## RHP Jacob deGrom (2-0, 1.62) vs. LHP Max Fried (10-4, 2.60) SNY - WCBS 880 AM • ESPN 1050

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Braves, 9-7, last night...The win snapped a two-game losing streak...The Mets have won nine of their last 12 games and 18 of their last 23...The Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (15-5)...The Mets are 60-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 27-6-3 in 36 series this year.... York-AL (two games).

AUGUST IS THE HOTTEST MONTH: In his first month back in over a year, Jacob deGrom leads the majors in several categories... He ranks first in strikeout rate ( 50 percent), WHIP (0.42), K/BB (28.00), opponent average (.109), OBP (.125), OPS (.307) and H/9 (3.24)... He paces the NL in pitches per inning (12.7)...The only pitcher with more strikeouts than deGrom's 28 since August 1 is yesterday's Mets starter, Max Scherzer, who has 30 with the benefit of an extra start and 10.1 more innings pitched.

JAKE VS. THE BRAVES: DeGrom has a lifetime 2.01 ERA against Atlanta, the fourth-best mark among the 252 pitchers to throw at least 140.0 innings against the franchise... The only three pitchers with a sub-200 ERA vs the Braves are Whit Wyatt (1.64), Pete Schneider (1.91) and AI Demaree (1.97)...Each of those three pitchers had his career end before the end of World War II...DeGrom and Scherzer sit in a tie for 22 nd all-time with 213 strikeouts vs. the Braves...With a repeat performance of his last start against the club, a $12-\mathrm{K}$ outing on August 7 . DeGrom would move into a 15th-place tie with Curt Schilling.

JUICY J: Jeff McNeil leads left-handed hitters with a . 324 (34-105) batting average against left-handed pitchers this year... He has hit . 364 (8-22) with three doubles against night's starting pitcher Max Fried...McNeil is second in the majors with a 352 (63-179) oad batting average...He is batting .352/.402/.508 with 22 runs, 17 doubles, a triple majors in batting avera with a 431 mark in the month of August In 16 games this month, he is batting $431 / 460 / .690$ with 10 runs, nine doubles, two triples, eight RB and two walks.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Brett Baty homered in his first major league at-bat last night.... He became the fifth Met to hit a home run in his first major league at-bat and the first since Mike Jacobs did so on August 21, 2005...The following is a complete list of players who have hit home runs in their first at-bat with the Mets:

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since April 12, a streak of 128 consecutive days...According to Elias, It's the fifth longest-streak in franchise history.

LIFE IN THE FAST LANE: Edwin Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 96 strikeouts...That is 21 strikeouts more than the second place reliever... He has done so in 48.1 innings...He is seeking to become the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in a season in major league history...Aroldis Chapman currently owns the record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 4, 2012 in 51.0 innings...Armando Benítez owns the franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings... Courtesy of Elias.

100 STRIKEOUTS OF SOLITUDE: Díaz has struck out 96 batters in 48 games this season... He is seeking to become the seventh reliever in franchise history to strike out 100 batters in a season...The last player to do that was Seth Lugo in 2019... His careerhigh best is 124 strikeouts in 73 games in 2018...His record with the Mets is 99 strikeouts in 66 games in 2019...Díaz is eighth on the Mets all-time strikeouts list for relievers...The late Pedro Feliciano is seventh with 350 strikeouts with the Mets.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 21 outings dating back to June 22, covering 21.0 innings, establishing a career-high scoreless streak... 42 of Díaz last 59 outs have been recorded via the strikeout.... He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.33 ERA (one earned runs/27.2 innings) with 11 hits, four walks and 58 strikeouts... He has converted all 16 saves in that period.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz has struck out 52.5\% of batters faced (96/183), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 48 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.88 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00 ...Overall, he is $2-1$ with 27 saves, a 1.30 ERA ( $7 \mathrm{ER} / 48.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ), allowing 27 hits and 14 walks...The Mets are $42-6$ when Díaz appears in a game this year

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets need to win one of its four remaining games against Atlanta to lock up the season series...It would be New York's first season series victory since 2017.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year... He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East (3-3)...Overall, the Mets are 40-17 against the East this year...They have not lost a series in the division all season long and have already clinched the season series vs. Philadelphia, Washington and Miami...New York must win one of its four remaining games against Atlanta to lock up all four season series vs. division foes (last accomplished by the Mets in 2015)...Since May 27, the team has gone 27-10 in the division...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.22 ERA against the East, while hitting .260/.335/.417...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents, 283-195.

SWEET 16: According to Elias, New York has either won or tied each of their 16 series this season against the NL East...That is tied for the second-longest streak by a team to start a season since the MLB implemented divisions in 1969...It's the longest since the Braves also went 16 straight in the NL East to start the 1999 season...The Cincinnati Reds own the longest streak, an 18-series streak in the NL West to start 1970.

