NEVER FORGET: The New York Mets will wear first responder caps during the game today...Caps from the FDNY, NYPD, Port Authority Police Department, Department of Sanitation and Department of Correction will all be represented to commemorate their bravery and sacrifice...Francisco Lindor will use two custom-made Rawlings Gloves during the game, one featuring logos of the FDNY and the other of the NYPD.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Marlins, 11-3, last night...The Mets are 70-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 31-9-3 in 43 series this year...The Mets conclude their road trip today, a seven-day, six-game trip (3-2) to Pittsburgh (2-1) and Miami (1-1)...Following this trip, the Mets return home for a seven game homestand against the Cubs (three games) and Pirates (four games).

ON THE MARK: INF Mark Vientos has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...When he enters a game today, it will mark his major league debut...He will be the seventh Mets player this year to make his major league debut joining INF Brett Baty, RHP José Butto, RHP Colin Holderman and OF Nick Plummer, LHP Nate Fisher and RHP Bryce Montes de Oca...Vientos is ranked as the seventh-best prospect in the organization according to MLB Pipeline.com...He has appeared in 101 games with Triple-A Syracuse this year and has hit .280/.358/.519 with 66 runs, 16 doubles, a triple, 24 home runs, 72 RBI and 44 walks...He was selected by the Mets in the second round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of American Heritage High School in Florida.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha has safely reached base in six straight games, batting .273 (6-22) in that span with five runs, two doubles, a home run, three walks, four RBI, a .385 OBP and a .500 SLG in that span...Over his last 22 games, Canha is batting .306 (22-72) with 13 runs, 10 doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI, six walks with a .390 OBP, a .653 SLG and a 1.043 OPS...He has recorded 19 extra-base hits in 42 games since the break compared to 15 he collected in 77 first-half games...Canha slugging .504 in the second half (.381 SLG in the first half).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets seeking their 43rd win on the road this year...That would tie 2016, 2011 and 1987 team for eighth-most in franchise history...Their .592 road winning percentage is the third-best in franchise history...Only the 1986 (.654) and 1969 (.600) teams have better winning percentages on the road...Their .592 road winning percentage is fourth-best in MLB and third-best in the NL...Overall they are 42-29 on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total (30-51)...New York is batting .262/.331/.421 away from Citi Field...Their .262 road average is the best in the NL and third in the majors and their .329 OBP on the road ranks second in the majors and in the NL.

ESC. KEY: Eduardo Escobar is on an eight-game hitting streak, batting .500 (14-28) with six runs, a double, four home runs, eight RBI, three walks with a .531 OBP and a .964 SLG...Since he returned from the IL on August 27, he is batting .405 (17-42) with six runs, two doubles, four home runs, eight RBI, three walks with a .435 OBP and a .738 SLG...In 57 games on the road this year, Escobar is batting .265/.319/.443 with 14 doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 22 RBI and 17 walks.

LINDOR CITY: In five games on this current road trip, Francisco Lindor is batting .350 (7-20) with four runs, three doubles, a home run, five RBI, two walks with a .409 OBP and a .650 SLG...Lindor ranks seventh in the National League with a 5.7 fWAR this season.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 45-22 against the East this year...They have lost only two series in the division all season long (against Atlanta, August 15-18 and Washington, September 2-4) and have already clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...New York must win one of its three remaining games against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division foes (last accomplished by the Mets in 2015)...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.35 ERA against the East, while hitting .260/.335/.421...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 334-241.

WINNING!: The Mets clinched a winning record both at home and on the road...It is the first time the team has posted record winning records at home and on the road since 2016, when they collected 44 wins and home and 43 on the road...The Mets are seeking their 89th win today...It would be their most wins since they recorded 90 in 2015.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets have won 88 games this season, the second-most in the NL and the third-most in the majors...Their .629 winning percentage is third in the majors...The team has posted a 88-52 record through the team's first 140 games... Only the 1986 (93-47) team posted a better record through the first 140 games of the season.

AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 56-82 Marlins today...Each of their next eight games and 16 of their 22 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 49-22 against teams with a record below .500 this year, giving them a .690 winning percentage...Their .690 winning percentage is the fourth-highest in MLB vs. sub-.500 opponents.

ABOVE AVERAGE: Jeff McNeil is fourth in the majors and third in the National League with a .318 batting average...He is behind only Paul Goldschmidt (.330), Freddie Freeman (.325) and Xander Bogaerts (.318)...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won six of their last eight games in Miami...New York is 50-46 since loanDepot Park opened up in 2012.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil leads the majors with .348 (79-227) batting average on the road...He has recorded 26 runs, 22 doubles, a triple, three home runs, 23 RBI, 13 walks with a .393 OBP and a .493 SLG in 60 games away from Citi Field...He is slashing .347/.375/.500 in 45 games following the All-Star break...His .347 average is sixth in the NL...Dating back to August 20, McNeil has just four strikeouts in his last 82 plate appearances...Overall this season, McNeil ranks seventh among qualified hitters and second in the NL with an 11.6 percent strikeout rate.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 92 times this year...The team's 92 HBP is the third-highest total in franchise history...The 2019 Mets set the record with 95 HBP...The Mets were plunked 94 times last year...Mark Canha has been plunked 18 times this year, which is tied for third in the majors...His 18 hit by pitches are the fourth-highest single-season total in franchise history.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 26 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985) with 24...That is the most by any player since the statistic was officially tracked in 1974...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) with 27 each are the only players with more in a season (data incomplete pre-1974)...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 12 of the Mets' 30 second-half wins.

