**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Mike Passanisi's Giants** and the fifth game (2-2) of a 7-day/6-game homestand that includes a 1-2 series loss vs **LAA** (Fri-Sun).

- The Reds are coming off their first series loss to the **Angels** since 2016.
- Following tomorrow's game vs **SF**, the Reds will head back on the road for a 6-game trip at **Min** (3g, 4/17-4/19) and **TB** (3g, 4/20-4/22).

**MAKE 'EM WORK:** In last night's 2-1 win vs **SF**, the Reds averaged a season-high 5.00 pitches per plate appearance (29pa, 145p)...had not reached that mark in a game since 7/19/24 at **Wsh** (38pa, 190p, 5.00p/pa).

**OUR PAL SAL:** **1b Sal Stewart** has hit safely in 13 of his 17 games this season and reached base in 16 of 17 (18-for-58, .310/.431/.638)...he's been on base 31 times, which ranks T8th in the majors.

- Stewart** ranks among Major League leaders in SLG (7th), OPS (1.069, 7th), and OBP (10th).

**WINS/RUNS:** The Reds have won 10 of their first 17 games despite ranking 27th in the majors with 56 runs scored (**SF** 52, **CWS** 54, **KC** 54).

- 8 of Cin's 10 wins this season have come in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the most such wins in the majors this year.
- The 2025 Reds went 35-38 (.479) in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the ninth-worst record in the majors.
- The Reds have been *held* to 2 runs or fewer 8 times already this season, including last night vs **SF**...they are 5-3 in such games.
- Cin is 4-0 in 1-run games...went 22-22 in 1-run games last year.

**RUNS VIA HOMER:** Of Cin's 56 runs this season, 25 have scored via HR...that 44.6% ranks 6th in the majors.

**MISSED OPPORTUNITIES:** Cin batters rank T5th in the majors with 129 runners left on base...the Reds are 1 of 5 teams in the majors to have stranded at least 10 runners on 5 different occasions (**Sea** 6, **LAA** 6, **Chc** 6, **Pit** 5).

- With runners in scoring position Cin is slashing .171/.301/.302...rank last w/RISP in BA, hits (22), and RBI (31), while ranking near the bottom in SLG (.302, 29th), OPS (.604, 29th) and runs scored (39, 29th).

**HE'S GRRRRRRREAT!:** RHP **Tony Santillan** has yet to allow a run in 8 apps this season (1-0, 8.0ip, 2h, 6bb, 10k)...his 8 scoreless outings rank T2nd among all Major League pitchers.

**SUDDEN SAM:** LHP **Sam Moll** has opened the 2026 season by not allowing a hit to any of his first 35 batters...it's the longest such hitless streak by a Reds pitcher to open a season since 1961.

- Moll's** 8 consecutive hitless relief apps ranks as the second-longest streak by a Reds pitcher to open a season since 1900 (**John Franco** 11g, 1987)

**SWITCH BLADE:** **SS Elly De La Cruz** has homered 4 times in 24 at-bats this season vs left-handed pitchers (.292/.320/.833)...his flyout to center in yesterday's 1st inning off **SF's** LHP **Robbie Ray** traveled 394 feet with an exit velo of 103.4mph (caught at the wall)...in 2025, he hit 5 HR in 199 at-bats vs LHP (.236/.276/.342).

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds and **Giants** are meeting for the first time in 2026 with 3 games here at **Great American Ball Park**...the teams will square off again in August at **Oracle Park** (8/24-8/26).

- Entering 2026, the **Giants** have won 4 of the last 5 series vs Cin.
- The Reds' .549 winning pct (62-51) vs the **Giants** since 2008 is the best mark by any NL opponent vs **SF** over the last 18 seasons.
- The **Giants** have won 7 of the last 12 games vs Cin at **GABP**.
- Beginning 6/29/12 and including the 2012 National League Division Series, the Redlegs have won 25 of 44 meetings at **Oracle Park**.

**EL CABALLO DE HIERRO:** **SS Elly De La Cruz** has appeared in each of Cin's last 235 games, beginning 7/30/24...it's the fifth-longest consecutive games played streak by a Red since 1970 (see box below).

**NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM:** The Reds have avoided being swept in 35 consecutive home series (min. 1g) dating back to 2024, including this one vs **SF**...it's the longest such streak since 9/19/11-9/25/13 when the Reds avoided being swept at **Great American Ball Park** in a franchise-record 52 consecutive home series.

- The Reds avoided being swept in all 26 of their series last year at **GABP**...only the Cin teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being broomed.

# Tonight's Starter

**RHETT LOWDER RHP #25**

**2026 Record: 1-1, 3.31**

Height/Weight: 6'1"/197 | Bats/Throws: R/R  
Born: 3/8/02, Albermarle, NC | Age: 24

**LAST TIME OUT:** Suffered the 8-1 loss on Thu 4/9 at Mia (5.1ip, 8h, 5r/4er, 2bb, 2k, 95 TP).

- Allowed 5 runs, 4 extra-base hits, 9 hard-hit balls (95+ mph EV), 10 base runners, and 22 balls in play - all career highs.
- Was ahead in the count to just 6 of his 26 batters.
- Pitched into the 6th inning (3 BF, 2h, groundout) before turning it over to reliever Brock Burke, who retired both batters he faced...left trailing 5-1.

