THE WORD ON THE 'BIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals and Minnesota Twins play the second game of a three-game weekend Interleague series today at Target Field in a rematch of the 1987 World Series ... Last night's wild 9-8 loss featured four lead changes, five home runs, 10 ABS challenges (8 overturned), and a 29-minute rain delay ... St. Louis is 2-2 on their six-game road trip through Queens (2-2) and Minnesota (0-1).

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters today in 2nd place in the NL Central, 5.0 games back of Milwaukee ... The Cardinals have dropped their last two games, despite holding leads in both, following their six-game win streak.

ON BASE MACHINE: Iván Herrera has reached base safely multiple times in 41 games this season, tied with Taylor Ward and James Wood for 3rd-most in MLB this season behind Nick Kurtz (45) and Shohei Ohtani (42) ... Herrera's 41 games of reaching base safely 2+ times are most by a Cardinal in the first 67 games of a season since 2008 Albert Pujols (42).

WE'RE GOING STREAKING!: Red-hot Alec Burleson is currently enjoying homer, RBI, and runs scored streaks, all career highs:

- The 2025 NL Silver Slugger has gone yard in a four straight (June 9-present), MLB's longest active homer streak, longest by a Cardinal since Nolan Arenado went yard in five consecutive (May 12-16, 2023) and longest by a St. Louis left-handed batter since Matt Carpenter's six-game homer binge from July 14-21 (G2), 2018) ... Only three Major Leaguers this season have homered in five straight: Kyle Schwarber (May 7-12), Spencer Torkelson (April 22-26), and Munetaka Murakami (April 17-22).
- Burleson is riding a 12-game hitting streak (17-49, .347/.407/.735) since May 30, matching Chase Meidroth for MLB's 2nd-longest active behind Zack Gelof (16 games).
- The 27-year-old Charlotte native has scored a run in a seven consecutive games (June 5-present), MLB's longest active and one shy of matching an MLB-best eight-game run-scoring streaks this season (4 players).

BREAKING OUT: Among all qualified Major Leaguers from both 2025 to 2026, 24-year-old Jordan Walker boasts the largest increases across all of Major League Baseball in home runs (+11), slugging pct. (+.252), wOBA (+.134), and Isolated Power (+.167) while ranking 2nd in batting average (+.085) and OBP (+.078) - Statcast

• Among qualified MLB right-handed hitting outfielders this season, Walker leads in hits (78), total bases (145), wOBA (.394), & wRC+ (155) while ranking 2nd in extra-base hits (33), slugging (.558), bWAR (3.4) & RBI (55), and T-2nd in homers (17) ... Minnesota's Byron Buxton leads in homers (21), extra-base hit (33), slugging (.585), isolated power (.320), and ranks 2nd in total bases (141) and wOBA (.388) ... Walker and Buxton share the MLB lead in OPS (.913).

• Walker (17-10) & Washington's James Wood (19-12) are the only two Major Leaguers in 2026 with 15+ HR & 10+ SB.

RBI GUYS: After last night's game, Jordan Walker (55 RBI) and Alec Burleson (50 RBI) became the first pair of Cardinals teammates with 50 or more RBI in the first 67 games of a season since 1B Albert Pujols (55) and 3B Scott Rolen (51) in 2003 ... St. Louis and Houston are the only two MLB teams with teammates ranking in the Top 10 in RBI: Walker (2nd), Yordan Alvarez, (54, 3rd), and Burleson (T-6th) Christian Walker (49, T-9th) ... The last Cardinals duo to finish a season in MLB's Top 10 in RBI was 2022 with NL MVP Paul Goldschmidt (115, 4th) and Nolan Arenado (103, T-7th).

SCHOOL COLORS: Cardinals of NCAA Division 1 College Baseball World Series participants that kicked off play yesterday include C Jimmy Crooks (Oklahoma), 2B JJ Wetherholt (West Virginia), and television play-by-play announcer Chip Caray (Georgia).

MINNESOTA CONNECTIONS

Cardinals.TV Director of Cardinals telecasts for over 30 years, Tom Mee's father, Tom, was the first employee hired by the Twins in the fall of 1960...later served as the Twins director of media relations until 1991, then he became the team's official scorer...inducted into the Twins Hall of Fame in 2013.

Cardinals Bench Coach Daniel Descalso signed with the Twins as a free agent in 2021 and played in 24 games for their Triple-A affiliate St. Paul.

Cardinals broadcaster John Rooney was a Twins broadcaster in 1987...has been the PxP voice for four World Series championship teams: 1987 Twins, 2005 White Sox, & 2006 & 2011 Cardinals.

