TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners kick off the first game of the series against the Athletics...Seattle continue the roadtrip after dropping the series in Kansas City (1-2)...today's tilt will be televised live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...Seattle play their first game in Sutter Health Field this season, Mariners have won their last two series openers and have won 5 out of the last 6...overall Mariners are 9-8 in the first game of the series.

- **Let Me Introduce Myself** - The Mariners are 19-13 (.593) when the offense score the first run of the game.
- **In West Sacramento** - Seattle holds a 3-3 record against the A's in Sutter Health Park.
- **What a Week** - Since making his debut last Sunday infielder **Colt Emerson** has reached base safely in 6 of his 7 games played.
- **Ouch!** - Mariners batters rank T-3rd in the Majors with 36 HBP this season, trailing only the St. Louis Cardinals (38 HBP) and Los Angeles Angels (38).
- **Happy Birthday!** - Mariners First Base Coach **Eric Young Jr.** celebrates his 41th birthday today.

J-ROD Y EL TRIDENTE...**Julio Rodríguez** has hit a home run in 6 of 7 series played in May...he's also hit 7 of his 9 home runs this month, T-3rd most in the majors only trailing Kyle Schwarber-PHI (9 HR) and Byron Buxton-MIN (8)... Rodríguez is looking to add on during the last road series in May, he's homered in both series played at Sutter Health Park in 2025 and has 13 home runs against the Athletics, tied for the most against any opponent in his career...overall he is batting .270 (24x89) with 15 runs, 5 doubles, 7 home runs, 11 RBI and 6 walks in 22 games in May.

THERE'S AN A IN PIEDRA...Mariners starter **Luis Castillo** makes his first start since coming out of the bullpen for the first time in the regular season in his last appearance on May 19 vs. Chicago-AL, tossing 2.1 IP allowing 2 runs with 4 strikeouts...against the Athletics, his 3.07 ERA (20 ER, 58.2 IP) T-2nd lowest against any opponent he's faced in his career (min 10 GS), trailing only Pittsburgh (2.40 ERA).

BIG TEX IN THE 'PEN...RHP **Bryce Miller** is expected to make his first bullpen appearance of his Major League career following starter **Luis Castillo** tonight...the last professional appearance out of the bullpen for Miller came on June 3, 2022 for High-A Everett, tossing 6.0 IP and recording 11 strikeouts...Overall, Miller is 0-0 and a 1.64 ERA (2 ER, 11.0 IP) with 2 walks and 10 strikeouts in two starts for Seattle.

REALLY GOOD ARMS...the Mariners pitching staff has posted a combined 3.66 ERA (195 ER, 479.1 IP) with an MLB-fewest 140 walks, along with 462 strikeouts...among Major League pitching staffs they rank 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.30), 1st in fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.63), 8th in ERA, T-7th in WHIP (1.22) and T-10th in strikeouts...Mariners starting pitching leads MLB with 308.1 innings pitched and ranks 5th in strikeouts (290)...the Seattle bullpen ranks T-5th in the Majors in ERA (3.16).

JOSH SPICE...over his last 31 contests (4/17-c), **Josh Naylor** is batting .328 (39x119) with 12 runs, 5 doubles, 3 home runs, 16 RBI, 13 walks and 12 stolen bases, getting on base at a .391 clip, slugging .445 with an .836 OPS in 133 plate appearances...during that span, Naylor's .328 average ranks T-7th in the big leagues (min. 100 AB)...Naylor's 12 stolen bases are tied for second most in the Majors since April 17 trailing only Nasim Núñez-WSH (15).

RALEY GOOD IN THE BOX...**Luke Raley** in 48 games this season, he is batting .265 (35x132) with 19 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 10 homers and 27 RBI, getting on base at a .326 clip, slugging .545 with a .871 OPS.

RANDY! RANDY! RANDY!...**Randy Arozarena** is batting .292 (56x192) with 36 runs, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 22 RBI, 14 stolen bases, a .385 OBP and slugging .453 for an .838 OPS in 54 games this season...Randy has been scorching hot as of late, batting .357 (20x56) with a 1.010 OPS across his last 16 games (5/8-c).

J.P. PRESENTS STEELHEADS UNIFORM TO NLBM...prior to the game on Saturday, **J.P. Crawford** presented his game-worn, autographed Seattle Steelheads uniform to **Bob Kendrick**, President of the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum located in Kansas City...manager **Dan Wilson** also presented Kendrick with a check for \$25,000 from the Mariners Care Foundation as a donation to the museum in support of its Buck O'Neil Education and Research Center...video and audio can be found on Marinersmedia.com.

