Versus Lefties

Atlanta is set tonight to face left-hander Jacob Lopez from the Athletics. The Braves beat southpaw Cole Ragans of Kansas City on Opening Day.

Dating to the start of the 2019 season, no team in baseball has a better winning percentage versus left-handed starters than Atlanta. The Braves have gone 167-99 (.6278) against lefties in that span, percentage points better than the Astros (199-118, .6277).

Of the 103 active players with at least 750 career plate appearances against left-handers, Ozzie Albies' .327 batting average is the highest in the majors. He is a career .327/.351/.541 batter against lefties, including two hits & one homer in five such at-bats this year.

Former Team Card

Matt Olson is set tonight to face the A's for the first time this season and for the 14th team in his career. A former first-round pick of the A's in 2012, he appeared in 575 career games for the club from 2016-21.

The Atlanta native finished fourth in AL Rookie of the Year voting for the A's in 2017, won Gold Gloves with the franchise in 2018 & 2019, and represented the club at the 2021 All-Star Game. His 142 home runs for the A's rank 16th in the 125-year history of the franchise.

Olson has batted .250 (13-for-52) in his first 13 games against his former club, with three homers, nine RBI and a .784 OPS. He has reached base 19 total times in the 13 games.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Athletics tonight open a three-game midweek set in what are the only scheduled meetings between the clubs this season...The A's won two-of-three to take the series between the clubs last year.

- The Braves and A's split the first two games of that series last season, before the Athletics walked off with an 11-inning win, 5-4, in the rubber game.
- The two clubs last played here at Truist Park in 2024, and Atlanta won two-of-three...Since the facility opened in 2017, the Braves are 4-1 in five total games versus the Athletics here...The A's are 4-10 all-time in the city of Atlanta.
- Despite dropping the series last season, Atlanta is 19-9 (.679) all-time against the Athletics franchise...Atlanta's .679 winning percentage versus the A's is its second-best mark against any AL club in interleague play (Minnesota, 20-8, .714)...Conversely, the A's .321 winning percentage against the Braves is also its second-lowest mark against any NL club in interleague play (Chicago, 7-17, .292).
- LH Jacob Lopez is set tonight to make the 20th start and 30th total appearance of his major league career, and his first against Atlanta...The 6-foot-4, 220-pound California native set career highs in nearly every statistic last season in his first campaign with the A's, including 113 strikeouts in just 92.2 innings.

BRYCE ELDER: Makes his first start of the season in his fourth major league campaign...The 6-foot-2, 220-pound native of Denton, TX, led Atlanta's pitching staff with 28 starts last year after beginning the season with Triple-A Gwinnett...He finished the season going 8-11 with a 5.30 ERA for the Braves.

- In four Grapefruit League starts he did not record a decision while pitching to a 4.73 ERA (7 ER/13.1 IP)...He broke camp with Atlanta and made his first Opening Day roster, despite leading the club in starts since 2023.
- Over his final seven games with Atlanta last season, Elder went 3-2 with a 2.82 ERA, 0.99 WHIP, 3.39 FIP and six quality starts...He faced Chicago (NL) twice, New York (NL), Philadelphia, Houston, Detroit and Washington...With the exception of the Mets and Nationals, all those teams reached the postseason...Five of the six teams finished above .500.
- Elder's eight wins last season led the Braves pitching staff...The eight victories marked the fewest for a Braves wins leader in single, full season since Buster Brown went 8-18 for the Boston Rustlers in 1911.

ROSTER MOVE: The Braves today selected LHP Martín Pérez to the major league roster after optioning RHP Didier Fuentes to Triple-A Gwinnett following yesterday's game.

- Pérez pitched to a 2.84 ERA (4 ER/12.2 IP) in four games this spring.

TOUGH LUCK: Atlanta lost to Kansas City, 4-1, yesterday afternoon to suffer its first defeat of the season...Both the Braves and Royals collected seven hits, although Atlanta's expected batting average for the game sat at .314 while Kansas City's was just .196.

- Atlanta batters collected each of the six hardest-hit balls of yesterday's game, all of which were over 105.0 mph...The Braves collected just one hit on these six balls (1-for-6, .167), a homer from Drake Baldwin in the eighth inning...For reference, the MLB batting average for balls hit over 105 mph last season was .666.
- The Braves barreled five balls yesterday, and again only Baldwin's went for a hit...Again for reference, the MLB batting average for barreled balls last season was .690.
- Atlanta has made 517 total outs since the 2023 season on balls hit over 105 miles per hour, by far the highest total in baseball...The Mets, with 467 such outs, rank second...Michael Harris II has 104 of those outs for the Braves in that span, tied for the fourth most in all of baseball...Harris II had two of Atlanta's five outs over 105 mph yesterday.

