**11TH ANNUAL D-BACKS RACE AGAINST CANCER:** On Sunday, September 29, the D-backs will host their 11th annual "D-backs Race Against Cancer" presented by Dignity Health Cancer Institute...proceeds from the event will support local patient care and cancer research projects such as screening tools to assist with earlier diagnosis, innovative treatment options for those currently facing cancer, and creating and maintaining support systems for patients' families...registration ends after September 28 and no race day registration will be available...for more info, visit dbacks.com/race.

#### SNAKEBITES

**THE NL CHAMPS:** The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

**LAST GAME:** The D-backs won, 9-4, yesterday @ Rockies.

- ◆ Corbin Carroll (2-4, 2 HR, 3 RBI) logged his career-high third multi-homer game, which are second most by a D-back this season.
- ◆ Eduardo Rodriguez (W, 2 ER in 6.1 IP, 11 K) collected 11+ strikeouts in a start for the first time since Sept. 14, 2019 @ Phillies (12 K) while with the Red Sox and first outing of 6.0+ innings since Oct. 1, 2023 vs. Guardians (7.0 IP) while with the Tigers.

**FOX TV BROADCAST TONIGHT:** Tonight's game will be exclusively televised on FOX Baseball Night in America with Adam Amin & A.J. Pierzynski.

**IN THE STANDINGS:** The D-backs are in third place in the NL West, trailing the Dodgers by 6.0 games and the Padres by 2.5 games...currently are tied for the second spot in the NL Wild Card (also: Mets, who hold tiebreaker), 2.5 games behind the Padres and 2.0 games ahead of the Braves (4th in WC).

**CORBIN 1 SHY OF 20+ HR/30+ SB: Corbin Carroll** is 1 stolen base shy of becoming the first D-back ever to record consecutive seasons with 20+ homers and 30+ stolen bases.

♦ On Wednesday, he became the fourth D-back in franchise history with 2+ consecutive seasons of 20+ homers and 20+ stolen bases (2023-24), joining Paul Goldschmidt (2015-16), Chris Young (2010-11) and Eric Byrnes (2006-07).

**AGE 23 OR YOUNGER WITH 20+ HR/20+ SB SEASONS: Corbin Carroll** is the 11th player in MLB history to have 2+ seasons of 20+ homers and 20+ stolen bases in their age 23 season or younger [h/t Jack Sommers/Stathead]:

**VS. LEFTIES:** Since the All-Star break vs. lefties, the D-backs lead MLB with a .480 SLG, 125 runs, 2.36 runs per game and 198 hits.

**HISTORICAL RUN:** The D-backs' 6.42 runs scored per game post-All-Star break are currently the most by a NL team in MLB history [ahead of 1953 Dodgers/6.41], and fifth overall, behind the Yankees (1936/6.67, 2007/6.65, 1994/6.54, 1939/6.47).

**STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE:** Out of the NL contending teams vying for a Postseason berth, the D-backs remaining schedule (.548) is second toughest:

**MOST WINS SINCE JULY 1:** Since July 1, Arizona leads MLB with an .850 OPS, .356 OBP .494 SLG, 441 runs and 6.49 R/G.

♦ The D-backs' 43 wins (43-25, .627; 20-12 home, 23-13 road) are second most in MLB to the Mets (43), ahead of the Tigers (42) and Padres (41).

**84 WINS:** The D-backs 84 wins match their total from last year (84-78) with 10 games remaining.

♦ The D-backs last reached 85+ wins in a season in 2019 (85) and 90+ wins in a season in 2017 (93)...Arizona has only reached 85+ wins on 8 occasions all-time.

**ADDITIONAL FIRST-INNING FACTS:** The D-backs lead the Majors with a franchise-high 36 occurrences of scoring 2+ runs in the first inning [previous high: 34 in 2018], ahead of the Yankees (30), Padres (25) and Marlins (25).

♦ In the first inning, the D-backs lead MLB with franchise highs of a .324 AVG, .383 OBP, .554 SLG, .937 OPS, 201 hits and 344 total bases...also lead MLB with 117 runs (third highest in franchise history).

MARTE 1 HOMER SHY: Ketel Marte is 1 homer shy of a new career high...his 32 are tied for the most of his career (also: 2019, when he finished fourth in NL MVP voting).

♦ Marte leads all second basemen [min. 100 G] in OPS (.910), OBP (.364), SLG (.547), homers (32), RBI (87), XBH (55) and bWAR (5.8).

**G0, G0 GENO!:** Since July 1, **Eugenio Suárez**'s 65 RBI are the most in the Majors, ahead of Brent Rooker/OAK (63) and Manny Machado/SD (59), while his 22 homers are tied for second most (also: Aaron Judge/NYY and Shohei Ohtani/LAD), behind Brent Rooker/OAK (23).

♦ His 1.220 OPS since Sept. 1 leads MLB while his 7 homers are tied for the most this month with Kyle Schwarber/PHI.