**APRIL 4 at TEX:** Earned the 2-0 win on Sat at Tex (6.0ip, 3h, 0r/0er, 2bb, 4k, 82TP).

- Was his first win since 9/21/24 vs Pit and his second career quality start (9/5/24 vs Hou).
- Of his 8 career starts, was his fifth in which he pitched at least 5.0 scoreless innings...ties him with Fernando Valenzuela (1981) for the most such outings through his first 8 career starts by any Major League pitcher since 1900.
- His 1.30 ERA after 8 career starts became the fifth-lowest by any Major Leaguer (min. 4ip/start) in that span, and the lowest since Valenzuela's 0.50 in 1981.
- Became the fourth Reds pitcher since the mound moved to its current distance in 1893 to allow 6 hits or fewer in each of his first 8 career starts, joining Tony Cingrani (2013-2014), Scott Williamson (2000), and Rob Bell (2000).

**MARCH 29 vs BOS:** Didn't factor in the decision in the 3-2 win vs Bos on 3/29 (5.0ip, 3h, 2r/2er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr, 86 TP)...was his first Major League appearance since 9/28/24, a span of 547 days.

- Missed the entire 2025 regular season due to injuries (R forearm strain & L oblique strain).
- Had his career-opening 33.2-inning homerless streak snapped after allowing a 2-run HR to Willyer Abreu in the 4th inning...marked the longest streak by a Reds pitcher to begin his career since Tom Browning (55.1ip, 1984-85).
- Became the seventh Reds pitcher since 1893 to allow 6 hits or fewer in each of his first 7 career starts, the first since Tony Cingrani did so in each of his first 24 Major League starts from 2013-2014.

**STILL A ROOKIE:** Still meets rookie qualifications despite entering the season with over a year of service time (1.031).

**SPRING RECAP:** Went 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA in 5 Spring Training appearances (15.0ip, 17h, 10r/6er, 6bb, 18k, 0hr).

- Made his final spring appearance on 3/24 in the 4-1 exhibition loss vs Mil at American Family Field (3.0ip, 4h, 2r/1er, 0bb, 3k, 50 TP).

**2025:**

- Missed the entire 2025 regular season with injuries...began the year on the 15-day injured list with a right forearm strain...made rehab appearances at R-ACL Reds, A-Dayton, and AAA-Louisville...suffered a left oblique strain while rehabbing at Louisville and was transferred to the 60-day IL on 6/4/25.
- Didn't pitch again until he made 4 apps with Peoria in the Arizona Fall League (9ip, 5r/5er, 1bb, 8k, 1bb, 2hr, 2hb, 145 TP)...was selected as an Arizona Fall League Fall Star.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Suffered the 10-2 loss on Fri, 4/10 (5.1ip, 7h, 5r/5er, 4bb, 2k, 2hr, 92TP).

- Allowed 21 batted balls in play, 9 hard-hit balls, 11 base runners, and 2 home runs - all career highs.
- Was ahead in the count to 13 of his 27 batters.
- For the third time in his 3 starts, the Reds plated just 2 runs.

**APRIL 5 at TEX:** Did not factor in the decision in the 2-1 win at Tex on 4/5 (6.0ip, 5h, 1r/1er, 1bb, 9k, 1hr, 87TP).

**TOP PROSPECT:** Enters the season rated as one of the Reds' top prospects per *Baseball America* (#3) and MLB Pipeline (#5)...is considered by *Baseball America* as having the best slider and best control in the Cincinnati system.

**1.91 ERA:** Has pitched to a 1.91 ERA (47ip, 11r/10er) through his first 9 career Major League starts, lowest by a Cin starter in that span since Reds Hall of Famer Tom Browning (1.87, 67.1ip/14er) in 1984-1985.

**A STAR AT WAKE:** After his 2023 junior season at Wake Forest, was named ACC Male Athlete of the Year, ACC Pitcher of the Year for the second straight season, ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, *Baseball America* All-America first team, and Collegiate Baseball All-America first team...was a finalist for the National Pitcher of the Year and Dick Howser Trophy awards and a semifinalist for the Golden Spikes Award.

- He and teammate Chase Burns (2024) are the only pitchers from Wake Forest to win the ACC Pitcher of the Year Award.

**PERSONAL:** Graduated from North Stanly HS in New London, NC where he pitched a pair of no-hitters as a junior...twice was named to the North Carolina All-State team...was a member of the National Honor Society and Beta Club and president of the North Stanly chapter of the National Art Honor Society...as a junior led Wake Forest to its third College World Series (1949, 1955, 2023) after establishing program single-season records in wins (15) and strikeouts (143) while pitching the fourth-most innings (120.1) in school history...that season led the nation in wins while ranking fourth in both strikeouts and ERA (1.87)...in the 2023 College World Series, in his final collegiate appearance threw 7.0 shutout innings against eventual national champion LSU.

**ACQUIRED:** Selected in the first round (7th overall) of the 2023 MLB Draft...was signed by Charlie Aliano.
