Padres take 1st of 2-game series with 7-3 win over M's

- Fernando Tatis Jr. and Manny Machado both homered last night to help propel the Friars 7-3 over Seattle...Tatis hit his 1st home run since June 20 vs. MIL (3-run homer in the 3rd), and Machado hit a 2-run home run in the 6th for his 164th-career homer as a Padre, setting a new franchise record...Jurickson Profar logged a double, and Luis Arraez had his 3rd straight 3-hit game.
- Starter Yu Darvish got the win (now 5-3) after allowing 2 runs (earned) on 5.0 IP on 7 hits with 5 strikeouts.

Machado sets the franchise home run record

- Manny Machado's team-leading 26th home run of the season last night in the 6th inning was his 164th as a Padre, setting a new franchise record and besting Nate Colbert's previous record of 163.
- Discounting the Pandemic-shortened 2020 season, Machado has hit at least 26 HRs in 5 straight seasons since joining the Friars (2019, 2021-24)...even in 2020, he hit 16 home runs in 60 games for a career-best 14.00 PA/HR.

Padres smell a sweep

- The Padres were swept in 2 game by SEA in their 1st series from July 9-10 in SD, and tonight, they have the opportunity to sweep the M's in their 2 games at T-Mobile Park...a win today would be the Padres' 7th sweep of 2024 and their 1st since they won all 3 vs. PIT from August 12-14 at Petco Park.

Padres have MLB's best record since the AS break

- The Padres' 32-15 (.681) record since the break is the best in MLB...ranking 2nd are the D-backs (32-16, .667) and the Dodgers are 3rd (30-18, .625)...since the ASB, Padres batters have scored the 2nd-most runs of any MLB team (249) behind just the D-backs (306)...since the start of the 2nd half, the Padres have won 11 of their last 15 series.

The race is on

- Entering Tuesday, the Padres are 82-64 (.562), 2nd in the NL West behind the Dodgers by 4.5 games...in the NL Wild Card race, the 3 spots are led by the Padres and D-backs (81-64, .559), and the Mets (79-66, .545) and Braves (79-66, .545) are T-3rd.

DATE IN PADRES' HISTORY

Sept. 11, 1973 - The Padres lose 4-2 in 10 innings to the Houston Astros before 1,413 at San Diego Stadium - the smallest home attendance in franchise history.

Sept. 11, 1995 - In a 7-5 loss at Pittsburgh, the Padres tie a franchise record with five steals in one inning. Bip Roberts and Tony Gwynn each steal two bases and Ken Caminiti one in the ninth.

Sept. 11, 1996 - Switch-hitter Ken Caminiti sets a Major League record by homering from both sides of the plate for the fourth time in a single season.

- In the Padres' final week of the regular season, they'll face the Dodgers (September 24-26) and D-backs (September 27-29).

Luis Arraez has 3 hits in 3 straight games, hasn't struck out in 120 straight PA's

- Luis Arraez has 3 hits in each of his last 3 games, tying his career-long 3-hit game streak (August 6-10, 2022 with MIN)...he's the 1st Padre to have a 3+ hit streak of at least 3 games since Jake Cronenworth's 3+ hit streak (3 straight games in 2022), and the Padres' record for consecutive games with 3+ hits is Gene Richards' 4-game streak (July 11-14, 1980).
- Arraez also hasn't struck out since August 10 @ MIA, now riding a streak of 120 straight plate appearances without punching out...the last time a player went longer without striking out in a single season was Juan Pierre (147 PA's without striking out in 2004), and the Padres' franchise record is held by Tony Gwynn, who went 170 PA's without a strikeout in 1995.

A look ahead / logging those miles

- After Wednesday's game, the Padres will enjoy their 3rd of 5 off days in the month of September, (remaining off days are September 12th, 19th, and 23rd), and they will finish the month playing only in the Pacific Time zone with road series @SEA (Sept. 10-11), @SF (Sept. 13-15), @ LAD (Sept. 24-26), and @AZ Sept. (27-29).
- Per Baseball Savant, the Padres will travel the most miles of any team in MLB this year at 51,690 miles (largely in part because of their Korea Series to start the year against the Dodgers)...the Dodgers travel the 2nd most miles at 49,131, and the Mariners will be 3rd at 47,438 miles.

Pads 'pen since the start of September

- Since the start of September, the San Diego bullpen has the 2nd-best opponent average in the big leagues (.157), behind just the Brewers' 'pen (.125 clip)...they have a 2.84 bullpen ERA and 1.01 WHIP since Sept. 1st.

Merrill Madness!

- 21-year-old Jackson Merrill leads all MLB rookies in RBI (83), AVG (.287), SLG (.495), HR (23), and OPS (.815)...his 4.4 WAR (FanGraphs) leads all MLB rookies.

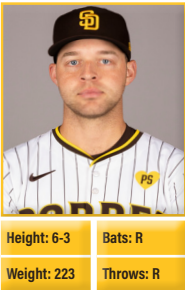

King set for 28th start of season, 2nd of career vs. SEA

29-year-old Michael King takes the mound for his 28th start of the season, his 15th on the road and the 2nd of his career (4th appearance) vs. SEA...he faced SEA earlier this season on July 10 at Petco Park, and allowed 1 ER on 3 hits and 1 walk with 9 SO across 6.0 IP...he was tagged with the loss despite the quality outing, getting 0 runs of support in SD's 2-0 defeat.

King gets 12th win of campaign, SD improves to 6-2 in his 8 second-half starts

The right-hander posted his 13th quality outing last Fri vs. SF, allowing 1 ER on 6 hits and 1 BB along with 8 SO in SD's 5-1 victory
SD is now 6-2 in his 8 second half starts, and he owns a 5-2 record with a 2.36 ERA, 1.16 WHIP and .216 opp. AVG since his July 21 start @ CLE.
The highlight of his 2nd half came on Aug. 13 in his 2nd consecutive start vs. PIT, fanning 10 batters without allowing a walk and becoming the 1st Padres' pitcher in 2024 to go 6.0 scoreless with double-digit strikeouts, 0 runs, and 0 walks allowed...he became the 9th Padres' pitcher in club history to have such an outing (Blake Snell did so twice in 2023 in his Cy Young season).

100+ pitch outings

7 of King's 8 career 100+ pitch outings have come this season, with his career-high 109 coming on April 17 @ MIL...his 93.7 pitches per game are 2nd-most among all SD hurlers and 12th-most among all qualifying NL hurlers.
King's seven 100+ pitch outings this season are 2nd-most on the SD staff, trailing Dylan Cease's 17 100+ pitch outings.

Home and away

In his 14 road starts, he owns a 7-3 record, 2.64 ERA (24 ER, 81.2 IP), including winning decisions in 4 consecutive road starts from June 29 @ BOS-July 27 @ BAL...the last SD hurler to earn a win in 4 straight road starts was Yu Darvish's 5 in a row from Aug 27-Sept 24, 2022.
The Padres have also won 5 of his last 6 road starts since June 29 @ BOS, and across his last 10 road starts since May 4, he's gone 6-1 with a 2.31 ERA, 1.11 WHIP and .218 opp. AVG.
In his 13 starts at home, he owns a 4-5 record with a 3.39 ERA (27 ER, 71.2 IP), 1.26 WHIP and a .225 AVG against in his home starts.

