**METSSELLANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Diamondbacks, 10-3, in their home opener yesterday...The Mets have won three-in-a-row for the second time this season, also April 7-10...The Mets continue their first homestand of the year, a seven-game stand against the Arizona Diamondbacks (1-0) and the San Francisco Giants (four games).

**HOF HODGES:** The New York Mets will proudly honor Gil Hodges' family prior to today's game...Hodges, the manager of the 1969 Miracle Mets and the eight-time Dodger All-Star first baseman, was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame last December by the Golden Days Era Committee...Hodges' children will be joined by Josh Rawitch, the President of the National Baseball Hall of Fame & Museum and Joe Torre, Special Assistant to the Commissioner for a press conference at Citi Field...The event will take place at 10:45 a.m. in the Press Conference Room... In addition, the Mets will show a video tribute on the Citi Field scoreboard prior to the game and Gil Hodges Jr., Cynthia Hodges and Louis Savelli and Logan Ojeda, the grandsons of Irene Hodges, will throw out ceremonial first pitches.

**WHAT AN ENTRANCE:** The Mets won their home opener for the seventh time in the last eight seasons...They improved to 40-21 all-time in their first home game of the season (10-4 at Citi Field)...In the game, the team hit a season-high four home runs, their most ever in a home opener...They scored double-digit runs for the first time this year and first time in their home opener since 2013, an 11-2 win over San Diego.

**SIDE TO SIDE:** Yesterday, Francisco Lindor homered from both sides of the plate for the fourth time in his career (14th multi-homer game overall, third with the Mets)...His second and third homers came in his eighth game of the season (hit home run Nos. 2 and 3 in his 27th and 33rd game last season, respectively)...He is batting .296 (8-27) with eight runs, two doubles, three home runs, seven RBI, seven walks, two steals with a .457 OBP and a .704 SLG in eight games this year... He is currently only a six-game hitting streak, batting .333 (7-21) in that span.

**TWOFERS:** Lindor became the third Met in team history to hit two home runs in the team's home opener...Mike Piazza hit two in a 9-4 win against Atlanta on April 9, 2001 as did Cleon Jones April 6, 1973 in a 3-0 win against the Phillies...Courtesy of Sportsradar.

**TRIPLE THREAT TRIO:** Tylor Megill, Max Scherzer and Chris Bassitt have each won their first two starts of the season...The last time a trio of Mets starting pitchers won at least their first two outings of the year was in 2015, when Bartolo Colon won his first four starts, Matt Harvey won his first five and Steven Matz won his first two...The last time three members of the Mets' Opening Day rotation accomplished the feat was in 1973 (Tom Seaver, Jerry Koosman, Harry Parker).

**THIS ONE GOES TO 11:** The Mets have won 11 straight games against the Diamondbacks at Citi Field...It is the longest winning streak against any one opponent at Citi Field in franchise history...It is tied for the third-longest streak at home in Mets history (see chart below)...In 11 games since the start of 2018, the Mets have posted a 1.80 ERA (20 earned runs/100.0 innings) with 31 walks and 112 strikeouts in that span...They have hit .256/.344/.510 against Arizona...Overall, they have outscored the D-backs 61-21 in the 11-game winning streak in New York.

**CONGRATS!** Colin Holderman was named the John Murphy winner as the most impressive rookie in Spring Training as voted by members of the media... Holderman appeared in six games during Grapefruit League play and struck out 14 over 6.2 innings...He appeared in 15 games (two starts) in 2021 between Binghamton and St. Lucie and combined to go 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA (nine earned runs/24.0 innings) with eight walks with 27 strikeouts...The 6-7, 240-pounder was selected by the Mets in the ninth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out Heartland Community College in Normal, IL.

**OUCH:** The Mets have been hit by 11 pitches this year, which leads the majors... New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 318 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 42 times... That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019... Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 56 HBP, while Starling Marte is fifth (40) in the last four seasons.

