BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals open up an eight-game homestand into the All-Star Break against first place teams in the National League Central (Milwaukee) and East (Atlanta). The Brewers will play a five-game series in their second visit to the Gateway City, while the Braves are in town for a three-game weekend series. St. Louis returned home after a 4-2 road trip to Atlanta (2-1) and Chicago-NL (2-1).

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters play in 3rd place in the National League Central, 7.5 games behind first place Milwaukee, and 1.5 games behind 2nd place Chicago. The Cardinals hold the 3rd Wild Card position, percentage points ahead of Miami. The Cardinals are playing a stretch of 14 games over 13 days without an off day leading into the All-Star Break (June 30-July 12), all against teams currently in playoff position (2-1 at Braves; 2-1 at Cubs; 5 vs. Brewers; and 3 vs. Braves).

BEER RUN: The Cardinals will face off against the Brewers in a five-game series for the first time since the COVID-shortened season of 2020. Each team hosted a five game series in Milwaukee (Sept. 14-16) and at Busch Stadium (Sept. 24-27). Both teams won their home series 3-2 that season. The Cardinals will complete their home schedule with Milwaukee on Thursday and finish the regular season series with the Brewers at American Family Field, Sept. 25-27.

WALKER & MARMOL TO REPRESENT CARDINALS AT ALL-STAR GAME: RF **Jordan Walker** was chosen by Major League Baseball as a National League All-Star reserve for the 96th Midsummer Classic at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia. Walker will be accompanied by Manager **Oliver Marmol**.

- Walker is the first Cardinals All-Star OF since 35-year-old **Matt Holliday** in 2015.
- The first homegrown OF to represent St. Louis since 23-year-old LF **Albert Pujols** in 2003.
- Youngest Cardinals All-Star position player since 24-year-old 1B **Albert Pujols** in 2004 and overall since the 2015 pitching duo of 23-year-old **Carlos Martinez** and 24-year-old **Michael Wacha**.
- Joins C **Ted Simmons** (#10 in 1967) and SS **Garry Templeton** (#13 in 1974) as the third position player drafted by St. Louis in the 1st round to become a Cardinals All-Star and first since Wacha (#19 in 2012).

CODE RED: Tonight's starting pitcher **Dustin May** carried a perfect game into the 7th inning in his last start vs. Milwaukee (5/27) at American Family Field. The Cardinals lost 2-1 and it was the last time May suffered a loss. Since that loss, May is 2-0 in his last five starts with the Cardinals posting a 4-1 record, winning the last four games that May has started.

HE'S OUR JULY GUY: **Jordan Walker** tallied all four of the Cardinals RBI yesterday and had nine total on the road trip, all since July 1. He currently ranks 2nd to Colorado's **Jake McCarthy** (10) for RBI in July with nine, which is already his highest total for the month in his career. Residing as the current MLB co-leader in RBI with 67, Walker posted a single-month high 20 RBI in both April and May with 15 in June.

WETHER FORECAST IS GOOD: Cardinals rookie second baseman **JJ Wetherholt** recorded his 4th multi-hit game of the six-game road trip Sunday at Wrigley Field. Wetherholt hit safely in his last four games and is tied for the lead among National League rookies in multiple hit games (26) and three-hit games (7) with Rockies' rookie **TJ Rumfield**. Since May 30, only Miami's **Otto Lopez** has more multi-hit games than Wetherholt (15) in MLB.

20-10 CLUB: With his three-run home run yesterday at Wrigley Field, **Jordan Walker** hit the 20 HR mark, the first Cardinals outfielder to hit 20 since **Tyler O'Neill** blasted 34 home runs in 2021. Walker also has 11 stolen bases making him one of two Cardinals player with 20 HR/10 SB before the All-Star Break joining **Albert Pujols** in 2009 (32 HR/10 SB).

MILWAUKEE CONNECTIONS

Riley O'Brien's grandfather **Johnny O'Brien** was drafted by the NBA's Milwaukee Hawks in 1953, but instead chose to play baseball.

Bryan Torres originally signed with Milwaukee as a non-drafted free agent in 2015 and played parts of five minor league seasons in the Brewers minor league system (2015-19)...played two seasons for the Milwaukee Milkmen of the American Association (2022-23), where he was back-to-back Independent League Batting Champion (.374 and .370).

