**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Marlins, 8-3, last night...The Mets have outscored their opponents 90-63 in 18 games this month...New York is in a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day (7-6)...The Mets head out on their final road trip of the year, a seven-game trip (2-1) to Miami (2-1) and Philadelphia (four games)...New York is off on Monday before they conclude the 2023 schedule with a six-game home stand against the Marlins (three games) and Phillies (three games).

**RADIO GA GA:** Tonight's Mets game can be heard of WOR 710 AM...The New York Giants game will be broadcasted on WCBS 880 AM.

**SENGA GENESIS:** Kodai Senga recorded his 12th win of the season last night...His 12 wins are tied for the most in franchise history by a Japanese born player...Masato Yoshii also had 12 in 1999...He is 12-7 with a 2.96 ERA (53 ER/161.1 IP) with 74 walks and 194 strikeouts in 28 starts this season...His 2.96 ERA ranks fourth in the majors and second in the National League...His 2.96 ERA is the seventh-lowest by a Japanese-born pitcher in MLB history (min. 100 innings).

**STRIKE THAT:** Senga has recorded 194 strikeouts...That is the second-most strikeouts by a rookie in franchise history...His 194 strikeouts are tied for the seventh-most in the NL...With six more strikeouts, he would become the 13th pitcher in franchise history to record 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Jacob deGrom and Noah Syndergaard were the last pitchers to do so...Tom Seaver owns the franchise record with nine such seasons.

**TAKE IT TO THE BANK:** In 17 career games at Citizens Bank Park, Luis Guillorme is a .423 (11-26) hitter with three runs, one double, one triple, three RBI and four walks...Jeff McNeil has hit .308 (44-143) with 15 runs, 11 doubles, one triple, one homer, 10 RBI and 12 walks in 40 games at the yard...Brandon Nimmo has slashed .280/.422/.487 with 26 runs, six doubles, two triples, seven home runs and 17 RBI in 47 games in Philly...Pete Alonso has hit .245/.323/.469 with nine doubles and eight home runs in 37 contests at Citizens Bank Park.

**X MARK'S THE SPOT:** Mark Vientos recorded his first career multi-homer game last night...In 19 games since his return from the 10-Day IL, Mark Vientos is batting .279 (19-68) with 11 runs, one triple, five home runs, nine RBI, three walks with a .329 OBP and a .529 SLG...Over his last nine games, Vientos is bating .343 (12-35) with five runs, three home run, six RBI, one walk with a .361 OBP and a .600 SLG.

**DINGERS!** The Mets feature eight players who have recorded at least 10 home runs this year...The team record is 10 players with 10 or more home runs, done in 2017...The 2019 team featured nine players, while the 2007 and 2005 teams feature eight players as well...The Mets have socked 201 home runs this season...That is the fifth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The 2023 team became the fifth team in franchise history record 200 or more homers in a year...team's 201 home runs are the X-most in a single season in franchise history...They previous four years with 200 or more homers are: 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

**EL JEFF-E:** Jeff McNeil has safely reached base in 13 straight games, posting a .345 OBP in that span...In 47 games since the start of August, Jeff McNeil is batting .298 (56-188) with 29 runs, eight doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 19 RBI, eight walks with four steals, a .338 OBP and a .463 SLG...McNeil has an .850 OPS in 18 games this month, recording eight-extra base hits.

**GOT TO GO TO MO'S:** Ronny Mauricio has safely hit in 13 of his first 16 career games...He is batting .300 (18-60) with five runs, three doubles, one home run, seven RBI, five walks and six steals in his first 16 career games...He is one of five players in franchise history to record a hit in each of his first five career major league games.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo has safely hit in 19 of his last 21 games...Since August 28, Nimmo is batting .344 (31-90) with 14 runs, eight doubles, one triple, six home runs, 12 RBI, six walks with a .392 OBP and a .655 SLG...He has socked a career-best 24 home runs this season...Nimmo has recorded 63 RBI in 2023...His career-best is 64, which he recorded in 2022.

**STEAL THIS ALBUM:** The Mets lead the major leagues with a 90.3% success rate in stolen bases this season...The team has stolen 112 bases out of 124 attempts...It's the highest success rate in franchise history...The previous high was 82.3% which was accomplished in 2004.

