**TONIGHT'S GAME:** The Braves and Marlins open a four-game set tonight with the 13th of 19 meetings between the clubs...This is Atlanta's last trip to Miami this season...The clubs will meet again at SunTrust Park on August 20-21 to wrap up the season series.

**A** The Braves went 14-5 (.737) against the Marlins last season, matching the franchise record for most single-season victories against Florida/Miami... The tied the mark first set in 2004 and matched in 2012...The Braves have seven more games against the Marlins this season.

**A** LH Dallas Keuchel is set to face the Marlins for the fourth time in his career and for the second time this season...The lefty tossed 7.1 innings and allowed two runs, earned, in a 4-3 win on July 7 at SunTrust Park, his first appearance against Miami since 2017...Overall, Keuchel is 2-1 with a 1.86 ERA (4 ER/19.1 IP) in his three career starts against the Marlins.

**A** RH Elieser Hernández is set to face the Braves for the seventh time in his career and for the second time as a starter...The righty has never pitched against the Braves in a victory, and is personally 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (4 ER/12.0 IP)...He took his lone loss in his lone start against the Braves, going 3.0 innings and allowing three runs, earned, in a 5-0 defeat on August 23, 2018 here at Marlins Park.

**MOVING ON TO MOIST MIAMI:** After spending the first three games of their road trip in Minnesota, the Braves have four games in Miami...The club is 6-0 at Marlins Park this season and have won seven straight at the ballpark, the club's longest winning streak in Florida/Miami in franchise history...They have not lost a series here since losing three of four games to end the 2017 season, September 28-October 1, 2017.

**A** Since the beginning of last year, the Braves are 12-4 (.750) here in Miami, outscoring the Marlins, 85-42.

**A** Overall, the Braves are 47-23 (.671) here, the best record by any National League team in Marlins Park...Among all major league teams, they rank second...Tampa Bay is 13-6 (.684).

**ROSTER MOVE:** The Braves today recalled RHP Jeremy Walker from Triple-A Gwinnett and placed OF Austin Riley on the 10-day injured list, retroactive to August 5, with a right knee sprain.

**A** Walker joins the team for his second stint at the major league level this season...He was up from July 24-August 1, and made his major league debut on July 26 at Philadelphia with a scoreless inning.

**A** He went unscored upon over his three major league appearances, all lasting one inning each.

**A** At Triple-A, Walker appeared in six games, allowing eight earned runs over 13.0 innings...Overall, across two minor league levels, Walker went 2-6 with a 3.01 ERA (24 ER/71.2 IP) and seven saves over 27 games, one start, this season.

**PRODUCTION FROM THE TOP:** OF Ronald Acuña Jr., 2B Ozzie Albies (twice), and 1B Freddie Freeman all homered yesterday, while going a combined 8-for-15 (.533) with six runs scored and five RBI in the Braves' 11-7 win...The production came a day after the trio combined to go 10-for-16 (.625) with eight RBI and nine runs scored in a 12-7 victory...For the series, the three went 23-for-45 (.511) with seven home runs, 18 runs, 15 RBI and two walks.

**A** For the season, the top three spots in the Braves lineup have hit 81 homers, most in the National League, and scored 280 runs, also most in the league.

**ON THE ROAD:** The Braves won another road series yesterday, beating Minnesota in two-of-three games to improve to 13-5-1 in series play away from SunTrust Park.

**A** Atlanta currently owns the best road record in the National League at 36-23 (.610).

**A** Only Minnesota (35-21, .625) and Tampa Bay (35-22, .614) have been better on the road this season.

**A** Atlanta went 4-2 on its last road trip, taking series from Philadelphia and Washington.

**A** The Braves finished 47-34 (.580) away from SunTrust Park last season, tied for the best road record in the National League...They won 11 road series all of last season.

**FREEMAN DAY OFF:** 1B Freddie Freeman did not start on Sunday, just the second game this season the All-Star began on the bench...He entered as a pinch hitter in the ninth inning of that game.

**A** In the three games since his day off, Freeman is 8-for-14 (.571) with three home runs, six RBI, and five runs scored.

