CINCINNATI REDS VS PITTSBURGH PIRATES

THURSDAY, MARCH 30 • GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK



147TH HOME OPENING DAY GAME

This afternoon's game will be the Reds' 147th Home Opening Day game, their 21st home opener at Great American Ball Park and their 20th to open a season at GABP...the Reds are 70-75-1 in home openers, including 65-69-1 vs National League opponents, 1-2 vs American League opponents (3-1 loss in 13 innings vs LAA in 2013, 9-7 win vs Det in 2020, 10-5 loss vs Cle in 2022) and 8-12 at GABP...is expected to be the 124th regular season sellout at GABP and the 19th sellout of the 21 season home openers (excluding the 2020 & 2021 seasons affected by COVID-19)... Thursday afternoon's is the first of the Reds' 2 Opening Day games...a week later in Philadelphia, on April 6, the Reds will be the opponent for the Phillies' home opener at Citizens Bank Park.

2022 OPENING DAY GAME

Because of a 99-day lockout that didn't end until March 11, the Redlegs opened the 2022 season April 7 on the road and earned a 6-3 win at Atl by using just 9 batters in an Opening Day game for the first time since 1980...they lost the 2022 home opener to the Guardians, 10-5 on April 12...for only the third time since 1890, the Reds opened a season on the road...they suffered a season-opening 4-3 loss at Phi on April 15, 1966 after the scheduled 3-game series vs Mets at Crosley Field was rained out...they also lost that year's home opener, 9-7 vs Phi on April 22...the wire-to-wire World Series champion Reds opened the 1990 season with an 8-4 win at Hou on April 9 after spring training was delayed by a 32-day lockout...they also won the 1990 home opener, 2-1 vs SD on April 17.

REDS VS PIRATES ON OPENING DAY

The Reds are playing the Pirates for the 30th time on Opening Day, but the Pirates are playing the Reds for the 31st time in their Opening Day game...because of a scheduling oddity in 2001, the Reds opened the season with 1 game vs the Braves, then began a traditional 3-game series vs the Pirates, who were "off" the day prior...dating back to 1892, Cin is 10-19 vs Pit in 29 season openers, while Pit is 19-11 vs Cin in their 30 openers...the teams most recently met in the season opener in 2019, when Zach Duke and the Reds beat Jameson Taillon, 5-3...Reds starter Luis Castillo threw 5.2 innings (2h, 1er, 3bb, 8k), while Pirates starter Taillon went 6.0 innings (5h, 4er, 2bb, 4k)...Cin's José Peraza and pinch hitter Derek Dietrich homered, as did Pit's Corey Dickerson...on Opening Day 2003, the Reds and Pirates played the first regular season game at Great American Ball Park...that 2003 game was the first season opener between the Reds and Pirates since 1963.

OPENING DAY VETERAN

Joey Votto leads all players with 14 games and 61 plate apps on Opening Day games at Great American Ball Park (14-53, .264, 1 2b, 3hr, 7rbi)...he homered in 2010 off StL's Chris Carpenter, in 2011 off Mil's Kameron Loe and in 2020 off Det's Matthew Boyd...according to @EliasSports, 154 players have played for the Reds in the previous 19 season openers played at GABP.

OPENING DAY STARTER

RHP Hunter Greene will make his first career Opening Day start...at age 23 years, 236 days, he will become the first pitcher age 25 or under to start for the Reds on Opening Day since 1980, when at age 22 years, 232 days RHP Frank Pastore beat Phil Niekro and the Braves, 9-0.