No-hit bids

King has taken 2 no-hit bids into the 7th inning this season...most recently, on July 21 @ CLE, King gave up a bloop single to center by Angel Martinez to lead off the seventh inning in SD's 2-1 victory
On April 17 @ MIL, he was hitless across his first 6.2 IP before giving up a 2-out single to Willy Adames, and he still had a shutout intact into the eighth before the Brewers finally broke through for a run and went on to post a 1-0 win in the series finale.

5th in starter ERA since start of 2023

Among all pitchers who have tossed at least 180.0 IP as a starter since the beginning of 2023, King's 2.83 ERA (61 ER, 193.2 IP) is 5th-lowest in the Majors, behind only Tarik Skubal (2.62 ERA), Blake Snell (2.70), Kyle Bradish (2.81) and Gerrit Cole (2.82).

King and Cease headline NL punchout leaders

Rotation-mate Dylan Cease (205 SO) and King (185) rank 2nd and 5th, respectively, in the NL among strikeout leaders...they are the only NL duo in the top 5 in punchouts, and they join Zack Wheeler (190, 3rd) and Aaron Nola (167, 8th) as the only other duo in the Top 10 in punchouts.

Best in baseball at limting the long ball since June 1

At the end of May, King had allowed 13 home runs in 12 appearances/11 starts (66.0 innings pitched), which were the most HR allowed in the NL and T-most homers allowed in the Majors at the time with TB's Tyler Alexander.
In June, King was 1 of just 5 Major League pitchers to allow 1 home run-or-fewer across at least 30.0 IP...since June 1, King joins Chris Sale as the only 2 hurlers to allow just 4 HR across at least 90.0 IP.

Doing his part

King's 14 separate outings allowing 1 ER-or-fewer across at least 5.0 IP are the most such starts on the SD staff and tie with Chris Sale for 2nd-most in the NL, trailing only Zack Wheeler (16).
King's 13 quality starts are 2nd-most on the SD staff, trailing only Dylan Cease's 14.

Putting the low in exit velo - 99th percentile

Entering today, Michael King's 85.4 exit velocity leads all Padres starting pitchers and ranks in the 99th percentile league-wide...the league-wide average exit velo is 88.5...he also ranks in the 97th percentile in hard-hit rate (30.3%), with the league-wide avg hard-hit % being 36.5%.

Tops in the NL in run support average

Despite receiving just 6 combined runs of support across his last 3 outings, King's 5.69 RSA ranks T3rd among all qualifying NL hurlers, also ranking T9th in the Majors.
After receiving 10 runs of support in SD's 11-1 win Sat, June 29 @ Fenway Park, King is the recipient of 3 of the 6 instances a Padre pitcher has gotten double digit runs of support this season (12 on March 31 vs. SF, 11 on May 4 @ AZ and 10 on June 29 @ BOS)...Matt Waldron's 13 on June 8 vs. AZ serves as the most an SD hurler has received in '24.

Among the leaders of the NL pack since May 4

King has gone at least 5.0 IP in 19 of his 21 starts since May 4, allowing 1 ER-or-fewer in 13 of the 21, including 0 runs 4 times...among all qualifying NL hurlers since May 4, he ranks 5th in HR/9 IP clip (0.52), 5th in ERA (2.54) and 9th in SO/9 IP ratio (10.81)...and that's including tying his career highs in hits (8) and ER allowed (6) on May 15, 2024 vs. COL.

First pitch damage

Opposing hitters are 29-74 (.392 AVG) on first pitches of an at-bat that get put in play, and his 6 HR T-10th most in the Majors in 0-0 counts that get put it play and his 19 RBI also T-8th most.

Tell us about the walks

Across his first 15 starts from March 31-June 18, he walked 3+ in 1/3 of his start (5/15) for a 3.63 BB/9 IP.
In his 12 starts since June 23, he has walked 2-or-fewer in 9 of the 12 (2.74 BB/9), including 1-or-fewer in 6 of the 12.

Change up swing and misses

King's changeup usage rate is up in 2024 with the Padres (25.0%) compared to his time with the Yankees (13.1%), and it has registered a 36.8% whiff rate that ranks 7th in the Majors (min. 500 total change ups thrown)...his .200 AVG (40-200) against his change up ranks 11th among all ML changeups (min. 500 thrown).

last app. 9/10 vs. SF (1.1 IP, 2 BB, SO) **current scoreless streak** 4.2 IP (5 G)
pitches: *Four Seamer (37.9%) Changeup (26.0%) Slider (20.6%) Sweeper (15.5%)*

- ▶ Scoreless in 18 of his 19 app for SD, owning a 3-0 record with 6 holds, 0.47 ERA, 0.63 WHIP and .141 opp. AVG as a Padre, including a 26-to-3 SO/BB ratio...SD is 15-4 in his 19 appearances.
- ▶ Owns a 38.9 whiff rate that ranks in the 99th percentile and 4th among all qualifying relievers.
- ▶ Also ranks in the 92nd percentile in K rate (30.5%), 87th in chase rate (33.1%), 91st in xBA (.203) and 87th in xERA (3.10).
- ▶ Since 2022, his 189 appearances are 15th most in the Majors...among the 19 relievers who have made 185+ app since '22, he ranks 1st in opponents' AVG (.161), 1st in WHIP (0.85), T1st in whiff rate (37.6%) 2nd in opp. OPS (.529), 2nd in ERA (2.11) and 2nd in base runners/9 (8.67).
- ▶ Blew his 1st SV and allowed all 3 IR from Cease to score in 4-3 win @ TB Sept 1...the only run he has allowed for SD came on Aug. 25 vs. NYM in SD's 3-2 win (solo HR from Mark Vientos)

last app. 6/26 vs. WSH (0.1 IP, 2 H, 4 ER, BB) **current scoreless streak** 0.0 IP (0 G)
pitches: *Sweeper (51.1%) Sinker (26.0%) Four Seamer (22.9%)*

- ▶ Recalled today (Wednesday) from Triple-A El Paso for his 4th stint with SD's big league squad this season...prior to today, was last recalled from ELP on Sept. 1 but was optioned back on Sept. 4 without making an appearance.
- ▶ Has yet to face Seattle this season, but in his 2 career appearances vs. the Mariners in 2023, he's allowed 2 hits and 1 run (unearned) in 1.1 innings.
- ▶ Optioned to ELP on April 30 after being scored upon in 6 of his 15 outings to start the season (10.50 ERA, 1.83 WHIP, .327 AVG)...recalled on June 21, and he allowed a combined 5 ER across 3 outings from June 21-26 (16.88 ERA, 2.63 WHIP, .462 AVG)...placed on the 15-day IL (left elbow inflammation) on June 28 before being reinstated on July 25 and sent back to ELP.
- ▶ Allowed multiple runs 4 times in his 18 outings for SD this season, including career highs in ER (6), hits (5) and home runs (2) on March 30 vs. SF...allowed 2 ER just 3 times in his 54 appearances during his rookie 2023 campaign...and his 3 HR so far in the Majors match his 3 long balls allowed in 2023.
- ▶ With SD this season, opp. are hitting .354 (14.11 H/9 IP), but his 86.6 mph average exit velocity is below the league average (88.5 mph).

