BIRD WATCHING: The Cardinals continue their penultimate homestand of the season tonight (0-1 vs. BAL, PIT-3) with the middle game of a three-game interleague series against the Baltimore Orioles...the Cardinals have matched their season-high longest losing streak of four games for the 6th time, and need wins tonight & tomorrow to avoid losing back/back series for the first time since dropping 3-of-4 vs. the Cubs (July 27-30) and 2-of-3 at the Blue Jays (July 31-Aug. 2)...including tonight's game, the Cardinals have 29 regular season games remaining with 14 at home & 15 on the road.

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis entered play today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 15.5 games behind 1st place Milwaukee; 1.5 games ahead of 4th place Pittsburgh and 5.0 games out of the final National League Wild Card position...the Cardinals are 4-6 in their last 10 games, 10-10 in last 20 and 14-16 in last 30...they are 35-38 vs. teams that are currently .500 or better and 31-29 vs. the sub .500 teams.

THE WINS WHISPERER: Tonight's starter **Michael McGreevy** has put the Cardinals in position to win in each of his four starts this month with the Redbirds a perfect 4-0 in his August starts, even though he has just one win to his credit this month (1-0, 3.38 ERA)...oddly, his lone career win in interleague play came in his 1st career MLB start on 7/31/24 vs. Texas.

ROOKIE 10/10: **Nathan Church's** HR (#10) last night provided the Cardinals lone run and moved him closer to becoming just the 10th Cardinals rookie (also **JJ Wetherholt** this season, 17 HR/14 SB) to amass 10 HR/10 SB in a season, needing just two more steals to do so - it's something no pair of Cardinals rookies have ever done in the same season.

THE RBI GUYS: Teammates **Alec Burleson** & **Jordan Walker** find themselves locked in a tie for RBI (96), ranking T-2nd in MLB behind the Reds Sal Stewart (99)...the Duo has combined for the greatest pct. (33.7 pct.) of team RBI since 1989 when **Pedro Guerrero** (117) & **Tom Brunansky** (85) combined for 34.4 pct...**Joe Medwick** (154) & **Johnny Mize** (113) combined for a team record 36.5 pct. of RBI in 1937. (Orf).

HAIR OF THE DOG: With baseballs' "Dog Days" of August coming to a close this weekend, the Cardinals feature three quaiifying batters hitting +300 for the month in **Alec Burleson** (.337), **Nathan Church** (.317) and **Jordan Walker** (.306); the NY Mets are the only other NL team with a trio of batters hitting +300 this month (Carson Benge, NL best .359, Bo Bichette, Jared Young and Luis Robert, Jr.)...**Burleson** also has an MLB best 25 RBI this month with the Orioles **Pete Alonso** ranked 3rd (20)

STILL STREAKING: **Alec Burleson** singled in the 6th inning last night to extend his hitting streak to 11 games, the longest active hit streak in the N.L....Burly is batting .366 (15-41) during the streak with 12 RBI & 10 runs scored...the **Cardinals** have hit home runs in 8-straight games for the 3rd time this season, their most 8-game HR streaks since 2022 when they had four.

BALTIMORE CONNECTIONS

JJ Wetherholt was born in Baltimore...is an avid fan of the Baltimore Ravens despite moving to Mars, PA, at age 5.

Ramón Urias was claimed off waivers by Baltimore from St. Louis on Feb. 11, 2020...played in 506 games for the Orioles (2020-25)...signed with St. Louis as a free agent on Feb. 21, 2026.

George Soriano was claimed off waivers by Baltimore (Nov. 5, 2025), his 1st of three waiver claims during 2025-26 (also Atlanta & Washington).

Asst. Pitching Coach **Kyle Driscoll** resides in Md.

Andrew Kittredge pitched the 2024 season in St. Louis...set the Cardinals single-season holds record (37)...originally traded by Tampa Bay to St. Louis for OF **Richie Palacios** (Jan. 5, 2024).

Jackson Holliday's father, **Matt Holliday**, played parts of eight seasons in St. Louis (2009-16), where he was a three-time NL All-Star, member of the 2011 World Series Champions, and later elected to the Cardinals Hall of Fame in 2022.

