METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the A's, 4-0, last night...The Mets are in a stretch of nine straight games (1-3)...New York is in the midst of six-game homestand (1-3) against Arizona (1-2) and the A's (0-1)...Following this series, the Mets hit the road for their second trip of the season...The team will head out for a six-game seven-game trip against the Dodgers (three games) and the Cubs (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to today's game, the Mets are expected to select RHP Craig Kimbrel...Over 16 Major League seasons he owns a career 56-48 record with a 2.58 ERA (236 ER/821.2 IP), 1282 strikeouts and 440 saves over...Among relievers all-time, he ranks fourth in strikeouts and fifth in saves...Among active relievers, he ranks second in strikeouts behind only Aroldis Chapman (1331) and second in saves behind Kenley Jansen (476)...He is a nine-time All-Star, which is the second-most selections all-time among relief pitchers, only trailing Mariano Rivera's 13 selections.

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets are on a season-long-tying three-game losing streak...The Mets have posted a 6.00 ERA (18 ER/27.0 IP) int hat span with 10 walks and 21 strikeouts...As a team, they are batting .200/.229/250...They have been outscored 18-3 in the current streak.

NO SCORE AND 17.0 INNINGS AGO: Entering today, the Mets haven't scored since the first inning of Thursday's game against Arizona...This is the second time this season they have gone 17.0 consecutive innings without scoring a run (also: 3/30-4/1)...Per Elias.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga is set make his third start of the season...He is 0-1 with a 3.09 ERA (4 ER/11.2 IP) with five walks and 16 strikeouts...He has made 29 starts at Citi Field, going 12-5 with a 2.80 ERA (49 ER/157.1 IP) in that span with 70 walks and 197 strikeouts.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets begin their Interleague schedule this series...They are 0-1 against the AL in 2026...New York went 24-24 against the American League in 2025...Since Interleague Play began in 1997, the Mets are 302-301 against the American League.

BO KNOWS: Over the last nine games, Bo Bichette is batting .308 (12-39) with four runs, two doubles, three RBI, two walks and a .700 OPS...He has safely hit in eight of those contests...This compares to a .091 (2-22) mark over his first five games of the season.

WHAT ABOUT BOB: Luis Robert Jr. is batting .326 (14-43) with eight runs, two homers, seven RBI, 11 walks, two steals and a .928 OPS in 13 games this year...He recorded a career-high 40 walks in 110 games last season...His .463 OBP is second in the National League and fourth in the Majors.

NO HOMERS CLUB: Mets pitchers have not allowed a home run over their last 66.0 innings dating back to April 2 at San Francisco (7th inning)...Their seven consecutive games without allowing a home run is the longest such streak since September 19-26, 2013 when they went eight games without allowing a home run.

A'S-METS NOTES: The Mets are hosting the A's for the first time since July August 13-15, 2024...The Mets have lost four of their last five to the Athletics in Queens and they are 6-6 against the Athletics all-time at Citi Field.

DRS ENABLED: The Mets are tied for sixth in the Majors and tied for fourth in the National League with a total of 10 Defensive Runs Saved according to The Fielding Bible.

IN A PINCH: The Mets have recorded an MLB leading seven RBI from their pinch-hitters this season...In 2025, the Mets recorded a total of nine RBI from their pinch-hitters...Overall this year, Mets pinch hitters are batting .400 (4-10) with two runs, one double, one home run and seven RBI...Their .400 average is tied for the Major League lead.

HERE'S THE PITCH: The Mets are fifth in the Majors and third in the National League with a 3.26 ERA (47 ER/129.2 IP)...The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.85 ERA (17 ER/53.2 IP), which is third in the National League.

BROOKS AND DONE: Brooks Raley has yet to allow a run through his first five appearances of the season (4.2 IP)...Since returning from "Tommy John" surgery on July 19 2025, has pitched to a 2.08 ERA (7 ER/30.1 IP)...Has not allowed a home run over his last 51.2 innings dating back to August 15, 2023...His streak of 51.2 innings without allowing a home run is the third-longest active streak in the Majors...Only the Pittsburgh's Carmen Mlodzinski (55.2 IP) and Boston's Garrett Whitlock (54.2 IP) have a longer streak...Courtesy of Elias.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets are in the midst of their second homestand of the season...The team is 3-4 in New York this year...The team has posted a 4.16 ERA (31 ER/67.0 IP) at Citi Field in 2026.

WE REMEMBER: The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets played their second game of the season, defeating the Phillies, 9-7, at Veterans Stadium...Ron Darling made the start, while Bobby Ojeda earned the win tossing 3.1 innings in relief...Gary Carter connected for three hits including a two-run homer, while Keith Hernandez and Darryl Strawberry doubled in the victory...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at Mets.com/1986.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed two runs over 5.2 innings on April 5 at San Francisco...Gave up five hits, issued two walks and struck out seven in the Mets' 5-2 victory

SPRING TRAINING: In three Spring outings (three starts), Senga recorded a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) with 11 strikeouts...Held Spring batters to a .176 (6-34) average...Last pitched on March 19 at Houston, tossing a spring-high 4.0 innings (2R, 6H, 1BB, 4K).

