three to play) tonight at Yankee Stadium...have won nine of 11, 13 of 17, and 20 of their last 28 games since Aug. 23...are an MLB-best 40-19 (.678) over their last 59 games (July 20–pres.), tied for their eighth-best record over any 59-game span in a single season in team history (20x, last: April 8–June 9, 2023)...have secured the AL East division title for the fifth time in franchise history (2021, 2020, 2010, 2008) and the No. 1 seed in the AL for the fourth time in franchise history (2021, 2020, 2010)...have qualified for the postseason for the 10th time in 29 seasons and sixth time in the last eight years (2019–pres.)...lead the second-place Yankees by 6.0 games in the AL East standings...have led the division for 88 consecutive days (June 27–pres.) and spent a total of 128 days at the helm overall as well as 127 days with the AL's best winning pct., both of which are franchise records.

- ✦ After losing 2-0 in the first game of yesterday's doubleheader against the Yankees, the Rays won 6-1 in game two and clinched the AL East division title for the third time in the last seven seasons (2020–pres.) and fifth time in team history...Sept. 22 marked the earliest date the Rays have clinched a division title (see table on the right).
- ✦ Including this season, the AL East winner has secured the No. 1 seed in the AL each of the last four seasons, one year after missing the postseason and finishing fourth or lower in the division...the AL East is the only division in the majors to have been won by all five teams since 2018 and to be won by each of its five members multiple times since 2014.
- ✦ Yesterday, **Yandy Diaz** (967G) tied and surpassed **B.J. Upton** (966G) for the fourth-most games played in franchise history...he is 97 games shy of **Ben Zobrist** (1,064G) for third most.
- ✦ In yesterday's nightcap, **Drew Rasmussen** struck out 11 batters and reached 600 career strikeouts...the Rays have won each of Rasmussen's 12 starts since the All-Star break, the longest streak in the AL since the Astros won 13 straight starts by **Framber Valdez** (May 7–July 22, 2025).
- ✦ Rasmussen earned the win for his effort, becoming the fourth Rays pitcher in team history to win nine games or more in the second half of a single season, joining **Blake Snell** (2018, 9W), **David Price** (2012, 9W), and **Edwin Jackson** (2008, 9W).
- ✦ The Rays claimed the season series over the Yankees, their fourth time doing so in the last seven seasons (2020–pres.).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays recalled **RHP Mason Englert** from Triple-A Durham and optioned **RHP Alex Cook** to Durham.

TIP TROP SHAPE—After securing the No. 1 seed in the AL, the Rays are slated to host Game 1 of the ALDS on Oct. 3 at Tropicana Field, their first postseason game at the ballpark since Oct. 4, 2023 and 724 days since the Trop sustained extensive damage during Hurricane Milton on Oct. 9, 2024.

- ✦ They finished the year with the third-best home winning pct. in franchise history (2020; .690/20-9 & 2008; 704/57-24) and are on pace to have the best home record in the majors this season...because the 2008 Rays played three home games (3-0) in Champion Stadium at the ESPN Wide World of Sports, the 2026 Rays 55 wins at Tropicana Field marked their most in a single season at the ballpark.
- ✦ The Rays five division titles since 2008 are tied for the ninth most in the majors and tied for the fourth most in the AL (also: MIN), behind the Astros (7), Guardians (6), and Yankees (6)...their three division titles since 2020 are the most among AL East clubs.
- ✦ When competing in the postseason as the AL East champions, the Rays are 22-23 compared to 6-13 as a Wild Card...they have qualified for the ALDS for the seventh time, first since 2021.

