AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game road trip tonight with the second game of a three-game set at Kansas City (1-0 thus far)...will also face the Athletics in a three-game series from Fri.-Sun.

- ▶ Their 32-22 (.593) record is the second-best in the American League and the fifth-best record in the Majors.
- ▶ Have won back-to-back games after losing their previous three games and 10 of their previous 14 games (5/8-22)... **are still 24-15 in their last 39 games (since 4/13).**
- ▶ Are in a stretch of playing 25 games in 27 days (5/1-27).
- ▶ Have won or split nine of their last 12 completed series (6-3-3 since 4/13) and 12 of their 17 completed series this season (9-5-3).
- ▶ The Yankees'+68 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the fourth-best in the Majors.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Royals in a 4-3 comeback win in their series opener on Monday at Kauffman Stadium...**RHP Will Warren** (6.0IP, 3H, 2R/ER, 3BB, 3K, 1HR) started and did not record a decision...**LF/1B Cody Bellinger** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit his seventh HR of the year with a go-ahead solo shot in the second inning...**3B José Caballero** (1-for-4, 1RBI) hit an RBI single in the second inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (1-for-3, 1R, 2RBI, 1BB) reached base twice and hit a go-ahead two-run single in the ninth inning...**C.J.C. Escarra** (3-for-4) recorded a career-high-tying 3H...**LHP Tim Hill** (0.2IP, 1K) earned his second win of the year after retiring both of his batters faced...**RHP David Bednar** (1.0IP, 1BB) tossed a scoreless ninth inning to record his 12th save of the year.

- ▶ **Marked the Yankees' third win this season when trailing after the eighth inning,** their most in a season since recording four in 2024.
- ▶ Three of the Yankees' last four wins have been comeback wins.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 3.07 ERA (295.2IP, 101ER) and 289K in 54 starts this season...**have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 46 of their 54 starts this season, tied with Milwaukee for the most in the Majors...also marks their second-most in franchise history through their first 54 games of a season,** trailing only their 49 starts in 2022.

- ▶ Have allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of their last five starts (since 5/20), posting a 1.50 ERA (30.0IP, 5ER) over that span.
- ▶ Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of their last six starts and 14 of their last 15 starts (since 5/9).
- ▶ **Lead the Majors in opponents' SLG (.317), opponents' OPS (.600) and HR/9.0IP (0.73),** rank third in opponents' BA (.210, first in AL), ERA (3.07, second in AL), opponents' OBP (.283, second in AL), WHIP (1.11, second in AL), fifth in innings pitched (295.2, fourth in AL), seventh in strikeouts (289, third in AL) and strikeout rate (24.0%, third in AL), eighth in K/BB (2.89, fourth in AL) and 10th in BB/9.0IP (3.04, fifth in AL).

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice has hit .276/.369/.609 (48-for-174) with 36R, 10 doubles, 16HR, 33RBI, 25BB/2IBB, 2HP, 2SF and 2SB in 49 games this season...has reached base safely in 36-of-45 starts.

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the Yankees' last eight games (since 5/17) and 11 of their last 15 games (since 5/9) have been decided by 2R-or-fewer.

ALL THAT JAZZ: INF Jazz Chisholm Jr. reached base twice on Monday at Kansas City...is batting .400/.467/.625 (16-for-40) with 6R, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 1HR, 5RBI, 5BB and 2SB over his last 11 games (since 5/13).

- ▶ Has reached base multiple times in seven of his last 10 games (since 5/15).

HIP HIP JOSÉ: INF/OF José Caballero hit an RBI single in the second inning on Monday at Kansas City...**is batting .310/.394/.414 (9-for-29) with 3 doubles, 9RBI and 4BB with RISP this year.**

- ▶ Has reached base safely in 25 of his last 29 games with a PA (since 4/13), batting .306/.364/.480 (30-for-98) with 15R, 5 doubles, 4HR, 10RBI, 6BB, 3HP and 8SB over that span.

