STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their eight-game, seven-day road trip against the Red Sox (0-3, one to play) and the Blue Jays (four to play) today at Fenway Park...marks their first road trip with back-to-back four-game sets since July 12-18, 2019 against the Orioles (3-1) and the Yankees (1-3)...are 13-8 (.619) in their last 21 contests (June 24–pres.), the fourth-best record in the AL over that span...had a season-high nine-game winning streak from June 24–July 3 (T4th-longest in TB history)...prior to the streak, went an MLB-best 22-4 from April 22–May 22 and an MLB-worst 9-18 from May 24–June 23...lead the AL with a 56-41 (.577) record, tied for the third best in the majors...they are currently 0-3 on a stretch of 11 games in 10 days (July 17-26) and 20 games in 20 days (July 17–Aug. 5)...have spent 63 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 21 consecutive days in first...hold a 2.0-game lead in the division.

✧ The Rays fell 7-6 to the Red Sox in their Saturday matinee...the loss marked their fourth in a row, tying their longest losing streak of the season (also: May 24-27).

✧ On the basepaths, they swiped four bases yesterday, their most since a season-high six stolen bases on July 4 at HOU...they are 1-3 in 2026 when stealing four bases or more, one of three teams to produce a losing record when reaching the mark (SEA & WSH, both 1-2).

✧ Marked their 10th one-run loss this season...entering June, the team was 9-1 in one-run games, but since has lost nine of their last 11, including seven of their last eight.

✧ With the loss, they are 0-6-9 in their last 15 four-game series (June 7, 2024–pres.) and 0-1-2 in four-game sets this season.

✧ After winning 10 of 11 games at Fenway Park between June 3, 2023–June 9, 2024, the Rays have dropped 11 of their last 14 games there, with five coming in one-run contests.

✧ According to FanGraphs, entering play today, the Rays have postseason odds of 94.0 pct., the fourth highest in the majors...they have the fifth-easiest remaining schedule by opponent winning pct. (.490), with just 27 of their remaining 65 games coming against teams currently above .500.

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win today, the Rays would:

✧ Avoid dropping their fifth straight game (July 12–pres.) for the first time since April 2-8, 2025 (5G)...are one of eight big-league teams to not lose five or more consecutive games this season (ATL, AZ, CLE, CWS, LAD, STL, TB, TEX).

✧ Prevent being swept for the fourth time this season and for the first time in a four-game series since July 10-13, 2025 at BOS...are tied for the second-fewest times being swept in the AL (also: BAL, HOU, TEX, TOR), behind Cleveland (1)...the Astros can be swept for the fourth time in 2026 today by the Orioles in Houston.

KEEP THE BALL IN THE YARD—Rays pitchers have been tagged for multiple homers in 10 of their last 16 games (June 30–pres.), including each of their last four (July 12–pres.)...their four-game streak is one game shy of the franchise record (8x) that was last done between May 12-17, 2023...over their 16-game stretch, they have allowed 29 home runs, tied for most in the majors (also: ATH & SD) and the most over any 16-game span since Aug. 9-27, 2025 (also 29)...across the season, Rays arms have allowed 192 runs on 126 home runs, the eighth-most long balls conceded in MLB...the 192 runs account for 46.3 pct. of all runs (415) they have allowed in the campaign, marking the fourth-highest pct. of runs allowed via homers in the majors (see table on the right).

✧ The Rays pitching staff has allowed multiple home runs in 35 games, tied for the third most in the AL and tied for the seventh most in the majors.

✧ Rays relievers have surrendered 61 home runs, tied for the second most in the majors with the Athletics and Cubs and fewer than only the Nationals (73) bullpen...the 61 home runs have accounted for 93 runs against the bullpen and 45.6 pct (93/204) of their runs allowed.

RISP & REWARD—On the season, the Rays are slashing .278/.354/.412 (220-for-791) with 61 extra-base hits and 96 walks when hitting with runners in scoring position...their .278 average is the second best in the majors behind the Twins .288 average...with runners in scoring position and two outs, the Rays pace the majors with a .262 (102-for-389) average and have struck out an MLB-low 82 times.