#### NEXT STARTER: RHP ZAC GALLEN (12-6, 3.61)

♦In his last 3 starts, is 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA (3 ER in 16.0 IP) with only 8 hits (1 HR) allowed and 22 strikeouts.

AT A GLANCE: Second season with the D-backs...debuted in 2023 and | THEN AND NOW: In his 18 starts last season, went 3-9 with a 5.70 ERA (57 made 5 starts in the Postseason (1 Wild Card, 1 NLDS, 2 NLCS, 1 World Series).

- Named the D-backs' 2022 Minor League Pitcher of the Year after leading the organization's farmhands in wins (11), ERA (3.83) and strikeouts (218).
- D-backs' fifth-round pick in the 2020 draft (Bellarmine University).

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Leads the team in starts (29), innings pitched (166.2) and strikeouts (160)...his 12 quality starts are tied with Ryne Nelson for the team lead.

- Arizona is 10-4 over his last 14 starts and 4-2 in his last 6 road bids... leads the staff with 6 quality road starts.
- Is 2-1 with a 3.86 ERA (14 ER in 32.2 IP), 7 walks and 31 strikeouts over his last 6 road starts.

LAST START: Lost vs. Brewers on Sept. 14 (8 ER in 1.2 IP, 7 H, 3 BB).

VS. BREWERS: Is making his second career regular-season start...made his first career start last week (See Last Start).

• Made the start in Game 1 of the 2023 NL Wild Card on Oct. 3 @ Brewers (ND; 3 ER in 2.2 IP, 7 H, 1 BB, 4 K).

AMONG TOP ARMS: Since June 30, ranks among top NL starters in wins (T-6th, 6), strikeouts/BB (10th, 4.93) and BB/9.0 IP (12th, 1.94).

**ROAD STINGY:** Has yielded 2 walks or fewer in 12 of his last 13 road starts.

WORKHORSE: Has worked 5.0+ innings in 25 of his 29 starts this season.

- Has tossed 5.0+ innings in 13 of his 15 road bids and gone 6.0+ frames in 8 road starts.
- Is 1 of 15 NL pitchers to record 25+ starts of 5.0+ innings...only 8 NL pitchers have recorded 26+ such starts.

VS. RIGHTIES: Is limiting righties on the road to a .213 AVG (35-for-164)/.614 OPS with a 0.95 WHIP, 8 walks and 46 strikeouts.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: With his sweeper (28.4% usage), is limiting hitters to a .210 AVG (42-for-200) with a 35.3% whiff and 72 strikeouts.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS: Since last season improved his first pitch strike percent by 6.9% from 63.9 to 70.8.

• Additionally, decreased his hard-hit percentage by 4.4, from 44.0% last season to 39.6%.

ER in 90.0 IP), 25 walks and 90 strikeouts...in comparison, over his last 18 starts this season, has gone 7-5 with a 5.24 ERA (58 ER in 99.2 IP), 27 walks and 97 strikeouts.

**LUCKY NO. 7:** Has worked a career-high-tying 7.0 innings 5 times this season (last: Aug. 12 vs. Rockies) and 7 times in his career.

NO-HIT FRAMES: Has opened with 4.0 no-hit innings twice this season (April 22 @ Cardinals and May 15 vs. Reds), which are tied for second longest in his career, behind his 6.1 innings on Aug. 18, 2023 @ Padres.

SCORELESS STREAK: Recorded a career-best 16.2 scoreless-innings streak from July 6-July 27.

STEE-RIKE!: On April 28 @ Mariners, set a career high with 11 strikeouts, his first career double-digit game...matched his career high on Aug. 12 vs. Rockies.

QUALITY CONTROL: His 5 straight quality starts from April 28-May 21 tied for the third-longest by a D-back since 2021.

2023 RECAP: Went 3-9 with a 5.72 ERA (61 ER in 96.0 IP) in 18 starts.

- Entered the season rated as the D-backs' No. 4 prospect by MLB Pipeline (No. 59 overall) and No. 5 by Baseball America.
- Made his Major League debut on May 3 @ Rangers (7 ER in 4.2 IP).
- Got his first Major League win on Aug. 25 vs. Reds (5.1 IP, 2 ER, 5 K).
- Had a trio of career-high 8-strikeout games on Aug. 13 vs. Padres and back-to-back on Sept. 22 @ Yankees and Sept. 27 @ White Sox.
- Had a 12.2-inning scoreless streak spanning 3 starts from Aug. 13 vs. Padres (2nd inning)-Aug. 25 vs. CIN (2nd inning).

- ♦ Made his first career relief appearance on Sept. 14 vs. Brewers (2 ER in 4.0 IP, 2 K).
- ♦In 4 career starts (2 quality), is 1-1 with a 4.05 ERA (9 ER in 20.0 IP), 4 walks and 7 strikeouts.
- ♦ At age 23-324, became the fifth youngest D-back starting pitcher to toss 6.0+ innings in their debut, behind Tyler Skaggs (21-040, 2012), Archie Bradley (22-244, 2015), Bryan Augenstein (22-306, 2009) and Enrique González (23-318, 2006).
