METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets were blanked by the Brewers, 10-0 yesterday...It was the team's first shut out loss of the season...The Mets continue their first road trip of the year, a seven-game trip to Miami (3-1) and Milwaukee (0-1)...Following this series, the Mets head to New York...The team will host the Marlins (three games) and Padres (three games).

BORN ON THIS DAY: Gil Hodges was born on this day in 1924...He managed the Miracle Mets to their first World Series Championship in 1969...Hodges was an eight-time All-Star with the Brooklyn Dodgers... An original Met, he hit the first home run in team history...His 14 was the second Mets number to be retired (1973).

MAX EFFORT: Max Scherzer last started in Milwaukee on September 19, 2022, making his return from the Injured List...On that day, he pitched New York into the playoffs, helping the Mets clinch their first Postseason berth since 2016...He threw 6.0 perfect innings, racking up nine strikeouts...The Mets won that contest, 7-2...It was Scherzer's 200th career win...The right-handed pitcher has appeared in seven games (six starts) at the home of the Crew and is 1-2 with a 2.31 ERA (10 ER/39.0 IP) with eight walks and 55 strikeouts...Over his career, Scherzer is 3-3 with a 2.14 ERA (15 ER/63.0 IP) with 17 walks and 86 strikeouts in 11 games (10 starts) against Milwaukee.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+ K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

THE LEFT OF US: Brandon Nimmo hit .264/.358/.428 with 24 walks and a .786 OPS in 234 plate appearances against left-handed pitchers last season...Since 2022, his 21 extra-base hits as a lefty against left-handed pitchers is tied for the third most in the majors.

OMAR'S COMING YO!: In three games with the Mets, Omar Narváez is 3-10 with a run, two RBI and a walk...In December, the Mets signed catcher Narváez to a one-year contract with a player option for 2024... The backstop played 247 games for the Brewers from 2020-22.

WALKING THE WALK: The Mets rank third in the majors in walk rate, drawing a base on balls in 13 percent of their plate appearances so far this season...Milwaukee leads the majors in that category, drawing walks at a 14.6 percent clip...Three Mets rank in the top 10 in the NL in walks: Brandon Nimmo (six, second), Francisco Lindor (five, tied for third) and Pete Alonso (four, tied for seventh).

BREWERS-METS NOTES: The Mets earned a series win over the Brewers from September 19-21, 2022, clinching a spot in the playoff.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha went 0-6 with a walk and was hit by pitch in his first two games...Over the last two contests, Canha is 4-11 with three runs, a double, a home run, two RBI and two walks... He is in his second year with the Mets and has hit .265/.368/.405 with 74 runs, 25 doubles, 14 home runs, 63 RBI and 51 walks in 145 games with the club.

ALL IN THE FAMILY: The Mets play their lone series at American Family Field this year...In 28 career games at the yard, Tommy Pham is a .317/.375/.663 hitter with 20 runs, seven doubles, two triple, eight home runs, 19 RBI and nine walks...Starling Marte has hit .298/.339/.500 with 27 runs, 12 doubles, two triple, eight home runs, 25 RBI and 6 walks in 52 career games in MKE...Francisco Lindor has hit .286/.348/.738 with nine runs, two doubles, one triple, five home runs and 10 RBI in 11 career games at the yard...Daniel Vogelbach, who played for Milwaukee, has hit 11 home runs in 162 games at the ballpark, and has posted a .500 SLG at the yard.

ONLY A FEW CAN COM-PETE: Pete Alonso set a franchise single-season RBI record with 131 last year...His 131 RBI were tied for the major league lead and led the National League...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most or tied for the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He had 27 game-winning RBI season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI were tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

HITTING THE ROAD: New York is 3-2 on the road his year...The team finished the 2022 season going 47-34 on the road...Their .580 road winning percentage placed them third in the majors and second in the NL...It was tied for the fourth-best road record in team history and the highest road-winning percentage since 2007...Overall, they hit .265/.334/.424 away from Citi Field...Their .265 road average was second in the majors and the best in the NL, while their .334 OBP led The Show... They ranked fourth in MLB and second in the Senior Circuit with a .424 SLG...Brandon Nimmo (.406), Jeff McNeil (.399) and Mark Canha (.378) ranked three through five in road OBP in the National League.

LUIS, LUIS: Luis Guillorme made his third career pitching appearance yesterday...He tossed a scoreless inning, allowing only one hit...He lowered his career ERA to 6.00 (2 ER/3.0 IP)...At the plate, Guillorme went 2-4.

TO THE SOUND OF DENNIS SANTANA: Yesterday, Dennis Santana tossed a scoreless inning, allowing two walks and striking out one... He has yet to allow a hit in three appearances this season, walking two and striking out five in 2.2 innings...Santana was claimed off waivers from the Minnesota Twins on March 17...He has struck out 133 in 141.2 career innings.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

OPENING UP: In his last start, March 30 at Miami, Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

COLD BREW: Scherzer has made seven appearances (six starts) in Milwaukee...He owns a 2.31 career ERA (10 ER/39.0 IP) at American Family Field...As a starter, he is 2-1 with a 1.66 ERA (8 ER/38.0 IP) at this ballpark with 54 strikeouts and just eight walks...Overall in his career against the Brewers, he is 3-3 with a 2.14 ERA (15 ER/63.0 IP), 86 strikeouts and 17 walks...He has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last six starts against the club, posting a 1.54 EAR (6 ER/35.0 IP) in that stretch.

HAPPY MEMORIES HERE: Scherzer made his return from the Injured List here in Milwaukee on September 19 last season...On that day, he pitched New York into the postseason, helping the Mets clinch their first playoff berth since 2016...He threw 6.0 perfect innings, racking up nine strikeouts...The Mets won that contest, 7-2...It was Scherzer's 200th career win.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+ K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just one punchout separating the two...Scherzer passed Verlander in his last start...With 172 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

QUITE THE DEBUT: After signing a three-year deal with New York last offseason, Scherzer posted a 2.29 ERA (37 ER/145.1 IP) in his first season with the Mets...That is the lowest mark in a season in his career and the best all-time in a pitcher's first season with the Mets (min. 140.0 innings)...His 0.91 WHIP was not just the best mark by a Met in his first season with the club, it was the best by any Met in club history (min. 140.0 innings)...Scherzer did not allow more than four runs in any of his 23 regular-season starts last season.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field...Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)...Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

ALWAYS IMPROVING: Scherzer set a career-best mark with a 2.29 ERA last season after posting what was then a career-best 2.46 ERA in 2021...No other pitcher since 1913 has thrown 130.0 or more innings and posted an ERA below 2.50 in both his age 36 and age 37 seasons...Only five pitchers have done that twice at any point after turning 36: Hoyt Wilhelm (three times - 1959, 1964-65), Eddie Plank (three times - 1915-17), Randy Johnson (2001-02), Dennis Martinez (1991-92) and Babe Adams (1919-20).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON (0-1, 1.80)

LAST TIME OUT: Limited the Marlins to one run over 5.0 innings, allowing eight hits with a walk and five strikeouts...The lone run he permitted came on a solo home run...Peterson left with the Mets trailing, 1-0, and was dealt a loss in the Mets 2-1 setback.

2022: Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen.