Cardinals.TV Analyst Brad Thompson signed with the Twins as a minor league free agent in 2012 and made four appearances (1 start) for their Double-A affiliate New Britain.

Twins Manager Derek Shelton was born in Carbondale, Ill...caught four seasons (1989-92) at Southern Illinois University.

Hall of Famer Joe Mauer and current Twins Special Assistant/Twins.TV Analyst Justin Morneau represented Minnesota in the 2009 All-Star Game at Busch Stadium.

Twins Baseball Research Director Dane Sorensen worked parts of eight seasons (2012-19) in a similar role in the Cardinals Baseball Operations Dept.

Josh Bell's sister, Joy, is a communications professor at Webster University in St. Louis.

Twins Data Quality Engineer John Edman's brother Tommy Edman played for St. Louis for parts of five seasons (2019-23).

Cardinals Hall of Famer Tommy Herr was traded by St. Louis to the Twins for Tom Brunansky (April 22, 1988)...played in 86 games for the Twins.

Cardinals Assistant GM/Scouting Director Randy Flores pitched in 11 games for the Twins in 2010.

Hall of Famer Jim Kaat pitched his final four seasons in St. Louis from 1980-83 and was a member of the 1982 World Series championship team.

In the 2014 All-Star Game at Target Field, 2026 Cardinals Hall of Famer inductee Yadier Molina was selected as a reserve for the NL squad along with teammate Matt Carpenter, while Adam Wainwright was selected as the NL starting pitcher.

Twins Major League Field Coor. Toby Gardenhire played baseball at SW Missouri St. and the Univ. of Ill.

Minnesota Strength Coach Aaron Rhodes worked six seasons (2016-21) in the Cardinals minor league organization...also interned with the St. Louis Blues prior to the Cardinals.

Twins MLB.com Supervising Reporter Matthew Leach covered the Cardinals for MLB.com from 2002-11.

Twins Hall of Famer Gary Gaetti played in 380 games for the Cardinals from 1996-98...was selected by St. Louis in the 4th round of the January 1978 amateur draft, but did not sign...was born in Centralia, Ill.

Hall of Famer Paul Molitor was selected by St. Louis in the 28th round of the 1974 MLB Draft, but did not sign.

Cardinals Social Media Manager Daniel Venn is a native of Cannon Falls, Minn...Graduated from Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, Minn.

Twins Executive VP, Chief Revenue Officer Sean Moore earned his marketing degree from Western Illinois University & his master's in brand communication from the University of Illinois.

Twins Communications Intern Brady Motes previously worked as a Cardinals communications gameday associate in 2025.

The Cardinals & Twins played a two-game Exhibition series (Apr. 2-3) at Target Field before the 2010 season.

The Twins defeated the Cardinals, 4-3, in the 1987 World Series...was first Fall Classic in history in which the home team won every game...notable Cardinals to appear included Cardinals Hall of Famers Willie McGee, Ozzie Smith, Vince Coleman, José Oquendo, & Tom Herr, and broadcaster Ricky Horton.

TODAY'S GAME:

- The 26-year-old Cardinals Opening Day starter makes his team-leading 14th start of the season this afternoon. Today's game marks his 134th career Major League appearance and his 67th career start.
- Next win will be his 20th career.
- Since May 1, ranks 2nd among Cardinals pitchers (May, 44) and ranks 7th among N.L. southpaws with 42 strikeouts. Only Chris Sale (11.22, ATL) and Cristopher Sanchez (10.70, PHI) have a highest K/9 IP over that period than Liberatore (10.50) among N.L. port-siders.
- Has faced the Twins twice in his career. Once as a starting pitcher at Busch Stadium in 2023 and as a reliever at Target Field in 2024.
- Tied for 2nd in the National League with three pick-offs; most pick-offs by a Cardinals pitcher since **Lance Lynn** (4, 2015) and by a southpaw since **Mark Mulder** (5, 2005).
- Sports a 3-3 record, but the Cardinals are 9-4 in his 13 starts this season, including a 6-2 mark in games he's started at Busch Stadium
- Is 0-2 with a 5.55 ERA against American League clubs this season, last win against the junior circuit was 9/3/25 vs. the Athletics.
- The Cardinals are 18-15 in his 33 career starts at Busch Stadium, where he has gone 12-10 with a 4.03 ERA (163.0 IP/73 ER) with 10 quality starts (all 10 starts with 6.0 IP or more).

