TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (1-1) of a 3-game series vs **Matt Birch's Angels** and the third game (1-1) of a 7-day/6-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3-game set vs the **Giants** (Tue-Thu).

- The Reds are coming off their first road trip of the season in which they swept the **Rangers** (3-0) and split with the **Marlins** (2-2).
- Following Thu's game vs **SF**, the Reds will head back on the road for a 6-game trip at **Min** (3g, 4/17-4/19) and **TB** (3g, 4/20-4/22).

OUR PAL SAL: **1b Sal Stewart** has hit safely in 11 of his 15 games this season and reached base in 14 of 15 (16-for-47, .340/.458/.681)...he's been on base 30 times, which ranks second in the majors to **Hou's Yordan Alvarez** (35).

- Stewart** ranks among Major League leaders in OPS (1.129, 4th), OBP (.469, 5th), SLG (.660, 5th), and walks (13, T3rd).

WINS/RUNS: The Reds have won 9 of their first 15 games despite ranking 29th in the majors with 48 runs scored (**CWS**, 43)...this is the first Cin team in any 15 game span to score 48 or fewer runs and win 9 times since the 2012 club did it from 9/18-10/3 (15 games, 9 wins, 42 runs).

- The last Major League team to win 9 times in any 15-game span while scoring 48 runs or fewer was the 2025 **Orioles** (9w/43r, 9/5-9/20).
- 7 of Cin's 9 wins this season have come in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the most such wins in the majors this year.
- The 2025 Reds went 35-38 (.479) in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the ninth-worst record in the majors.
- The Reds have been *held* to 2 runs or fewer 7 times already this season, tied for third in the majors (**CWS** & **KC**, 9g each).
- The Reds plated a season-high 7 runs in yesterday's 15th game of the season, marking the second-longest wait in franchise history for Cin to produce its first 7-run game...the 2022 Reds didn't score 7 or more runs until their 26th game (5/7g1, 9-2 win vs **Pit**).

MISSED OPPORTUNITIES: Cin batters rank T2nd in the majors with 119 runners left on base (**Hou** 129, **NYM** 119)...the Reds are 1 of 3 teams in the majors to have stranded at least 10 runners on 5 different occasions (**Sea** 5, **LAA** 5).

- With runners in scoring position Cin is slashing .165/.290/.281...rank last w/RISP in average, and hits (20), while ranking near the bottom in RBI (28, 29th), SLG (.281, 29th), OPS (.571, 28th) and runs (33, 28th).

18 WALKS: The Reds and **Angels** yesterday combined for 18 walks, second-most in a single game in the 24-year history of **Great American Ball Park** (19bb, 7/28/04 vs **StL**).

- The Reds and **Astros** combined for 20 walks in Cin's 13-inning, 6-5 win on 9/18/13 in **Houston**...that game went 5 hours and 18 minutes.

STEER, THERE, EVERYWHERE: **OF/INF Spencer Steer** yesterday vs **LAA** made his 150th career start in the outfield (LF), becoming the fifth Red since 1900 to make at least 150 starts in both the infield (305) and outfield.

PLAYING CLEAN BASEBALL: Cin leads the majors with a .993 fielding pct and is tied with **LAD**, **Cle**, and **Ath** for fewest errors in the majors (4)...the Reds had played the first 11 games of the season without a fielding miscue, their longest streak of errorless games to begin a season since 1900.

SERIES NOTES:

- The Redlegs are 15-12 all-time vs the **Angels**, including 9-4 here at **Great American Ball Park** and 6-8 at **Angel Stadium of Anaheim**.
- The Reds' 10-game winning streak vs **LAA** dating back to 8/5/19, was snapped in the clubs' final meeting of 2025 (8/20, 2-1 at **Angel Stadium**)...it's Cin's longest winning streak ever vs an AL opponent.
- In 2013 the Reds and **Angels** played the first interleague **Opening Day** game in Major League history, a 3-1 **Angels** win in 13 innings in which the teams established the modern Major League record for strikeouts by both teams in a season-opener (Cin pitchers 17, **LAA** pitchers 13).
- OF Mike Trout** led off the 2015 All-Star Game at **GABP** with a home run off **RHP Zack Greinke** and became the first player ever to win the ASG's MVP award in consecutive years.

EL CABALLO DE HIERRO: **SS Ely De La Cruz** has appeared in each of Cin's last 233 games, beginning 7/30/24...it's the fifth-longest consecutive games played streak by a Red since 1970 (see box below).

SWITCH BLADE: **SS Ely De La Cruz** has homered 3 times in 21 at-bats this season vs left-handed pitchers...in 2025, he hit 5 HR in 199 at-bats vs LHP.

NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM: The Reds have avoided being swept in 34 consecutive home series (min. 1g) dating back to 2024, including this one vs **LAA**...it's the longest such streak since 9/19/11-9/25/13 when the Reds avoided being swept at **Great American Ball Park** in a franchise-record 52 consecutive home series.

- The Reds avoided being swept in all 26 of their series last year at **GABP**...only the Cin teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being broomed.

LOWE END THEORY: **1b Nathaniel Lowe's** 3-run double in the bottom of the 1st inning of yesterday's 7-3 win vs **LAA** marked his 800th career hit...he's the first player to collect his 800th career hit while playing for the Reds since **Eugenio Suárez** did it on 5/2/21 vs **Chc**.

- Lowe** needs 2 more runs to reach 400 for his career.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in the Reds' 10-inning, 6-3 win at Mia on 4/7 (5.1ip, 6h, 2er/2er, 2bb, 2k, 0hr, 91TP)...squared off against Sandy Alcantara.

- Gave up both his runs in the 4th inning (double, single, **2 ground outs**, single, flyout).
- Pitched into the 6th inning and was 2 outs from a quality start...turned it over to Pierce Johnson with the bases loaded and 1 out...Johnson produced a groundout and a strikeout to end the threat and keep the score at 2-0.

APRIL 1 vs PIT: Was outdueled by Paul Skenes in the 8-3 loss on 4/1 vs Pit (5.2ip, 5h, 4r/4er, 3bb, 5k, 1hr, 88 TP)...was his first loss of the 2026 season.

- After giving up a 1st-inning, 3-run homer to Oneil Cruz, went on to retire 14 of his next 17 batters.
- Had a chance for a quality start when he retired the first 2 batters he faced in the 6th inning, but was removed when the next 2 batters reached (single, walk).

OPENING DAY, MARCH 26 vs BOS: Did not factor in the decision in the 3-0 loss vs Bos on Opening Day (3/26)...threw 6.0 shutout innings (7h, 1bb, 4k, 83 TP)...battled Garrett Crochet.

- Was his first Opening Day start, becoming the 19th different left-handed pitcher to start for the Reds in a season opener since the club joined the National League in 1890 (last: Mike Remlinger, 1998).
- Became the ninth Reds starter since 1890 to pitch at least 6.0 scoreless innings in a season opener (last: Frankie Montas, 2024)...is the second Cin lefthander to ever accomplish the feat (also: Johnny Vander Meer, 1943).
- Snapped the Reds' streak of 27 consecutive season openers started by a right-handed pitcher...was the longest such run in franchise history.
- At 26 years, 298 days old, became the youngest left-handed pitcher to start a Reds' season opener since Don Gullett (24-091) in 1975.
- Reds manager Terry Francona on 3/8 announced Abbott as the Opening Day starter.

SPRING RECAP: Went 1-3 with a 11.72 ERA in 6 Cactus League starts (17.2ip, 28h, 25r/23er, 8bb, 22k, 6hr, 362 TP).

- His final Cactus League tuneup came on 3/21 in the 11-7 win over the White Sox in Goodyear (4.2ip, 4h, 5r/3er, 1bb, 5k, 1hr, 84 TP).

AWARD TOUR: Following the 2025 season, received from the local chapter of the Baseball Writers' Association of America the 2025 Ernie Lombardi Award as the Reds' Most Valuable Player and the Johnny Vander Meer Award as the Reds' Most Outstanding Pitcher.

- Became the sixth Reds pitcher since the Vander Meer Award was established in 1969 to receive both awards in the same season.
- Became the seventh Reds pitcher (eighth occurrence) to be named team MVP.

2025 ALL-STAR: Was named to the National League All-Star team as a replacement for LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto...was his first career All-Star selection..

- Pitched a perfect 6th inning in the National League's 7-6 victory (Jazz Chisholm Jr lineout, Riley Greene flyout, Randy Arozarena groundout; 13 total pitches).

ACCOLADES: Was recognized as a finalist for the 2025 All-MLB Team and received votes in 2025 for National League Cy Young Award and Rawlings Gold Glove Award.

HE EARNED IT: His 3.41 ERA through his first 78 career starts is the lowest by a Reds starting pitcher in that span since RHP Mario Soto (3.27, 1977-82).

PERSONAL: Graduated from Halifax County High School (South Boston, VA), the same school attended by All Elite Wrestling champion "Hangman" Adam Page and Major League pitcher Jeremy Jeffress...was named 2017 Gatorade Virginia Player of the Year...was a 4-year member of the Halifax swim team...at the University of Virginia became only the second pitcher in school history to record at least 300 strikeouts.