Tyler O'Neill played 477 with the Cardinals (2018-23) and co-led the team with 34 HRs in 2021...won Rawlings Gold Glove awards in '20 & '21.

Ryan Helsley was selected by St. Louis in the 5th round of the 2015 MLB Draft and pitched in seven seasons for the Cardinals (2019-25) with 105 saves (6th in franchise history), including a franchise single-season record 49 in 2024...traded to NYM in exchange for 3 MLB players in 2025.

Bryan Torres and **Rico Garcia** were teammates on Team Puerto Rico in the 2026 WBC.

Orioles Infield Coach **Miguel Cairo** played in 255 games for the Cardinals (2001-03, '07).

Yohel Pozo played in 85 games for St. Louis from 2025-26...was claimed off waivers by Baltimore from St. Louis on July 23, 2026.

Cardinals Principal Owner/Chairman **Bill DeWitt Jr.** has been a prior owner of the Baltimore Orioles...his father, **William O. DeWitt**, began his baseball career in 1916 as a 14-year-old office boy with the St. Louis Browns, and later rejoined the organization as an executive and team owner, in the early 1940s...was majority owner of the Browns (1949-51) when Bill, Jr. served as the team's bat boy...DeWitt Jr's uniform (#1/8) was worn by **Eddie Gaedel** during his famous pinch-hitting appearance on August 19, 1951.

Orioles EVP & GM **Mike Elias** spent five seasons as a scout with St. Louis, including over a year as the club's Manager of Amateur Scouting.

Orioles Assistant Pitching Coach **Mitch Plassmeyer** was born in St. Louis...graduated from nearby DeSmet Jesuit High School in 2014...worked as Mizzou Pitching Coach (2022) & Director of Baseball Player Development (2021-22).

The **St. Louis Browns** played 52 seasons in the AL (1902-53), playing at Sportsman's Park and shared the same ballpark with the Cardinals from 1920-53...Coinciding with the sale of the Cardinals and Sportsman's Park to Anheuser Busch, the Browns relocated to Baltimore as the Orioles in 1954.

Orioles Chief Strategy Officer **Rosina Lanson**, Pitching Director **Forrest Herrmann** & Chief Revenue Officer **Don Rovak** are St. Louis natives...Rovak served as VP of Marketing & Ticketing for Triple-A Memphis from 1998-2007.

Orioles VP & AGM, Analytics **Sig Mejdal** worked for St. Louis for seven seasons (2005-11), spending his final year as the team's Director, Amateur Draft Analysis...began pro baseball career as a Quantitative Analyst for the Cardinals in 2005.

Orioles Bench Coach **Donnie Ecker** was a hitting coach in the Cardinals' minor league system at Palm Beach (2015-16) and Peoria (2017).

Orioles VP, Intl. Scouting & Operations **Koby Perez** worked as the Northeast area scout for the Cardinals from 2006-08.

Orioles VP, Player & Staff Development **Matt Blood** worked for the Cardinals as an area scout from 2009-15.

The Baltimore Orioles of the National League went 72-30 against the St. Louis Browns/Perfectos from 1892-99 before being eliminated by the National League...Upon the foundation of the American League in 1901, a reorganized Baltimore Orioles franchise competed as a charter member, before relocating to New York City after two seasons, where they ultimately became known as the New York Yankees.

In the only all-St. Louis World Series, Sportman's Park hosted the 1944 Fall Classic as the Cardinals defeated the Browns, 4-2, for their 5th World Series title...dubbed the "St. Louis Showdown," "Trolley Series," and "Streetcar Series" as many fans used that mode of travel to and from the ballpark...third World Series in which both teams had the same home field (1921 & 1922 at New York City's Polo Grounds)...remains one of four World Series to feature teams from the same city (1906 Chicago & 1921-22 in New York).