LAST TIME OUT (Saturday, June 6 vs Cincinnati): ND, W, 6-5; 4.1 IP, 4 H, 5 R, 3 ER, HR, 3 BB, 4 SO; 84 pitches

- Was cruising along until a fielding error with the bases loaded led to a three-run 3rd inning snapping his scoreless streak at 11.1 IP. A Matt McLain 2-run home run in the 4th inning turned a 3-0 lead into a 5-3 deficit.
- Departed with one out in the 4th inning as Gordon Graceffo ended the threat, stranding a pair of runners.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

SUNDAY FUNDAY: Had his deepest start (5.1 IP) since a 6.0 inning effort on 5/7 at SD and led the Cardinals to a series win over the Cubs on NBC Sunday Night Baseball in his 5-1 win vs Chicago on 5/31.

K-CLUB: Libby notched single-game career highs for strikeouts in consecutive starts when he fanned 9 on 5/19 vs. PIT and then he bettered that with 10 K's on Memorial Day (5/25) at MIL; He and Brewers starter Jacob Misiorowski (12) combined for 22 strikeouts in the 5/25 game.

LIBBY & LEFTY: Recorded 38 strikeouts in May, the most by a Cardinals lefty in the month of May since Hall of Famer **Steve "Lefty" Carlton** fanned 52 in May, 1970.

SLAMMED: Took the loss in Sacramento (5/13) allowing his first career grand slam (**Nic Kurtz**) in a 4-3 loss, coming during an inning where he threw a career-high 43 pitches.

FRIAR FRYER: Earned his 2nd straight win holding the Padres (5/7) to one run over 6.0 innings in a 2-1 come-from-behind win at Petco Park. Recorded his 300th career strikeout fanning **Nick Castellanos** in the 5th inning.

HR DERBY: Surrendered a career-high 3 HR's in 3.1 IP vs. SEA (4/25) as the two teams combined for 33 hits and 8 HR's in 11-9 Mariners win.

SPACE DUST: Worked a season high 6.0 IP, allowing just one run on three hits, taking a ND in the Cardinals 7-5 extra inning win on 4/19 at HOU to complete the series sweep of the Astros.

FIRST TO 100: Threw a career high 105 pitches in 9-3 loss vs. CLE on 4/13 in 5.0 IP; He was the first Cardinals pitcher to reach the 100 pitch plateau.

NO FOOLING: Held the Mets to one run in his second start on April Fools Day, a day after **Andre Pallante** and company shut out New York. Retired the first 12 Mets batters (first time a Cardinal vs. NYM since 1968) and carried a no-hitter through 4.2 innings, longest of his career.

LIBBY'S LID-LIFTER: Made his 1st career Opening Day start and received a no decision vs. TB (3/26) despite pitching 5.0 innings and allowing just one run. Cardinals rallied for a 9-7 win (he exited with game tied 1-1).

LEFTY LIFT-OFFS: Made his 1st career Opening Day start on 3/26 vs. TB, becoming the 1st Cardinals lefty to start on Opening Day since **Donovan Osborne** (4/5/99) vs. MIL - the same year that Libby was born. He became one of just 16 LHP's to make the Opening Day start for the Cardinals since 1901 (MLB).

CAREER:

- Chose to switch to uniform No. 32 prior to 2026 season in honor of Hall of Fame left-handed pitcher **Sandy Koufax**, whom he grew up admiring.
- Was acquired by the Cardinals from the Rays in a four-player trade in 2020 that included Randy Arozarena, with a compensation pick that netted the Cardinals RHP **Tink Hence**.
- Is a career 16-24 with a 4.77 ERA (315.0 IP) in his 65 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA (81.0 IP) in 67 career relief appearances.
- 2021 Cardinals Minor League Pitcher of the Year, his first season of play in the Cardinals organization.

LIBERATORE vs. MINNESOTA:

- Making his 2nd career start and 3rd appearance vs. the Twins. Will be his first start at Target Field, only pitching in relief in 2024.
- Is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA over 6.2 innings vs. MIN. The Twins are the only A.L. Central team he has yet to earn a win against (4/30/24 at DET; 8/9/24 at KC; 6/17/25 at CWS & 6/29/25 at CLE).
- All of his wins vs. A.L. Central opponents have come on the road (4-1, 2.17 ERA, 8 app., 4 GS, 29.0 IP).
- Only start vs. MIN was at Busch Stadium (8/3/23), tossed 5.2 innings allowing 5 R in Cardinals 5-3 loss opposing Sonny Gray. Allowed home runs to Ryan Jeffers and Michael A. Taylor.
- Appeared in relief at Target Field (8/24/24) tossing a scoreless inning in a 6-0 loss; this time Sonny Gray was starting for the Cardinals.
