To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays begin a nine-game homestand against the Astros (three to play), Athletics (three to play), and Red Sox (three to play) in their final homestand of the campaign...have won four of their last six, nine of their last 14, and 11 of their last 17 games (Aug. 23–pres.)...since July 20, the Rays are a MLB-best 31-17 (.646)...have the second-toughest remaining schedule in the AL with an opp. winning pct. of .521 (BAL, .531), with four of their five remaining series (including current set) coming against opponents currently in position to qualify for the postseason...hold a 3.0-game lead over the second-place Yankees in the AL standings, marking the fifth-latest date in franchise history they have led the division; 2020 (Sept. 27), 2008 (Sept. 30), 2021 & 2010 (Oct. 3)...have spent 116 days leading the division (76 consecutive days, June 27–pres.), 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...have held the AL's best record for 115 days in addition to leading the AL East for 116 days, both of which are franchise records (Stats Perform)...are seeking their fifth AL East division title, first since winning the division in back-to-back campaigns from 2020-21.

- ★ The Rays dropped their series finale in Atlanta, 3-1, despite allowing no runs through the first seven frames...it marked the third time this season they have lost after keeping their opponents scoreless through the 7th (also: May 13 at TOR & Aug. 22 at BAL).
- ★ **Victor Mesa Jr.** launched a pinch-hit home run in the 9th inning, the fourth pinch-hit homer by a Ray this season (last: **Carson Williams**, Aug. 11 at ATH)...four pinch-hit long balls in a season is the most since 2015 (also 4) and is tied for the third most in a single season by a Rays team (also: 2015, 2012, 2005), trailing only 2010 (5x) and 2008 (7x)...it was the first pinch-hit home run by a Ray in the 9th inning or later since Sept. 9, 2024 at PHI (**Brandon Lowe**).
- ★ With the blast, Mesa Jr. extended his career-best hitting streak to six games (Sept. 4–pres.) and homered in back-to-back games for the second time in his career (also: 3G, July 18-20, 2026)...his six game hitting streak is the longest by an active Ray and tied for the seventh-longest streak in the AL.
- ★ Despite tossing his fourth straight quality start (Aug. 23–pres.), **Nick Martinez** left with a no-decision...over those four starts, he has turned in a 2.19 ERA (24.2IP, 6ER), a .172 (15-for-87), and a 0.69 WHIP.
- ★ The Rays have won in each of tonight's probable starter, **Drew Rasmussen's** nine post-All-Star break starts...**Blake Snell** (10G, Aug. 10–Sept. 29, 2018) and **Matt Moore** (11G, Sept. 22, 2012–May 19, 2013) are the only pitchers in franchise history to have the Rays win double-digit consecutive starts...the last AL pitcher to have their club accomplish the feat was HOU **Framber Valdez** (13G, May 7–July 22, 2025), with PHI **Jesús Luzardo** (10G, May 25–July 18) and MIL **Kyle Harrison** (10G, April 21–June 14) as the only hurlers to turn the trick this season.

PLAYOFFS? DON'T TALK ABOUT PLAYOFFS!—Per MLB, the Rays can be the first major league team to clinch a spot in the postseason today with any of the following scenarios listed below...Sept. 11 would mark the earliest date in franchise history the club has clinched a postseason berth, surpassing 2023 and 2020 (Sept. 17).

- ★ The Rays clinch a postseason spot with a win tonight; OR
- ★ A Rangers loss to the Diamondbacks AND a Blue Jays loss to the Orioles; OR
- ★ A White Sox loss to the Cardinals AND a Guardians loss to the Twins.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, RHP Hunter Bigge was claimed off waivers by the Athletics.

DEADLINE DEALS—Prior to the Aug. 3 trade deadline, the Rays acquired RHP **Freddy Peralta** (Aug. 2), C **Liam Hicks** (Aug. 3), and RHP **Tyler Wells** (Aug. 3)...according to Baseball-Reference, the trio have combined for a 1.8 bWAR in the 35-game span since the deadline closed on Aug. 3.

