METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Philadelphia Phillies, 6-0, yesterday...The Mets earend their ninth series sweep of the season and the first since their three-game sweep of the Giants in San Francisco from July 25-27... Last night's win marked their eighth shutout of the season and first since June 26 vs. Atlanta...The Mets are in a stretch of 16 straight games...The team is 6-3 in that span...Tonight, the Mets play their fourth game of a seven-game homestand (3-0) against the Phillies (3-0) and Marlins (four games).

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: This week, the U.S. Open begins at the Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Flushing Meadows, NY...The Mets encourage all fans who attend next week's homestand to utilize mass transportation...Mass transit is the easiest and fastest way to access Citi Field.

ONE OF A KIND: Last night, Nolan McLean threw 8.0 shutout innings and earned his third win in as many career games...He became the first Met ever to record a win in each of his first three games...He's the first Met to record an 8.0+ inning start in his first three career starts since Jon Niese in 2008...McLean became the first pitcher since Brian Johnson in 2017 to have an outing of 8.0+ scoreless innings and zero walks in his first three career games and the first Met to do so since Jason Jacome (9.0 IP/O BB on 7/7/94)...He joins Jacome, Eric Hillman (8/17/92) and Dennis Ribant (8/17/64) as the only franchise pitchers to do so... His 21 strikeouts are the second-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history through three career starts (most: Matt Harvey - 23 K)... His 20.1 innings are the most through a player's first three career games since Andrew Moore and Ben Lively both recorded 21.0 innings through as many games in 2017

AUGUSTUS BLOOM: The Mets are 10-14 in August...In 24 games this month, the Mets are batting .284/.359/.490 with 44 doubles, one triple, 42 home runs, 143 RBI and 89 walks...They rank first in the majors with an .849 August OPS, second in SLG and OBP and pace the NL in home runs during the month.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games against the NL East...They Mets are 6-3 in that span...Overall, they are 22-16 against the division...The Mets are batting .273/.343/.468 against the NL East, while posting a 4.00 ERA.

RISPY BUSINESS: In 24 games in August, the Mets are batting .368 (78-212) with 15 doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 103 RBI, 34 walks, a .438 OBP, and a .590 SLG with RISP...Their .368 average and .438 OBP tops the majors in August, while their .590 SLG is second.

HOME SWEET HOME: This season, the Mets are 44-24 (.647) in home games... The team is tied for fourth in the NL and tied for fifth in the majors in home winning percentage...Their 3.59 home ERA is the sixth-lowest mark in the NL and the 10th-lowest in the majors...Over their last eight home games, including August 17's game in Williamsport, PA, the Mets are batting .341/.401/.549 with 15 home runs, 21 doubles and 66 RBI.

MIAMI VICE: Tonight, the Mets face the Marlins for the seventh time this season...The Mets have won each of their first two series against Miami this season, going 2-1 at loanDepot Park from March 31-April 2 and 2-1 at Citi Field from April 7-9...The Mets have not lost a series of two or more games against the Marlins in Queens since they dropped two of three from August 25-26...Since 2018, the Mets are 77-44 against Miami and have pitched to a 2.98 ERA duringt that span.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso ranks third in the majors with 106 RBI...His 106 RBI are tied for the second-most RBI (with himself in 2022) through the team's first 133 games of a season, trailing only Carlos Beltrán's 112 RBI in 2006.

NO MINOR THING: Today, Major League Baseball announced the 2025 Rookie-level All-Star Teams and Award winners...Edward Lantigua was selected to the Florida Complex League All-Star Team at Designated Hitter and Randy Guzman was name to the FCL All-Star Team at Utility...Lantigua batted 288/433/399 with three home runs, 27 RBI and an .832 OPS for the FCL Mets and Guzman batted .282/371/474 with seven home runs, 33 RBI and an .845 OPS...Additionally, Elian Peña was named the Dominican Summer League's top MLB prospect...In his first professional season, Peña batted .292/421/528 with nine home runs, 33 RBI, 21 stolen bases and a .949 OPS in 55 games for DSL Mets Orange...The 17-year-old was signed by the Mets as a Minor League free agent on January 15, 2025.

BRETT THE MET: Over his last 18 games, Brett Baty has a .351/422/596 with four home runs, two doubles, seven RBI and 16 runs...In 59 games at Citi Field, Baty is slashing .311/374/559 with 11 home runs, 28 RBI, five doubles, one triple, 16 walks and 31 runs...His 15 home runs this season are a career high.

