SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

ROSTER MOVES: The D-backs recalled LHP Brandon Hughes from Triple-A Reno and optioned LHP Tommy Henry following last night's game.

TODAY'S ROKU TV BROADCAST: Today's 8:35a AZT/11:35a ET game will be broadcast on the Roku Channel App and available to stream via MLB.TV/DBACKS.TV subscrip-tions...D-backs' own Tom Candiotti and Jody Jackson join the broadcast with Phillies TV play-by-play broadcaster, Tom McCarthy.

- Roku TV is not required to watch the game...the Roku Channel app is available for download on all smart TVs and devices or via the Roku Channel website.

EARLY BIRD SPECIAL: This morning's 11:35 a.m. ET first pitch (8:35 a.m. AZ) will be the earliest ever @ Citizens Bank Park.

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost last night, 1-12, @ Phillies.
-Tucker Barnhart collected the lone RBI for the D-backs in the fifth inning.

- Jake McCarthy marked his fifth game with a hit in his last 6.

MAKE OUR SNAKES ALL-STARS: Ketel Marte, in second place among NL second basemen (608,807 votes), leads D-backs vote getters in first balloting update for 2024 MLB All-Star Game.

- Christian Walker currently sits at sixth among first basemen (112,385 votes) while Joc Pederson sits at sixth among designated hitters (81,340 votes).
- Phase 1 balloting ends on Thursday, June 27 at 9:00 a.m. AZ with finalists announced later that day at 3:00 p.m. AZ on MLB Network.

GOING 4 THE SERIES: With a victory today, the D-backs would secure their fourth straight series win (also: vs. Angels, vs. White Sox, @ Nationals)...they have won or split their last 6 series since May 30.

SOMETHING ABOUT FINALES: In series finales this season, the
D-backs are 15-9 and 5-1 in June.

VS. SOUTHPAWS: The D-backs' . 280 team average vs. lefties is the best in the Majors, ahead of the Twins (.279) Dodgers (.278) and Giants (.267), while their . 330 Batting Average on Balls in Play (BABIP) is second to the Red Sox (.351) and . 778 OPS is third, behind the Dodgers (.820) and Twins (.788).

- The D-backs feature 5 players with an average of .350+ vs. lefties in June: Kevin Newman (.667), Jake McCarthy (.462), Ketel Marte (.409), Randal Grichuk (.375) and Lourdes Gurriel Jr. (.353).

DAY GAMERS: In 7 day games this month, Kevin Newman and Jake McCarthy are each hitting 500 (10-for-20). - McCarthy also boasts a 1.327 OPS in the month with 1 triple, 1 homer and 5 RBI.
-Christian Walker has reached base in his last 11 day-game starts since May 15 (has a hit in 10-of-11 games), hitting .333 (15-for-45) with 1 double, 4 hom ers, 13 RBI, 2 BB and 1 HBP

CREATING CHAOS: The D-backs' 84.2 stolen base pct. since 2023 is second in the Majors, behind the Mets (87.2).

- The D-backs have stolen 5 bases in 8 attempts over their last 5 games, including 4 stolen bases in their last 3 games.

AT THE BANK: The D-backs have won 3 of their last 4 games @ Citizens Bank Park (since Game 6 of the 2023 NLCS on Oct. 23).

- Last season, the D-backs became the sixth team in MLB history to win a 7-game Postseason series after losing the first 2 road games (lost on Oct. 16-17 @ Phillies).
- Since 2022, the D-backs are 4-4 @ Citizens Bank Park in the regular season...last season, Arizona took the 3-game set 2-to-1.

MARTE MAKING HIS CASE: Ketel Marte leads all second basemen with a 3.8 bWAR, an . 839 OPS, 33 extra-base hits, 146 total bases and 11 defensive runs saved, is tied for first with a 1.5 dWAR, second with 15 homers and 42 RBI, tied for second with 16 doubles and third with 81 hits.

- Marte's 3.8 bWAR is third in the NL (8th in MLB), behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (4.4) and Mookie Betts/LAD (3.9).

WALKER, TEXAS RANGER ALL-STAR: Christian Walker's 2.0
bWAR is third among all first basemen, behind Freddie Freeman/LAD (3.1) and Bryce Harper/PHI (3.1)....his 17 home runs are third, behind Josh Naylor/CLE (19) and Bryce Harper/PHI (18), while his .812 OPS is seventh. - Defensively, his 6 DRS and 0.3 dWAR are tied for the best marks among first basemen with Joey Gallo/WSH.

DEFENDERS OF THE DIAMOND: This season, the D-backs' . 989 fielding pct. is tied for the best overall mark in the Majors with the Braves, while their 32 errors are second fewest, behind the Braves (30).

ON DECK - MINNESOTA TWINS: The D-backs welcome the Minnesota Twins back to Chase Field for the first time since June 17-19, 2022.

- In their last series @ Chase Field, the D-backs took 2-of3 from the Twins.
- The D-backs are 7-5 lifetime @ home vs. Twins.