SEE THE VALUE—Through 157 games this season, **Junior Caminero** ranks highly in the AL in home runs (T1st, 41), XBH (2nd, 67), total bases (2nd, 315), SLG (3rd, .525), RBI (3rd, 97), OPS (3rd, .886), hits (4th, 165), multi-hit games (6th, 43), runs (6th, 96), multi-RBI games (T9th, 23), OBP (13th, .361), and AVG (15th, .275)...Caminero has registered a hit in 116 of 157 games, the most games with a hit in the majors...it is the fifth most in Rays history and marks the most since **Delmon Young** had a hit in 118 games in 2007.

- ✦ In his age-22 season, he is on pace to become the fourth Ray in team history to play 162 games in a season, joining **Evan Longoria** (2014), Young (2007), and **Aubrey Huff** (2003)...in reaching 162 games, he would become the first player in the modern era (since 1900) to hit 40 home runs or more and play in 162 games in an age-24-or-younger season...he would also become one of 12 players in the modern era to appear in 162 games in an age-22-or-younger season, and the seventh player to do so without appearing as a DH, PH, or PR...the last player to play 162 games without being a DH, PH, PR in an age-22-or-younger season was BAL **Manny Machado** (162G) in 2015.
- ✦ There have been only seven players in the modern era to start 162 games or more at third base in a single season: COL **Vinny Castilla** (1998), BAL **Cal Ripken Jr.** (1997), OAK **Sal Bando** (1969), CHC **Ron Santo** (1968, 1965, 1963), STL **Ken Boyer** (1964), PHI **Dick Allen** (1964), and BAL **Brooks Robinson** (1964, 1961-62).
- ✦ Additionally, he is on pace for 100 RBI this season...he would become the 23rd player (27x) in the modern era to produce 40 homers or more and 100 RBI or more while playing 162 games...only eight of the previous 22 players did so without appearing at DH, PH, or PR (ATL **Matt Olson**, 2023; MIL **Prince Fielder**, 2009; MIL **Richie Sexson**, 2003; TOR **Carlos Delgado**, 2000; CHC **Sammy Sosa**, 1999; Castilla, 1998; MIN **Harmon Killebrew**, 1969 & 1967; BOS **Carl Yastrzemski**, 1969).
- ✦ He paces the AL with 1,369.2 innings played in the field...he is 12.0 innings behind Longoria's franchise record with 1,381.2 innings played in 2014...at third base, he has produced five defensive runs saved (DRS), more than 12 clubs have produced at all positions as a team thus far in 2026.

FINAL FIVE—Several Rays are within reach of notable accomplishments:

- ✦ **Chandler Simpson** (.309) trails HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (.314) by five points for the AL batting title...**Yandy Diaz** (2023) is the only Ray to pace the AL in average in team history...Simpson could become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title within their first two major league seasons and the third since 1942 alongside SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season - 2001) and Rays Hall of Famer BOS **Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season - 1983).
- ✦ Simpson leads the AL in singles (152), stolen bases (46), and is T2nd in triples (6)—only four players (5x) in the modern era (since 1900) have paced the AL or NL in all three categories over a full season: LAD **Maury Wills** in 1962, NYY **Snuffy Stirnweiss** in 1944, SLB **George Sisler** in 1922, and DET **Ty Cobb** in both 1917 and 1911 (Elias)...no Ray has ever paced the AL in singles, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have had the most three-baggers...Crawford (4x, last: 2007) and **José Caballero** (2024) are the only Rays to lead the league in steals.
- ✦ Caminero is tied for the AL lead with Alvarez at 41 home runs...he is attempting to join **Carlos Peña** (2009, 39HR) as the only Rays to earn at least a share of the AL home run crown...Peña's 39 bombs that season matched NYY **Mark Teixeira** for the Junior Circuit lead.
- ✦ **Bryan Baker** is tied for the major league lead with CLE **Cade Smith** with 40 saves...he is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47SV) as the only Ray to pace the majors in saves over a full season...he has converted 29 straight save opportunities and could become the 12th AL pitcher (13x) since saves became an official statistic in 1969 to record a streak of 30 consecutive saves or more within a single season and the second since 2017 along with CLE **Emmanuel Clase** (34) in 2024.
- ✦ Between **Junior Caminero** (HR), Simpson (SB), and Baker (SV), the Rays could become the third club since 1969 to have the league leaders (AL or NL) in homers, stolen bases, and saves on the same team, joining Cleveland in 1995 (HR - **Albert Belle**; SB - **Kenny Lofton**; SV - **Jose Mesa**) and Cincinnati in 1970 (HR - **Johnny Bench**; SB - **Bobby Tolan**; SV - **Wayne Granger**), according to Elias.
- ✦ The pitching staff leads the majors with a 1.13 WHIP, which would surpass the club record established in 2022 (1.15) and signal the lowest mark since the 2024 Mariners (1.08)...the Rays are attempting to post the majors' best WHIP for the third time, joining 2023 (1.18) and 2012 (1.17).