TONIGHT'S START:

- Making his 26th start of the season, continuing to add to his career-high in starts and appearances.
- Leads the Cardinals with a career-high 137.1 innings. Pitched a career-best 173.0 innings between Memphis-AAA (150,0) and St. Louis (23.0) in 2024.
- Allowed two runs or fewer in 15 of his 25 starts this season, while his 13 starts of 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer runs allowed lead the Cardinals and rank T-6th in MLB.**
- Ranks among NL leaders in Pct. Pitches Taken (55.3%, 3rd), Pct. Pitches Put in Play (19.2%, 6th) and Pct. Swings Put In Play (43.0%, 2nd).
- The Cardinals are 26-18 (.591 win pct.) in his 44 career starts.
- Has yet to issue more than three walks in any of his first 44 career starts, longest such streak to begin a career by a Cardinal. Seattle's **George Kirby** leads active pitchers with 137.
- Has pitched 6.0+ innings in 27 of 44 career starts (23 quality starts), including 9 of his last 14 since June 1 ... Had a team-high streak of 5 straight 6.0+ IP starts from June 26-July 23.
- Allowed 1 run or fewer with 6.0+ IP in a four-start stretch (April 26-May 14), the longest such streak by a Cardinal since **Adam Wainwright** had four straight starts from Sept. 2-18, 2019.
- Since joining the rotation June 8, 2025, St. Louis has won 23 of his starts - most among all Cardinals starters.

LAST TIME OUT (Thursday, August 20 at Cincinnati):, ND, W 10-9; 5.1 IP, 3 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 2 BB, 4 SO, HR; 90 pitches

- Allowed three runs on three hits in 5.1 innings in the Cardinals wild 10-9 win over the Reds at Great American Ball Park.
- Exited with one out and the bases loaded with the Cardinals leading 4-0 as McGreevy allowed one walk and a pair of singles.
- The Cardinals (6) and Reds (4) combined for 10 runs in the 9th inning.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

ONE FOR THE ROAD: Posted a 3.66 ERA in 13 road starts this season, with a team-high six quality starts.

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE: Has induced a career-high 14 groundball double plays, one of an MLB-best five Cardinals starting pitchers this season.

HERE COMES THE SUN...: Is 2-2 with a 2.81 ERA (20 ER/64.0 IP) in day games this season with a team-leading 1.09 WHIP and a team-high 7 quality starts; however, has allowed 9 of 18 HR in his 10 afternoon starts.

EMPTY HANDED: The Cardinals have given him 2 runs of support or fewer in 13 of his starts. The Cardinals have been shut out 7 times this season, 4 of which were when McGreevy starts.

FAITH IN FIELDERS: Has the NL's lowest percent (19.4) of Swing & Miss. His difference in Opponent BA (.251) vs. xBA (.280) ranks 4th among qualified MLB starting pitchers (-.029).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: Celebrated his 26th birthday vs. MIL (7/8) with a 5-1 win, limiting the Brew Crew to 1 run in a season-high 6.1 innings.

"NO" NEWS IS GOOD NEWS: Retired the first nine batters en route to 6.0 no-hit innings in his first start of the season vs. TB (3/28) in a no decision the Cardinals won in 10 innings (6-5) ... Became the first Cardinal to throw 6.0+ no-hit innings in a completed start since **Erick Fedde** on April 9, 2025 at Pittsburgh (6.0 IP). Since 1961, the Cardinals record for the longest hitless inning streak *as a starter* (excluding any possible intervening relief appearances) to begin a season is 8.0 IP by **Daniel Ponce de Leon** - July 23, 2018 (7.0 IP) and Aug. 21, 2018 (1.0 IP) - *Elias*

RARE BIRD: In his season debut on 3/28 vs. TB, became the 2nd pitcher in team history with a hitless start within his first 2 starts (**Jack Flaherty** 4/1/23 vs. TOR) and the 14th time in MLB a pitcher has in a start of 6.0+ IP. **Emerson Hancock** (SEA) had 6.0 no-hit innings vs. CLE the next day.

McGREEVY vs. BALTIMORE:

- Is making his 1st career appearance/start against Baltimore, his 24th different opponent faced in his young career.
- Previously faced Tampa Bay and New York in the NL East, combining for a 1.74 ERA (10.2 IP) and .111 average against.
- Lifetime 1-3 with a 2.83 ERA (67.0 IP) and 42 strikeouts in 12 Interleague starts.
