METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Phillies, 4-0, yesterday at Citi Field...The Mets have lost two straight and four of their last five games...Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 19-17...The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games and 26 games in 27 days...New York is 1-4 in that span... Today, the Mets head back out on the road for an eight game road trip to Philadelphia (two games), Miami (three games) and Cleveland (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: Earlier today, the Mets announce the following roster moves - RHP José Buttó was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse...RHP Yohan Ramírez and INF Joey Wendle were designated for assignment...RHP Grant Hartwig, LHP Joey Lucchesi and INF Mark Vientos were recalled from Triple-A Syracuse.

ENFUEGO: LHP Joey Lucchesi is expected to make his season debut tonight in Philadelphia...In seven starts at Triple-A this year, Lucchesi is 2-1 with a 2.58 ERA (11 ER/38.1 IP) with 16 walks and 28 strikeouts...He last pitched on May 8 at Lehigh Valley where he allowed three earned runs on seven hits with one walk and three strikeouts across 6.1 innings...Across five major league seasons, the left-handed pitcher is 23-24 with a 4.07 ERA (174 ER/384.1 IP) with 129 walks and 381 strikeouts...He was acquired by the Mets as part of a three-team deal involving the Pirates and Padres on January 19, 2021.

GET WELL SOON!: LHP David Peterson made another rehab start last night...In 5.1 innings for Binghamton, Peterson allowed only five hits, while striking out eight...In five rehab starts, the lefty is 1-0 and has yet to allow a run in 14.0 innings...He has walked one and struck out 24 in that span...Peterson began the season on the IL after under going left hip surgery during the off-season.

IN A PINCH: As a team, Mets pinch hitters are batting .265 (9-34) this year with three doubles, two home runs, four walks, a .342 OBP and a .529 SLG... Their 10 RBI from pinch-hitters top the majors...They rank fifth with a .529 SLG and are seventh with a .265 average.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is 9-8 away from Citi Field...New York is batting .269/.336/.421 on the road this year...Their .269 batting average is the second-best in the majors...Their 5.47 runs per game on the road are the most in the major leagues.

WAY AWAY, AWAY FROM HERE: Brandon Nimmo is batting .271/.442/.576 with 16 runs, four doubles, one triple, four home runs, 15 RBI, 13 walks and a 1.018 OPS in 16 games on the road this year...This compares to a .186/.307/.291 slashline in 24 games at Citi Field in 2024...Jeff McNeil is hitting .323/.400/.435 with five extra-base hits and an .835 OPS in 17 road games...He is batting .167/.244/.205 in 23 games at Citi Field...Omar Narváez is 8-22 with four runs, two doubles, four RBI and an .846 OPS in seven road games...He is 0-25 in 13 games at Citi Field in 2024.

TAKE IT TO THE BANK: Starling Marte has hit .387 (58-150) with 30 runs, 17 doubles, six home runs, 20 RBI and nine walks with a .442 OBP and a .620 SLG in 38 games at Citizens Bank Park...Jeff McNeil owns a .314/.377/.434 slashline with 14 extra-base hits in 44 games at the yard...Brandon Nimmo has posted a .421 OBP in 50 games at the ballpark, smashing seven home runs... Pete Alonso has hit eight home runs in 41 games at the home of the Phillies.

PHILLY SPECIAL: Starling Marte owns a .373 (113-303) career batting average with 53 runs, 28 doubles, one triple, eight home runs, 38 RBI, 22 steals and 12 walks in 77 career games against the Phillies...His .373 batting average against Philadelphia is the highest mark among active players (min. 100 AB)... Jeff McNeil's .318 (95-299) mark is the sixth-highest.

SWING AND NO MISS: The Mets offense has struck out 315 times this season, the fewest in the National League...It is the fourth-fewest in the majors...Jeff McNeil ranks 12th in the majors and seventh in the National League with a 12.7% strikeout rate.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen owns a 2.94 ERA (51 ER/156.1 IP) with 80 walks and 194 strikeouts...Their 2.94 ERA is the best in the Senior Circuit and third in the majors...Their 194 strikeouts from the bullpen are the most in the major leagues...They lead the majors with a 11.17 K/9 IP ratio and are second in batting average (.200).

PHILLIES-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped five straight in Philly... Overall, New York is 94-87 since Citizens Bank opened up in 2004.

ESQUIRE MARTINEZ: J.D. Martinez is batting .286 (16-56) with three runs, four doubles, one home run, five RBI and four walks in 17 games this year...He has hit 316 home runs in his career...That is eighth among active players...Over the last six games, Martinez is batting .308 (8-26) with two runs, two doubles, one home run, four RBI, two walks with an .857 OPS.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets begin their third series against a division foe this season...New York is in a stretch of 10 straight games against the NL East...The team is 1-4 in that stretch...The Mets are 3-5 against the NL East... The Mets went 25-27 against the East last year with a 4.41 ERA...The team hit .237/.315/.395 against the division in 2023.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: Since 2021, Brandon Nimmo is batting .279/.364/.418 against left-handed pitchers...That is the ninth-best batting average by a left-handed hitter against Southpaws since 2021...Jeff McNeil has slashed .290/.359/.360 against fellow lefties...His .290 average is fourth-best by a lefty in that time-frame.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Over his last 17 games, Nimmo is batting .271 (16-59) with eight runs, four doubles, four home runs, 12 RBI, eight walks with a .377 OBP and a .542 SLG...After starting the season 1-21 in his first six games, Nimmo is batting .250/.380/.468 with 21 runs, seven doubles, one triple, six homers, 27 RBI, 21 walks and an .848 OPS over his last 34 games.