Matthew Liberatore earned his first MLB win on May 28, 2022 vs. Milwaukee at Busch Stadium.

Andre Pallante struck out **Christian Yelich** (April 15, 2022 at Milwaukee) for his first career strike-out, and **Matt Svanson** fanned **Isaac Collins** for his first strikeout (April 27, 2025 at St. Louis).

Jacob Misorowski played college baseball at Crowder College in Neosho, Mo...made MLB debut vs. St. Louis (June 12, 2025 at Am. Fam.).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played in 73 games for Milwaukee in 2010.

Brewers Baseball Ops Special Asst. and Domestic/International Scouting **Rickie Weeks** made his MLB debut on Sept. 15, 2003 at St. Louis.

Steve Dillard, father of Brewers broadcaster **Tim Dillard**, was hitting coach for the Single-A Quad Cities Swing/River Bandits from 2006-07 and hitting coach for the High-A Palm Beach Cardinals in 2007...later piloted Quad Cities in 2008-09, where he managed infielder **Oliver Marmol**.

Cardinals Special Asst. to the President of Baseball Ops & 2026 Cardinals Hall of Fame inductee **Yadier Molina** hit his first MLB home run on Sept. 23, 2004 at Milwaukee off **Matt Wise**.

William Contreras's older brother, **Willson Contreras**, played in 344 games for St. Louis from 2023-25.

Brewers Lead Hitting Coach **Eric Theisen** played college baseball at Illinois State Univ. (2005-08).

KMOX broadcaster **Matt Pauley** hosted Brewers pre- and post-game shows for parts of six seasons (2017-22)...was radio play-by-play voice of the Univ. of Wisconsin-GB women's basketball team.

Brewers broadcaster **Jeff Levering** previously worked three seasons (2010-12) as broadcaster for the Springfield Cardinals (AA).

Brewers Sr. Special Asst to the GM **Carlos Villanueva** pitched in 35 games for St. Louis in 2015.

Trevor Megill was originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2014 MLB Draft, but did not sign to return to Loyola Marymount Univ.

Drew Rom was acquired by the Cardinals from the Orioles in the four-player Jack Flaherty trade in 2023. He earned his first MLB win with St. Louis at Baltimore on Sept. 13, 2023.

Cardinals broadcaster **Mark Sweeney** played two seasons in Milwaukee (2000-01).

Hall of Famer **Ted Simmons** played five seasons with Milwaukee (1981-85), where he was a two-time AL All-Star and faced off against St. Louis in the 1982 World Series...traded to Milwaukee with **Rollie Fingers** & **Pete Vuckovich** for **David Green**, **Sixto Lezcano**, **Dave LaPoint** & **Lary Sorensen**.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- The 28-year-old **Dustin May** makes his 17th start as a member of the Cardinals (74th career start & 88th appearance) tonight.
- Exited his last start on July 2 at Atlanta after two outs after being hit in the right foot by a **Dominic Smith** line drive off his right ankle. Pitched to the next two batters before exiting with a right ankle contusion.
- After throwing 101 pitches in consecutive starts on June 9 at NY Mets and June 15 at San Diego, has thrown just 34 pitches and 44 pitches in his last two starts.
- The Cardinals are 9-7 in his starts this season, with wins in each of his last four (June 9-present).
- Pitched 6.0 innings in every start over a four-game stretch (April 27-May 15), the longest streak of his career and tying **Michael McGreevy** for the longest by a Cardinal this season. All were quality starts.
- His four caught stealing on attempted base stealers, T-7th among NL pitchers with teammates **Matthew Liberatore** and **Kyle Leahy**.
- Limiting opposing right-handed batters to .203/.239/.297 (26-128) with only four walks (134 batters faced).
- Joins **Nathan Church** (2024-26), **Hunter Dobbins** (2026), **Mark McGwire** (1997-2001), **Red Schoendienst** (1945-56, '61-63), and **Rex Hudler** (1990-92) as notable red-headed Cardinals.

LAST TIME OUT (Thursday, July 2 at Atlanta's Truist Park): ND, W, 11-5, 0.2 IP, 5 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 2 BB, 1 SO, 0 HR, 34 pitches.

