## CHICAGO WHITE SOX (32-65) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (39-58)

### July 18, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #98/Home #48

#### RHP Jonathan Cannon (3-7, 4.44 ERA) vs. LHP Bailey Falter (6-4, 3.79 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** ended their season-high, eight-game losing streak with Sunday's 2-1, last at-bat win at Minnesota...Are in a stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League teams, including 12 straight games against the American League Central (their next game against a National League team will be on July 25 vs. Arizona)...Are 27-32 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta (their 17 errors in that span are tied for the second-fewest in MLB).

**WE WERE ON A BREAK!** The Pirates return to action tonight with the start of this nine-game homestand, tied for their longest of the season (they went 6-3 on a nine-game homestand from June 3-11 vs. Houston, Philadelphia and Miami)...Pittsburgh will host Chicago (AL) for three games this weekend, Detroit for three games from Monday-Wednesday and Arizona for three games from July 25-27...The Pirates have won seven straight games here at PNC Park (since June 22 vs. Texas), their longest home winning streak since June 19-July 3, 2019 (also seven)...Pittsburgh's last eight-game home winning streak came from September 3-19, 2018.

**SHOWING NO LOVE:** Pittsburgh has pitched a shutout in three consecutive home games for the first time since June 14-16, 2015 (the last two of those games came against the White Sox)...All three shutouts during this current streak came in a three-game sweep of St. Louis here at PNC Park from June 30-July 2, marking the third series of at least three games since at least 1901 where the Pirates didn't allow a single run...They also did that from October 2-3, 1976 vs. St. Louis (three games) and from June 4-6, 1903 vs. Boston (three games).

**CASHING IN AT PNC:** The Pirates have posted a 3.33 ERA (433.0ip/160er) this season at PNC Park...That's the seventh-lowest home ERA in Major League Baseball (Texas, 2.73, is first)...During the team's seven-game home winning streak, the Pirates have recorded a 1.00 ERA (63.0ip/7er).

**PHAMTASTIC RUN:** Tommy Pham is hitting at a .415 clip (22-for-53) over his last 16 games (since June 22 vs. Texas), which leads all Major League players with at least 50 at-bats in that span...He has also collected 16 RBI in that stretch, which are tied for the fifth-most in the National League...Pham is also batting .615 (8-for-13) with 11 RBI with runners in scoring position since June 22.

**HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS:** Ke'Bryan Hayes has hit safely in each of his last 12 games at PNC Park (since June 8 vs. Philadelphia), going 19-for-47 (.404) with three doubles, a home run and 10 RBI...Tommy Pham is 9-for-21 (.429) with two doubles, a home run and 10 RBI in his last six games here (since June 22 vs. Texas)...Andrew McCutchen is 15-for-27 (.556) with two doubles, a home run and six RBI in seven career games vs. the White Sox at PNC Park (went 5-for-9 here in 2023).

**CLEANING UP AGAINST THE SOX:** The Pirates are 3-0-2 in their last five series vs. the White Sox at PNC Park since being swept in a three-game series from June 15-17, 2010 (won two of three games from April 7-9, 2023, the first home series of 2023)...Pittsburgh also swept Chicago in a three-game series at Guaranteed Rate Field from July 12-14, 2024, the last series before the All-Star break.

**YINZERPALOOZA:** David Bednar has allowed one unearned run over 17.1 innings in his last 18 appearances, dating back to May 24 vs. Milwaukee (he has posted a .138 batting average against during that time)...Bednar and Chicago (NL)'s Drew Pomeranz (12.0ip) are the only Major League relievers with at least 10.0 innings pitched and zero earned runs allowed in that stretch.

**PITCHER'S PARADISE:** There have been just a combined 68 home runs at PNC Park this season, the fewest of any stadium in Major League Baseball, according to OptaStats (Texas' Globe Life Field is second on the list with 71).

