# PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (62-34) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (48-48) July 19, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - GAME \#97/HOME \#47 RHP AARON NOLA (11-4, 3.38 ERA) vs. LLP MARTíN PÉREZ (1-5, 5.15 ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...have won four straight games (had a season-high five straight wins to open the 2024 season from $3 / 28$ to 4/1)...Are back at .500 for the first time since being $14-14$ on 4/27...Have won 10 games in their last at-bat, matching their total from all of 2023 (the team won 13 games in the final at-bat of 2022)...Have gone $36-3$ (. 923 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have drawn at least one walk in 61 straight games, which is the longest active streak in MLB (the longest streak for the season is 75 straight games by the Phillies from $4 / 15$ to $7 / 9$ )...Have played in 31 one-run games, which are tied for the second-most among National League teams behind the Cubs (34)...Have the fourth-most quality starts (45) in MLB behind the Mariners (58), Phillies (53) and Royals (48)...Have the third-best ERA (3.52) among all starting rotations in MLB, trailing only the Phillies (3.22) and Mariners (3.36)...Rank second in all of MLB in stolen base percentage ( 83.1 percent), trailing only the Brewers ( 84.7 percent)...Have won seven straight and 10 of their last 11 games when scoring at least four runs...Gained 3.0 games in the standings on the front-running Brewers in the National League Central during their last road trip after going 5-1 against Milwaukee and the White Sox...Have gone 15-2 since the beginning of June when scoring first in a game.

WE WERE ON A BREAK!: The Pirates return to action tonight riding a four-game winning streak, which is the longest since opening the 2024 campaign by winning each of their first five games from March 28 to April 1...Beginning with their win against the Reds on June 25, Pittsburgh's 11-7 record is tied with the Twins for the fourth-best in all of MLB...The only three teams to post a better record during that time are the Astros (12-6), Mets (12-7) and Red Sox (10-6).

PACK PNC: Last year the Pirates had a total attendance of 107,151 (35,717 average) for their three-game series against the Phillies at PNC Park from July 28-30...The paid attendance of 38,434 for the July 29 game against the Phillies was the second-largest of the 2023 home campaign for the Pirates (the only home game with a higher attendance in 2023 was on April 7 against the White Sox in the Home Opener).

IN GOOD COMPANY: Over his last 30 games, Bryan Reynolds owns an OPS of 1.002 with five game-winning RBI...The last Pirate to have a 30 -game stretch with an OPS of 1.000 or better including at least five game-winning RBI was Andrew McCutchen in May-June, 2015...Special thanks to StatsPerform.

MAKE THAT A DOUBLE: Andrew McCutchen has doubled in each of the last three games...lt's the first time McCutchen has recorded an extra base hit in three straight games since doing so from Sepember 21-23, 2021...The 37-year-old McCutchen ranks fifth all-time in Pirates history with 594 extra base hits...McCutchen's 783 extra base hits are also the fourth-most among active players behind Freddie Freeman (864), Joey Votto (837) and Paul Goldschmidt (802).

PHILTY NUMBERS: Pittsburgh's pitching staff recorded a 2.88 ERA to help the

 this year from April 11-14...The Bucs are 41-28 all-time against the Phillies at PNC Park (the Pirates took two of three games against the Phillies at PNC Park last year from July 28-30)...Since the beginning of last season, six of the 10 games between Pittsburgh and Philadelphia have been decided by one run...That is the highest rate of one-run games between the Pirates and any opponent over that span.

THE MEN BEHIND THE MASK: Joey Bart homered and had three RBI in the finale of the first half of the season Sunday against the White Sox...Pittsburgh's catchers rank fifth in the National League and tied for 11th in MLB with 48 RBI...The only four National League teams whose catchers have driven in more runs are the Brewers (61), Dodgers (59), Padres (57) and Braves (49).

A STARRY NIGHT: Tuesday night 's All-Star Game marked only 66 days since Paul Skenes pitched his first game for the Pirates on May 11...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, only one player started an All-Star Game fewer days after his Major League debut... That was Joe DiMaggio, who started in right field for the American League in 1936 just 65 days after his MLB debut.