MAX EFFORT: Last night, Max Scherzer struck out eight on the way to career win number 199...Justin Verlander (241) and Zack Greinke (223) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career... He is 199-99 in his career...If he wins his next decision, he will reach 200 career wins before losing 100 games...Elias says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came before their 100th loss: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96).

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo has reached base safely in 25 straight road games the longest stretch of his career...He is batting .362 (38-105) with 24 runs, six doubles, five home runs, $16 \mathrm{RBI}, 10$ walks with a .429 OBP, a .562 SLG and a .990 OPS in that span
that dates to June 12 Overall, he is batting $316 / 404 / 500$ with 47 runs, 11 doubles, two that dates to June 12...Overall, he is batting . $316 / .404 / .500$ with 47 runs, 11 doubles, two to a $.209 / 286$, road OBP is third in the National League and sixth in the majors.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are $36-23$ on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their 2021 road wins total ( $30-51$ )...Their .610 road winning percentage is the second-best in MLB...New York is batting .260/.326/.417 away from Citi Field...Their . 260 road average ranks third in the majors and is the best in the NL as does their . 326 OBP on the road.

ON THE RECORD: New York has won 76 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the second-most in the majors...Their .644 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 76-42 record through the team's first 118 games...Only the 1986 (77-41) team posted a better record through the first 118 games of the season.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 18-7 in the second-half...The team's 18 wins are the second-most in the majors, and their .720 winning percentage also ranks second... The team is batting .281/.347/.455 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and OBP and are fourth in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents $125-90$ following the break.

JUST SHORT: Francisco Lindor has hit 21 home runs this season (20 as a shortstop)... Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016...He is the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 83 RBI in 117 games this seaso.. (81 a shortstop)....

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season.... He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons..Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs.

200 CLUB: On August 7, 2022 against Atlanta, deGrom set the MLB record for most strikeouts through a pitcher's first 200 career starts with 1,523 ...He surpassed the previous record set by Yu Darvish with 1,517...Through his first 200 games, deGrom recorded a 2.50 ERA...Only five pitchers have had a lower ERA through 200 career games (min. 1,000 IP): Dutch Leonard (2.09), Carl Mays (2.23), Reb Russell (2.28), and Baseball Hall of Famers Red Faber (2.41) and Tom Seaver (2.42).

SINCE 2020: Has a 1.63 ERA ( 32 ER/176.2 IP) in 30 starts over the last three seasons... Has 278 strikeouts and 30 walks in that span...His ERA is the best in MLB (min. 162.0 IP) in that span by more than half a run...He also leads the majors in WHIP (0.70), K/9 (14.16) and K/BB ratio (9.27).

HIT THE ROAD, JAKE: Since the start of 2018, deGrom owns a 2.05 ERA ( 60 earned runs/264.0 innings) on the road, by far the best mark in MLB in that span... He is the only pitcher (min. 250.0 innings) with a road ERA under 2.30 over the last four years...He is $9-0$ with a 1.90 ERA ( $27 \mathrm{ER} / 128.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) over his last 21 road starts...His 21 consecutive road starts without taking a loss are the most in Mets history...Dwight Gooden (15-straight, July 10, 1987-May 21, 1988) and Ron Darling (15, July 7, 1985May 21-1986) previously held the club mark...Jake Arrieta (23 in a row from 2015-2016) was the last pitcher with a longer unbeaten streak on the road...The major league record is 25 road starts without a loss.

OVERPOWERING HEATER: DeGrom used his fastball 57.4 percent of the time last season...Even giving hitters a better than 50-50 chance of guessing what was coming, the pitch has been nearly untouchable, with batters going 29-188 (.154) with 69 strikeouts in at bats ending on the fastball since the start of last year...He's averaged 99.2 mph on the offering, the highest ever by a starting pitcher over a full season

THE EXCELLENCE IS SUSTAINABLE: Since 2018, deGrom owns a 1.93 ERA in 94 starts... That is the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 400.0 IP )...Justin Verlander is second with a 2.41 ERA, while teammate Max Scherzer has posted a 2.66 ERA since 2018...Since 1920, only four other starting pitchers have held an ERA of 1.93 or lower over a span this long: Sandy Koufax, Bob Gibson, Greg Maddux and Clayton Kershaw.

2022 SEASON, PART 2: In five starts since the All-Star Break, Bassitt has pitched to a 1.64 ERA (six earned runs/33.0 innings) going 3-1, with 30 strikeouts and eight walks...Last year, Bassitt was 2-2 with a 2.75 post-All-Star Break ERA.