ON THE MARK: Mark Vientos has hit safely in each of his last 10 games and has a .395/442/974 slashline with six home runs, four doubles and 17 RBI...Vientos has recorded at least one RBI in a career-high six straight games, the longest such streak by a Met since Pete Alonso recorded at least one RBI in eight straight games from September 13 - 20, 2022...He is batting .300 (30-100) with 11 runs, eight doubles, seven homers, 25 RBI, four walks and a .917 OPS in 27 games following the All-Star break.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stole 110 bases in 124 attempts this year... Their 88.7% success rate is the highest in the majors...The Mets 110 stolen bases are their most through the first 133 games of a season since their 113 stolen bases through the first 133 games of the 2011 season.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is the first primary shortstop in Major League history with five separate 20/20 seasons...His three 20/20 seasons as a Met are the second-most in franchise history behind Darryl Strawberry and Howard Johnson who each had five such seasons.

IT'S A MARTE PARTY: Over his last 23 games dating back to July 3, Starling Marte has a .359/409/590 slashline with four home runs, six doubles, seven walks and eight RBI...Over his last 10 starts, Marte has a 1.153 OPS.

OUCH: The Mets were hit by a pitch three times for the second time this season on August 26 vs. Philadelphia (also: 4/27 at WAS)...Mets batters have been hit by a pitch 74 times this season, tied with Los Angeles-AL for the second-most in the majors.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 107 walks this year...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

OVER THE WALL AND ON THE BASEPATHS: Juan Soto has 32 home runs and 22 stolen bases while Francisco Lindor has 25 home runs and 24 stolen bases...The pair joins Carlos Beltrán and David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson, Kevin McReynolds and Darryl Strawberry (1988) and Johnson and Strawberry (1987) as the only pair/trio of Mets teammates to record 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in the same season...Lindor has recorded his fifth 20/20 season which ties Randy Arozarena for the second-most such seasons in the majors since 2018 (most: 7, José Ramírez).

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his 11th win of the season on August 23 Atlanta...Allowed two runs over 6.1 innings, surrendered three hits, issued two walks and struck out four batters...His 6.1 innings marked his longest start since his season-high 7.0 innings on June 1 vs. Colorado.

THE GAME OF RISP: Over his last eight starts, opposing batters are 15-46 with four doubles and 22 RBI against Holmes with runners in scoring position...In his first 17 starts of the season, Holmes held opposing batters to a .111 (7-63) average with runners in scoring position...Overall, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .202 (22-109) average with runners in scoring position, tied for the seventh-best mark in the NL and tied for the 15th-best mark in the majors (min. 100 batters faced w/RISP)...Additionally, Holmes is one of 17 pitchers to allow one or zero home runs with runners in scoring position (min. 100 batters faced w/RISP).

STAYING GROUNDED: Since 2019, Holmes' 63.8% groundball rate is the third-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 65.2% clip and Andre Pallante's 64.3% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season)...This season, Holmes ranks fifth in the majors with a 56.6% groundball rate (min. 500 BF).

HOOK, LINE AND SINKER: Tonight, Holmes will face the Miami Marlins for the third time this season...Through his first two starts of the season against Miami, Holmes is 1-0 with a 4.50 ERA (5 ER/10.0 IP) with 16 strikeouts...On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut and allowed four runs over 5.1 innings while striking out a career-high 10 batters...In 11 career outings against Miami, Holmes is 2-1 with a 4.05 ERA (9 ER/20.0 IP), 20 strikeouts and .228 opponents' batting average...Among the 11 opposing teams Holmes has logged 20.0 innings against, Miami is the only opponent he has yet to allow a home run to.

ALLOWING HOLMES RUNS: Over his last nine starts, Holmes has allowed just one home run...In his previous 10 starts from May 9 - July 2, the right-hander allowed 11 home runs after not allowing a home run in each of his first seven starts of the season...He became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the team...Holmes allowed two home runs in three of his four starts from May 14 - June 1 after he had never surrendered multiple home runs in his first 319 career Major League games...At the time, it was the fifth-longest active such streak by a pitcher to begin their Major League career...Among qualifiers, Holmes ranks fifth in the NL and ninth in the majors with a 0.79 HR/9 rate.

10 K CLAY: On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

NEW ROLE WHO DIS: In his new role as a starting pitcher, Holmes has established career highs in both innings (137.1), strikeouts (109) and wins (11)...Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 12-8 with a 4.02 ERA (68 ER/152.1 IP) in 30 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30...Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)...Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances...Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

REELIN' IN THE YEARS: Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazeroski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazeroski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.