last app. 9/10 @ SEA (1.0 IP) **current scoreless streak** 4.1 IP (5 G)
pitches: *Four Seamer (57.4%) Slider (22.7%) Split Finger (19.8%)*

- ▶ Posted his pen-leading 13th hold in SD's 7-3 win Tues night @ SEA.
- ▶ His 13.99 SO/9 IP ratio is 2nd-highest among all qualifying NL relievers and 3rd-highest in the Majors, trailing only PIT Aroldis Chapman (14.63) and OAK Mason Miller (14.45).
- ▶ His 37.3 K% ranks in the 99th percentile (MLB average is 22.2%)...also ranks in 98th percentile in whiff rate (37.8), 92nd in chase % (33.3%), 92nd in fastball velo (971), 93rd in xERA (2.76) and 95th in xBA (.197).
- ▶ Opponents are batting .198 (.200 xBA) against his 4-seamer (39 SO, 34.5 whiff %).
- ▶ Batters are .154 (.154 xBA) against his split finger, or as he has coined it, his "chitter", to go along with 33 SO and a 51.7 whiff rate.

pitches: *Sinker (50.1%) Slider (23.7%) Split Finger (19.8%) Four Seamer (6.5%)*

- ▶ Scoreless in 11 of his 13 appearances for SD, owning a 1-1 record with 1 HLD, 0.96 ERA, 0.80 WHIP and .172 AVG...SD is 9-4 in the 13 outings he's appeared in.
- ▶ In his 27 total relief outings this season (14 w/ MIA and 13 w/ SD), he has posted a 1.27 ERA (6 ER, 42.2 IP) as opposed to a 7.50 ERA (5 ER, 6.0 IP) in his 2 starts (both w/ MIA).
- ▶ His .180 opponents' AVG as reliever is T8th-lowest among qualifying NL relievers.
- ▶ Owns reverse splits this season, allowing just 2 XBH (1 2B, 1 HR) and a .131 AVG to LHH while RHH have 7 XBH (4 2B, 1 3B & 2 HR) at a .271 clip.
- ▶ Limiting opponents to a .159 clip (7-44) with RISP and a .091 clip (2-22) with RISP/2 out.
- ▶ Allowed his 1st HR as a Padre (Goldschmidt) and just his 3rd in '24 in SD's 7-5 win Aug 27 @ STL.
- ▶ The 27-year-old his career-best 14.1 consecutive scoreless IP streak across parts of 9 app snapped Sun, Aug. 18 @ COL...tagged with his 1st loss as a Padre and his 3rd of the season.

pitches: *Sinker (32.0%) Changeup (31.0%) Four Seamer (21.5%) Sweeper (15.5%)*

- ▶ Recalled from Triple-A El Paso Aug 31 for the 2nd time in '24...has thrown the top 2 most pitches and IP in each of his last 2 outings (48 across 3.2 IP Aug 31 @ TB & 44 across 2.2 IP Sun vs. SF).
- ▶ Allowed his 1st ML HR (solo to Curt Casali) Sun vs. SF, and has allowed just 1 HR to the 59 big league hitters he's faced (0.57 HR/9).
- ▶ His other stint with the ML club in '24 came from July 28-Aug 8, and he is scoreless in 6/9 ML app dating back to '23 (2.30 ERA, 0.64 WHIP, .132 AVG against), including a 23-to-3 SO/BB ratio.
- ▶ Opponents are hitting .200-or-fewer against all 4 of his pitches
- ▶ At the time of his most recent call-up, his 42 app were 3rd-most in the Chihuahuas pen this season...across his last 18 Triple-A app since June 20, he owns a 2-1 record with a 2.70 ERA, 11.2 SO/9 IP ratio and .224 AVG against.

YUKI MATSUI

last app. 9/7 vs. SF (1.0 IP, H, 2 ER, BB, 2 SO, HR) **current scoreless streak** 0.0 IP (0 G)
pitches: *Four Seamer (41.2%) Slider (26.6%) Split Finger (25.1%) Sweeper (6.2%) Curveball (1.0%)*

- ▶ His 61 appearances lead the SD pen and are 4th-most among all ML rookies...he's 2 appearances shy of matching Nick Martinez's pen-leading 63 from 2023, and 3 shy of matching Luis Garcia's pen-leading 64 form 2022.
- ▶ Limiting RHH to a .195 clip while LHH are batting .209, but 5 of his 8 HR allowed have come against RHH.

- Underwent Tommy John surgery in 2019 and converted from a starter to a reliever.
- During the COVID season, he worked for DoorDash for a couple of weeks...it was mostly due to boredom, Tom said, but he's admittedly bad at directions.
- His parents and his sister have gone to most of his games since he was about 12...his mom can't watch him pitch, however, because she gets too nervous.

CRONENWORTH, JAKE

- Hails from St. Clair, Mich., which is an hour's drive north of Detroit. The closest movie theater is 12 miles north.
- Resides in Chicago (his favorite city) in the offseason.
- Is childhood friends with NHL player Tyler Motte (Tampa Bay Lightning).
- Lost his mother to brain cancer when he was four years old. His grandparents, Charles and Lorraine Cronenworth, helped raise Jake and older brother, Charlie.
- During his breakout rookie 2020 campaign, someone added "the Crone Zone" to Google Maps, located in the right field bleachers at Petco Park. According to Google, it's open 24 hours a day.
- His grandfather, Charles, played ice hockey at Michigan Tech and signed with the New York Rangers before serving in WWII.
- Jake's father, Charles, also played ice hockey at Michigan Tech, and his older brother, Charlie, also played collegiality at Northwood University...Jake also grew up playing ice hockey.
- Jake attended he University of Michigan, which he describes as the "greatest university in the world."
- At one point, played on the same travel baseball team (East Coast Grays) as Pete Alonso.
- His grandmother would make cookies for his travel team and eventually Michigan's baseball program. There is a bench at the Little League field where Jake played that is named after her...she threw out the 1st pitch of one of Jake's short-season New York-Penn League games.
- When he was drafted, Major League Baseball called him "Jake," but he had only gone by "Jacob" growing up. Now, he usually goes by Jake, but his teammates often call him "Jacob."
- He and his fiance, Brooke Fletcher, announced their engagement in May of 2024...Fletcher is on-air talent for Apple TV+, Bally Sports, and the Big Ten Network, and she co-hosts the Bally Sports show The Rally and previously covered the Detroit Tigers, Detroit Red Wings, and Detroit Pistons for Bally Sports Detroit...her father is Scott Fletcher, who played 15 seasons in MLB including his final season for Tigers in 1995.
- Loves coffee and has a partnership with Achilles Coffee, a local San Diego roaster...has his own coffee roast, called the "#9 Blend."