✧ **Yandy Diaz** paces the major leagues in average with RISP, hitting .443 (31-for-70) with 4 2B, 1 3B, 35 RBI, and a 1.062 OPS...his .443 average is on pace to be the best RISP average (min. 70AB) in franchise history and the seventh best in a single major league season since RISP stats began being tracked in 1974 (see table on the right).

✧ Only **KC George Brett** (1980), **MIL Paul Molitor** (1987) **SD Tony Gwynn** (1997), **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (2001), **STL Allen Craig** (2013), and **ATL Freddie Freeman** (2013) have finished with a .443 or better RISP average with 100 AB or more in a single season...Brett and Suzuki claimed MVP honors in their seasons, while Freeman, Gwynn, and Molitor finished top-six in MVP voting and Craig finished top-20.

SHANE AND THE SOX—Today's probable starting pitcher, **Shane McClanahan**, will be making his first start opposite Boston since working 6.0 IP of one-run ball on June 5, 2023 at Fenway Park, 1,140 days ago...he has gone 5-1 with a 2.23 ERA (40.1IP, 10ER), 45 SO, 11 BB, a 1.04 WHIP, and four quality starts in his previous seven outings against the Red Sox...he has earned the win in four consecutive starts vs. Boston (April 24, 2022–pres.), tied with **Blake Snell** (April 27, 2018–June 9, 2019) for the longest streak in franchise history and the longest streak by any MLB pitcher against the Sox since **TOR José Berrios** won four straight from 2023-25—the last longer streak belongs to **NY Y J.A. Happ** (5GS) from 2019-20...McClanahan has turned in a 1.85 ERA (24.1IP, 5ER) during the streak, yielding 1 ER in three of the four outings.

✧ McClanahan has gone 3-0 with a 1.32 ERA (27.1IP, 4ER) in five starts against AL East competition...min. 25.0 IP, only two MLB pitchers have better ERAs against their own division: **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (1.00) vs. the NL West and **CLE Joey Cantillo** (1.03) against the AL Central.

✧ He has gone 19-7 with a 2.78 ERA (200.2IP, 62ER) in 37 career starts vs. AL East opponents...min. 200.0 IP it marks the lowest ERA against the division among active major league pitchers.

✧ The lefty is chasing his 42nd career win today, which would tie **Blake Snell** for the sixth most in franchise history...his 41 wins through his first four major league seasons are tied with **David Price** for the second most in Rays history behind **James Shields** (43)...with a winning decision today, he would become the 30th southpaw in the divisional era (since 1969) to record 42 wins within his first four big-league seasons and the first since **BAL Wei-Yin Chen** (46, 2012-15).

GET OUT BALL—The Rays have homered in 18 of their last 24 games (June 21–pres.), tallying more multi-homer games (12) over that span than games without a long ball (6)...their 37 home runs over that stretch are the most in the AL, second most in the majors (WSH, 42), and are their most in any 24-game span since May 21–June 16, 2025 (also 37)...they are 21-5 (.808) when they hit multiple home runs this season, the fourth-best record in the majors behind the Yankees (35-4/.897), Dodgers (27-5/.844), and Guardians (17-4/.810)...they have won 12 of their last 14 contests (June 14–pres.) when registering two long balls or more.

✧ Since the power surge began on June 21, 11 of the 13 position players the Rays have used during that span have have homered, with **Junior Caminero** (14), **Cedric Mullins** (5), **Victor Mesa Jr.** (4), **Jonny DeLuca** (3), **Ryan Vilade** (3), **Jonathan Aranda** (2), **Richie Palacios** (2) all recording multiple long balls.

GREAT GREEN JEWEL OF THE COMMONWEALTH—The Rays and Red Sox continue their 13-game season set today at Fenway Park...the Rays claimed the first two sets of the season against the Red Sox between May 7-10 (2-1) in Boston and June 8-10 (3-0) in St. Petersburg before dropping their current four-game set (0-3)...the Rays are 5-4 against the Red Sox in 2026 after going 3-10 in 2025...they need to win two of their remaining four games against the Red Sox to clinch their seventh season series victory over the past eight seasons (2019–pres.).

