The Mariners pitching staff has combined to post a 1.87 ERA (28 ER, 135.0 IP) over the club's last 15 Opening Day contests, leading the Mariners to a 12-3 record during that span.

With a win in tonight's game, **Marco Gonzales** would join Randy Johnson with 2 wins on Opening Day, trailing only Félix Hernández (7) for the most Opening Day wins in club history.

Kyle Seager is making his 7th career Opening Day start for the Mariners, joining Alvin Davis and Dave Valle for T7th-most Opening Day starts in club history... Seager was in the Opening Day lineup in 6 consecutive seasons (2013-18) before beginning last year on the Injured List.

With an appearance in tonight's game, **Evan White** would become the 12th player in Mariners history to make his Major League debut on Opening Day (last: **Dylan Moore**, 2019)...with a start, he would become the 8th player in club history to make his Major League debut in the starting lineup on Opening Day (last: Kenji Johjima, 2006).

198

With 198 career home runs, **Kyle Seager** is two homers away from becoming the 4th player in club history to hit 200 career home runs as a **Mariner**, joining **Ken Griffey Jr.** (417), **Edgar Martinez** (309) and **Jay Buhner** (307).

298

Tonight marks the Mariners first regular season game since September 29, 2019 vs. Oakland, a span of 298 days between regular season games.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners open their 44th season against the Houston Astros at Minute Maid Park... tonight is the first of a 4-game series at the Astros...following Monday's game, the Mariners will travel to Anaheim for a 3-game series at the Angels: July 28-30...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the **Mariners Radio Network**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners open the season against Houston for the second time in club history (also: April 3, 2017 at HOU)...the Mariners are 12-3 over their last 15 Opening Day contests...are 9-2 on the road during that span.

- **First Opening Day** - 10 Mariners players are making their first appearance on an Opening Day roster: **Justin Dunn**, **Kyle Lewis**, **Shed Long Jr.**, **Tim Lopes**, **Matt Magill**, **Anthony Misiewicz**, **José Marmolejos**, **Austin Nola**, **Yohan Ramirez**, **Justus Sheffield** and **Evan White**.
- **Service Time** - the Mariners have three players with at least seven years of Major League service time: **Kyle Seager** (8.085), **Bryan Shaw** (8.081) and **Dee Gordon** (7.154)...14 players on the Mariners roster have less than 1 year of service time.
- **Young & Old** - third baseman **Kyle Seager** (32 years, 264 days) is the oldest player on the Mariners Opening Day active roster...left-handed pitcher **Nick Margevicius** (24 years, 36 days) is the youngest player on the Mariners Opening Day active roster.
- **Debuts** - four players are set to make their respective Major League debuts with their first appearance: **José Marmolejos**, **Anthony Misiewicz**, **Yohan Ramirez** and **Evan White**.
- **International Game** - the Mariners Opening Day roster is represented by four countries: Cuba (**Nestor Cortes**), Dominican Republic (**Yohan Ramirez**), Japan (**Yusei Kikuchi**), United States (27 players).
- **2019 in Review** - Completed the 2019 season 68-94 (.420), finishing 5th in the American League West (39.0 games behind division-winner Houston)...went 35-46 (.432) at home and 33-48 (.407) on the road...were 23-26 in one-run games and 9-4 when games went to extra-innings.

IT'S A SPRINT...as part of its COVID-19 response, Major League Baseball has restructured the 2020 schedule to span only 60 games compared to the normal 162...the Mariners will face off against the AL West in 40 games and the NL West in 20 games...with the shorter season, each game in the 2020 season carries the equivalent weight of 2.7 regular season games in a typical MLB season...the trade deadline will take place on August 31.

YOUTH MOVEMENT...the Mariners are fielding the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days...rank ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.

OPENING DAY DATA...the Mariners are 26-17 (.605) in season openers and have won 12 of the last 15 season openers, including Opening Day shutouts in 2007 (4-0 vs. OAK) and 2013 (2-0 at OAK)...**OPENERS VS. THE ASTROS**...the Mariners will open with the Astros for the 2nd time in club history...on April 3, 2017, lost to the Astros, 3-0, at Minute Maid Park...**OPENERS IN TEXAS**...this will be the Mariners third opener in the state of Texas (also: 4/4/16 at TEX and 4/3/17 at HOU)...**OPENERS IN JULY**...tonight marks the Mariners 1st Opening Day in the month of July...marks only the second Opening Day after April 9 in club history (also: 1995, April 27)...**OPENERS ON THE ROAD**...this will be the 17th time in club history that the Mariners have opened the regular season on the road...marks the 10th road opener in the last 12 seasons, dating back to 2009...are 9-7 in openers on the road...**NIGHT OPENERS**...opening the season with a night game for the 32nd time in club history...are 22-9 in season openers in night games...**FRIDAY OPENERS**...will open on a Friday for the 2nd time in club history...the Mariners defeated the Athletics, 6-2 on April 1, 2011 at the Coliseum in Oakland.