- ★ Since Hicks was acquired on Aug. 3, his 1.1 fWAR leads Rays hitters and tied for the eighth highest by an AL left-handed hitter...over that span, he has slashed .307/.398/.489 (27-for-88) with 4 2B, 4 HR, 17 RBI, and an .887 OPS as many walks as strikeouts (11)...min. 100 PA over that timeframe, his .887 OPS is the second best in the AL by a primary catcher behind SEA **Cal Raleigh** (.938).
- ★ Peralta turned in his third consecutive quality start (Aug. 26–pres.) Tuesday, earning the win in all three outings...his four quality starts in seven appearances as a Ray equal his total across 22 starts to begin the year with the Mets...during the three-start streak, the right-hander has spun a 1.00 ERA (18.0IP, 2ER) with 13 strikeouts to one walk and a .156 (10-for-64) opp. average.
- ★ Through 12 relief appearances, Wells has posted a 2-0 record with two saves, a 1.69 ERA (16.0IP, 3ER), a .135 (7-for-52) opp. average, and a 0.69 WHIP...his 0.69 WHIP is the second lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors since Aug. 3 (min. 15.0IP), while his .135 opp. average is tied for fourth in the AL and tied for sixth in MLB...he has allowed no runs in 10 of his 12 outings and allowed no hits in seven of 12.

HEAVY IS THE CROWN—Chandler Simpson (.308) is two points behind HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (.310) for the AL batting title, attempting to become the second Ray to pace the AL in average (2023, **Yandy Diaz** - .330)...in doing so he would become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title within their first two major league seasons and the third since 1942, alongside SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season - 2001) and Rays Hall of Famer BOS **Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season - 1983)...he is on pace to become the fifth player in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to bat .295 or better in each of his first two MLB seasons (min. 400AB in both seasons), joining joining CHC **Starlin Castro** (2010-11), NYY **Robinson Cano** (2005-06), STL **Albert Pujols** (2001-02), and Suzuki (2001-02).

- ★ The outfielder paces the AL in singles (140) and triples (6)—no Ray has ever paced the AL in the former category over a full season, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have finished atop the Junior Circuit's leaderboard in the latter...since 1983, only two AL hitters have led the league in both categories in the same season: CLE **Amed Rosario** (2022) and KC **Whit Merrifield** (2019)...Simpson needs five singles over the Rays final 16 games to match Crawford's club record from 2003 (145).
- ★ Per Baseball Savant, his 57 infield hits are the most across a single season by a Ray in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008) are tied for the fifth-most by any player in a single season over that time frame (see table on the right).
- ★ Simpson has recorded 52 multi-hit games this season, including nine in his last 17 games (Aug. 23–pres.), compared to 41 games without a base hit...he is seven multi-hit efforts shy of tying **Carl Crawford's** franchise record from 2006 (59G).
- ★ With 41 SB, he joined CAL **Chad Curtis** (1992-93), MON **Delino DeShields** (1990-91), STL **Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and NYY **Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns.

300: THIS IS SPARTA—Since Aug. 1, **Yandy Diaz** has collected multiple hits in 17 of his 36 games—in all of MLB, only teammate **Chandler Simpson** (19) has more multi-hit efforts and no other player has more than 14...he (.305/171-for-561) is looking to become the second player in franchise history to finish back-to-back seasons with a .300 average or better (min. 502PA)...only **Carl Crawford**, who turned the trick twice in his career, has accomplished the feat as a Ray, doing so between 2005-07 and 2009-10...the pair are the only players in team history to have multiple qualified .300 or better seasons.

THE RAY WAY—The Rays have opened September 5-4 and need to win eight of their final 16 games to clinch their six straight month with a .500 record or better...it would mark the first time in franchise history they have finished a full season with a .500 record or better in every month and tie the franchise record for consecutive months going .500 or better (also: July 2019–Sept./Oct. 2020)...they have secured their 13th winning season across 29 campaigns in franchise history, all of which have come in the last 19 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...their 13 winning seasons since 2008 are tied with the Braves and Brewers for fourth most among all major league clubs, trailing the Dodgers (18), Yankees (18), and Cardinals (16)...the Astros, Guardians, and Red Sox (all 11) are the next closest AL teams over that timeframe.

