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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (58-64) vs. MIAMI MARLINS (62-59)

August 13, 2026 - loanDepot park - Miami, FL - 1:10 EDT - Game #123/Road #63

RHP Braxton Ashcraft (11-5, 4.08 ERA) vs. RHP Tyler Phillips (3-5, 3.47 ERA)

THE PIRATES: will wrap up this brief, three-game road trip to Miami (0-2, Tuesday-Thursday) with today's series finale at loanDepot park...Will begin a six-game homestand vs. Boston (Friday-Sunday) and Detroit (August 17-19) following today's game at Miami (will play 21 of their final 39 games at home)...Have hit 145 home runs (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)...Have the most hits (1074) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the fourth-most runs (604) in all of Major League Baseball, behind Washington (655), Chicago-NL (634) and Los Angeles-NL (606), after scoring 583 runs in 2025...Have struck out the third-most batters (1127) in all of Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (1196) and Milwaukee (1176).

GO FOURTH: Pittsburgh and Miami are meeting for the final time this season today at loanDepot park...The Pirates and Marlins will meet again next with a four-game series next year from July 1-4 here in Miami...It will mark only the second time the two teams have played on Independence Day, with the other time coming on July 4, 2009 at Land Shark Stadium (Florida won, 5-3).

AMERICAN SPIRIT: Pittsburgh will host Boston (Friday-Sunday) and Detroit (August 17-19) during its upcoming six-game homestand...The Pirates are 10-2 at home during interleague play this season...They swept a three-game series from April 3-5 vs. Baltimore, won two of three games from April 17-19 vs. Tampa Bay, swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota and won two of three games from June 23-25 vs. Seattle...Pittsburgh has also won seven straight home interleague series, dating back to its three-game sweep from July 21-23, 2025 vs. Detroit (the team has never won eight straight home interleague series).

IRON CITY BRYAN: Bryan Reynolds has played in each of Pittsburgh's 122 games this season and 131 straight team games (he missed his last game last season on September 17 vs. Chicago-NL)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the fifth-longest streak by a Pirate since 1989, trailing Jason Bay (307, 2004-06), Bobby Bonilla (189, 1989-90), Kevin Young (142, 1998) and Andrew McCutchen (132, 2011)...He is also on pace to become the seventh Pirate (10th instance) in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to play in all of the team's games in a season, joining Dick Groat (161 in 1962), Bill Mazeroski (162 in 1964, 162 in 1966 and 163 in 1967), Matty Alou (162 in 1969), Omar Moreno (162 in 1980 and 103 in 1981), Johnny Ray (162 in 1982) and Bay (162 in 2005).

BRAXTON ON THE BUMP: Braxton Ashcraft, who will start for Pittsburgh in today's series finale against Miami here at loanDepot park, has earned six wins over his last nine starts, a stretch that began with his win on June 17 at the Athletics...His six wins during that stretch are tied with Chicago's Matthew Boyd, Arizona's Brandon Pfaadt and Arizona's Eduardo Rodriguez for the third-most in the entire National League, trailing only Miami's Sandy Alcantara and Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (seven wins apiece)...The only National League ballparks that Ashcraft has yet to pitch in other than loanDepot park are Citi Field and Dodger Stadium.

SHOWING HEART AND HUSTLE: The Pirates' 120 infield hits this season rank third in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Tampa Bay (153) and Milwaukee (140)...Miami is tied for fourth in the league with 116 infield hits...Otto Lopez, who was the Marlins' 2026 Heart and Hustle Award nominee, has the second-most infield hits (30) in all of MLB, behind only Tampa Bay's Chandler Simpson (46)...Pittsburgh's Nick Gonzales ranks tied for fourth with 22 infield hits, while Jake Mangum (the Pirates' 2026 Heart and Hustle Award nominee) is seventh with 20 infield hits...Gonzales' 22 infield hits are the most by any Pirate since Starling Marte also had 22 infield hits in 2019 (Marte also had 29 infield hits in the 2018 season).

THE MAGICIAN: Esmerlyn Valdez singled and had a sacrifice fly on Wednesday at Miami...His 27 RBI since the start of July rank second among all Major League rookies, trailing only Cincinnati's Sal Stewart (28)...They are also tied for the ninth-most among all Major Leaguers during that time.