JULY HIGHLIGHTS: Pittsburgh comes into today with the fifth-best ERA (3.13) in all of MLB for the month of July...The only four teams with a lower ERA are the Cubs (2.58), Mariners (2.61), Braves (2.79) and Rangers (3.03)...The pitching staff has surrendered the fewest home runs (eight) in all of MLB (the Mariners have allowed 10, which are the second-fewest)...Offensively, Pittsburgh's 21 home runs are the sixth-most in MLB (Cincinnati leads with 29)...The Bucs are tied for seventh in all of MLB and rank fifth among all National League teams in runs scored (69) this month.

HOW ACQUIRED: Signed by Pittsburgh as a free agent on January 5, 2024

STARTING OFF: The 33-year-old lefthander is in his 13th Major League season, having played for the Rangers (2012-18; 2022-23), Twins (2019), Red Sox (2020-21) and Pirates (2024)...He was named an American League All-Star with the Rangers during the 2022 season...Tonight will be his 15th start of the season for the Pirates and his 303 rd career appearance on a Major League mound (excluding Postseason)...A native of Guanare, Venezuela, Perez was signed by the Rangers as an international free agent as a 16 -year-old on July 2, 2007.

He made one rehab start with Triple-A Indianapolis on June 22 vs. lowa (CHC), allowing two runs (one earned run) on five hits with four strikeouts and no walks over 5.0 innings of work ( 63 pitches, 41 strikes).

LAST TIME OUT: Took the loss on July 10 at Milwaukee after allowing five runs on nine hits with five strikeouts against three walks in 4.2 innings pitched.

GOING DEEP: He has pitched into the eighth inning twice this season: 7.1 innings on July 4 vs. St. Louis and 8.0 innings on April 9 vs. Detroit.

HOME COOKING: Has posted a 3.89 ERA (16 ER in 37.0 IP) in seven starts at PNC Park this season compared to a 6.44 ERA ( 26 ER in 36.1 IP) in seven starts on the road.

REACHING MILESTONES: In his outing on June 28 at Atlanta, Perez made his 300th career Major League appearance, making him the 15th active player to have made $300+$ appearances and $250+$ starts and the sixth lefthander to do so, joining Clayton Kershaw, Chris Sale, Wade Miley, Patrick Corbin and Jose Quintana.

- Along with 300 appearances, Perez also eclipsed 1500.0 career innings pitched in that start, making him just the ninth Venezuelan-born pitcher in Major League history to record $300+$ appearances and 1,500+ innings pitched, joining Felix Hernandez, Johan Santana, Anibal Sanchez, Carlos Zambrano, Carlos Carrasco, Freddy Garcia, Wilson Alvarez and Kelvim Escobar.

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF: At the time of his injury on May 26 vs. Atlanta, Perez ranked among the NL leaders in opponents grounded into double plays per 9.0 IP (1st, 1.41), opponents grounded into double plays (T2nd, 9) and pitches per batter faced (5th, 3.62) [min. 50.0 IP ...stats represent start of the season thru May 26].

VS. PHILADELPHIA: Perez will be making his 10th career appearance and ninth start against the Phillies tonight... He owns a 4-1 record with a 2.96 ERA (16 ER in 48.2 IP) in his nine career outing against Philadelphia.

His last start against the Phillies was on April 2, 2023 at Globe Life Field as a member of the Rangers, earning the win after he allowed just one run on eight hits with seven strikeouts against one walk in 5.2 innings pitched.

2023 RECAP: Split the season between the starting rotation and bullpen for the World-Champion Rangers...Ranked in the 71st percentile in groundball percentage according to Baseball Savant, inducing opposing hitters into 18 grounded into double plays, which were tied for the seventh-most in the American League (his 1.14 grounded into double plays per 9.0 innings also ranked third among American League pitchers with at least 100.0 innings pitched).

- Appeared in three postseason games for Texas last year, including a relief appearance in Game 2 of the World Series.
Made two starts while pitching for Venezuela in the World Baseball Classic.