**DOING THE SPLITS:** Brandon Nimmo is batting .296 with 45 runs, 14 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs, 36 RBI, 36 walks with a .374 OBP and a .478 SLG in 74 games on the road this season...This compares to a .247/.346/.452 slashline in 72 games at Citi Field...Francisco Lindor has posted a .281/.349/.520 slashline with 54 runs, 23 doubles, two triples, 15 home runs and 26 walks in 77 games on the road in 2023...He has posted a .213/.311/.375 slashline in 73 games at Citi Field...Pete Alonso is slashing .241/.345/.563 with 24 home runs and 53 RBI in 73 road games...He is batting .202/.302/.473 at Citi Field.

**I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ:** Over his last 27 games, DJ Stewart is batting .303 (30-99) with 17 runs, six doubles, 10 home runs, 23 RBI and a 1.028 OPS...In 50 games this year, Stewart is batting .264 (37-140) with 120 runs, eight doubles, 11 home runs, 26 RBI, 12 walks, a .342 OBP and a .557 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

**100:** Pete Alonso became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 492 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...He is second in the majors and in the NL with 114 RBI.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso has recorded his second season with 45 or more home runs, becoming the only player in franchise history to do so...He recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs...He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...He is tied for second in the majors and is tied for second in the National League with 45 home runs...Alonso's 191 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** The Syracuse Mets defeated the RailRiders, 14-3, last night...RHP Denyi Reyes excelled allowing only one run on two hits with one walk and struck out six in 6.0 innings of work...The Syracuse Mets recorded 13 hits in the win...Danny Mendick, Jonathan Arauz and Jose Peroza all recorded three RBI apiece in the victory.

**THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY:** On this day in 2001, in the first game played in New York since the attacks on 9/11, Mike Piazza hit a two-run homer in the eighth inning to put the Mets ahead, 2-1, against the Braves.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Fanned a career-high-tying 10 batters for the first time this season on September 15...Threw 5.2 innings in the Mets' 5-3 loss to the Reds at Citi Field...Allowed three runs on six hits while allowing just two walks.

**PHILADELPHIA FREEDOM:** Tonight, Peterson will make his eighth career appearance and seventh career start against the Phillies...Peterson owns a career 1-2 record against Philadelphia, posting a 4.83 ERA (17 ER/31.2 IP) over seven games (six starts)...Peterson last faced the Phillies in Philadelphia in Game 2 of the doubleheader on August 20, 2022, allowing three runs and striking out six over 4.2 innings.

**STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT:** In his last start, Peterson matched a career-high 10 strikeouts and reached double digit strikeouts for the first time this season...Peterson has had four 10 strikeout games in his career, and last struck out 10 batters on July 1, 2022 vs. Texas...Peterson is the third Mets pitcher to strikeout 10 or more batters in a game this season, behind Kodai Senga (five 10+ K games) and Max Scherzer (one 10+ K game)...Senga also struck out 10 batters in his start on September 14, the day before Peterson accomplished the feat.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** In his start on August 27, Peterson pitched a season-high 7.0 innings...Was the fourth time in his career that he has pitched 7.0 or more innings...Peterson has only gone deeper in a start once in his career, throwing 7.1 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay on May 14, 2023...In those starts, Peterson owns a 1-0 record.

**MAKIN' IT MAJOR:** Since returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson has pitched to a 2-2 record with a 3.39 ERA (23 ER/61.0 IP) in 17 games, 11 of which were starts.

**A MINUTE IN THE MINORS:** Peterson was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on April 29, was recalled on May 9, then optioned again on May 16...In his first start with Syracuse following his May 16 option, he dealt 8.0 shutout innings, allowed just two hits and struck out nine...For his effort, he as named International League Pitcher of the Week...All told, he has made seven starts for the Syracuse Mets this season...Has a 1-2 record with a 4.86 ERA (20 ER/37.0 IP).

**NEW YORK, NEW YORK:** Over 12 road outings (ten starts) this season, the southpaw has pitched to a 7.35 ERA (40 ER/49.0 IP)...This season, Peterson has pitched to a 3.18 ERA (18 ER/51.0 IP) in 13 home outings (nine starts).

**LETHAL LEFTY:** Peterson has limited lefties to a .238 (66-277) average in his career...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.

**SLIP 'N' SLIDE:** Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the third- highest in the majors behind only Díaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

**2022 RECAP:** Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (8-8, 4.94)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 5.2 innings in the Mets loss to the Reds at Citi Field on September 16...Allowed three runs (two earned) on nine hits while walking two and fanning two batters.

**A MINUTE IN THE MINORS:** Megill made six starts with Triple-A Syracuse after being optioned on June 22...The right-hander went 0-3 with an 8.67 ERA (26 ER/27.0 IP) over those six starts...Megill recorded two quality starts with Syracuse, July 9 at Worcester and July 29 at Lehigh Valley.