- ★ The Rays are approaching their first postseason berth since 2023 and sixth in the last eight seasons since 2019...as it stands, their five postseason appearances since 2019 are sixth most in the majors, trailing the Dodgers (7), Astros (6), Braves (6), Brewers (6), and Yankees (6)...they have made the postseason nine times since becoming the Rays in 2008, tied with the Astros and Brewers for fifth most in MLB behind the Dodgers (15), Yankees (13), Braves (10), and Cardinals (10).

THE SUN & THE STARS—The Rays welcome the Astros to the Trop for a three-game set this weekend...the clubs met for a three-game series in Houston over the Fourth of July weekend with the Rays losing the set, 2-1...despite the series loss, the Rays have won four of their last six sets against the Astros (July 28, 2023–pres.), including a three-game series (2-1) at Steinbrenner Field between May 19-21, 2025.

- ★ Through 11 career games opposite the Astros, Junior Caminero has hit .279 (12-for-43) with 3 2B, 5 HR, 13 RBI, and a 1.038 OPS...eight of his last nine hits against the Astros have gone for extra-base hits...he has recorded three games with 5 RBI or more in his career, with two of the three coming against Houston (May 31, 2025 at HOU - 5RBI & May 29, 2025 at HOU - 6RBI).

TONIGHT'S START—Drew Rasmussen will toe the rubber tonight for his 28th start of the campaign and his 158th career appearance (109th start)...he ranks highly among AL arms in strikeout-to-walk ratio (1st, 5.78), WHIP (1st, 0.91), opp. on-base pct. (T1st, .244), opp. OPS (2nd, .551), walks per 9.0 innings (2nd, 1.58), opp. SLG (2nd, .307), and opp. AVG (3rd, .200), quality starts (5th, 16), and ERA (5th, 2.88).
★ Rasmussen's active seven-game winning streak is tied for the ninth longest in TB history, three shy of the record (**Jalen Beeks** - 10W) and the longest since **Shane McClellanahan**'s eight-game streak (March 30–May 24, 2023).
★ Since 2021, his 2.81 ERA (598.2IP, 187ER) ranks fourth among MLB pitchers (min 500.0IP) behind LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (2.68), ATL **Chris Sale** (2.74), and MIL **Brandon Woodruff** (2.79).
★ The Rays have won each of his last nine starts since July 21 and 18 of 27 this year...the nine-game team winning streak in his outings is tied for the third-longest by a Rays starter in club history, behind **Blake Snell**'s 10-start streak (Aug. 10–Sept. 29, 2018) and **Matt Moore**'s 11-start streak (Sept. 22, 2012–May 19, 2013).

LAST TIME OUT—Spun his 16th quality start of the season despite not factoring into the decision on Sept. 5 at TEX (7.0IP, 3H, ER, 7SO, HR)...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced, 13 of the first 14, and 16 of the first 18 before allowing a homer to **Joc Pederson**...he retired each of the final five batters he faced after the long ball...it marked the seventh time this season completing 7.0 innings or more (last: Aug. 7 at SEA).
★ Surpassed **Ryan Yarbrough** (579.2 IP) for the ninth-most innings pitched in franchise history in the outing...he is 10.2 innings shy of **Matt Garza**'s 592.1 innings for eighth most.
★ Across his last three starts (Aug. 24–pres.), opposing hitters are 10-for-66 (.152) and have been limited to two extra-base hits (2B, HR).