DARVISH, YU

- Is honored with a museum in Hyogo, southern Japan. The Space11 Darvish Museum opened in November of 2013. The museum features roughly 100 items related to Yu Darvish. The museum includes the glove and uniform from Darvish's no-hitter in 2004 and a computer graphics system that allows visitors to virtually hit against him.
- Says he throws 11 different pitch types: four-seam fastball,

two-seam fastball, hard cutter, slow cutter, two different sliders, hard curveball, slow curveball, changeup, splitter, and supreme (somewhat of a cross between a splitter and a two-seamer).

- His father, Farsad Darvishsefat, is Iranian, and his mother, Ikuyo, is Japanese. Yu' grandfather sent Farsad to the United States to study in 1977, shortly before the Shah of Iran was deposed. Farsad once worked in the cafeteria at the Seattle Seahawks' training camp, and he met Yu's mom, Ikuyo, at Eckerd College in St. Petersburg, Florida. They married and moved to Japan, where Yu was born.

- According to Japanese law, citizens must choose a singular nationality before turning 22. Darvish chose Japanese, partly so he could play for Japan in the World Baseball Classic.

- Yu is married to Seiko, who is one of Japan's most accomplished and famous female wrestlers. She has since coached the sport.

- Yu sometimes likes to throw left-handed while warming up to help his balance. He has said that he can throw 82 mph lefty.

- In 2012, was named GQ Man of the Year by the Japanese issue of GQ Magazine.

- Donates money to a number of causes, including natural disaster relief, ALS (Lou Gehrig's disease) and clean water for developing countries. Much of his money goes to various causes, and Yu credits his father for teaching him that as a kid, starting when his father's native Iran suffered an earthquake and Darvish donated his allowance money to the cause.

- He established the Yu Darvish Water Fund in 2007 to supply safe water to people who face water shortages and contamination of water in developing countries, and he donates 100,000 JPY for every win he records.

- In 2021, as he walked to the plate in his 1st at bat against the Cubs since being traded to San Diego, he used the walk up song "Intoxicated" by Martin Solveig & GTA. It was the same walk up song as Anthony Rizzo's at Wrigley Field.

- His full name is Sefat Farid Yu Darvish, and his Twitter handle is @faridyu. He has almost 3 million followers on "X," and he is quite active. Once, the Cubs made a t-shirt based on one of his tweets: "Eat Fried Chicken Until Death."

- Former Kansas City Royals manager, Trey Hillman, who was Darvish's first pro skipper, called him the "Elvis of Japan."

DÍAZ, ELIAS

- Son of Ana Soto and Porfirio Díaz...in the 2023 All-Star game at T-Mobile Park, was named the All Star Game MVP after his game-winning home run, and postgame, Elias was emotional in talking about his mom...said Díaz: "It was incredibly special for me to have her here, a lot of emotions with everything that we've been through, all the sacrifices that she made for me."
- Díaz older brother, Emison Soto, played 4 seasons in the Red Sox organization and for various other independent and international teams...credits his brother with helping to push his sports career forward and working to make him a professional ballplayer.
- Is married to Katherine Delgado, and they have two children, Eliana and Elanie Díaz.
- The native of Maracaibo, Venezuela resides in Venezuela in the offseason...over the years, he has provided food, shoes, and supplies for schools...said Elias, "I want to help people that don't have money, that don't have opportunities. And it's from my heart."
- His favorite athlete as a kid was Ivan Rodriguez.
- Was signed by the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2008 at the age of 17.
- His father is of Colombian decent, and he played for Team Colombia in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.

ESTRADA, JEREMIAH

- Grew up in Palm Desert, California and attended Palm Desert High School.
- Underwent Tommy John surgery in 2019...was claimed off waivers by San Diego from the Cubs on November 6, 2023.
- Enjoys playing video games...when he set a new Major League Expansian-Era record for striking out 13 straight batters (in May of 2024 with the Padres), he said, "I feel like I just got done playing a video game and I finally accomplished a mission that I have been trying to go at for so long."
- Says he doesn't really enjoy watching sports very often.
- Starting in high school, he had a very specific throwing routine, and he kept lists of the exact number of stretches and the exact number of long tosses to throw...keeps a very detailed daily journal of everything he does relating to pitching while he's home.
- In '23, spent time in AZ working on a split-fingered changeup that he calls a "chitter" with Cubs pitching coordinator Tony Cougoule...continued to refine the pitch prior to the '24 season.

HIGASHIOKA, KYLE

- Graduated from Edison HS (in Huntington Beach, CA) in 2008.
- Married to Alyse Higashioka.

ADAM, JASON

- He and his wife, Kelsey, have 4 daughters: Kinsley, Joelle, Selah, and Raelynn...his wife played a vital role in turning him into the epitome of a "girl dad," a term coined by NBA legend Kobe Bryant.
- Was born in Omaha, Nebraska, and attended Blue Valley Northwest High School in Overland Park, Kansas.
- His family was able to attend the 2023 World Baseball Classic, where he did not allow a run while tying for the Team USA lead in appearances (4)...Jason kept as much memorabilia from the experience as he could, including a team-signed jersey.
- Began his career with the Kane County Cougars...after the canceled 2020 season, the team was cut from the Midwest League as part of MLB's reorganization of the minor leagues...are now part of the American Association, an independent MLB Partner League.
- 2024 is his 2nd stint in the SD org...was signed by San Diego to a minor league deal on July 20, 2017...pitched 2.0 scoreless innings for the Double-A San Antonio Missions, and appeared in 7 games for the AZL Padres before he was released on August 14, 2017.

ARRAEZ, LUIS

- Luis and his wife, Gladys, live in Doral, FL with their three daughters: Emma, Esther, and Esthela.
- Luis' parents came to the U.S. from Venezuela during the final homestand of the 2023 season to see Arraez play in the Major Leagues for the first time. His father, Ernesto, spoke about his early hitting lessons with Luis at 2 years old where he would tie a ball to a mango tree in their backyard where he taught him to hit the ball to the opposite field.
- Was named a finalist for the 2023 Luis Aparicio Award, given to the league's best Venezuelan player.
- Some of his favorites musicians are El Alfa, Gilberto Santa Rosa, and Antony Santos. His favorite type of dance is Merengue. Also likes salsa.His favorite Venezuelan food is arepas.

BOGAERTS, XANDER

- When former Red Sox scout Mike Lord visited Aruba for a tryout in the summer of 2009, a 16-year-old Xander was sick with chicken pox and a fever. His mom gave him strict orders to stay in bed, but she agreed to lift the mandate for one day, thanks to persuading from Xander's uncle. After an impressive showing at the tryout, Xander and his twin brother, Jair, signed with the Red Sox and paid off the mortgages on their mother's and uncle's houses.
- Wears number 2 because of Derek Jeter.
- Is an avid soccer fan. On the day of his introductory press conference in San Diego on December 9, 2022, he was distracted by the Netherlands vs. Argentina match in the FIFA Quarter Finals in Qatar (they tied 2-2).
- His twin brother, Jair, also played in the Red Sox org. Both Xander and Jair signed with Boston out of Aruba in 2009. In 2012, Jair was traded to the Cubs to finalize the compensation for Theo Epstein.
- He and Jair learned baseball from their uncle, Glenroy Brown. Xander would use a broomstick to hit almonds that grew in the family's backyard.
- Is 1 of only 6 Aruban-born players in MLB history. In the 2013, '18, and '23 World Baseball Classics, he played for the Netherlands. He was knighted in 2011 by the governor of Aruba after helping Netherlands win a gold medal in the IBAF Baseball World Cup.