**DBACKS-METS NOTES:** The Mets have won the season series in each of the last three years...Since 2019, the Mets have posted a 16-5 record against Arizona.

**STARTING OFF:** The Mets starting staff has gone 6-0 with a 1.32 ERA (six earned runs/41.0 innings) with seven walks and 47 strikeouts...Half of the outings have been quality starts...The club's starters have held opponents to a .153 batting average through the team's first eight games...The team leads the majors with a 1.32 starter's ERA and a .153 opponent's average...They are second with 47 punchouts and their 41.0 innings pitched is fourth in the majors.

**THE CHARMING MAN:** In four games this season, Drew Smith has posted a perfect ERA, allowing only two hits, a walk and striking out six in 4.2 innings of work...He owns a career record of 4-3 with a 3.04 ERA (27 earned runs/81.0 innings) with 24 walks and 72 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Rays on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

**THAT'S OFFENSIVE:** The Mets lead the majors with a .371 OBP, are fourth with a .271 batting average, fifth with a .439 SLG and 35 walks...Though eight games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents 44-22.

**NEED FOR SPEED:** The Mets have totaled seven stolen bases through eight games...The Mets did not record their seventh steal until May 8 last season in the team's 29th game...The Mets are tied for third in the majors in stolen bases this year.

**WHAT DO YOU SAY, JAY?:** On Sunday, the New York Mets will dedicate the press box at Citi Field in honor of Jay Horwitz, the head of team's Media Relations department from 1980-2018, in a pre-game ceremony beginning at 12:30 pm...The ceremony will take place in the press box and will be attended by Mets President Sandy Alderson and Mets Hall of Famers John Franco and Mookie Wilson.

**VENEZUELAN BORN:** Carlos Carrasco needs 11 wins to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone, while he ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...His 1,360 career strikeouts are the fourth-highest total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster.

**OPS, I DID IT AGAIN:** J.D. Davis owns a lifetime OPS of .890 OPS at Citi Field...It is the highest total in franchise history (min. 100 PA)...Jeff McNeil is second with an .873 OPS at the home of the Mets.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso has collected seven RBI over his last two games... He is batting .257 (8-31) with five runs, three doubles, two homers, 12 RBI and an .873 OPS this year...He is tied with Nolan Arenado for the National League lead with 12 RBI.

**MOVING ON UP:** Pete Alonso hit his 108th career home run on Wednesday in Philadelphia...That ties him with Jose Reyes for 13th on the team's all-time list...Ed Kranepool (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120)...Alonso has socked 46 home runs at Citi Field...That is fourth in Mets history...David Wright is third with 49, followed by Michael Conforto (66) and the franchise leader, Lucas Duda (71).

**ED, EDD AND EDDY:** Edwin Diaz has record 65 saves as a member of the Mets... That places him tied for 10th with Skip Lockwood on the franchise's all-time list... Next up is Neil Allen who recorded 69 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 174 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Diaz is 9-14 with 65 saves, a 3.98 ERA (66 earned runs/149.1 innings) with 60 walks and 243 strikeouts...His 243 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (280) and Josh Hader (275) have struck out more...Additionally, his 243 strikeouts are the 14th most by a reliever in franchise history...Turk Wendell is 13th with 259.

**THAT'S SHOW BUSINESS:** Buck Showalter became the first manager in Mets history to win each of his first three contests...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with 1,557.

**LIVIN IN THE CITI:** The Mets improved to 1-0 at Citi Field this year...In 2021, the Mets recorded a winning season at home for the second time in the last three years (also, 2019)...New York finished its home schedule with a 47-34 (.580) record, a 3.42 ERA, 251 walks and 767 strikeouts...The team's 47 home wins were tied for eighth in the majors and tied for fourth in the NL...The team's 3.42 ERA at home was the fifth-best in the majors and the fourth-best in the NL...The team's 767 strikeouts at home were the fourth-most in franchise history.

### CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

**LAST START:** Carrasco eclipsed 1,300 career innings pitched in his first start of the season on April 10 at Washington...He is one of 27 active pitchers to reach the milestone and is one of nine Venezuelan-born hurlers to achieve the mark all-time (three active)...Tossed 5.2 innings of one-run ball with two hits (one home run) and five strikeouts in the no decision...Marked his first start without issuing a free pass since August 26, 2021; was his fourth such start since the 2020 season.

**GET OUT OF THE FIRST:** In his last start, Carrasco surrendered a first-inning home run to Nelson Cruz, his only run allowed in the contest, before retiring each of his final 15 batters faced...Last season, he pitched to a 13.50 ERA (18 earned runs/12.0 innings) in the first inning compared to a 3.89 ERA (18 earned runs/41.2 innings) in all subsequent innings...Eight of his 12 home runs allowed came in the first frame...Opponents slashed .404/.444/.877 against Carrasco in the first inning last year.

**VS. ARIZONA:** Has not faced the Diamondbacks since June 24, 2014 at Chase Field...His last start against the club was on June 29, 2011...Both outings came while with Cleveland and he went 1-0 with a 2.00 ERA (two earned runs/9.0 innings), no walks and seven strikeouts...Will be his first appearance against the D-Backs as the home team.

**AGAINST THE NL WEST:** Last faced a National League West opponent on August 26, 2021 vs. San Francisco...Has pitched against the division six times on the road in his career, compared to twice at home...Is 1-4 in those eight career games (seven starts) with a 4.19 ERA (20 earned runs/43.0 innings)...Last season, went 0-2 and posted a 7.07 ERA (11 earned runs/14.0 innings) in three starts against the NL West.

**HOME VS. ROAD:** Carrasco is looking for his first ever win at Citi Field, as he went 0-2 with a 5.39 ERA (20 earned runs/30.1 innings) in seven starts at home last season...In six starts away from home as a Met, he is 1-3 with a 5.28 ERA (17 earned runs/29.0 innings)...Is 39-42 with a 4.36 ERA (309 earned runs/637.1 inning) in 127 career games (105 starts) at home, compared to 50-36 with a 3.36 ERA (248 earned runs/664.1 innings) across 128 games (103 starts) on the road.

**VENEZUELAN BORN:** Carrasco needs 11 wins to become the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone, while he ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...His 1,360 career strikeouts are the fourth-highest total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster.

**GRAPEFRUIT LEAGUE:** Carrasco made two starts during Spring Training, both against the Houston Astros...He did not earn a decision while posting a 5.40 ERA (five earned runs/8.1 innings) with two walks and eight strikeouts...In his final Spring Training start on April 4 at Houston, Carrasco allowed two runs on four hits and a walk with five strikeouts through 4.1 innings of work.

**2021 RECAP:** Missed the first three months of the season with a hamstring injury and made his Mets debut on July 30 vs. Cincinnati...Issued one or no walks in his first eight starts with the Mets (six walks total in that span)...Only three pitchers have walked fewer batters in their first eight starts with the Mets (Bartolo Colón, Bob Friend and Dennis Ribant each walked five)...He posted a 3.51 ERA (13 earned runs/33.1 innings) in six starts from August 20-September 18, tossing at least 5.0 innings and allowing three earned runs or fewer in each outing...Underwent right elbow surgery on October 19, performed by Mets Medical Director Dr. David Altchek at the Hospital for Special Surgery in Manhattan.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON (0-0, 0.00)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Tossed 4.0 scoreless innings of relief with three hits, two walks and three strikeouts on April 11 at Philadelphia, his lone appearance of the 2022 season.

**GETTING THE START:** Last made a start for the Mets on June 30, 2021 at Atlanta...Suffered the loss, allowing six runs on eight hits (one home run) and a walk with two strikeouts through 3.0 innings...Will start tomorrow in place of RHP Taijuan Walker who was placed on the 10-Day Injured List on April 12 with Right Shoulder Bursitis.