VS. ATHLETICS/AMERICAN LEAGUE: Today, Senga will make his third career start against the Athletics, his first at Citi Field...On April 14, 2023, Senga allowed four runs and struck out seven across 4.2 innings at Oakland Coliseum...Last season, Senga threw 7.0 scoreless innings and earned the win on April 13 at Sutter Health Park...Across 12 career starts against Interleague opponents, Senga is 1-3 with a 3.63 ERA (25 ER/62.0 IP)

2025 SEASON RECAP: Senga finished last season going 7-6 with a 3.02 ERA (38 ER/60.2 IP), 55 walks and 109 strikeouts in 22 starts...Started the season going 7-3 through June 12, with a 1.47 ERA (12 ER/73.2 IP)...He had thrown at least 5.0 innings in all 13 starts and allowed three earned runs or fewer in all of those starts...Following his return from the IL, posted a 5.90 ERA (26 ER/39.0 IP) in nine starts...Allowed three or more earned runs in three consecutive games before being sent to Triple-A.

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga picked up 71 of his 109 strikeouts on the ghost fork last season...Held batters to a .130 average with his ghost fork this season, which was the second-lowest opponents' batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing a split-finger pitch and the seventh-lowest opponent batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing any pitch...His 41.8% whiff rate was the fourth highest...In his rookie year (2023), Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES: Has allowed three or fewer runs in 46 of his first 54 career starts...His 46 such starts are tied with Dwight Gooden for the second-most in franchise history through a starter's first 54 career games...He had allowed three earned runs or less in 31 consecutive starts from June 23, 2023 to July 11, 2025, which tied with deGrom (from 4/16/18-4/3/19) for the second-longest such streak in franchise history...At the time, it was the longest active such streak in the majors...He trailed only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22).

SENGA GENESIS: Through Senga's first 54 career starts he has posted 336 strikeouts...His 320 strikeouts through his first 52 Major League games are the fifth-most in Mets history behind Dwight Gooden (449), Noah Syndergaard (374) Matt Harvey (373) and Jacob deGrom (358)...His 320 strikeouts are also the fifth-most among Japanese-born pitchers through their first 54 starts, trailing only Yu Darvish (446), Hideo Nomo (425) and Shohei Ohtani (379)...His career 3.00 ERA (99 ER/296.2 IP) is the eighth-best in franchise history through a player's first 54 starts with the club.

CRUISING AT CITI: In 29 career games at Citi Field, he has gone 12-5 with a 2.80 ERA (49 ER/157.1 IP), which is the 11th best in the history of the ballpark (min. 90.0 IP)...He has allowed just 15 home runs to 653 batters faced, recording a 0.86 HR/9.0IP ratio at home...His 11.27 K/9.0IP is the third-highest among pitchers at Citi Field behind Edwin Diaz's 15.10 K/9.0IP and Jacob deGrom's 11.52 K/9.0IP (min. 400 BF).

2024 REWIND: He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967)...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

- Earned his first win of the season after tossing 1.1 scoreless innings on April 5 at San Francisco (1.1 IP)...Since the start of last year, he has recorded four or more outs without allowing an earned run in 16 relief appearances, which is tied for the eighth-most appearances among NL relievers.
- Since joining the Mets in 2024, he has made 36 appearances (two starts) at Citi Field...In those contests, he is 3-1 with eight holds, a 3.27 ERA (15 ER/41.1 IP) and 34 strikeouts.

- Threw a scoreless seventh inning on April 3 at San Francisco (1.0 IP, H, K)...Dating back to last season, each of his last eight appearances has been scoreless.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Appeared in three Grapefruit League games and he threw 3.0 scoreless innings...He struck out five of the 11 batters he faced during the spring.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.

- Allowed three earned runs over 0.1 inning on April 9 vs. Arizona (0.1 IP, 3 H, 3 ER, BB)...Was the first time he allowed three or more earned runs since September 18, 2025 at Milwaukee while with Los Angeles-AL.
- Fired 2.0 scoreless innings on April 7 vs. Arizona (2.0 IP, H)...Was his first multi-inning scoreless appearance since he fired 2.1 scoreless innings against the Mets at Citi Field as a member of the Dodgers on May 23, 2025.
- Has made 19 lifetime appearances at Citi Field and he is 2-0 with a 3.32 ERA (7 ER/19.0 IP) in those games.
- In 23 career appearances (one start) against the Athletics he is 1-1 with one save, four holds, a 3.54 ERA (8 ER/20.1 IP) and 12 strikeouts...He is holding Athletics batters to a .192 average (14-73).
- Tossed the 10th inning on March 28 vs. Pittsburgh (1.0 IP, 2 H, R, BB)...Only allowed the free runner to score.
- Pitched in five Grapefruit League games and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings while recording three strikeouts.
