THE CHIPPER JONES TRAIL: The St. Louis Cardinals continue a seven-game road trip through New York (0-4) and Atlanta (0-1) through the Easter holiday weekend, arguably two cities Braves' Hall of Famer **Chipper Jones** loved to play. The Cardinals fell to the Braves last night 7-6 after holding a 3-2 lead into the bottom of the 8th inning. Tonight, the Cardinals play the second of a three-game series against the Braves. The Cardinals have lost five straight games. St. Louis opens today in 4th place 4.5 games behind first place Chicago.

SIX IS A SERIOUS NUMBER: The Cardinals have lost five straight games for the first time this season and since Aug. 10-14, 2024. Dating back to Pittsburgh on April 9, the Cardinals have lost six straight road games, the first time since May 28-June 6, 2023 (CLE 1, PIT 3, TEX 2). The last time St. Louis dropped seven straight road games was May 28-June 8, 2017 when they lost eight games (COL 1, CHI 3, CIN 4).

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS OF THE FIFTH KIND: In five one-run games this season, the Cardinals are 0-5. The Athletics are the only other team without a win in a one-run game at 0-4.

MUST BE SOMETHING IN THE WATER: Last night, Powder Springs, Ga., native **Victor Scott II** went 3-for-4 with a double, stolen base and two RBI. The last time the Cardinals had an Atlanta native play their first game at Truist Park, **Jordan Walker** was 3-for-4 with a double and a home run on Sept. 5, 2023.

WINN ACTIVATED; SIANI OPTIONED: Shortstop **Masyn Winn** was activated from the 10-day Injured List (lower back spasms) today and OF **Michael Siani** was optioned to Memphis (AAA). Winn was 2-for-11 in his three injury rehabilitation games. He struck out three times in his first game, homered in his first two at-bats in his second game and walked twice in his first two plate appearances in his third game. St. Louis was 3-6 in his absence while shortstops **Brendan Donovan** and **Thomas Saggese** batted .395 (15-38) with seven doubles and five RBI in Winn's absence.

"THERE GOES THE PERFECT GAME...": **Lars Nootbaar** drew a lead-off walk to begin Sunday's game marking the 7th time this season he has "broken up a perfect game" as the first batter. Nootbaar's seven games with lead-off walks in March-April are the most in Major League Baseball this season and rank T-2nd all-time. With two more in the Cardinals final nine games in April, Nootbaar would set the MLB record for the early combined months, surpassing **Davey Lopes** (1975).

DONNY, YOU'RE OUT OF YOUR ELEMENT: **Brendan Donovan** continues his hot start leading the National League with 32 hits and a .356 batting average. Donovan ran off a career-high 14-game hit streak (Apr. 4-18), the 2nd-longest streak in MLB this season (**Jacob Wilson**, ATH, 15). Donovan's 32 hits in March/April is eight behind **Paul DeJong's** 40 for the franchise record set in 2019. Donovan currently ranks tied for 14th. (see chart left)

BARNSTORMIN' GORMAN: Cardinals infielder **Nolan Gorman** scored a run in the 2nd inning giving him a run scored in seven straight games at Truist Park. Gorman's streak at the Battery is the longest active and the 5th-longest all-time by an opposing player behind **Juan Soto** (9), **Trevor Story** (8), **J.D. Martinez** (8) and **Giancarlo Stanton** (8).

FOREVER YOUNG: With a victory on April 16 vs. Houston, 38-year old **Oliver Marmol**, the youngest manager in MLB, earned his 256th career managerial win, passing **Roger Bresnahan** (1909-12) for 14th all-time in franchise history. **Eddie Stanky** (1952-55) ranks next on the Cardinals managerial list in 13th place with 260 wins.

ATLANTA CONNECTIONS

Cardinals broadcaster **Chip Caray** previously was the play-by-play voice of the Braves for 20 seasons on Bally Sports South and Bally Sports Southeast (2010-22). TBS and Peachtree TV (2005-2009) and on TBS and the Atlanta Braves Radio Network (1991-1992)....his father, **Skip Caray**, was part of Braves broadcasts from 1978-2008.

Jordan Walker was born in Stone Mountain, Ga.... Graduated from Decatur (Ga.) High School, where he was a 2019 and 2020 Gatorade High School Player of the Year.

Victor Scott II was born in Atlanta....graduated from McEachern High School in Powder Springs, Ga....resides in Powder Springs Ga....grew up a fan of the Atlanta Braves.

Rodderly Muñoz is the middle child if triplets. His older brother, **Roldy Muñoz**, pitches for Columbus (AA) in the Atlanta Braves organization... Rodderly was originally signed by Atlanta as an International Free Agent (June 11, 2018).

JoJo Romero (Aug. 21, 2020 at Truist) and **Jon Jay** (April 26, 2010 at Busch III) made their MLB debut vs. the Braves.

Kyle Leahy's uncle, **Thomas Leahy**, pitched in the Braves minor league organization (1991-93).

Brian Snitker was born in Decatur, Ill....graduated from Macon (Ill.) High School...managed **Adam Wainwright** on the 2003 Greenville Braves.

Hall of Fame Manager **Joe Torre** played for & managed both the Cardinals (1969-74 & 1990-95) and Braves (1966-68 & 1982-84)...traded to St. Louis from Atlanta for **Orlando Cepeda** (Mar. 17, 1969).

Braves pitching coach **Rick Kranitz** was originally selected by the Cardinals in the 3rd round of the 1977 MLB January Draft, but did not sign.

Austin Riley made his MLB debut vs. the Cardinals (May 19, 2019 at Truist Park)...homered off Michael Wacha that night for his first MLB hit.