WINTER IS COMING—The Rays return to Canada to take on the Blue Jays in a four-game set beginning tomorrow...the Rays won each of their first two sets, including five games in a row to begin the campaign against the Jays...the clubs will meet again in Florida between Aug. 18-20 for a three-game series to conclude their 13-game season set...the Rays need two wins in the remaining seven games against the Blue Jays to claim the season series for the ninth consecutive year (2017–pres.) and 11th time in 12 seasons...over that nine-season stretch, the Rays are 90-60 against Toronto.

TODAY'S START—Shane McClanahan will toe the rubber for his 18th start of the season and 10th on the road...marks his 92nd career start and 44th away from home...has tossed 131 consecutive scoreless innings and recorded three straight quality starts, his longest streak since June 5-16 (3GS) and tied for the second-longest stretch of his career behind May 11-July 26, 2022 (franchise-record 13 straight QS)...has yielded 2 ER or fewer in 13 of his 17 starts, held opponents homerless in 13 of them, allowed three hits or fewer in nine of them, and yielded 0 XBH in eight starts (T1st in AL with LAA **José Soriano**)...missed the last two years after his second Tommy John surgery wiped out his 2024 season and nerve-related issues sidelined him for 2025...the Cape Coral High School (Fla.) product was selected by the Rays in the Compensatory Round (31st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Florida.

- Min. 80.0 IP, he ranks among AL leaders in opp. SLG (3rd, .314), opp. OPS (5th, .595), home runs per 9.0 IP (5th, 0.63), ERA (6th, 2.83), and FIP (7th, 3.15).
- McClanahan will be starting on 10 days' rest since his last outing on July 8 vs. NYY—in five starts this season with six days' rest or more, he is 3-1 with a 1.32 (27.1IP, 4ER) ERA and .149 (14-for-94) opp. average...min. five such starts, only two AL pitchers have lower ERAs following six days of rest or more: SEA **Emerson Hancock** (0.86) and HOU **Spencer Arrighetti** (1.30).
- His 41 career wins are seventh most in franchise history, one shy of sixth-ranked **Blake Snell** (42)...min. 50 career starts, he owns the best winning pct. by any pitcher in Rays history (.661/41-21)...he needs two more wins to become the first Tampa Bay hurler to record double-digit wins in each of his first four major league campaigns.
- The Rays are 41-4 in his career when he receives three runs of support or more (7-0 in 2026) and 14-32 with two runs or fewer (3-7 in 2026).

LAST TIME OUT—Picked up his second win in as many starts after holding the Yankees scoreless during a season-high 6.1-inning effort in a 3-0 win on July 8 vs. NYY (W, 6.1IP, 4H, OR, .550)...retired his first 4 BF and worked around back-to-back singles in the 2nd...following the hits, set down the next 11 Yankees to come to the plate, a run halted by **José Caballero's** leadoff single in the 6th...still faced the minimum in the 6th after Caballero was thrown out on a strikeout/caught stealing double play...entered the 7th having thrown 74 pitches, but a 10-pitch battle with **Amed Rosario** resulting in a single prevented him from finishing the frame...after the single, McClanahan retired **Cody Bellinger** on one pitch before giving way to the bullpen.

- He worked into the 7th inning for the first time since June 16, 2023 at SD (6.2IP)...he has gone consecutive starts without walking a batter or the first time since July 28–Aug. 2, 2023 (final two starts of 2023).
- It marked McClanahan's seventh scoreless start of 5.0 innings or more, tying PHI **Cristopher Sánchez** (7) for the most in the majors.
- He has been the starter in four of the Rays six shutout victories, tied for the most team shutouts in a pitcher's starts in MLB alongside MIL **Kyle Harrison**, Sánchez, LAA **José Soriano**, and PHI **Zack Wheeler**.

GOING STREAKING—With his last outing, McClanahan extended his scoreless inning streak to 13.1 consecutive frames, the second-longest active streak among major league starters behind TOR **Dylan Cease** (15.0IP)...he has recorded back-to-back scoreless starts of 6.0 IP or more for the first time in his career and has worked 6.0 IP or more in three consecutive outings, regardless of runs allowed, for the first time since June 5-16, 2023 (3GS)...his last longer streak was Aug. 6-24, 2022 (4GS)...entering the current stretch, he had reached 6.0 IP in only one of his first 14 starts (6.0IP on May 1 vs. SF).