CAMPUSANO, LUIS

- Has two French bulldogs, Cookie and Pablo.
- Committed to Missouri before signing with the Padres in '17.
- His father, Genaro Campusano, was born in the Dominican Republic and played parts of five seasons between the Pirates and Rangers organizations.

CEASE, DYLAN

- Has a twin brother, Alec.
- Is an avid frisbee golf player...co-owns and operates frisbee golf businesses in both Tuscaloosa, Ala. and Brooksville, Fla.
- He and his father took up beekeeping in Georgia during the COVID-19 pandemic and now produces raw honey... when the Padres played the Braves in Atlanta in May of 2024, he and his dad harvested bee honey, and he brought in dozens of jars for his teammates and coaching staff.
- Graduated in 2014 from Milton (Ga.) High School...was a pre-season First Team All-American entering his senior season after going 9-0 with a 0.81 ERA (69.1 IP) and 100 strikeouts as a junior...required Tommy John surgery during his senior year.
- In 2022, took up painting with acrylics, and he does it periodically as a creative, theraputic outlet.
- On July 25, 2024 @ WSH, Cease became the 2nd Padre to ever throw a no-hitter, joining Joe Musgrove (April 9, 2021 @ TEX)...prior to his no-no, Cease had 1 instance in his career in which he was 1 out shy of a no-hitter (Sept. 3, 2022 vs. MIN), which was broken up by now-teammate Luis Arraez...after Dylan got the final out, Arraez asked Bryce Johnson for the ball to hand to Dylan on the field.

FRIAR FACTS

- His father, Ted, is a third-generation Japanese American, and Kyle learned Japanese to better communicate with former teammate Masahiro Tanaka...also learned Spanish to better communicate with Spanish-speaking teammates.
 - Missed all of 2014 after undergoing Tommy John surgery.
 - Took classes in mechanical engineering at Orange Coast College during the 2017 offseason.
 - Partnered with the Special Operations Warrior Foundation (SOWF) in 2021 and 2023 to auction game-used gear to support the families of fallen soldiers...SOWF provides support to the surviving children of Special Operations personnel who lose their lives in the line-of-duty and provides grants to severely combat-wounded and hospitalized Special Operations personnel and their families...the raffle has featured Higashioka's game-worn custom Memorial Day spikes, full catchers gear and mask, commemorative, game-used Armed Forces Day and Team USA gear and other specialty game-worm items from the Memorial Day weekend series.
 - Was named the Yankees' nominee for the 2021 Roberto Clemente Award, his first career nomination...following the 2021 season, was tabbed by the New York Chapter of the BBWAA as the winner of the Ben Epstein/Dan Castellano "Good Guy" Award.
 - Is an avid supporter of the MLB Urban Youth Academy in Compton, California — which he is a proud alumni of.
 - In his off day in D.C. on July 22, 2024, Kyle accepted a replica of the Congressional Gold Medal at the US Army Museum in honor of his grandfather, G. Shigeru Higashioka, who served in the 100th Infantry Battalion of the 442nd Regimental Combat Team in World War II...the Congressional Gold Medal is one of the country's highest civilian honors, and G. Shigeru Higashioka fought for the United States from 1943-45, and he did so as a Nisei Soldier -- one of many Japanese Americans who fought for the United States, in spite of turmoil for their families at home...while G. Shigeru served, the rest of the Higashioka family was placed in an incarceration camp in Salinas, California. "It was a really cool experience, just learning more about my grandfather's time in the war," Higashioka said. "Because before this year, I didn't really know much at all."
- HOEING, BRYAN**
- Attended Batesville High School in Batesville, Indiana, where he played baseball and basketball...was named All-State in Illinois as a high school basketball player and selected as a 2014 Under Armour All-American at Batesville HS.
 - Played 3 years at the University of Louisville, where he held a 3.24 ERA in 57 appearances.
 - Was selected in the 32th round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft by Arizona, but opted to go to college...was selected by San Francisco in the 36th round of the 2018 Draft, but returned to college...was drafted for a 3rd time by the Marlins in the 7th round of the 2019 Draft from University of Louisville (KY).
 - Grew up a Reds, Colts, and Pacers fan.
 - His mom, Donna, played college basketball at Ball State...his cousin, Alex Meyer, was a 1st round selection of the Nationals in the 2011 Draft and played in MLB for the Twins and Angels.
- JACOB, ALEK**
- Grew up a Mariners' fan in Spokane, Washington. Also was a Gonzaga fan, and he eventually attended the university, throwing the program's 5th no-hitter on April 16, 2021 vs. Pepperdine...he was the 5th Bulldog since 1960 to toss a no-hitter--and the first in 30 seasons. The previous four were also drafted in MLB's 1st Year Player draft the following June after their no-no's...he became the 28th former Gonzaga player to reach the show...
 - Parents are Susie and Scott...has a sister named Natalie and a brother named Dominic.
 - When he was in high school, Jacob adjusted his arm slot every season...sophomore year was about 25% sidearm and 75% over the top. By his senior season, he was 80%-90% sidearm.
- JOHNSON, BRYCE**
- Born in Cypress, Texas, about a half-hour drive from downtown Houston.
 - Attended Cypress Ranch High School...in addition to baseabl, he also was a wide receiver on the football team...MaxPreps named him to the 2013 Texas 5A All-District Football First Team.
 - Attended Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas, playing for the Sam Houston State Bearkats, and he began switch-hitting in his sophomore year in college.
 - In 2016, played collegiate summer baseball with the Falmouth Commodores of the Cape Cod Baseball League.
 - Played 3 seasons at Sam Houston State where he helped the Bearkats reach their first NCAA Division I Super Regional...named to the NCAA Lubbock All-Tournament Team after hitting .353 (6-for-17) with 4 RBI in 2017...his 67 career steals were fourth-most in program history.
- KIM, HA-SEONG**
- When he was first signed by the Padres, Chan Ho Park and Kim would talk almost daily.
 - Is the youngest of 3, and he was out of the house and staying in a dorm with fellow baseball players by middle