8-INNING GAMES—The Rays remain undefeated (83-0) when leading after the 8th inning...they are on pace to be the 16th team in the modern era (since 1900) to finish a season 83-0 or better when leading after eight innings...the last team to go 83-0 or better was the 2022 Mets (89-0) and the last AL club to turn the trick was the 2011 Tigers (83-0)...the last AL club to go 84-0 or better was the 2007 Angels (86-0)...dating back to 2025, the Rays have won a franchise-record 95 straight games when leading after the 8th frame and have not suffered a loss after entering the 9th with the lead since Aug. 27, 2025 at CLE...prior to this season, the longest streak in franchise history was 81 games between July 21, 2010–July 21, 2011.

TONIGHT'S STARTER—Mason Englert was recalled from Triple-A Durham earlier today and is scheduled to take the mound for his fourth start and 15th appearance of the campaign...marks his sixth career start and 87th career appearance...is in the midst of his fifth stint with the Rays this season, joining Opening Day—May 9, June 3-13, July 5-6, and July 17-18....was acquired from the Detroit Tigers for **LHP Drew Sommers** on Feb. 12, 2025.

★ He is seeking his first career victory after the All-Star break...has gone 5-4 over 68 appearances (three starts) before the Midsummer Classic compared to 0-3 in 18 outings (two starts) following the break.

RECENTS IN THE MINORS—Since being optioned to Triple-A Durham on July 18, he has gone 3-4 with a 3.83 ERA (49.1IP, 21ER), 55 strikeouts, a 1.24 WHIP, and a .268 (52-for-194) opp. average in nine appearances (eight starts).

★ In three starts with the Bulls this month, he has logged a 1-0 record with a 2.04 ERA (17.2IP, 4ER), 11 strikeouts, a 1.08 WHIP, and a .231 (15-for-65) opp. average.

★ In his most recent start on Sept. 15 at WOR, Englert fired 7.0 scoreless innings (7.0IP, 3H, 0ER, 2BB, 4SO), matching the longest outing of his professional career (3x, last: Aug. 11, 2022 at GVL, w/HIC) and marking his longest scoreless appearance.

LAST TIME OUT—Englert was dealt his third loss of the season after allowing season highs in hits (8) and runs (5) on July 17 at BOS [G2] (L, 5.0IP, 8H, 5ER, BB, 4SO, 3HR)...retired his first batter faced before surrendering three consecutive extra-base hits, including back-to-back home runs from **Wilyer Abreu** and **Willson Contreras**...escaped the 2nd frame allowing one baserunner, before another homer to Abreu to begin the 3rd inning, marking the first time in his career that he has allowed multiple home runs to the same player in an outing...gave up an RBI-single to **Anthony Seigler** in the 4th, extending the Red Sox lead to 5-3...recorded a 1-2-3 5th inning before handing the ball to **Craig Kimbrel** to begin the 6th.

★ He allowed a career-high three home runs...at the time, he was the fourth Ray to allow three home runs or more in an outing this season (also: **Griffin Jax**, **Steven Matz**, and **Shane McClanahan**)...since July 17, **Nick Martinez** (July 31 vs. CWS) and **Ian Seymour** (Aug. 20 vs. TOR) have joined this group.