ON THE UPCOMING HOMESTAND...following the current road trip, the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 6-game homestand against the Diamondbacks (3 G, May 29-31) and Mets (3 G, June 1-3)...featured on the homestand is '90s weekend (May 29-31) with '90s Fireworks Night on Friday, **Julio Rodríguez** '90s Jersey Night on Saturday and '90s Pin Day on Sunday, as well as Pride Night on June 1.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...infielder **Colt Emerson** went 4-for-4 with 3 doubles and an RBI in yesterday's game against Kansas City, joining **Ken Griffey Jr.** (4x) and **Alex Rodriguez** (3x) as the only 20 year old players to have a 4-hit game in Mariners history, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Emerson also became the youngest player in Mariners history to record 3 doubles in a game?...the record was held by Mr. Mariner **Alvin Davis** who hit 3 doubles on April 18, 1984 vs. Oakland at the age of 23 years, 222 days,...**DID YOU ALSO KNOW?**...at 20 years, 308 days is the youngest player with 3 doubles in a game since Roberto Clemente (20 years, 284 days, 5/29/55 vs PHI)?

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 25

- **1989** - The Mariners acquire pitchers Randy Johnson, Brian Holman and Gene Harris from the Expos for pitchers Mark Langston and a PTBNL(Mike Campbell).
- **2008** - Mariners play final game at historic Yankee Stadium.
- **2012** - Hall of Famer Gaylord Perry threw out the ceremonial first pitch as part of the 35th Anniversary celebration. The Mariners held a 4-0 lead in the game vs. the Angels, but Albert Pujols hit a 3-run home run in the 6th inning, and closer Brandon League gave up 3 runs in the 9th in the 6-4 loss.
- **2016** - Hisashi Iwakuma recorded his 50th career win in a 13-3 win over the Athletics. He became the 10th pitcher to win 50 or more games with the Mariners.
- **2018** - James Paxton threw 11 strikeouts in a 2-1 win over the Minnesota Twins at Safeco Field, his 4th game of the season at that point with double-digit strikeouts. That was the most in a single season by a Mariners pitcher since Félix Hernández had 6 games with 10+ strikeouts in 2014.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 11th appearance of the year and the 254th of his career (252 GS)...it will also be his 2nd appearance against the Athletics this season and the 11th of his career (10 GS).
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on Dec. 23, 2011.
- Made MLB debut on June 23, 2017 vs. Washington (w/ CIN).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
- Named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).

LAST TIME OUT...L#5, on May 19 vs. the White Sox, tossing 2.1 innings of relief, and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 1 hit and 2 walks with 4 strikeouts...he threw 54 pitches (34 strikes) in his first career appearance out of the bullpen.

"For me, nothing changes. I mean, same guy, same mentality, same teammate. You're coming in here and trying to support everyone you can, and for me that mentality has always given me results. The only thing that has changed (is it's a) different job, coming in at a different position. So just come in, get ready and try to be the best teammate that I can and try to execute my job the best I can."

WHAT A RELIEF... piggybacked off **Bryce Miller** in his last appearance on May 19 vs. the White Sox, marking his first career relief appearance in the regular season...prior to then, he made a relief appearance in the 2025 Postseason, entering the 14th inning of Game 5 of the ALDS vs. Detroit (10/10/25), tossing the final 1.1 innings and retiring all 4 batters faced to earn the win.

HEATED RIVALRY... across 39 career appearances with the Mariners against AL West teams, he is 14-10 with a 3.41 ERA (85 ER, 224.2 IP) and 226 strikeouts...is 16-10 with a 3.37 ERA (89 ER, 237.2 IP) and 246 strikeouts across 41 career starts all-time vs. AL West teams...went 2-2 with a 2.37 ERA (15 ER, 57.0 IP) and 47 strikeouts across 10 starts against AL West teams last season.

VS. ATHLETICS... making his first appearance at Sutter Health Park since July 28, 2025 when he tossed 7.0 innings of 1-run baseball, allowing 5 hits with no walks and 4 strikeouts...has tossed 7.0 innings in each of his last 3 road starts against the Athletics (9/19/23-c).

SO WE MEET AGAIN... Castillo has made all 10 of his career starts against the Athletics while playing for the Mariners...is just 1-of-4 pitchers with 10+ starts against the Athletics since 2022, joining teammates **Bryan Woo** (10 GS) and **Logan Gilbert** (11 GS), and **Framber Valdez** (11 GS)...the Athletics are 1-of-10 teams that Castillo has faced 10+ times in his career and are just 1-of-3 teams that he has faced 10+ times with the Mariners (also: Angels and Astros).