LETS GO FISHING: Francisco Lindor has seven home runs, 19 RBI and a 1.145 OPS in 16 games against Miami this year...Only six players have more RBI against a single opponent this season and no other player in MLB has driven in more than 11 runs against the Fish...Going back to September 2 of last season, Lindor has nine homers and 29 RBI in his last 24 games against the Marlins...Lindor is a .339 (21-62) hitt81 SLG in 16 career games at loanDepot Park.

ONE AWAY: Brandon Nimmo is one RBI away from 200 for his career...He is batting .303 with 55 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs, 37 RBI, 35 walks with a .399 OBP and a .485 SLG in 70 road games this season...This compares to a .222/.297/.342 slashline with 20 extra-base hits, 13 RBI and 21 walks in 61 games at Citi Field...He has safely reached base in 36 of his last 37 road games, batting .325 (49-151) with 32 runs, eight doubles, seven home runs, 22 RBI, 18 walks with a .411 OBP and a .517 SLG in that span that started on June 12...Overall, his .303 average on the road ranks seventh in the National League.

PUTTING UP LUG-O'S: Seth Lugo has not allowed a run in 11 of his last 12 appearances...He has tossed 13.0 innings in that span, allowed 10 hits, four walks, struck out 16 and posted a 0.69 ERA (one earned run/13.0 innings)...In 18 games following the All-Star break, Lugo has posted a 1.40 ERA (three earned runs/19.1 innings) with seven walks and 21 strikeouts.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 102 strikeouts...That is 15 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Craig Kimbrel (53.1 IP in 2017, 54.0 IP in 2012) and Chapman (53.2 IP in 2012) round out the top five fastest to 100 K all-time...Armando Benítez owned the previous franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias...Díaz has posted a 0.81 ERA (three earned runs/33.1 innings) with 15 hits, seven walks and 643 strikeouts in 33 appearances since the start of June.

30 FOR 39: Díaz is seventh in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,319 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...Only the Braves with 1,342 have struck out more...The team's 1,319 strikeouts are already the seventh-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.54 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.5 percent), the second-highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his fourth loss of the season and second loss since the All-Star Break after allowing four runs on six hits over 5.0 innings on September 6 against the Pirates at PNC Park...Issued two walks and struck out three batters.

FISH FRIED: For his career, Walker is 3-2 with a 3.59 ERA (21 ER/52.2 innings) in nine outings (eight starts) against the Marlins...This season against Miami, Walker is 3-0 with a 2.49 ERA (7 ER/25.1 innings) and 25 strikeouts, the highest total against a single opponent this season...In two starts at Marlins Park this season, Walker is 2-0 with a 4.63 ERA (6 ER/11.2 IP)...As a Met, Walker is 3-1 with a 3.31 ERA (18 ER/49.0 IP) and a 1.10 WHIP in eight games (seven starts) against the Marlins...In those outings, Walker has tossed five quality starts and has allowed four runs only once.

ROAD IMPROVEMENT: In 14 road starts this season, Walker is 6-3 with a 3.56 ERA (29 ER/73.1 IP)...His six road wins are tied for sixth in the NL and tied for 14th in the majors...Last season, Walker went 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (44 ER /68.0 IP) in 14 road starts...His six road wins are one shy of tying his career-high set in 2015 with the Mariners.

SPLIT FINGER SUCCESS: In 24 starts this season, Walker has used his splitter just over 28 percent of the time and has held opposing hitters a .208 (37-178) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...43 of Walker's 96 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

NICE TRY: Walker is second in the majors with five pickoffs this season, trailing only Robbie Ray of the Mariners who has six pickoff on the season... Since 2021, Walker has nine pickoffs, tied with Ryan Weathers for the most during that span...His 18 pickoffs since his debut year of 2013 are the fourth-most by a right-handed pitcher.

FEW KS, THAT'S OK: Through 24 starts this season, Walker has 96 strikeouts the seventh-fewest among pitchers with at least 100.0 innings...Walker has a 3.60 ERA (51 ER/127.2 IP) in his first 24 starts of the season...Only Cal Quantrill of the Guardians had fewer strikeouts (94 Ks) and a lower ERA (3.59) through a pitcher's 1st 24 starts of the 2022 season (Min. 100.0 IP).

1ST HALF/2ND HALF: In 16 first half starts, Walker went 7-2 with a 2.55 ERA (26 ER/91.2 IP)...His 2.55 ERA is the lowest first half mark in his career and his seven wins are tied with 2021 season for the most in Walker's career during the first half of the season...Walker is the eighth Mets starting pitcher to allow four or fewer first half home runs (Min. 12 first half starts...In eight second-half starts, Walker is 3-2 with a 6.25 ERA (25 ER/36.0 IP) and has surrendered seven home runs...Last season, Walker went 7-3 with a 2.66 ERA (28 ER/94.2 IP) in the first half, the 10th-best mark in the NL and 14th-best mark in the majors among qualified pitchers before the All-Star Break... Through his first eight starts after the All-Star Break of the 2021 season, Walker went 0-6 with a 6.81 ERA (30 ER/39.2 IP).