**A** After his first day off on May 12, Freeman went 18-for-52 (.346) with six home runs and a 1.145 OPS over his next 13 games.

**A** Freeman's two homers the last two days came on the first pitch...The first baseman is hitting .466 (27-for-58) with nine home runs and a 1.509 OPS when putting the first pitch of an at-bat in play this season.

**OZZIE FOUR HITS:** 2B Ozzie Albies collected consecutive four-hit games the last two days and he is just the eighth Braves player in the live-ball era (since 1920) with consecutive four-hit games, and the first since Matt Diaz in 2006.

**A** Only one Braves player, Marcus Giles in 2003, has done so in three straight games.

**A** Albies ranks fourth in the National League in hits with 136, two behind teammates 1B Freddie Freeman and OF Ronald Acuña Jr. for the second most...Arizona's Ketel Marte leads the league with 141 hits.

#### Tonight's Game

- A* Makes his 10th start of the season and the 193rd of his career...Is his 202nd career appearance.
- A* Faces Miami for the fourth time in his career and for the second time this season... Is 2-1 with a 1.86 ERA (4 ER/19.1 IP) over his first three turns.
- A* Pitched against them once this season, July 7 at SunTrust Park...Went a season-most 7.1 innings and held the Marlins to five hits and two runs to get the win, 4-3.
- A* Has made one career start at Marlins Park, May 16 of last season...Got the win, 12-2, after allowing four hits and two runs in 5.0 innings.
- A* Makes his sixth start of the season on the road, and is 2-3 with a 4.71 ERA (15 ER/28.2 IP) over his first five starts.
- A* Opponents are batting .301/.388/.558 against him away from SunTrust Park, and just .172/.219/.273 in four games at home.
- A* Of the 155 pitchers to make at least nine starts this season, Keuchel's .129 difference in batting average between home and road starts is second biggest in the majors...Only Detroit's Ryan Carpenter, who has a .381 average at home and a .241 mark on the road (.140 difference), has a larger split.
- A* Allowing opponents to bat just .178/.250/.233 against him in their first time through the lineup, with two extra-base hits and 18 strikeouts.
- A* Opponents are hitting .211/.300/.380 when seeing him a second time, and .328/.386/.688 on their third trip through the order.
- A* Keuchel has a 1.00 ERA (3 ER/27.0 IP) through the first three innings of his starts, and a 6.52 ERA (21 ER/29.0 IP) from the fourth inning on.
- A* Last started on August 3 vs. Cincinnati and held the Reds scoreless over the first six innings, before allowing a three-run homer with one out in the seventh... Each of the last five runs he has allowed have scored in either the sixth or seventh inning.