SOUTHPAW STARTER...**Marco Gonzales** is making his second consecutive Opening Day start for Seattle...last year, he became the first left-hander to start on Opening Day for the Mariners since Erik Bedard (3/31/08 vs. TEX)...Gonzales is set to become the first left-handed starter for the Mariners to make consecutive Opening Day starts since Jamie Moyer in 2004-06 (3 starts)...if he earns the win tonight, he will join Randy Johnson at second place in club history with 2 Opening Day victories, trailing only Félix Hernández (7)...Gonzales (28 years, 159 days) becomes only the 6th pitcher in club history to make multiple Opening Day starts before turning 29 years of age; he joins Hernández (8 such starts), Freddy García (3), Mark Langston (3), Mike Moore (3) and Glenn Abbott (2)...Gonzales and Langston are the only left-handers in Mariners history with multiple Opening Day starts before turning 29.

WHO ARE THESE GUYS?...**Dee Gordon** and **Marco Gonzales** are the only players remaining on the Mariners active roster from the 2019 Opening Day lineup (**Mitch Haniger** is on the IL)...marks the first time in club history the Mariners have returned 2 or fewer players from the previous year's Opening Day lineup...in addition to Gordon and Gonzales, **Kyle Seager** (6 starts), **Kendall Graveman** (2 starts) and **Mallex Smith** (1 start) are the only other members of the Mariners roster that have made a start on Opening Day.

HISTORICALLY GOOD...the Mariners are 12-3 over their last 15 Opening Days and have limited their opponents to 3 runs or fewer in 12 of their last 13 Opening Day games (2007-c)...the Mariners are 26-17 (.605) all-time on Opening Day, the 2nd-best winning percentage in the Majors, trailing only the New York Mets (38-20, .655).

LEGACY...with **Yusei Kikuchi** being named to Seattle's roster, the Mariners have had a Japanese-born player on their active roster in 23 consecutive seasons, dating back to 1998...Kikuchi became the 10th Japanese-born player (6th pitcher) to appear with the Mariners last season.

SUMMER CAMP RECAP...the Mariners played 12 intrasquad games at T-Mobile Park during Mariners Summer Camp...**Kyle Lewis** led the way on offense, batting .435 (10x23) with 4 home runs, 7 RBI and 5 walks in 9 games...**Justin Sheffield** was a standout for the pitching staff, tossing 9.0 innings and allowing just 1 run (1.00 ERA) with no walks and 13 strikeouts over 3 outings.

AS YOU KNOW...The Mariners have won 26 of 43 Opening Days since their inaugural season in 1977, registering a .605 winning percentage in lid-lifting affairs...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...the 26 wins are tied for the 3rd-most Opening Day victories in that time span with Chicago-AL, trailing only the Mets (32-11/.744) and Orioles (28-15/.651)?

ABOUT GONZALES...

- 28-year-old left-hander is making his first start of the season, 86th career appearance (78th career start) and his 8th career appearance (7th career start) vs. Houston, tonight at Minute Maid Park.
- Acquired by Seattle from St. Louis in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill on July 21, 2017.
- Native of Fort Collins, CO...attended Gonzaga University for 3 years (2011-13).
- Originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball program.
- Made his MLB debut with Cardinals on June 25, 2014 at Colorado.
- Went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (3 ER, 6.0 IP) with 4 strikeouts and 2 walks with St. Louis in the 2014 postseason...earned 2 wins in the NLDS vs. Los Angeles, becoming the 4th rookie in post-season history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002).

FOR OPENERS......is set to make his second consecutive Opening Day start...made first career Opening Night start on 3/20/19 vs. OAK in Opening Series in Tokyo...was winning pitcher, allowing 3 ER in 6.0 IP.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...made 3 Cactus League starts, tied for most on the team with Yusei Kikuchi...went 0-3 with a 7.71 ERA (6 ER, 7.0 IP) with 4 walks and 8 strikeouts.