MOVING ON UP: Nimmo has hit 93 career home runs...That puts him tied for 20th on the Mets all-time list with Cleon Jones...Next up is John Milner who socked 94, followed by Bobby Bonilla and Curtis Granderson who each hit 95...The Mets have had 15 players who have hit 100 or more home runs with the club.

I FEEL THE NEED FOR REED: Reed Garrett has allowed one earned run in 21.0 innings, giving him a 0.43 ERA...He is tied for the major league relievers with five wins, while his 35 strikeouts as a reliever are the second-most in the majors...He has struck out 35 of the 82 batters (38%) faced this year...Right-handed hitters are batting .132 (5-38) against him this season.

STRAWBERRY FIELDS FOREVER: On Saturday June 1, the New York Mets will retire Darryl Strawberry's No. 18 in a special pregame ceremony... Strawberry was a seven-time All-Star with the Mets after he was selected first overall in the 1980 June Draft...Strawberry earned National League Rookie of the Year honors in 1983 when he slugged a then-club rookie record 26 homers...He is the Mets all-time leader in home runs (252), ranks second in RBI (733) and walks (580), third in extra-base hits (469) and runs (662) and fourth in slugging (.520).

BUTTÓ NEWS & NOTES

2023, RETURN OF LUCCHESI: Lucchesi pitched to a 4-0 record with a 2.89 ERA (15 ER/46.2 IP) in 2023 in his return to the majors after missing the entirety of the 2022 season due to undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...Finished the season with a 1.31 WHIP and .251 opponent average while tallying 32 strikeouts...Lucchesi collected three quality starts this season, more than both 2020 and 2021 combined (both of which were shortened seasons).

CHURVE TO THE LEFT: Gained fame for a pitch he calls a "churve"...He holds it deep in his palm like a classic circle changeup, and for most of his college career, that's all it was - a basic changeup...Early in his pro career, he began tinkering with his wrist action as he threw it, snapping off the pitch like a breaking ball...It soon became his go-to putaway weapon...Per Statcast, his churve had an average 8.9 inch vertical drop in 2019, which was the most movement of any pitcher's changeup by more than a full inch.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Established a career-high winning streak with four wins last season after picking up wins in each of his four decisions...His wins came on April 21 at San Francisco, August 18 at St. Louis, September 13 against Arizona and September 27 in the first game of a doubleheader against Miami.

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Has made seven starts at Triple-A this season where he went 2-1 with a 2.58 ERA (11 Er/38.1 IP) with 16 walks and 28 strikeouts...Allowed only two home runs during his time in the minors this season...In 2023, Lucchesi made 15 appearances, 14 of which were starts, this season for Triple-A Syracuse...In those appearances, he pitched to a 4.74 ERA (43 ER/81.2 IP) and tallied 75 strikeouts...Lucchesi earned International League Pitcher of the Week for the week of June 12-18 after tossing 6.2 scoreless innings against the Buffalo Bisons on June 13, during which he allowed two hits while striking out six batters...In his last Triple-A start, Lucchesi threw 4.0 innings on September 6 against the Rochester Red Wings, allowing three earned runs on six hits and three walks while striking out three batters in a 7-6 Syracuse walk-off victory in 10 innings.

SPRING FLING: Lucchesi made only appearance in Spring Training in 2024...Allowed four runs on four hits with one walk in 1.1 innings of work.

CAN'T WAIT TO GET ON THE ROAD AGAIN: In five away starts in the majors last season, Lucchesi pitched to a 2-0 record with a 2.59 ERA (7 ER/24.1 IP), tallying 20 strikeouts, and earned his first two wins of the season on the road (April 21 at San Francisco, August 18 at St. Louis)...In four home starts this season, Lucchesi pitched to a 2-0 record with a 3.22 ERA (8 ER/22.1 IP).

HEY NOW, IT'S AFTER ALL-STAR: In 2023, pitched to a 3-0 record with a 1.48 ERA (4 ER/24.1 IP) after the All-Star Break in four starts compared to a 1-0 record with a 4.43 ERA (11 ER/22.1 IP) in the first half of the season...All four home runs allowed by Lucchesi this season came before the break...Pitched to a 1.93 ERA (4 ER/18.2 IP) in the month of September, picking up two wins in three starts.

PUTTING UP GOOSE EGGS: Dating back to June 13, 2021, Lucchesi tossed 18.1 straight scoreless innings, a career-best scoreless streak, which came to an end on April 27 against the Nationals...Among starting pitchers, Lucchesi's scoreless streak was the third-longest active scoreless streak in the majors at the time, behind Zac Gallen (28.0 innings) and Gerrit Cole (20.0 innings).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JOSE QUINTANA (1-4, 5.44)

LAST TIME OUT: Took the bump on May 10 vs. Atlanta...Suffered the loss, allowed four runs on six hits with two walks and three strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work in a 4-2 loss.

8.0 IS GREAT: Threw a season-high 8.0 innings on April 28 vs. St. Louis in the Mets' 4-2 walk-off victory...Was his longest start as a Met and his longest start since September 17, 2022 vs. Cincinnati with St. Louis (Also 8.0 IP)...Was the longest start by a Met since Justin Verlander threw 8.0 in-nings on July 19 vs. Chicago-AL.