SHORT HOPS

For the seventh consecutive year, the Reds will start a different shortstop on Opening Day (Zack Cozart 2012-2017, José Peraza 2018, José Iglesias 2019, Freddy Galvis 2020, Eugenio Suárez 2021, Kyle Farmer 2022)...will be the Reds' longest such streak since 1900 for that position...3 previous times since 1900, there were stretches of at least 7 straight Opening Days without consecutive starts at shortstop by the same player (though not necessarily 7 different shortstops): 1906-1914 (Mike Mowrey, 2 starts), 1968-1974 (Dave Concepcion, 3 starts) and 2004-2012 (Alex Gonzalez, 2 starts)...in 2022, Kyle Farmer led the Reds with 97 starts at shortstop...on 11/18/22, Farmer was traded to the Twins for RHP Casey Legumina...courtesy @EliasSports.

BONUS BASEBALL

The Reds are 11-3 in Home Opening Day extra-inning games, most recently a 13-inning, 3-1 loss vs LAA in 2013 that ranked as the second-longest Opening Day in team history...most recently won an extra-inning Opening Day game in 1990 at Hou (8-4 win, 11 innings) and most recently won an extra-inning game at home in 1988 (5-4 win vs StL, 12 innings).

AT NIGHT & ON THE ROAD

The Reds played 3 openers at night (1966, 1994, 2020)...opened on the road 6 times, including 3 times because of inclement weather (1877, 1885, 1966), twice because of labor strife (1990, 2022) and once as scheduled (1888).

PARADE ROUTE

Newest Reds Hall of Famers Bronson Arroyo and Danny Graves will be the grand marshals of the 104th Findlay Market Opening Day Parade...current players Graham Ashcraft and Nick Lodolo also will ride in the parade.

POMP AND CIRCUMSTANCE

Former Reds infielder and 2015 All-Star Game home run derby champion Todd Frazier will throw out the ceremonial first pitch...Cincinnati Mayor Aftab Pureval will deliver the official game ball...Hamilton County Commissioner Alicia Reece will serve as the honorary captain of the game...Marlana VanHoose of Denver, Kentucky will perform the National Anthem...the pregame flyover will be performed by two F-16 Fighting Falcons of the 112th Fighter Squadron "Stingers" from the 180th Fighter Wing Ohio Air National Guard Base in Toledo...a 300- by 150-foot American flag will be unfurled during the singing of the National Anthem by members of the Cincinnati Firefighters Department...representatives from the Rosie Reds organization will make the traditional presentation of Opening Day plaques to managers David Bell of the Reds and Derek Shelton of the Pirates...representatives from Findlay Market will make their annual basket presentation to Reds manager David Bell...player introductions begin at 3:40 p.m..

IN THE BOOTHS

John Sadak will broadcast his third Opening Day game as the play-by-play voice of Bally Sports Ohio...he will be joined in the booth by Hall of Fame shortstop Barry Larkin (3rd season) and former Reds pitcher Chris Welsh (31st season) as color analysts and in the Reds' dugout by Jim Day (22nd season)...Brian Giesenschlag (18th season), Sam LeCure (5th season) and Annie Sabo (2nd season) will provide insight from the studio desk...Tommy Thrall (5th season) and Jeff Brantley (17th season) return for their third full season together in the 700 WLW Radio booth.

REDS PITCHERS

REDS PITCHERS IN 2022

62-100, 4.86, .251baa

- For the second straight season led the Major Leagues in most walks (612bb, 1423.1ip) and for the fourth time in the last 7 seasons led the National League in most walks.
- Among National League team leaders ranked 13th in ERA and fifth in highest opponents' BA.
- 38 players pitched in at least 1 game for the Reds, a new club record for number of pitchers in a season and including position players Matt Reynolds (2g), Max Schrock (1g) and Alejo Lopez (3g)...the previous club record was held by the 2021 Reds (35 pitchers).
- The Reds and Twins used the third-most pitchers in the Major Leagues behind the Cubs (42) and Rays (40).
- Allowed 44 HR to the Brewers, the most home runs allowed by Reds pitchers to any team in a single season.
- In the first 25 games of the season, through 5/5, went 3-22 with a season-high 6.86 ERA...in the last 137 games beginning 5/7 went 59-78, 4.51.