GOOD AS GONZO: Nick Gonzales went 2-for-3 with a double, a walk and two runs on Wednesday at Miami...Gonzales' 47 multi-hit games are the most in all of Major League Baseball (Miami's Otto Lopez, 46 games, ranks second)...The last Pirates righthander with more than 47 multi-hit games in a season was Starling Marte, who had 48 such games in both 2015 and 2016...Gonzales' .307 average (135-for-440) is fifth in Major League Baseball.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

August 13, 2019: The Pirates scored 10 runs for a second consecutive game in their 10-7 win over the Angels in Anaheim. It marked their second time scoring at least 10 runs in back-to-back games that year (also June 26-27 at Houston). The No. 1-3 hitters in Pittsburgh's batting order (Adam Frazier, Bryan Reynolds and Starling Marte) each recorded three hits while combining to score five of the 10 runs.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Ashcraft lost a 5-2 decision after allowing four runs on four hits (including two home runs) and one walk in his 5.0 innings on August 6 at Milwaukee.

AGAINST THE MARLINS: Ashcraft has a 5.06 ERA (5.1ip/3er) in two career appearances (one start) against Miami...He allowed two runs in 0.1 inning of relief in the Pirates’ 5-2 win on June 11, 2025 at PNC Park...Ashcraft also had a no-decision after allowing two runs over 5.0 innings in his start this year on June 12 at PNC Park (the Pirates lost, 8-3).

ON THE ROAD: Ashcraft, who is making his third straight start road today at Miami, has posted the ninth-most road strikeouts (71) in the National League, behind only Philadelphia’s Jesús Luzardo (92), Atlanta’s Chris Sale (86), Cincinnati’s Chase Burns (81), Milwaukee’s Jacob Misiorowski (79), Philadelphia’s Zack Wheeler (78), Philadelphia’s Cristopher Sánchez (77), New York’s Nolan McLean (76) and Miami’s Eury Pérez (74)...Ashcraft has gone 6-4 in his first 12 road starts of the 2026 campaign.

LEADING THE WAY: Ashcraft has a team-high 11 wins this season...The last Pirate with more than 11 wins in a season was Mitch Keller (13 wins) in 2023...Pittsburgh has not had a starting pitcher with at least 12 wins and a sub-4.00 ERA in a season since Trevor Williams (14-10, 3.11) and Jameson Taillon (14-10, 3.20) did that in 2018.

HEY NOW: Ashcraft was named to his first career All-Star team this season, joining Paul Skenes as Pittsburgh’s representatives (he replaced Skenes on the roster)...Skenes (130) and Ashcraft (128) became just the second pair of Pirates teammates to both have at least 115 strikeouts prior to the All-Star break in a single season (the first All-Star Game was held in 1933), joining Francisco Liriano (125) and Gerrit Cole (116) in 2015...They were also only the third pair of Pittsburgh starters to be named to the All-Star team in the same season, along with Bob Friend and Vernon Law (1960), as well as A.J. Burnett and Cole (2015)...Ashcraft’s 128 strikeouts prior to the All-Star break were the sixth-most in Pirates history, behind Bob Veale (137) in 1965, Veale (134) in 1966, Skenes (131) in 2025, Skenes (130) this year and teammate Mitch Keller (129) in 2023.

TWICE AS NICE: Ashcraft has made multiple starts where he recorded at least 10 strikeouts and did not issue a walk...He struck out 11 batters on May 31 vs. Minnesota and 10 batters on June 24 vs. Seattle...Ashcraft became the only Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to post multiple such starts during a single season.

MR. CONSISTENT: Ashcraft pitched at least 6.0 innings, struck out at least five batters and walked two or fewer batters in six consecutive starts from May 3-May 31...He became one of five Pirates (six instances) during the Modern Era (since 1901) to do that, joining Rick Reuschel (six starts, September 4-October 1, 1985), Jon Lieber (six starts, June 15-July 13, 1998), Gerrit Cole (six starts, April 14-May 11, 2017 and six starts, July 30-August 26, 2017) and Paul Skenes (seven starts, June 11-July 23, 2024).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Ashcraft did not allow a first-inning run in any of his first 20 Major League starts (from last year on June 23 at Milwaukee to May 31 vs. Minnesota)...The streak was snapped on June 6 at Atlanta (allowed two runs in the first inning)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he was one of three Major League pitchers in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to allow zero first-inning runs in at least each of his first 20 career starts, along with Rollie Sheldon (20, 1961) & Dennis Rasmussen (22, 1983-84).