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger hit a go-ahead solo home run in the second inning on Monday at Kansas City...is hitting .311/.411/.600 (28-for-90) with 15R, 10 doubles, 2 triples, 4HR, 19RBI, 16BB, 2SB and 15F over his last 25 games (since 4/28).

- ▶ According to FanGraphs and Sports Info Solutions, leads all Major League LF in DRS (11) and is tied for sixth in go-ahead RBI (10, tied for third in AL).

GOOD WILL WARREN: RHP Will Warren allowed only 2R/ER in 6.0IP on Monday at Kansas City...has gone 6-1 with a 3.55 ERA (58.1IP, 23ER) and 65K in 11 starts this season, allowing 2ER-or-fewer in nine of his starts...since 2025, has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 31 of his 44 starts, the most in the AL and the third-most in the Majors over that span.

SCHLITTLER'S CREEK: RHP Cam Schittler will make his 12th start of the season tonight at Kansas City...**has gone 6-2 with a 1.50 ERA (66.0IP, 11ER) and 75K in 11 starts this season, holding opponents to a .185/.227/.248 (44-for-238) slash line.**

- ▶ **His 1.50 ERA is the third-lowest by a Yankees pitcher through his first 11 starts of a season since 1913** (when ER became an official stat), trailing only Max Fried (1.29 ERA in first 11GS in 2025) and Jack Quinn (1.32 ERA in first 11GS in 1919).
- ▶ **Is the only pitcher in franchise history to post a 1.50 ERA-or-lower and record at least 75K through their first 11 starts of a season.**
- ▶ **Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in six of his last seven starts (since 4/17), going 4-1 with a 1.02 ERA (44.1IP, 5ER) and 45K during that span.**
- ▶ **Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in eight of his starts this season, tied for the most in the Majors.**
- ▶ Has allowed only 2HR to 253BF this season...is only the fourth Yankees starting pitcher (excluding openers) in the last 42 years (since 1985) to allow 2HR-or-fewer over his first 11 starts of a season, joining CC Sabathia (2HR in first 11GS in 2016), Joba Chamberlain (2HR in first 11GS in 2008) and Kevin Brown (2HR in first 11GS in 2005).
- ▶ The Yankees are 8-3 in his starts.
- ▶ **Over his last 19 Major League starts (since 8/20/25), has gone 9-3 with a 1.81 ERA (109.1IP, 22ER) and 129K...** the Yankees are 15-4 in those starts...has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 12 of those starts
- ▶ According to Elias, **his 2.27 career ERA is the second-lowest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 25 career starts** (ignoring relief appearances), trailing only Hank Thormahlen's 2.10 ERA in his first 25 career starts from 1917-19...**marks the lowest ERA by a Yankees pitcher whose first 25 career appearances were all starts.**

MATCHING UP: The Yankees have won each of their last 11 regular season games vs. Kansas City (since 9/11/24), marking their longest winning streak vs. an opponent since their 12-game winning streak vs. Boston from 9/7/19-9/19/20.

- ▶ **Including the postseason, the Yankees have won each of their last 12 games vs. the Royals (since 10/9/24) and 14 of their last 15 games (since 9/11/24)...have gone 18-3 against Kansas City since 2024 (15-2 during the regular season and 3-1 in the 2024 ALDS).**
- ▶ Including the postseason, the Yankees are 29-6 in their last 35 games vs. Kansas City (since 8/11/21)...are also 32-7 in their last 39 games (since 6/23/21) and 37-9 in their last 46 games (since 4/19/19).
- ▶ **Have won 21 of their last 22 completed series vs. the Royals** (including the postseason) since 5/25/15, going 55-16 in that span...their 53-17 (.757) record vs. the Royals in the regular season since 2015 is the highest winning percentage by any team vs. an opponent in their league over that span.
- ▶ **Are 19-5 at Kauffman Stadium in their last 24 games since 5/19/18 (including the postseason)**...including the postseason, are 29-12 in their last 41 games at Kansas City since 2013.