NEXT STARTER: RHP BRANDON PFAADT (3-6, 4.37)

- Has made 2 straight consecutive starts.
- Made last start on June 19 @ Nationals (L; 3 ER in 6.1

IP).

- Will make first career start vs. Twins.
- Made his lone start vs. AL Central opponent on Sept

27, 2023 @ White Sox (W, 0 ER in 5.2 IP, 8 K).

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: 10th start of the season and seventh on the road.

- In 6 road starts this season, is 2-1 with a 2.23 ERA (8 ER in 32.1 IP).
- The D-backs are $4-0$ in his last 4 road starts and $5-1$ in his 5 road starts in 2024.
- In his last 4 starts, has walked just 1 batter (77 BF).
- Recalled from Triple-A Reno on May 31 for his second stint with the D-backs this season.

ROOKIE RANKINGS: Ranks among National League rookie starting pitchers in starts (9th, 9) and quality starts (T-9th, 3).

LAST OUTING: Tossed a career-high 6.0 scoreless innings on 3 hits with 0 walks and 6 strikeouts @ Nationals on June 18.

PICKOFF POWER: Recorded his first career pickoff on June 6 @ Padres (Fernando Tatis Jr. in the third inning).

- Is 1 of 2 D-backs starters to have a pickoff this season (also: Merrill Kelly).

VS. PHILLIES: First career start against the Phillies.

- Faced the Phillies twice out of the bullpen in the 2023 NLCS ((0 ER in 2.0 IP, 2 H, 0 BB, 1 K).

RENO RECAP: In 5 starts with Reno this season, is $3-2$ with a 3.38 ERA (10 ER in 26.2 IP) and 32 strikeouts.

- Tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and struck out 9 batters in his last start on May 26 @ Oklahoma City.

FIRST WIN: Earned his first Major League win on April 21 @ Giants (2 ER in 6.0 IP).

STEE-RIKE!: Struckout a career-high 8 batters on April 27 @ Mariners.
VS. LEFT AND RIGHT: In 6 road starts, is holding right-handed hitters to a .206 average (14-for-68) with 19 strikeouts, while lefties are batting .224 (15-for-67) with 9 strikeouts.

- In his first 4 starts of the season from April 21-May 9, held righties to a .114 average (4-for-35)/. 205 OBP and lefties to a .220 average (9-for-41)/. 289 OBP.

INNINGS 1-3: In innings 1-3 in his 8 starts, owns a . 135 opponent average (12-for-89), .056 WHIP, 3 walks and 26 strikeouts.

- Is holding hitters to a . 105 average (6-for-57) with 2 walks and 18 strikeouts in 6 road starts.
- His . 135 opponent average from innings 1-3 (min. 5 starts) is second among starting pitchers in the Majors, behind Spencer Turnbull/PHI (.127).
- From April 21-May 14 in innings 1-3, held hitters to a . 022 average (1-for-45), including a . 000 average (0-for-26) from May 3-14...his . 022 average was the lowest among all starters in that span (min. 5 starts), ahead of Ryan Weathers/MIA (.100), Dylan Cease/SD (.135) and Tanner Bibee/CLE (.137)

LIMITING THE FREEBIES: His 4.3 walk pct. is tied for fifth lowest among NL starters with Ty Blach/COL [min. 5 starts], behind Robert Gasser/MIL (0.9\%), Braxton Garrett/MIA (2.5\%), Nick Martinez/CIN (3.3\%), Shota Imanaga/CHC (3.7\%).

RISPY BUSINESS ON THE ROAD: In 6 road starts, is holding runners in scoring position to a . 067 average (1-for-15), 0.35 WHIP, 1 walk and 4 strikeouts...the . 067 average is the best among NL starters on the road (min. 5 starts), ahead of Tobias Myers/MIL (.077), MacKenzie Gore/WSH (.103) and Hunter Greene/CIN (.103).

PITCH TRACKING: Is throwing his slider 21.0 percent and changeup 14.8 percent this season.

- In 6 road starts, opposing batters are hitting . 125 (3-for-24) with 5 strikeouts off his slider and 130 (3-for-23) with 5 strikeouts off his changeup.
- From April 21-May 9, held opponents to a . 118 average (2-for17)/. 211 OBP with a 0.60 WHIP, 1 walk and 4 strikeouts.

FIRST TIME THROUGH: In his first time thru the lineup as a starter, is limiting batters to a . 103 average (8-for-78) with 3 walks and 24 strikeouts.

- Rated as the D-backs' No. 9 prospect by MLB Pipeline.
- In 4 starts, went 0-1 with a 5.60 ERA (11 ER in 17.2 IP, 15 K ).
- Appeared in 3 games in relief and went 0-0 with a 1.93 ERA, 0.75 WHIP, 206 opponent average and 5 strikeouts.
- Walked just 4 of his 111 batters faced.
- Optioned to Triple-A Reno on Sept. 4...went 1-1 with a 4.05 ERA (6 ER in 13.1 IP) in 3 starts with the Aces.
- Recalled by the D-backs on Sept. 22 and made 1 relief appearance @ Yankees (1 ER in 2.2 IP, 2 K).