- school.
- His helmet constantly falls off when batting, running, etc...said Kim, "I think that the head of (Korean) people is kind of more wide, more sideways. I think people here are more front and back"...says he tried all the helmets in the clubhouse, in the storage room, and had helmets customized numerous times...he still hasn't found the perfect fit...Jake Cronenworth suggested he get a chin strap.
 - Loves different baseball uniforms, and he started playing baseball as a kid because he loved his school's baseball uniform...students at his school would dress normally for class, but if you played baseball, you would go to school with their jersey, belt, and hat.
 - He thinks his mom's cooking is the best in the world. She lives with him in San Diego, and said Kim, "I can cook...but why would I cook if I have the best chef in my house?"...his favorite meal is Kimchi jjigae (kimchi soup/ kimchi stew).
 - When he plays third base when Manny Machado gets an off day, he is called (and calls himself) "Kimchado."
 - From the KBO, loved the chanting and cheering from fans, when they would sing an existing song but change the lyrics. "They will sing (the player's) name in the lyrics," he said...in regard to the Padres' fans, he said, "Fans just give me motivation...it's 100 percent love from the fans...the chants, it's just a blessing."
 - Because of his baseball accomplishments, he was allowed to swap out the two years of military service demanded of all able-bodied South Korean men for essentially four weeks of basic training and nearly 600 hours of baseball instruction. Had previously completed the basic training. But his baseball endeavors had prevented him from completing his community service hours until after the 2021 season. Kim toured schools Monday through Saturday in the offseason, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., for three months straight.
 - On a zoom call when introduced to the media, Ha-Seong made a statement in English: "Hello everyone. I am Ha-Seong Kim of the San Diego Padres. Nice to meet you all."
 - Played on the 2023 South Korea World Baseball Classic team.
- KING, MICHAEL**
- Was born in New York but grew up in Rhode Island...graduated from Bishop Hendricken (R.I.) High School, where he was named the 2013 Rhode Island Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior.
 - His mom, Michelle, was a Yankees fan, and his father, Jim, was a Red Sox fan...when Michael grew up, he was a Red Sox fan, but when he was eight, his dad got him and Michael tickets to Game 5 of the 2003 ALCS between the Yankees and Red Sox at Fenway Park...the game was scheduled for a Monday but was delayed because of a previous rainout...his dad had to work, however, and his mom took Michael...after seeing how much she loved the Yankees and experiencing the game, Michael would be a Yankees fan from that moment on...his dad had even given Michael 20 dollars to buy a souvenir at the game, and Michael bought a Yankee hat with the money. Complicating matters even further, Michael attended Boston College, from which he was drafted by the Marlins in 2016...King eventually was traded to the Yankees, and he made his debut with them on Sept. 27, 2019.
 - On June 18, 2023 on the Father's Day broadcast, ESPN was on Sunday night baseball when they spoke with King (out in the bullpen) via headset...his dad Jim, a surprise guest for Michael, asked his son "Hey, so I heard your dad was a big Red Sox fan, and you were too, until you were about 8 years old. What happened?"
 - In 3 seasons with Boston College (2014-16), went 11-11 with four saves and a 3.14 ERA (73 ER, 209.1 IP) in 47 games (27 starts)...his 314 career ERA ranks second all-time at Boston College.
 - His father, Jim, started GaGa brand ice cream back in Rhode Island...in the late 1990's, he was a weekend morning news anchor for WGST...in Sept. 2005, became a producer and reporter with WXIA-TV Atlanta, and in 2021, King moved from WXIA to Atlanta television station WUPA as a digital media strategist.
 - His sister Olivia is a songwriter and performer, and in his junior year at Boston College, she gave him a Christmas present by writing a song "Messin' With The King"...she wrote it and sings the chorus, and Michael used it with the Yankees as his warm-up song prior to his outings.
 - Didn't think he was fit to be a starter when he first arrived in the big leagues. Says he basically had just a sinker and command of a changeup. He didn't have four-seamer, nor a slider. Corey Kulber taught Michael his slider. He calls it the "Kluber ball." It became one of his best pitches the last couple of years.
 - 10 days after the Padres/Yankees trade went down, he married his now-wife, Sheila, on December 16, 2023 at the The Pierre Hotel on Fifth Avenue and Central Park in New York. "It was like our going away party," King said. "And we had a freaking blast." Coincidentally, in January, he and Sheila attended another wedding in San Diego. While he was there, he threw a bullpen and attended the team's pitchers camp.
- MACHADO, MANNY**
- Married to Yainee, who is the sister of former Padres' 1st baseman Yonder Alonso...they married in the offseason in 2014 in Angers, France, right outside of Paris...the couple welcomed their 1st child in April of 2024.

- Yonder, whom Manny considers one of his best friends, introduced Manny to Yainee in 2009, when the three of them went to lunch one day after classes at the University of Miami...Yonder had taken Manny under his wing, and while they were training for the season together, Manny and Yainee became friends...in 2011, Yonder invited Manny to join them on a family vacation in Spain, and it was at that time when Yainee and Manny started dating.
 - Enjoys playing chess, which he learned in 2017 from Brady Anderson, former player and Orioles executive...he keeps a board on a small table between his locker and his clubhouse neighbor, Fernando Tatis Jr., and he has another board in the nearby players' lounge...plays at home during the winter with his father-in-law, Luis Alonso (father of Yonder Alonso).
 - When he was 17, ate empanadas with then-teammate Bryce Harper while in Barquisimeto, Venezuela with the 2009 under-18 U.S. National Team for the Pan Am junior world championships. "Crushed them," Machado said.
 - Graduated from Brito Miami Private High School and was drafted 3rd overall by the Orioles in 2010.
 - Manny's grandfather, Francisco Nuñez, had the largest impact on his passion for baseball...he passed away during his senior year of high school and Machado writes his initials (FN) in the infield dirt as he takes the field every game.
 - He and Yainee have a dog, Kobe (named after Kobe Bryant).
 - A minority owner of San Diego FC, the 30th expansion team for Major League Soccer (announced on May 18, 2023).
- MATSUI, YUKI**
- Married to Anna Ishibashi, and they have two sons.
 - Posted a 2.40 ERA over 10 seasons in Japan with the Tohoku Rakuten Golden Eagles...in the last 3 seasons, shifted to a 1.0-inning relief role, posting a 1.42 ERA with 214 strikeouts in 152 IP.
 - Was selected to the Japan national baseball team at the 2013 18U Baseball World Cup, 2015, 2015 WBSC Premier12, 2017 World Baseball Classic, and 2023 World Baseball Classic.
 - When he met with the media for the first time in 2024 Spring Training, he introduced himself in Japanese, English, and Spanish.
- MCCOY, MASON**
- He and his wife, Cassandra, the couple have two children - Mateo Harley and Zaela Dawn.
 - Born in Peoria, Illinois, and at Washington Community High School (IL), lettered in baseball, basketball and soccer, while earning all-conference honors in basketball and soccer.
 - For a year during high school, he "tassled," corn to earn extra money...for corn crops, farmers sometimes remove the tassel from some corn plants in a process called "detasseling," allowing them to control pollination and ensure that one variety of corn pollinates another...he would go and walk through the corn fields and pull the tassels off the top of the corn...he would start at 4:00 am and would be done by noon.
 - Played for Illinois Central College from 2013-15...spent his junior and senior collegiate seasons at the University of Iowa (2016-2017).
- MERRILL, JACKSON**
- Parents are Josh and Jennie Merrill, both school teachers...his dad, Josh, coached many of Jackson's teams as he grew up.
 - Attended Severna Park High School in Maryland...despite living 30 minutes from Camden Yards, he grew up a Red Sox fan (because his dad, Josh, was a Red Sox fan), and his favorite player was Dustin Pedroia...grew up watching teammate Xander Bogaerts.
 - On June 28, 2024, he played in his 1st game at Fenway Park, and he hit a 3-run home run to CF...the ball landed about 20 feet from where Jennie was watching her son play from the center field bleachers. "That was probably the dopest moment of my baseball career, because I've watched so many games here," said Jackson.
 - Made his MLB Debut in Korea at 20 years old, becoming the youngest player to ever make his MLB debut outside the US or Canada...since his parents couldn't make the trip to Korea, they watched the game apart, in their respective classrooms.
 - The Merrill's have a family charity called Merrill Madness, in which a portion of every shirt sold is donated to the family of a youth baseball player to help with the cost of travel expenses.
 - The Orioles' Jackson Holliday (MLB Pipeline's No. 1 prospect), Brewers' Jackson Chourio (MLB Pipeline's No. 2 prospect) and Merrill (No. 12) each made their MLB debuts in 2024...the "Jackson 3" also happens to be the youngest trio of players in the Majors...Jackson is the oldest of the 3.
 - Enjoys basketball, ping pong, and darts...favorite food is Hibachi (Japanese for "fire bowl.")
 - Became the 1st Padre rookie to ever be named to an All-Star team (and the youngest Padre ever).
 - Jackson returned home to Baltimore on July 26, when the Padres visited Camden Yards to play the Orioles.