#### 2019 Recap

- A* Started, 7/23 vs. KC, and logged his sixth career double-digit strikeout game... Fanned 12 Royals over 6.0 innings, one off his career high.
- A* The last Atlanta pitcher to fan more batters in a single start was Kris Medlen, who struck out 13 Nationals over 7.0 innings on September 14, 2012.
- A* Keuchel also doubled in the fifth inning in his last start, and became just the third pitcher in Atlanta franchise history to strike out at least 11 batters and double in the same game, joining Greg Maddux (April 24, 1994 vs. Pittsburgh) and Julio Teheran (August 1, 2013 vs. Colorado).
- A* Beat the Padres on 7/12, allowing just six hits and one run over 7.0 innings.
- A* In three career starts against San Diego, is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (3 ER/21.0 IP)...Has allowed exactly one run in each of the three turns.
- A* Earned the win in Atlanta's final start before the All-Star break, 7/7 vs. MIA, and in Atlanta's first game after the break, 7/12 at SD...Became the third Braves pitcher to start and win consecutive regular season games for the Braves in the modern era (since 1900) and the first since Johnny Sain on September 6 and September 11 of 1948.
- A* Pitched at least 7.0 innings in each his three starts from 7/2-12, going 2-1 with a 2.11 ERA (5 ER/21.1 IP) in that span.
- A* Was the first Atlanta starter to pitch at least 7.0 innings in three consecutive turns since 2017, when Jaime García did so from 5/31 to 6/11.
- A* Lowered his ERA by nearly two full points during the stretch, from 5.06 after his second start of the season to 3.09 following his start at SD.
- A* Went a season-long 7.1 innings and allowed five hits and two runs to earn his second win of the season, 7/7 vs. MIA.
- A* Was his first daytime start of the season...For his career, is 26-22 with a 3.53 ERA (166 ER/423.2 IP) in 64 career starts during the day.
- A* Made his first career appearance at SunTrust Park, 7/2 vs. PHI...Allowed just five hits and two runs over 7.0 innings, but took his second loss of the season.
- A* Became the 18th different Atlanta pitcher to make a start at SunTrust Park.
- A* Earned his first win of the season, 6/26 at CHI...Held the Cubs to three runs over 5.2 innings in Atlanta's 5-3 win.
- A* Was his first win in the majors since 9/24/18 at Toronto, while with Houston... Went 275 days between wins.
- A* Made his season debut, 6/21 at WSH...Took the loss after allowing eight hits and four runs (three earned) over 5.0 innings...Did not walk a batter, and struck out three.
- A* Signed by the Braves to a one-year major league contract on 6/7...Was recalled to Atlanta on 6/21.
- A* Became the first former Cy Young winner to join Atlanta midseason since the Braves acquired reliever Mark Davis from the Kansas City Royals in 1992.

#### Career Recap

- A* Selected by the Houston Astros in the seventh round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft...Signed by Jim Stevenson.

- Is 1-0 with 3.57 ERA (9 ER/22.2 IP) in 30 games with Atlanta...Twenty-five of his 30 appearances have been scoreless, including 12 of his last 14.
- On July 27 celebrated 10 years of major league service time.
- Allowed four runs, earned, in 1.0 inning of work, 5/7 at LAD...Has a 2.08 ERA (5 ER/21.2 IP) in his other 29 games.
- Seventeen of his 30 appearances have been less than 1.0 inning.
- Holding left-handed batters to a .154 (6-for-39) average with 12 strikeouts...Righties are 12-for-46 (.261) with 15 strikeouts.
- Atlanta acquired him from the Oakland A's on 4/28 in exchange for cash considerations...Was designated for assignment by Atlanta on 5/14 and re-signed to a major league contract on 5/18.

- Made his Braves debut on 8/3 vs. CIN, allowing a run in the ninth inning to blow a save...Has allowed a run in each of his three games with the Braves.
- Acquired from Detroit on July 31 in exchange for LHP Joey Wentz and OF Travis Demeritte...Prior to joining the Braves ranked fourth in the American League with his 22 saves, while his 1.18 ERA was the second lowest in baseball to San Diego's Kirby Yates among qualifying relievers.
- Was 0-2 with 22 saves and a 1.18 ERA (5 ER/38.0 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 12 walks in 38 games out of the bullpen for the Tigers this season.
- Finished tied for fourth in the league with 32 saves in 2018.
- Originally drafted by the Yankees in the 15th round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of Daytona State College in Florida, Greene made his major league debut with New York in 2014...He worked mostly as a starter that season, and converted full-time to a relief role in 2017.

- Is 6-2 with a 3.78 ERA (22 ER/52.0 IP) in 50 games this season...Has converted 17 of his 24 save chances after logging just one career save prior to 2019...His seven blown saves are tied for the most in the majors.
- Fanned all three batters he faced, 8/3 vs. CIN, to collect his sixth win of the season in his first appearance since the club acquired RHP Shane Greene at the trade deadline.
- Since July 12, has allowed nine runs in 10 games (8.1 IP) for a 9.72 ERA...Owned a 2.66 ERA (13 ER/44.0 IP) prior.
- Earned his 17th save, 7/15 at Milwaukee...Has four saves of at least 1.1 innings.
- Left-handers have just 14 hits in 77 at-bats (.182) against him...Righties are hitting .310 (40-for-129).
- Has fanned 70 batters in 52.0 innings for a career-best 12.19 SO/9.0 IP ratio.