SUMMER CAMP RECAP...made 2 starts in Mariners Summer Camp, going 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA (4 ER, 5.2 IP)...tossed 4.0 innings in his last start, allowing 2 runs with no walks and 3 strikeouts.

THE NEW DEAL...signed a 4-year contract extension with the Mariners through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025 on Feb. 3, 2020.

'19 RECAP...went 16-13 with a career-best 3.99 ERA (90 ER, 203 IP) with 56 walks and 147 strikeouts...posted career-highs in wins (16), starts (34), innings pitched (203.0) and strikeouts (147)...finished the season with 3.4 fWAR, 19th among American League pitchers.

ELITE...since 2018, ranks 9th among American League pitching leaders in Fan-Graphs WAR with a mark of 7.1, trailing only Gerrit Cole (13.4), Justin Verlander (13.0), Lance Lynn (9.5), Mike Clevinger (8.7), Trevor Bauer (8.5), Shane Bieber (8.3) and Jose Berrios (7.5).

FINISH STRONG...made 4 consecutive starts of at least 7.0 innings pitched and 2 or fewer earned runs to end the 2019 season...during that span, went 2-2 with a 1.60 ERA (5 ER, 28.0 IP) with 19 strikeouts and 7 walks...previously, the last Mariner with at least 4 straight starts of 7.0-or-more innings pitched and 2-or-fewer earned runs allowed was Félix Hernández when he set the Major League record with 16 such consecutive starts in 2014 (5/18-8/11).

CAREER...in 5 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c), is 34-25 with a 4.25 ERA (211 ER, 447.0 IP) with 121 walks and 356 strikeouts in 85 games (77 starts).

BULLDOG ROOTS...played 3 seasons (2011-13) with the Gonzaga Bulldogs, compiling a career record of 26-7 with a 2.34 ERA while recording 9 complete games and 4 shutouts...tallied 278 strikeouts over 303.2 innings of work...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball program when he was selected 19th overall by St. Louis in 2013...shared West Coast Conference Player of the Year honors with the Cubs' Kris Bryant (University of San Diego) as a freshman in 2011 and as a junior in 2013...in 2013, earned John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year honors as well as WCC Co-Player of the Year for the 2nd time in his career.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER (0-0, ---)

27-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 1st start of the season tomorrow at Houston...made only 1 abbreviated Major League start last season, missing the majority of the year recovering from Tommy John Surgery...tossed 1.0 scoreless inning in his lone start on 9/29/19 vs. SD...CAREER: was originally selected by the Mariners in the 1st round (43rd overall) out of Yucaipa High School (CA)...has appeared in parts of 7 Major League seasons with the Mariners (2013-16) and Diamondbacks (2017-19), going 31-31 with a 3.95 ERA (232 ER, 528.1 IP) with 165 walks and 478 strikeouts in 97 career games (94 starts)...vs. HOU: Is scheduled to make his 13th career start against the Astros tomorrow...is 5-4 with a 4.57 ERA (31 ER, 61.0 IP) with 18 walks and 66 strikeouts in 12 career appearances against Houston.

2020 SPRING TRAINING REVIEW

CACTUS LEAGUE...the Mariners were 6-12 (.333) in Cactus League play before Spring Training was ended short due to the Coronavirus pandemic...they went 2-7 when playing as the home team and 4-5 on the road.

HITTERS...In 18 games in Arizona, the Mariners slashed a combined .243/.317/.395 (.713 OPS) with 79 runs scored, 74 RBI, 55 extra-base hits, 22 stolen bases and 144 hits...they were led by **Tim Lopes** (.440, 11x25, 5 doubles and 7 RBI), **J.P. Crawford** (.400, 10x25, 2 triples and 5 RBI) and **José Marmolejos** (.233, 7x30, 18 total bases, 2 home runs and 8 RBI).

PITCHERS...In 18 games in Arizona, the Mariners posted a 4.95 ERA (86 ER, 156.1 IP), striking out 181 batters while holding opponents to a .239 batting average...**Brandon Brennan** thrived over 5 games, not allowing a run and striking out 5 over 5.2 IP...**Justus Sheffield** threw well in 3 games, posting a 2.25 ERA over 8.0 innings, striking out 12, which ranked T-10th in Cactus League play.