- Exited after recording two outs in the first inning after being hit in the right foot by a **Dominic Smith** line drive off his right ankle. Pitched to the next two batters before exiting with a right ankle contusion.
- Charged with five runs on five hits and a pair of walks in 34 pitches.
- The Cardinals scored eight unanswered to come-from-behind and beat the Braves at Atlant's Truits Park in last week's road trip opener.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

CODE RED: Threw his first complete game and shutout vs. SD (6/15) carrying a perfect game through 6.0 innings and a no-hitter 6.1. Struck out eight batters in a 3-0 win. First Cardinals pitcher to throw a one-hit shutout at home since Jaime Garcia vs. MIL (4/14/2016).

ALMOST PERFECT: June 15 shutout vs. SD saw D. May carry a perfect game into the 7th inning before his walk to **Fernando Tatis, Jr.**, snapped it, and one batter later, a Manny Machado single through the left side broke up the no-hitter.; struck out eight batters, his 3rd-highest total of the season and threw a season-high 101 pitches for the 2nd consecutive start; it was his 2nd start this season carrying a no-hitter through 6.0 innings.

POPPING THE CORK IN NEW YORK: Fired his first scoreless start as a member of the Cardinals pitching 6.0 scoreless innings of four-hit ball with six strikeouts in a 7-0 'Birds win at Citi Field (6/9), running the St. Louis win streak to five games. His first win since 4/21 at MIA (7 starts).

BASEBALL HQ TOUR: Took time on June 9 to tour MLB's Central Offices while the Cardinals spent their off-day in NYC.

OH NO-NO: Took a no-hitter in the 8th inning at MIL (5/27), broken up by a **Garrett Mitchell** lead-off double, and eventually lost 2-1; Threw a season-high 7.0 IP and fanned a then season-high 9 batters; the only Brewers batsmen to reach safely before the 8th came via a HBP and catcher's interference.

NOCTURNAL NIGHTMARE: Has made 8 starts in Day games this season (1-6, 6.81 ERA) is 4-0 with a 3.002 ERA in his 8 Night starts.

DECISIONS, DECISIONS: His 2026 season has been one of streaks starting with 2-straight losses, then 3-straight wins, a career-high 4-straight losses and he currently has consecutive wins.

DON'T WALK TO STRANGERS: Tied with **Andre Pallante** (6.8%) the 2nd-lowest walk percentage among Cardinals starting pitchers behind **Michael McGreevy** (5.8%) with 6.8%.

MAY'S DAY: Started on May 3 while wearing uniform No. 3, against his former team, the Dodgers, suffering 4-1 loss that snapped his 3-game winning streak.

MILESTONE WIN: Bested his former team the Red Sox on 4/10 in a 3-2 win. It was his 1st win as a member of the Cardinals and his 20th career win.

TIGER STRIKE: Was hit for a season-high seven runs on seven hits (and struck in leg by line drive) over 3.1 innings in an 11-6 loss at Detroit (4/4) in his second start. First Cardinals pitcher since **Mike Parisi** (2008) to begin a season allowing 6 or more runs in his first two starts of a season; and the first Cardinal to pitch the Opening Day series since **Dizzy Dean** (1936).

OPENING ACT: Took the loss in his Cardinals debut at Busch Stadium vs. TB (3/29) allowing six runs over 4.0 inning. Tied his career-high allowing 10 hits, the first Cardinals pitcher to allow double-digit hits in his debut in 55 years since **Chris Zachary** surrendered 10 to the Phillies (5/3/1971) *Elias*. Recorded his 300th career strikeout retiring **Junior Caminero**.

MAY VS. MILWAUKEE:

- Makes his 3rd career start vs. the Brewers and first at Busch Stadium.
- In May 27 start, took a no-hitter in the 8th inning at Milwaukee, broken up by a **Garrett Mitchell** lead-off double, and eventually lost 2-1; Threw a season-high 7.0 IP and fanned a then season-high 9 batters; the only Brewers batsmen to reach safely before the 8th came via a HBP and catcher's interference.
- His first career start vs. Milwaukee was in 2021 with the Dodgers. Pitched 1.2 innings allowing a home run to Luis Urias before departing after 27 pitches. Exited with a right arm injury following a 2-2 pitch to Billy McKinney in the 2nd inning. Placed on the 10-day Injured List the following day and missed the rest of the season.
- The 1.2 innings and 27 pitches are his fewest in any career start vs. an N.L. Central opponent.