Pierce Johnson pitched three seasons (2010-12) at Missouri State University...set the school's single-season record with 119 strikeouts in 2012.

Hall of Fame catcher **Ted Simmons** played his final three seasons with Atlanta (1986-88).

Marcell Ozuna played two seasons with St. Louis (2018-19)...originally became a Cardinal via trade with Miami for **Sandy Alcantara**, **Daniel Castano**, **Zac Gallen**, & **Magneuris Sierra** (Dec. 14, 2017)...as compensation for Ozuna signing with Atlanta. St. Louis selected **Alec Burleson** in the 2nd round of the 2020 MLB draft.

Braves Bench Coach **Walt Weiss** managed **Nolan Arenado** for four seasons in Colorado (2013-16).

Stubby Clapp played the 2003 season for the Richmond Braves (AAA-Braves).

FanDuel Sports reporter **Hannah Yates** is a native of Oakville, Mo....graduated from the Univ. of Missouri...previously worked at KFNS and KSDK TV.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Making his 5th start of the season tonight, as he makes his 35th career start in his 143rd career game.
- It's his 3rd road start of the season and 2nd on this current road trip; The Cardinals are 0-2 in his two prior road starts (4/6 at BOS & 4/17 at NYM) and 2-0 in his home starts.
- Is 3-6, 4.09 ERA in 16 career road starts; His last road win came on 8/23/24 at MIN (6-1).
- Tonight will be his 2nd career start vs. ATL; Lost 7-1 at Truist Park on 7/5/22 in his 1st career start against the Braves & then made four relief appearances against Atlanta with the last meeting coming on 9/6/23 in relief.
- Since returning to the Cardinals starting rotation on May 26, 2024 he has led the team in wins (10, tied with Sonny Gray), qualifying ERA (3.50) and opponent BA (.228) in 24 starts; He's one of just 17 National League starting pitchers with 10+ wins dating back to his insertion into the rotation last May 26.
- Is leading the MLB with his 67.2 groundball pct. & is ranked 3rd in Groundball/Flyball ratio at 3.75 behind the Dodgers Yoshinobu Yamamoto (4.00) & Angels Jose Soriano (3.82).** Since he started his career in 2022, has the 2nd-best ground ball percentage (66.3%) in MLB trailing only the Mets **Clay Holmes** (66.7%). min. 140 appearances.
- Since moving into the Cardinals starting rotation 5/26/24 he's 5th among NL starters in opponent's slugging pct. (.331); has a .341 Opp. SLG pct. this season.**
- As a starting pitcher in 2024 was 8-7 with a 3.56 ERA over 20 starts after going 0-1 with a 6.30 ERA in nine relief appearances in April.
- Ranked 3rd on the Cardinals with eight wins in 2024 while his 3.78 ERA was the lowest among the club's pitchers with 100 or more innings.

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his 1st loss of the season last Thu. (4/17) at NYM in the opening game of the Cardinals current road trip; threw a season-high 95 pitches over 6.0 IP with all 4 of his runs allowed in the 4-1 defeat coming in the Mets 2nd inning.

2025/CAREER NOTES:

- Made the Cardinals Opening Day Roster for the 4th time (2022-2025).
- Improved his record to 2-0 in a combined 2-0 shutout win over the Philadelphia Phillies 4/11 at Busch Stadium, allowing just 2 hits in his 7.0 IP (93 pitches). After an injury to Masyn Winn, catcher Pedro Pages played 4 innings (2nd thru 5th) of that game at 2nd base.
- Took a no-decision in the Cardinals 5-4 loss in extra innings in Game 1 of 4/6 doubleheader at Boston
- Utilized as a hybrid pitcher during his 2022 rookie season with 47 appearances and 10 starts. Led the Cardinals with 62 relief appearances in 2023. Began the 2024 season in the bullpen, was optioned on April 21, and returned to the rotation on May 26 finishing the season with 20 starts as one of the Cardinals most effective starters.
- Established single-season highs in wins (8), games started (20), innings pitched (121.1), strikeouts (94) and quality starts (7) in 2024.
- His first start came in his 18th career appearance, on June 4, 2022 at Chicago Cubs in the second game of a doubleheader. Threw 4.0 innings allowing one run in a no-decision the Cardinals rallied to win in extra innings (7-4).
- Started vs. San Francisco (June 20, 2024) at Rickwood Field in Birmingham, Ala., tossing 5.1 innings in the 6-5 Cardinals win. Was the first Cardinals starting pitcher to earn a win at a neutral site since Alan Benes vs. San Diego on April 19, 1997 at Aloha Stadium in Honolulu, Hawaii.
- Pitched for Team Italy in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.
- The San Clemente, Calif. native was 4th round (125th player overall) draft selection in 2019 out of University California-Irvine.
- Graduated from San Clemente High School that also produced Cardinals 2021 1st round pick RHP Michael McGreevy and Braves 2015 1st round pick Kolby Allard.

PALLANTE vs. ATLANTA:

- Is making just his 2nd career start and 6th career appearance against the Braves tonight.
- Is 0-1, 12.15 ERA career in his previous 5 appearances against Atlanta, the last on 9/6/23 in relief.
- The Cardinals posted high-scoring wins (10-6 & 11-6) in his last two appearances at Truist Park, both coming in relief on Sept. 5 & 6, 2023.
- His lone career start against Braves came at Truist Park on 7/5/22 in a 7-1 defeat as he allowed a career-high 10 hits, 7 runs & 2 HR's in 3.2 IP.