FRIAR FACTS

MOREJON, ADRIAN

- Native of La Habana, Cuba...played for the Cuban national baseball team in the 2014 15U Baseball World Cup, and he was named the tournament's most valuable player.
- Relocated to the Dominican Republic in 2015, and he was declared a free agent by MLB in July 2016.
- Signed by the Padres in 2016 at 17 years old as the top pitching prospect in the 2016-17 international class.
- Underwent Tommy John surgery in April of 2021.

MUSGROVE, JOE

- Grew up 15 miles northeast of Petco Park in El Cajon, where he attended Grossmont High School. After his no-hitter on April 9, 2021 in Arlington, TX, a mural was painted on an wall at Grossmont High of Joe in his uniform with the script "Meant to be..."
- Wears No. 44 in honor of his favorite pitcher growing up, Jake Peavy...in January of 2023, started a camp in San Diego called "Camp 44." In it's inaugural year, 20 pitchers and catchers gathered in San Diego for a non-mandatory pre-spring minicamp...Padres clubhouse and equipment manager TJ Laidlaw thought of the name, which stuck.
- Joe was a seasonal Costco employee in 2012 to make extra money when we was in the minor leagues. On September 13, 2022, a few local Costco employees went to the Padres' game in Seattle and made a blown up name badge sign for Joe.
- His sister, Terra, has homemade baked goods for the Padres players and staff members on the days in which Joe starts. When Joe signed his 5 year extension on August 1, 2022, Terra tweeted "The Padres just signed me to a 5 year baked goods extension."
- When Joe was 15, his father, Mark, contracted Guillain-Barré syndrome - a syndrome in which the body's immune system attacks its nerves.
- Was recruited by Tony Gwynn Sr. at San Diego State before deciding to sign with the Blue Jays in the 1st round (46th overall) of the 2011 Draft. Through the college recruitment process, he developed a relationship with Gwynn. Said Joe: "He always told me that your family should always come first in whatever you do, that what I was going through was not easy at my age, but the things that I was going through — not as a baseball player but as a man growing up and trying to mature — was something that he valued extremely. He was a guy that I was able to reach out to throughout my high school career if I had questions about stuff. Baseball, life, anything. He was always there for me."
- On April 9, 2021 at Globe Life Field, made Padres history by throwing the 1st no-hitter in franchise history. "Part of it doesn't seem like it's real," Musgrove said. "It feels like it was meant to be." He had 11-12 bottles of water throughout the game, but due to his routine, he wouldn't allow himself a bathroom break.
- His parents own and operate a coffee shop, Caffe' Adesso, in the San Diego suburb of Apline. The shop saw an unprecedented amount of business following Joe's no-hitter.
- Also following the no-hitter, Ballast Point Brewing gifted him a lifetime supply of beer and he collaborated with Resident Brewing to create his own beer, the No-No Joe Double IPA.

- Lines up bubble gum that he chews and spits out between each inning of a start.
- Was the originator of the Padres Polaroid celebration...there's a wall in the Padres' clubhouse in the hallway leading to the field where all their pics from the season are posted....he got the idea when he went camping in the 2021 offseason with his girlfriend, and they took a Polaroid camera with them...they would take pictures of fellow campers and hikers and gift the shots to them.
- Is obsessed with coffee and has a coffee station by his locker with a Chemex (a manual pour-over style glass coffee maker).
- Has a dog, Theo, and on May 14th, the Padres have a Joe & Theo bobblehead night, featuring Joe holding a cup of coffee in his bucket hat with Theo by his side...when Joe was selected to the 2022 All-Star game in Los Angeles, he brought Theo with him...in the game, he pitched with a glove that had the outline of Theo embroidered on the black glove with "Theo" stitched on.

PERALTA, DAVID

- Started playing baseball at 3 years old at the encouragement of his father, who worked for Bridgestone Tires for almost 40 years...played with Major Leaguers Felix Doubront, Alex Torres and Yangervis Solarte growing up...his favorite player growing up was fellow Venezuelan Johan Santana.
- He and his wife, Jordan, had their first child, Sofia, on Aug. 14, 2017, David's 30th birthday...their second daughter, Isabella, was born March 19, 2020.
- Was motivated to learn English after meeting Jordan, in Jupiter, Florida...he initially took friends out on their dates to help with the language barrier, but he was worried his friend would flirt with her, so he was motivated to learn English quickly.
- Signed with STL as a pitcher at 17 in 2004 for about \$35,000...pitched in 27 games from 2005-07 before moving to the outfield.
- Had a mid-90's fastball and a good "12-to-6" breaking ball before his first shoulder (labrum) surgery...got hurt again and thought his baseball dream was over...was released on Cinco de Mayo in 2009 and hasn't liked that holiday ever since...asked the Cardinals to allow him to stay for

2 weeks after being released so he could see his wife graduate from college.

- After being released by the Cardinals, his parents persuaded him to try hitting again...1st played in a government-run independent league in Venezuela...he went back to the United States, without an agent, and was given the number of Eduardo "Eddie" Dennis, who managed the independent Rio Grande Valley WhiteWings...Peralta rented a car and drove to practice and was signed after his hitting session.
- Worked at McDonalds for gas money to drive to Texas to play with Rio Grande...slept on an air mattress in his first season with the WhiteWings...garnered interest from the Rays and Angels before signing with the D-backs in 2013...Arizona scout Chris Carminucci wanted him to come to Phoenix for a tryout in 2013 but couldn't afford to travel...Carminucci then came to see him hit in a batting cage in St. Petersburg, Fla....Arizona's rosters were full, so he started the season playing independent baseball and had to wait until July before signing with the D-backs.
- His favorite TV show is "Friends"...says it helped him learn English.
- Has a collage of Venezuela-themed tattoos on his right arm...it includes the country's flag, as well as a clock that reads "3:08," signifying he was the 308th Venezuelan-born player to appear in MLB...on the inside of his right biceps, he has "Stay strong, great things take time," and "June 1, 2014," the date of his MLB debut.
- Became a United States citizen during the 2017-18 off-season.
- Was named as the D-back's nominee for the 2021 Roberto Clemente Award.
- During the 2020 Covid season, at David's request, teddy bears were placed in the Chase Field bleachers to help remind him of his fans and his family...smaller versions of the bears were delivered to Phoenix Children's Hospital and Banner Cardon Children's Hospital, courtesy of David and the D-back's Foundation.