SOX TALK—McClanahan is making his first start opposite Boston since working 6.0 IP of one-run ball on June 5, 2023 at Fenway Park, 1,140 days ago...he has gone 5-1 with a 2.23 ERA (40.1IP, 10ER), 45 SO, 11 BB, a 1.04 WHIP, and four quality starts in his previous seven outings against the Red Sox...he has earned the win in four consecutive starts vs. Boston (April 24, 2022–pres.), tied with **Blake Snell** (April 27, 2018–June 9, 2019) for the longest streak in franchise history and the longest streak by any MLB pitcher against the Sox since TOR **José Berrios** won four straight from 2023-25—the last longer streak belongs to NYY **J.A. - McClanahan has gone 3-0 with a 1.32 ERA (27.1IP, 4ER) in five starts against AL East competition, four of which were scoreless...min. 25.0 IP, only two MLB pitchers have better ERAs against their own division: LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (1.00) vs. the NL West and CLE **Joey Cantillo** (1.03) against the AL Central.
- He has gone 19-7 with a 2.78 ERA (200.2IP, 62ER) in 37 career starts vs. AL East opponents...min. 200.0 IP, it marks the lowest ERA against the division among active major league pitchers.

TRAVELING MAN—He is 2-4 with a 3.77 ERA (43.0IP, 18ER) in nine road starts, but he picked up the second victory in his most recent outing away from home on July 1 at KC...the left-hander has produced a 2-1 record, 2.13 ERA (25.1IP, 6ER), and 0.99 WHIP over five road starts in AL ballparks...this includes a combined 10.1 scoreless frames in two outings as a visitor at AL East venues: May 12 at TOR (5.0IP) and May 25 at BAL (5.1IP)...today, he is seeking victories in back-to-back road starts for the first time since April 5–May 8, 2023 (four straight).

FALTERED IN THE 5TH—From innings 1-4, McClanahan has pitched to a 2.00 ERA (67.2IP, 15ER) and 0.92 WHIP...15 of the 33 (45.5%) runs against him have come in the 5th frame, where he has recorded a 6.92 ERA (13.0IP, 10ER) and 2.08 WHIP...opponents are batting .350 (21-for-60) against him in the 5th, including 9-for-26 (.346) with RISP, compared to .174 (42-for-242) over the first four innings (.196/9-for-46 with RISP).

KEEP THE CHANGE—He has held opponents to an MLB-best .124 (13-for-105) average on his changeup (min. 75AB)...this includes an 0-for-22 clip across his last four outings (June 17–pres.)...under the same parameter it would mark the second-lowest opp. average on changeups by a Ray in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008), trailing **Fernando Rodney** (.070/8-for-114) in 2012...he has yielded only 1 XBH on a changeup (**Taylor Ward** 2B on May 18 vs. BAL) and tallied nearly half (40) of his 82 strikeouts on the offering...min. 150 swings, his 36.9 pct. whiff rate on changeups ranks fifth among AL southpaws behind DET **Tarik Skubal** (50.3%), CLE **Joey Cantillo** (49.5%), ATH **Jeffrey Springs** (40.5%), and CLE **Parker Messick** (37.1%).

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS—Left-handed hitters have gone 9-for-69 (.130) against McClanahan, including 0-for-14 with 6 SO in his last two starts...min. 60 AB, it signals the lowest mark in the AL and third lowest in the majors to MIL **Jacob Misiorowski** (.098) and STL **Gordon Graceffo** (.114)...left-handed batters on AL East clubs are hitless against McClanahan (0-for-18).

MASTERPIECE OF A MONTH—During May, McClanahan went 4-0 with a 1.41 ERA (32.0IP, 5ER) across six starts, the lowest ERA among AL pitchers (min. 30.0IP)...he also ranked highly among AL starters in WHIP (4th, 0.84), opp. on-base pct.