REDS STARTERS IN 2022

33-73, 4.97, .254baa

- Among National League team rotation leaders ranked 13th in ERA, second in walks allowed (316bb, 809.2ip) and fifth in highest opponents' BA.
- 17 pitchers started at least 1 game for the Reds, tying the 2003 club record for number of starters in a season.
- After failing to complete 6.0 innings in any of the first 31 games of the season through 5/11 (3-21, 8.19), Reds starting pitchers threw at least 6.0 innings in 44 of the last 86 games beginning 5/12 (21-34, 4.30).
- The 31 games to begin a season in which the starting pitcher failed to pitch at least 6.0 innings are the most in the Major Leagues since 1893, when the mound was moved to its current distance...the second-longest streak belongs to the Pirates, who began the 2022 season with 21 games without a 6-inning stint by a starter until Mitch Keller threw 6.0 innings in a 5-2 loss on 5/1 vs SD.
- In the 1-0 loss on 5/15 at Pit, Hunter Greene threw 7.1 of the staff's 8.0 no-hit innings (Art Warren, 0.2ip), the furthest a Reds pitcher ever has gone without allowing a hit before he was removed from the game...for only the sixth time in the modern era, a team allowed no hits and lost.

REDS RELIEVERS IN 2022

29-27, 4.72, .248

- Among National League team bullpens ranked 13th in ERA, T1st in most walks allowed (296bb, 613.2ip) and sixth in highest opponents' BA.
- Posted ERAs of 5.42 prior to the All-Star break and 3.85 in the second half.
- 10 Reds pitchers recorded at least 1 save (Ross Detwiler, Alexis Díaz, Buck Farmer, Ian Gibaut, Joel Kuhnel, Dauri Moreta, Tony Santillan, Lucas Sims, Hunter Strickland, Art Warren), tying the 2021 single-season franchise record.
- Made 574 relief apps, just 5 shy of the 2021 single-season franchise record.

85 LUIS CESSA, rhp

Spring Training: 3g, 2gs, 0-0, 4.50, 6ip, 4h, 5k

- Last name is pronounced SESS-uh.
- Is scheduled to start Game 5 of this championship season, on Tue vs Cubs.
- Made his fifth Opening Day roster (2016, 2019, 2021 for NYY and 2022, 2023 for Cin).
- Last pitched in relief on 8/15/22 vs Phi...since then made his last 9 apps as a starter.
- In 2022, in his second season with the Reds went 1-3, 4.30 in a career-high 10 starts and 3-1, 4.91 in 36 relief apps.
- In August joined and remained in the rotation after the Reds lost to trade or injury starting pitchers RHP Luis Castillo (to the Mariners), RHP Tyler Mahle (to the Twins), RHP Robert Dugger (right shoulder pain), RHP Hunter Greene (right shoulder strain), RHP Graham Ashcraft (right biceps soreness), RHP T.J. Zeuch (back soreness), RHP Justin Dunn (right shoulder tightness) and LHP Mike Minor (left shoulder soreness).
- Beginning 8/22 at Phi made his last 9 apps of the 2022 season as a starter (1-3, 3.77, .226baa).
- Made 1 appearance for Mexico in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.
- Pitched the sixth and seventh innings of Mexico's 10-inning, 5-4 loss vs Colombia in Arizona Pool C (2ip, 2h, 1er, 0bb, 1k, 25 pitches).
- Returned to the Reds after Mexico's 5-4 quarterfinal win vs Puerto Rico and finished the spring with appearance, started and received no decision in the 4-3 loss at Mil.
- Is the only player, manager or coach in Reds history to wear uniform #85.