**DENNIS DEALIN':** Dennis Santana's 1.56 ERA (40.1ip/7er) ranks seventh among Major League relievers...He's faced 29 straight batters at home without allowing a hit (his last hit allowed here was a two-run home run to Houston's Isaac Paredes on June 3)...That's the longest-such active streak in all of MLB.

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 18, 1951: Ralph Kiner became the first player in club history to hit three home runs and collect seven RBI in a game, as the Pirates outlasted Brooklyn, 13-12, at Ebbets Field. Kiner hit a grand slam in the first inning, a two-run shot in the fourth and a solo blast in the eighth. The Pirates pounded out 17 hits in the win, including four from Gus Bell, who also recorded a pair of RBI.

HOW ACQUIRED: From Philadelphia for INF Rodolfo Castro on August 1, 2023.

**STARTING OFF:** The 28-year-old lefty is in his third season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline on August 1, 2023, in exchange for infielder Rodolfo Castro...He's in his fifth Major League season after debuting in 2021... He was selected by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Falter allowed three runs in 4.2 innings on July 9 at Kansas City, having a no-decision in the team's 4-3 loss...He left in the fifth inning, with the Pirates trailing 3-0...Pittsburgh tied the game in the sixth inning before the Royals' Salvador Perez led off the eighth inning with his 12th homer of the season, breaking the 3-3 tie.

**AGAINST THE WHITE SOX:** Falter will make his second career start against Chicago... He allowed three runs on three hits and three walks over 7.0 innings and lost a 3-0 decision to Lucas Giolito in his other start, which came in game two of a doubleheader at Guaranteed Rate Field on April 18, 2023, while Falter was a member of the Phillies.

**FIRST-HALF HIGHLIGHTS:** Falter ended the first half of the season with a 3.79 ERA (97.1ip/41er), the seventh-lowest ERA among left-handed pitchers in the National League with at least 95.0 innings pitched...The only pitchers on that list with a lower first-half ERA than Falter were Chicago's Matthew Boyd (2.34), Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (2.50), San Francisco's Robbie Ray (2.65), Washington's MacKenzie Gore (3.02), New York's David Peterson (3.06) and Cincinnati's Nick Lodolo (3.38).

**ALONG THE BANKS OF THE ALLEGHENY:** Tonight will be Falter's 11th start of the season here at PNC Park, where he has gone 5-1 with a 3.25 ERA (52.2ip/19er)... Since giving up seven runs over 4.0 innings in his first home start on April 5 vs. New York (AL), Falter has recorded a 2.22 ERA (48.2ip/12er) in nine starts here at PNC Park.

**RISPY BUSINESS:** Falter has posted a .232 batting average against (16-for-69) with runners in scoring position this season...Since his outing on May 9 vs. Atlanta, Falter has limited opposing hitters to a .160 batting average against (8-for-50) with RISP.

**ORDINARY, AVERAGE GUY:** Falter finished the first half of the season with a .235 batting average against (83-for-353), which was the 13th-best among all qualfied pitchers in the National League...Coming into the 2025 season, Falter's lowest batting average against in a season occurred last year, when opponents hit .260 against him.

**THE MERRY MONTH OF MAY:** Falter finished the month of May with a 0.76 ERA (35.2ip/3er), the third-lowest mark among qualified Major League pitchers during the month, behind Cincinnati's Andrew Abbott (0.55) and Kansas City's Kris Bubic (0.56)... Falter's 0.76 ERA was the lowest by any Pirates pitcher in a single month (minimum six starts) during the Live-Ball Era (since 1920)...In his outing on May 31 at San Diego, he became the first Pittsburgh pitcher to throw 6.1-plus scoreless innings on one/zero strikeouts since Jeff Locke (9.0ip/1k) did in a 10-0 win on May 30, 2016 at Miami.

**WINNING THE DAY:** Falter had his career-high-tying five-game winning streak come to an end in his outing on July 4 at Seattle...He had a 2.54 ERA (49.2ip/14er) and a .225 batting average against during the streak (began on May 9 vs. Atlanta)...He also won five consecutive decisions from August 20 [G2]-September 13, 2022 with Philadelphia.