HIGH VOLPAGE: INF Anthony Volpe reached base twice and hit a go-ahead two-run single in the ninth inning on Monday at Kansas City...marked his fourth career hit that either tied the game or gave the Yankees the lead in the ninth inning-or-later...is batting .300 (6-for-20) with 3R, 2 doubles, 5RBI, 3BB and 2SB over his last six games (since 5/17).

- ▶ Has reached base in 14-of-31PA over his last eight games (since 5/15), posting a .452 OBP during that stretch (6H, 8BB).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge has hit .352/.441/.752 (44-for-125) with 28R, 8 doubles, 14HR, 31RBI, 20BB/2IBB and 35B in 33 games vs. the Royals since 2019...has hit 4HR in his last eight games against Kansas City (since 4/16/25) and 12HR in his last 24 games (since 4/29/22).

- ▶ Be of his 49H this season have been XBH (9 doubles, 17HR).

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in each of their last five games (since 5/20), posting a 2.00 ERA (45.0IP, 10ER) over that span.

- ▶ Have posted an AL-best 3.24 ERA this season and rank third in the Majors, trailing only Atlanta (3.04) and Los Angeles-NL (3.10).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CAM SCHLITTLER (6-2, 1.50 ERA)

RHP Cam Schlittler will make his 12th start of the season tonight at Kansas City...the 25-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Saturday's rain out vs. Tampa Bay...made his 11th start of the season on Wednesday vs. Toronto, suffering his second loss of the season despite allowing only 2R/ER in 6.0IP (8H, 2BB, 7K, 0HR)...has gone 6-2 with a 1.50 ERA (66.0IP, 44H, 13R/11ER, 13BB, 75K, 2HR) in 11 starts this season...has also allowed 1ER-or-fewer in eight of his starts, including six of his last seven starts (since 4/17)...has allowed only 2HR to 253BF this season...made his first career Opening Day roster...**over his last 19 Major League starts (since 8/20/25), has gone 9-3 with a 1.81 ERA (109.1IP, 71H, 24R/22ER, 30BB, 129K, 4HR)**...saw his first Major League action in 2025 with the Yankees, going 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (73.0IP, 58H, 24R/ER, 31BB, 84K, 8HR) in 14 starts...in 25 career Major League starts, has gone 10-5 with a 2.27 ERA (139.0IP, 102H, 37R/35ER, 44BB, 159K, 10HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 23-of-25 career starts, 2R-or-fewer in 19 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 14 starts...according to *Elias*, **his 2.27 ERA is the second-lowest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 25 career starts** (ignoring relief appearances), trailing only Hank Thormahlen's 2.10 ERA in his first 25 career starts from 1917-19...**marks the lowest ERA by a Yankees pitcher whose first 25 career appearances were all starts...his 159K through his first 25 career games are the third-most in franchise history**, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (174K) and Orlando Hernández (160K)...**his 37R allowed are the fewest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 25 career starts...has posted a .202 opponents' BA over his first 25 career starts...according to *Elias*, marks the sixth-lowest opponents' BA by a Yankees pitcher through their first 25 career starts** (ignoring relief appearances), trailing only Luis Gil (.176), Al Downing (.179), Tommy Byrne (.179), Russ Ford (.188) and Spec Shea (.201)...the Weymouth, Mass., native was selected by the Yankees in the seventh round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University (Mass.).

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 11th start of the season on Wednesday vs. Toronto, suffering his second loss of the season despite allowing only 2R/ER in 6.0IP (8H, 2BB, 7K, 0HR)...his 106 pitches matched his career high (also threw 106 pitches in his previous start on 5/15 at the Mets)...his 8H allowed marked a career high.