63 FERNANDO CRUZ, rhp

Spring Training: 5g, 0-0, 5.40, 5ip, 3h, 8k

- Begins the season rhp No. 33 on *Baseball America's* Reds Top 40 Prospects list.
- Pitched for Puerto Rico in the 2023 World Baseball Classic (3g, 1gs, 0-0, 2.45, 3.2ip, 4h, 2bb, 5k, 1hr).
- Pitched in the second inning of Puerto Rico's 9-6 loss vs Venezuela in Miami Pool D (1ip, 2h, 1er, 0bb, 1k, Salvador Perez 3-run HR, 19 pitches)...started the 5-2 win vs Dominican Republic that took Puerto Rico to the quarterfinal round (1.2ip, 1h, 0r, 2bb, 2k, 28 pitches)...threw a scoreless sixth inning in the 5-4 quarterfinal loss to Mexico (1h, 0bb, 2k, 13 pitches, 11 strikes).
- In 2022 received the Mary E. Barney Award as Louisville's Most Valuable Player.
- In 2022 led all Class AAA pitchers in saves.
- Was the Reds' Minor League Pitcher of the Month for August 2022.
- Was promoted to the Reds on 9/1, when rosters expanded, and in his Major League debut posted a 1.23 ERA in 2 starts and 12 relief apps.
- In the 3-2 win on 9/2/22 vs Col, at 32 years, 158 days old was the oldest Reds player to make his Major League debut since LHP/OF Pat Scantlebury pitched vs StL on 4/19/56 at age 38 years, 160 days.
- Prior to the 2022 season, last pitched for a traditional MLB-affiliated organization in 2015.
- From 2016-2018 played in the independent Canadian-American Association...played in the Puerto Rican Winter League (2011-2022), Venezuelan Winter League (2017-2018), Mexican League (2020-2021) and Dominican Winter League (2020-2021).
- Was selected by the Royals as a shortstop in the sixth round of the June 2007 draft...in 2011 was converted to pitcher.

REDS BATTERS

REDS BATTERS IN 2022

4.00 r/g, .235 / .304 / .372

- Among National League team leaders ranked 10th in hitting, 13th in on-base percentage, 13th in slugging percentage and 13th in OPS (.676).
- Reds designated hitters hit .286 (38 2b, 1 3b, 24hr, 95rbi) and ranked among the National League leaders at team DH in batting average (1st), hits (2nd), doubles (T2nd), HR (5th) and RBI (3rd).
- With 35 assists, the Reds led all Major League outfielders (Aristides Aquino 12, Tommy Pham 7, Albert Almora Jr. 5, TJ Friedl 4, Nick Senzel 3, Tyler Naquin 3, Jake Fraley 1).
- From 4/15-4/23 the Reds scored 2 runs or fewer in 8 consecutive games, their longest such stretch since a club-record 9 straight games from 8/28-9/6, 1982.
- From 4/13-4/23 the Reds scored 3 runs or fewer in 10 consecutive games, their longest such stretch since 7/18-7/29, 2014 (11g).
- From 6/8-6/18 committed at least 1 error in 10 consecutive games (15 errors), a season high and the longest error streak by a Reds defense since an 11-game streak from 4/7-4/19, 2000 (13e).

2 JOSE BARRERO, inf

Spring Training: 17g, .311, 4 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 10rbi, 3sb

- In spring training made his 15 starts at SS (12gs), CF (2gs) and DH (1gs).
- Made his first Opening Day roster.
- Played for the Reds in each of the previous 3 seasons but doesn't turn 25 years old until the seventh day of the 2023 season (Wed, 4/5).
- In 2022, started at SS in 46 of the Reds' 59 games after his 8/3 promotion.
- Began the 2022 season on the Reds' 10-day injured list following 3/22 surgery to remove the left hook of hamate bone...missed 53 games.
- From 5/20-6/5 hit .204 in 14 rehab apps for Louisville before he was reinstated from the 10-day IL on 6/6 and optioned...played with the Bats until 8/3, when following the trade of Brandon Drury to the Padres he was promoted to Cin for the rest of the season.
- Entered the 2022 season rated by *Baseball America* the organization's top prospect and best defensive infielder while ranking #33 on *Baseball America's* Top 100 Prospects List.
- In 2021 received the "Chief" Bender Award as the Reds' Minor League Player of the Year.
- In May 2021, following the death of his mother changed his last name from Garcia to Barrero.