LOPES ROPES...prior to the suspension of Spring Training, **Tim Lopes** was tied for the Cactus League lead with 5 doubles, joined by Oakland's Seth Brown, Eric Campbell and San Francisco's Darin Ruf...he had also driven in 7 runs and stolen 2 bases in 11 games.

CRAWFORD, DRIVEN TOUGH...**J.P. Crawford** was enjoying a strong Spring at the dish as he was slashing .400/.429/.560 (.989 OPS) with 2 triples, 5 RBI and 2 stolen bases...he was one of only eight players in MLB to record at least 2 triples this Spring, joining ARI-Ben DeLuzio (3), PIT-J.T. Riddle (2), OAK-Franklin Barreto (2), TEX-Scott Heineman (2), SD-Abraham Almonte, BAL-Yusniel Diaz and NYM-Amed Rosario.

YES WAY, JOSÉ!...signed as a minor league free agent in November 2019, **José Marmolejos** made quite the impression before Spring Training was suspended, leading the Mariners with 18 total bases, 2 home runs and 8 RBI...in fact, 6 of his 7 hits in Spring Training went for extra bases (3 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs).

BOMBS AWAY...the Mariners had homered in 5 consecutive games, dating back to March 5, prior to the suspension of Spring Training...during that span, **Kyle Lewis** (2), **José Marmolejos** (2), **Donovan Walton** (1), **Jake Fraley** (1) and **Tom Murphy** have each chipped in with at least one home run.

2020 SUMMER CAMP REVIEW

WELCOME, CAMPERS...as the Mariners prepared for the resumption of the 2020 Major League Baseball regular season, they held Summer Camp workouts in Seattle from July 3-22...the Mariners played 12 intrasquad games at T-Mobile Park prior to Opening Day...playing as the Seattle Steelheads (a Negro league baseball team that played in the West Coast Negro Baseball League in 1946) and the Seattle Pilots (the city's first MLB team that played in Washington in 1969 as an expansion team, and then moved to Milwaukee prior to the 1970 season), several players had standout performances.

LAYING DOWN THE LEW...outfielder **Kyle Lewis** led the Mariners at the plate in Summer Camp, batting .435 while launching 4 home runs and recording 7 RBI.

STEADY EVAN...paired with some stellar defense at first base, **Evan White** hit .310 (9x29) in Summer Camp, including 2 home runs and 4 RBI.

2020 DRAFT CLASS...following the 2020 MLB Draft (June 10-11), the Mariners invited four of their six draft picks to Summer Camp...2nd round draft pick **Zach DeLoach** and 3rd round draft pick **Kaden Polcovich** made appearances in games during Summer Camp while 1st round draft pick **Emerson Hancock** and 4th round draft pick **Tyler Keenan** participated in workouts...all 4 players remain on the Mariners 60-man player pool.

WHILE WE WERE AWAY...

JACKIE ROBINSON DAY...on April 15, the Mariners celebrated the day Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier in Major League Baseball in 1947...in honor of Jackie Robinson Day, Mariners **Dee Gordon**, **Mallex Smith** and **Shed Long Jr.**, joined by former Mariner **Harold Reynolds** and Negro Leagues Baseball Museum President **Bob Kendrick** held a roundtable discussion on Robinson's influence on baseball and society. The conversation was moderated by Mariners announcer **Dave Sims** and is available on the Mariners YouTube channel.

FRED HUTCH...on April 23, Seattle Mariners second baseman **Dee Gordon** was named recipient of the 55th Annual Hutch Award. Gordon was chosen for his commitment to helping his community through various philanthropic efforts including the Flash of Hope program to help children and families affected by domestic violence.

2020 MLB DRAFT...from June 10-11, the Seattle Mariners selected six player in the MLB Draft: RHP **Emerson Hancock** (RHP, Georgia, 6th overall), **Zach DeLoach** (OF, Texas A&M, 43rd overall), **Connor Phillips** (RHP, McLennan CC, 64th overall), **Kaden Polcovich** (INF, Oklahoma State, 78th overall), **Tyler Keenan** (INF, Ole Miss, 107th overall) and **Taylor Dollard** (RHP, Cal Poly, 137th overall).

GONZALES' PEANUT BUTTER DRIVE...on May 15, **Marco and Monica Gonzales** kicked off the Gonzales Family Peanut Butter Drive, an online fundraiser to help Northwest Harvest meet the increasing demand for nutritious food. The Gonzales Family Peanut Butter Drive raised \$54,173, which will help provide meals for over 500,000 children in Washington state facing food insecurity.