HOUSTON, WE HAVE A PITCHER—Across six career appearances (five starts) against the Astros, Rasmussen has pitched to a 2-2 record with a 4.85 ERA (29.2IP, 16ER) and 18 strikeouts...his last outing against Astros came on July 4, 2026 in Houston, and he allowed five runs over 5.0 innings of work with one walk, two strikeouts, and two home runs...the Rays are 2-3 lifetime when Rasmussen starts against the Astros.
★ He is 11-4 with a 3.16 ERA (108.1IP, 38ER), 114 strikeouts, and a .207 (82-for-397) opp. average in 19 starts against AL clubs this season.
★ Rasmussen has made 26 career appearances (22 starts) against AL West clubs, pitching to an 11-4 record with a 3.08 ERA (119.2IP, 41ER), 112 strikeouts, and a 0.89 WHIP in those contests...his career WHIP against the AL West is the lowest by any pitcher (min. 100.0IP) since the division was established in 1969...in five starts this season against the division, he is 2-1 with a 4.18 ERA (28.0IP, 13ER), 24 strikeouts, and a .188 (19-for-101) opp. average.

IN TIP TROP SHAPE—The right-hander is slated to make his 14th home start of the season tonight...so far this season, he is 8-3 with a 3.22 ERA (72.2IP, 26ER) and a 0.99 WHIP at Tropicana Field...the right-hander is on pace to be the fifth pitcher in franchise history with a sub-1.00 home WHIP across a single season (min. 81.0IP), joining **Charlie Morton** (2019, 0.96), **Blake Snell** (2018, 0.87), **Alex Cobb** (2017, 0.96), and **David Price** (2012, 0.94).
★ Min. 250.0 IP, Rasmussen's 2.80 career home ERA as a Ray is the second best in franchise history behind Snell's 2.50...his 20 home wins as a Ray are tied for 10th most in team history with **Matt Garza** and **Jeremy Hellickson**, one shy of **Matt Moore** and **Jake Odorizzi** (both 21) for eighth most.

STARDOM—Since the All-Star break, Rasmussen has gone 7-0 with a 2.17 ERA (54.0IP, 13ER) across nine starts...despite not factoring into the decision during his two most recent outing on Aug. 30 vs. SD and Sept. 5 at TEX, he is the first pitcher in franchise history to win his first seven starts following the All-Star break.
★ Among all major league arms since the break, he ranks highly in wins (T1st, 7), WHIP (3rd, 0.83), opp. average (7th, .182), and ERA (9th, 2.17)...his seven wins are tied for the 10th most by a Rays pitcher in the second half of any season in franchise history and is one shy of being tied for fourth most (6x, last: **Tyler Glasnow**, 2023).
★ His .769 (20-6) winning percentage after the All-Star break as a Ray is the highest in franchise history (min. 30GS) and the third-highest mark since the inaugural All-Star Game in 1933, trailing **Julio Urias** (.844), and **Johnny Beasley** (.826).
★ Rasmussen boasts a career 2.34 ERA (265.0IP, 69ER) across 64 games (47 starts) following the Midsummer Classic...it is the third-lowest clip by a starting pitcher (min. 200.0IP) since 1933 behind **Blake Snell** (2.26) and **Urias** (2.28) and is the fifth-lowest mark by any pitcher behind **Billy Wagner** (2.07), **Snell**, **Javier Lopez** (2.28) and **Urias**...Rasmussen's 0.94 WHIP under the same parameters is the lowest mark by all pitchers during that span.

IN AWE OF AUGUST—Across five starts during August, Rasmussen went 5-0 with a 2.57 ERA (35.0IP, 10ER) and a 0.91 WHIP, with the Rays winning all six of his starts...the five wins matched a franchise record for a calendar month, and he became the second Rays pitcher to reach the mark without recording a loss during August (also: 5W, **Shane McClellanahan** - 2021)...Rasmussen also joined McClellanahan (5W - April/March 2023), **Tyler Glasnow** (5W - April/March 2019), **Blake Snell** (5W - Sept./Oct. 2018), and **Matt Moore** (5W - April/March 2013) as the only Rays to turn the trick in any single calendar month...Rasmussen's WHIP was his fourth lowest in a month during his career, with three of those months coming in 2026 (also: June - 0.61 and April/March - 0.85); Rasmussen logged a 0.67 WHIP during Aug. 2022.
★ It was the ninth time in franchise history the Rays have gone 6-0 or better in a pitcher's starts during a month, including the second occurrence in August (also: **Alex Cobb** - 2012).