2026: In 11 starts this season, has gone 6-2 with a 1.50 ERA (66.0IP, 44H, 13R/11ER, 13BB, 75K, 2HR)...has held opponents to a .185/.227/.248 (44-for-238) slash line...**see Major League rankings at right.**

- ✦ **His 1.50 ERA is the third-lowest by a Yankees pitcher through his first 11 starts of a season since 1913 (when ER became an official stat)**, trailing only Max Fried (1.29 ERA in first 11GS in 2025) and Jack Quinn (1.32 ERA in first 11GS in 1919).
- ✦ **Is the only pitcher in franchise history to post a 1.50 ERA-or-lower and record at least 75K through their first 11 starts of a season.**
- ✦ **Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in all 11 starts this season, including 1R-or-fewer in seven starts (including four scoreless starts)**...his 11 starts of 3R-or-fewer are tied for the most in the Majors (most in AL)...**his season-opening streak of 3R-or-fewer through his first 11 starts of the season is tied for the fifth-longest streak in franchise history**, trailing only Clarke Schmidt's 15-start streak to begin the 2024 season, Ron Guidry's 15-start streak to begin the 1978 season, Jordan Montgomery's 13-start streak to begin the 2022 season and Jim Bouton's 12-start streak to begin the 1966 season...along with Schlittler's nine-start streak to begin the 2025 season, is only the second pitcher in franchise history to allow 3R-or-fewer in at least nine starts to begin a season multiple times, joining Jim Bouton (2x: first 12GS in 1966 and first 10GS in '63).
- ✦ **Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in eight of his starts this season, including six of his last seven starts (since 4/17)**...his eight starts of 1ER-or-fewer are tied for the most in the Majors (tied for most in AL)...allowed 1ER-or-fewer in six straight starts from 4/17-5/15...was one of just three Yankees starters (not including openers) in the last 29 seasons (since 1998) to allow 1ER-or-fewer in at least six straight starts in a single season, joining Luis Gil (7GS from 5/1-6/4/24) and Michael King (7GS from 8/24-9/26/23)...**his six-start streak of 1ER-or-fewer matched the sixth-longest by a Yankees starter in franchise history** (not including openers), trailing only Whitey Ford (9GS from 8/24-9/28/63), Spud Chandler (8GS from 9/29/45-5/19/46-G1), Gil, King and Steve Kline (7GS from 7/18-8/14/72).
- ✦ **Has allowed only 2HR to 253BF this season**...his 0.27 HR/9.0IP ratio is the second-best mark in the Majors, trailing only teammate Max Fried (0.15 HR/9.0IP)...is only the fourth Yankees starting pitcher (not including openers) to allow two-or-fewer home runs over his first 11 starts of a season in the last 42 years (since 1985), joining CC Sabathia (2HR in first 11GS in 2016), Joba Chamberlain (2HR in first 11GS in 2008) and Kevin Brown (2HR in first 11GS in 2005).
- ✦ Has recorded at least 7K in seven of his starts, including 8K in four starts...his four starts with at least 8K are tied for the sixth-most in the Majors (tied for fourth in AL).
- ✦ Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in seven of his starts, tied for the fourth-most in the Majors (tied for second in AL).
- ✦ The Yankees are 8-3 in his starts...his eight team wins are tied for the fifth-most in the Majors this season (tied for fifth in AL).
- ✦ Has tossed at least 6.0IP in seven of his last 10 starts (since 4/1), including six of his last seven starts (since 4/17).
- ✦ Has posted two of the Yankees' top-three longest scoreless streaks: 14.0 inning streak from 4/23-5/4 (second longest) and a season-opening 13.2 inning streak from 3/27-4/7...trails only Max Fried's 16.0 scoreless streak from 4/22-5/3...is one of five pitchers in the Majors this year to record at least two scoreless streaks of at least 13.0IP, joining Fried (16.0IP and 13.1IP), Paul Skenes (20.0IP and 16.0IP), Ranger Suarez (19.0IP and 14.0IP) and Michael Wacha (two streaks of 15.0IP)...opened the season with a 13.2 scoreless inning streak from 3/27-4/7...was the second-longest scoreless streak by a Yankees starter to begin the season in the last 15 years (since 2012), trailing only Luis Gil's 18.2 scoreless inning streak in 2021.