PERALTA, WANDY

- Grew up in San Francisco de Macoris, Dominican Republic.
- Set a Yankees' record by appearing in all 5 games of the 2022 ALDS against CLE...he wants to pitch in every game. "Once the game starts," Peralta said, "the mentality is, 'I'm in the game.'"
- Loves pulling pranks and is normally a fun and jovial person...but his personality changes during road trips...Wandy hates flying. "I would rather be in a car for 20 hours than fly for one."
- In the 2022 Postseason pitched multiple days in a row..."How do I say this politically correctly?" catcher Kyle Higashioka said. "He's got brass balls."
- Former teammate Aaron Judge called Peralta "the ultimate teammate."

PÉREZ, MARTÍN

- Signed with the Rangers at age 16 and headed to the U.S. a year later without knowing any English...he made it a priority to learn and has become proficient in his years in the states.
- In his first stint with the Rangers, underwent Tommy John surgery and endured 14 months of rehab from 2015-16.
- Years ago, incorporated a breathing exercise into his pitching.
- In 2011, he threw the shortest perfect game in Texas League history for Double-A Frisco in April 2011. The game was stopped in the sixth inning due to rain after Perez retired all 15 batters he faced.

PROFAR, JURICKSON

- Grew up playing baseball in Curaçao. Watched a lot of Braves games because of Andruw Jones.
- Speaks 4 languages: Papiamentu, Dutch, English, and Spanish.
- Jurickon's son is named Khairy, and he loves baseball and is often in the Padres' Clubhouse. Jurickson says Khairy watches baseball more than he does.
- Curaçao is accessed only by plane, boat or its famous moving pontoon bridge. The population is roughly 160,000.
- Wears No. 10 because he loved soccer growing up, and he said all the best players in soccer wore No. 10.
- His mom would say that whenever Jurickson wakes up, he wakes up smiling.
- Profar was a member of the 2004 and 2005 Curacao Little League World series clubs, which made the championship game both years and won it all in 2004. In 2004, he was a pitcher and struck out 19 hitters in 12.1 innings and allowed one run. His two other brothers also played in the Little League World Series for Curacao (Juremi in 2007 & 2008 and Jurdick in 2019). The Profars were the second trio of brothers to play in the Little League World series since its inception in 1947.
- Profar is a Real Madrid fan and loves soccer. If he didn't play baseball, he thinks he could have played professional soccer. Growing up though, his mom didn't want him to play soccer. On weekends, he would sneak off to play soccer. He'd play a baseball game, and then after would go play a soccer game.
- His grandmother, Victoria, hasn't been able to come see him play in America, as she is terrified of planes.

- Had labrum surgery on his right shoulder in 2014.
- Scouts wanted to draft him as a pitcher, but the Texas Rangers' A.J. Preller (the former Rangers Director of International Scouting) drafted him as an infielder.
- Played for the Netherlands in the 2017 and 2023 WBCs.

REYNOLDS, SEAN

- Is a native of Redondo Beach, Calif...was originally selected by the Marlins as a first baseman and outfielder in the 4th round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Redondo Union HS.
- After batting .178 across 398 minor league games, Reynolds made the transition to becoming a pitcher in '21.
- On August 1, 2023, was traded along with 1B Garrett Cooper to San Diego in exchange for LHP Ryan Weathers.
- Is a co-founder of "Own Your Move Baseball," providing private baseball lessons and clinics for youth ballplayers in the greater South Bay area in Los Angeles county.

SCOTT, TANNER

- Married to Maddie Scott on Nov. 8, 2021 in Big Sur, CA...they have a child together named Bo and a dog, Otis.
- Graduated from Howland High School in Howland Township, Ohio.
- Hometown of Warren, Ohio, is about 56 miles southeast of Cleveland and near the Mahoning Valley Scrappers -- a Minor League affiliate for the Guardians' organization until '20.
- Has an older brother, Tyler, who played football at Northwestern University.
- Tanner says his mom, Bette was the athlete of their family...she played softball and basketball, and his uncles also played sports.
- Played one season at Notre Dame University in Ohio in 2013...transferred to Howard College in Big Spring, Texas, from which he was drafted in the 6th round of the 2014 Draft by the Orioles.
- Prior to signing, however, he pitched one game for the Chatham Anglers of the Cape Cod League.

SOLANO, DONOVAN

- He and his wife, Laura have 2 sons: Donovan Jr. and Enoc.
- His mother is Myriam, and Donovan's father, Luis, was a pitcher in the Colombian baseball leagues.
- Has a brother, Jhonatan, who was a catcher and played parts of 3 MLB seasons with the Nationals (2012-13) and Marlins (2015).
- Solano was born and raised in Barranquilla, Colombia...he and his brother, Jhonatan, were members of Team Colombia in the 2017 World Baseball Classic (did not play in the 2023 WBC).

SUAREZ, ROBERT

- Worked as a security guard at a supermarket and in construction in Venezuela in his early 20s, pitching solely on the weekends in amateur and independent leagues.
- His brother, Albert, has also pitched in Nippon Professional Baseball for the Tokyo Yakult Swallows...he now pitches for the Baltimore Orioles.
- When the Padres played the Orioles in Baltimore in 2024, he did not pitch in the same game as his brother, Albert, but the two exchanged lineup cards in the 2nd game of the series...they have pitched in the same game in professional ball just 1 time (when they both pitched in Japan's NPB on October 3, 2021)...in that game, Albert got the start for the Yakult Swallows, and Robert entered the game later for the Hanshin Tigers, getting the save.

TATIS JR., FERNANDO

- Fernando is the son of Maria and Fernando Tatis Sr...his dad is a former 11-year MLB veteran infielder, widely known for hitting two grand slams in one inning on April 23, 1999 @ LAD (with STL) off Chan Ho Park (now an advisor to Padres' baseball operations).
- Has 3 brothers, Joshua, Elijah and Daniel, and a sister, Maria.
- Goes by the nickname "El Niño."

- His mom's favorite color is pink, and he likes to wear it when he plays as way to show her that she's always in his heart.

WADE, TYLER

- Grew up in Murrieta, California (southwestern Riverside County), and he attended Murrieta Valley High School.
- Had committed to play college baseball at San Diego State University after visiting and meeting Tony Gwynn, but he signed with the Yankees (selected in the 4th round of the 2013 Draft).
- Grew up a Yankees fan, however, even though he was a 45 minute drive from San Diego...when he was a kid, he played a baseball tournament in New York and toured Yankee Stadium, where he fell in love with the team...his favorite player was Derek Jeter, but he grew up going to Padres' games.
- Remembers watching Padres' SS Khalil Greene run out to his position at the start of innings...said that it was a "big league run."