BACK IN THE BIG APPLE—Across six career appearances (all in relief) against the Yankees, Englert has not factored into a decision and has produced a 7.50 ERA (6.0IP, 5ER), 1.17 WHIP, and .217 (5-for-23) opp. average...took the mound against New York-AL in relief earlier this season on April 12 at Tropicana Field, when he earned his first career save (SV, 1.0IP, 3H, 2ER, BB, SO, HR).

★ Against AL East foes this season, Englert is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (9.1IP, 7ER) in three appearances (one start)...across 21 career appearances (one start) against the division, he has gone 1-2 with a 6.00 ERA (33.0IP, 22ER).

★ Tonight's outing will mark his fourth career appearance at Yankee Stadium, where he has allowed 3 ER in 2.0 innings of work.

AWAY WE GO—Englert is making his 12th road appearance this season...in 45 career road appearances, he has gone 4-4 with a 5.09 ERA (81.1IP, 46ER) compared to a 1-3 mark with a 4.46 ERA (76.2IP, 38ER) in 41 career home outings...since making the Rays Opening Day roster in 2025, the right-hander is 0-2 and has posted a 4.37 ERA (45.1IP, 22ER) with 44 strikeouts across 25 road appearances (two starts).

★ Six of his last nine road outings (April 4–pres.) have been scoreless, logging a 3.00 ERA (24.0IP, 8ER) over that span.

ROLECALL—Despite beginning his minor league career as a starter, Englert has made only five career starts in the majors...in those contests, he has gone 0-3 with a 5.21 ERA (19.0IP, 11ER), five walks, and 18 strikeouts...over 81 career relief appearances, he has posted a 4.73 ERA (139.0IP, 73ER) with 36 walks and 115 strikeouts.

★ He is seeking his first career win as a starter tonight...he is 0-3 lifetime as a starter.

MAJOR LEAGUE RECAP—Englert is in the midst of his fourth major league season...in his first season with the Rays in **2025**, he recorded career bests in ERA (3.83), strikeouts (44), WHIP (1.21), and FIP (3.05), holding opponents to a .251/.299/.345 (43-for-171) clip—all three marks were the lowest of his career...had three stints in the majors after being acquired from the Tigers Feb. 12: Opening Day—May 9, June 10-16, and July 7–season's end...made his final appearance Sept. 3 at SEA and was placed on the 15-day IL Sept. 4 with right shoulder impingement.

★ Finished **2025**, his first season with the Rays, with 11 BB in 44.2 IP, good for a 5.9 pct. walk rate, 10th among AL relievers (min. 30.0IP)...was the only MLB pitcher to throw his changeup 200 times or more without allowing an XBH on the offering.

★ In **2024**, made 12 appearances (1 start) with the Tigers spanning three stints in the big leagues: May 23–June 4, June 5-25, and Aug. 26-29...was on the minor league injured list (right forearm strain) from July 6–Aug. 22...completed a four-game rehab assignment between Rookie-level Lakeland and Class-A West Michigan...designated for assignment Feb. 7, 2025 to accommodate **Jack Flaherty's** addition to the Tigers 40-man roster...traded to the Rays in exchange for **LHP Drew Sommers** Feb. 12.

★ In **2023**, made 31 appearances with Detroit in his first major league season...placed on the 15-day IL on July 23 with left hip tightness...completed a nine-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Toledo from Aug. 13–Sept. 6, but did not return to the majors...allowed one or zero runs in 24 of 31 outings...when he was placed on the injured list on July 24, his 18 multi-inning relief appearances led MLB...on March 30 at TB, made his major league debut, yielding a solo home run before retiring **Isaac Paredes**, **Randy Arozarena**, and **Luke Raley** in succession.