LA PIEDRA... among qualified pitchers since 2017 (his debut season), he is 5th in games starts (252), T-5th in quality starts (136), 6th in innings pitched (1457.0), 7th in total strikeouts (1540) and T-12th in wins (85).

SEASONED VET... made his 250th career start on May 2nd vs. Kansas City...became 1 of 5 active pitchers with 250+ starts since 2017, joining **Patrick Corbin**-4Tms (272 GS), **Aaron Nola**-PHI (260 GS), **José Berrios**-MIN/TOR (259 GS), and **Kevin Gausman**-5Tms (259 GS)...among 19 active pitchers with 250+ career starts, his 3.64 ERA and 9.5 strikeouts-per-nine innings each rank 8th-best.

WELL TRAVELED... is making his 6th appearance on the road this season...his 122 career road starts are 5th-most in MLB since 2017...has thrown 5.0+ innings in 100 career road starts (7th-most such games in MLB since 2017), 6.0+ in 63 starts, and 7.0+ in 18 starts...his 676.0 career innings pitched on the road ranks 7th-most in MLB since 2017.

KEEPING IT 100... threw season-high 108 pitches in his last start (5/14 at HOU)...is the only Mariners pitcher to throw 100+ pitches in multiple starts this season...**Emerson Hancock** (5/2 vs. KC) and **Bryan Woo** (5/12 at HOU) have also tossed 100+ pitches in a game this season...Castillo has thrown 100+ pitches in 102 career games, the 5th-most such games in MLB since 2017.

WHIFF LEADER... has recorded 10+ swings and misses in 8 of his 10 appearances this year...registered a season-high 18 swings and misses plus 5 swinging strikeouts on May 9 at Chicago White Sox, surpassing his previous season-high 17 swings and misses in his first start of the season (3/30 vs. NYY)...leads MLB since 2017 with 3,505 swings and misses across his career, ranking ahead of **Kevin Gausman** (3,470) and **Max Scherzer** (3,308)...his 1,285 career swinging strikeouts are 3rd-most in MLB since 2017, trailing **Max Scherzer** (1,320), **Kevin Gausman** (1,316), and ranking ahead of **Gerrit Cole** (1,267).

SIX IN SIX... has thrown 6+ strikeouts across 6.0+ innings once this season (3/30 vs. NYY)...his 112 career starts of 6.0+ innings pitched and 6+ strikeouts are 6th-most in MLB since 2017...his 41 such games since 2023 are T-6th most in MLB across that span, alongside **Framber Valdez**.

AMONG MARINER GREATS... his 3.67 ERA with Seattle is the 7th-lowest ERA in franchise history (min. 500.0 IP), behind **Félix Hernández**, **Randy Johnson**, **Hisashi Iwakuma**, and **James Paxton** (all 3.42 ERA), **George Kirby** (3.58), and **Logan Gilbert** (3.61)...his 680 strikeouts with the Mariners are 10th-most in franchise history (next: **Hisashi Iwakuma**, 714 SO)...his 1.172 WHIP and 9.2 strikeouts-per-nine innings each rank 4th-best among Mariners with 500.0+ innings pitched.

ALL-DECADE ACCOLADES... is one of 5 pitchers in the last 10 seasons (2017-c) to have at least 1,500 strikeouts and a WHIP below 1.20, joining **Gerrit Cole**, **Aaron Nola**, **Max Scherzer**, and **Zack Wheeler**.

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 3rd appearance of the season and the 77th of his career...it marks his 1st time facing the Athletics this season and his 7th career outing against the Athletics.
Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller on July 20, 2021.
Played 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21.
Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...

on May 19 vs. White Sox made his 2nd start of the season and 1st at T-Mobile Park since being activated from the 15-day Injured List (left oblique strain) on May 13...he threw 5.2 scoreless innings, allowing 1 hit and 1 walk, while striking out 7 batters...threw 72 pitches and 50 strikes...retired 10-consecutive batters to start the game...marks the 2nd start of his career with 7+ strikeouts, 1 or-fewer walks, and 1-or-fewer hits (last:4/17/24 vs. CIN).

A+ OUTINGS...

has faced the Athletics 3rd most of any opponent in his career with 33.2 IP against them...owns a 9.6 K/9, 3rd best of any opponent he has faced, and a 7 K/BB for the T-5th best mark against an opponent...his K/BB and BB% (3.7%) against the Athletics ranks 6th best among AL pitchers (min. 20.0 IP)...4 of his 6 games played against the Athletics have been quality starts with 5+ strikeouts.

BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER...