30 WILL BENSON, of

Spring Training: 17g, .327, 1 2b, 1hr, 3rbi, 6sb

- Just before spring training (2/8) was acquired for minor league OF Justin Boyd and cash or a player to be named (3/25, LHP Steve Hajjar).
- In spring training led the Reds in stolen bases...tied for the team lead in hits...hit safely in 13 of his 17 apps...made his 16 starts in LF (3gs), CF (10gs), RF (1gs) and designated hitter (2gs).
- Was a non-roster invitee to the Indians' 2022 Major League spring training camp.
- Spent most of the 2022 season at Class AAA Columbus.
- Was International League Player of the Month for July (23g, .371, 8 2b, 2 3b, 5hr, 11rbi, 3sb, 1.155 OPS).
- When promoted to the Guardians on 8/1 was leading the International League in on-base percentage, walks and runs scored, was tied for the IL lead in OPS and ranked fourth in both extra-base hits and total bases.
- Made his Major League debut in an 11-inning, 6-5 walkoff win on 8/1 vs the Diamondbacks...with 2 outs in the bottom of the 10th pinch hit against Mark Melancon and grounded out...began the 11th as the runner on second base and scored the winning run on Amed Rosario's 1-out, RBI-single.
- Collected his first career hit and RBI on 8/10 at Det, his seventh appearance...in the second inning of the 3-2 win produced a run scoring-single off Victor Reyes.
- Was selected by Cle in the first round (14th overall) of the 2016 first-year player draft.
- Entered the 2018, 2019 and 2022 seasons rated the best athlete in the Guardians' organization.

12 CURT CASALI, c

Spring Training: 13g, .300, 2 2b, 1hr, 4rbi

- Made his sixth career Opening Day roster (2016 Rays; 2019, 2020 & 2023 Reds; 2021 & 2022 Giants).
- On 12/22/22 was signed as a free agent to a 1-year contract through the 2023 season, with a mutual option for 2024.
- Returns to the Reds following stints with the Giants (118g) and Mariners (16g).
- Has 462 Major League apps for the Rays, Reds, Giants and Mariners.
- From 2019-2022 helped pitchers hold opponents to a .230 batting average (3rd-lowest in the Major Leagues), a .293 on-base percentage (2nd-lowest) and a .372 slugging percentage (2nd-lowest)...includes catchers with at least 200 apps.
- In 2022 made 57 apps for the Giants and Mariners, including 49 starts at catcher...also made 3 apps at 1B.
- Missed time last season while on the 7-day concussion list and 10-day injured list with a right oblique strain.
- While on the 10-day IL with the oblique injury, on 8/2/22 was traded from SF to Sea with LHP Matt Boyd for minor leaguers RHP Michael Stryfeler and C Andy Thomas.
- In spring training hit safely in 9 of his 13 apps...made his 13 starts at C (9gs) and DH (4gs).

17 STUART FAIRCHILD, of

Spring Training: 16g, .258, 2 2b, 1hr, 5rbi

- On Opening Day was added to the 26-player roster.
- In spring training produced an .829 OPS before he was optioned to Louisville on 3/20.
- Went to 2022 spring training with the Diamondbacks...on 4/23 was traded to the Mariners for cash...on 5/14 was traded to the Giants for IF Alex Blandino and cash...on 6/11 was claimed off waivers by the Reds.
- Last season for the Reds made 15 starts in LF, 9 starts in CF and 2 starts in RF.
- On 8/23 was recalled to replace injured IF Matt Reynolds and spent the rest of the season with the Reds...in 30 apps and 21 starts after that promotion hit .306 (4 2b, 1 3b, 4hr, 5rbi, .390obp, .556obp, .946ops).
- In 2022 returned to the Reds after spending time in the Diamondbacks, Mariners and Giants organizations.