OZZIE IN PLAY: Ozzie Albies went 2-for-4 yesterday afternoon and has reached base in all three games to start his season...He is batting .364/.417/.636 with a homer, walk and two runs scored through the Braves' first three games.

- He has now reached in each of the first three games for the fifth consecutive season, becoming the sixth Brave since 2000 to do so...He joins Austin Riley (2022-25), Chipper Jones (2000-02, '06-12), Brian McCann (2008-11), Andruw Jones (2004-06) and Mark DeRosa (2000-02).
- Albies has not struck out in any of his 12 plate appearances this season, extending his streak to 32 consecutive plate appearances without fanning dating to 2025...It is the longest active streak in the majors.

PITCHING: Atlanta pitchers combined to allow just 17 hits through its first three games and 27.0 innings of the year, the fewest in the NL this season...Only the Yankees (13) and Blue Jays (16) have allowed fewer.

- The Braves' 2.00 ERA (6 ER/27.0 IP) through three games is tied with the Marlins for lowest in the NL, and also ranks third in baseball.
- Atlanta has yet to allow an unearned run this year.

OPENING IN INTERLEAGUE: For the first time in franchise history, Atlanta opened its season with an interleague series as the Braves hosted the Kansas City Royals this weekend.

- Atlanta will play 12 of its first 16 games against American League opponents to open the year, with just one of its first five series of the season against a fellow NL club...The Braves are hosting the Athletics (AL) to complete its opening homestand, before subsequent series against the D-backs (NL), Angels (AL) and Guardians (AL).

Today's Game

- Set to make his 80th career appearance, 79th start, and first of the 2026 season for Atlanta tonight against the Athletics.
- Elder has faced the Athletics twice in his career, going 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (3 ER/14.0 IP) while striking out 12 against the club.
- Made four spring training starts, going 0-0 with a 4.73 ERA (7 ER/13.1 IP) while striking out 12 and walking five...Held Boston to one hit and one run over 5.0 innings with six strikeouts in his final Grapefruit League outing on March 14.
- Closed the 2025 season going 3-2 with a 3.13 ERA (11 ER/31.2 IP) and 32 strikeouts in five September starts...Allowed two earned runs or fewer in four of those five outings.
 - Won back-to-back starts on September 3 and 8 against Chicago (NL), going 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA (1 ER/13.1 IP) and 12 strikeouts over the two outings.
- The 6-foot-2, 220-pound right-hander went 8-11 with a 5.30 ERA (92 ER/156.1 IP) in 28 starts last season, leading the Braves in starts for the second time in three years...Also paced the staff with 31 starts in 2023.
- Elder's last outing against the Athletics came on July 9, 2025 in Sacramento, earning the win in a 9-2 victory while scattering eight hits and two runs over 6.2 innings with seven strikeouts.
 - His first career start against the Athletics came during the 2023 season...In two career starts against the club, Elder has allowed three earned runs and 13 hits over 14.0 innings while walking four and striking out 12.
- Won his eighth game of the year on September 19, 2025, scattering five hits and one earned run over 7.0 innings at Detroit while fanning six...Took the loss in his final start of the season on September 24 against Washington (7.0 IP, 6 H, 3 ER, 2 HR, 7 SO).

2025

- Led the Braves in starts (28) for the second time in three years...Also led the staff with 31 starts in 2023.
- Struck out a career-most 12 hitters on June 7, scattering three hits and one earned run over 8.0 innings at San Francisco without issuing a walk.
 - The 12 punchouts were the second most by a Braves starter in 2025.
- Posted a 1-2 record with a 4.82 ERA (20 ER/37.1 IP) across six August starts...Went 3-2 with a 3.13 ERA (11 ER/31.2 IP) in five September outings while striking out 32.
- Went 0-3 with an 8.25 ERA (22 ER/24.0 IP) over five June starts...Allowed a career-high 10 runs (9 ER) and three home runs over 2.0 innings on June 27 against Philadelphia.
- Recorded six quality starts over his final seven outings of the season, dating to August 24...The six quality starts led the National League over that stretch and were tied with New York's (AL) Carlos Rodón for the most in the majors.
- When pitching on four days of rest, Elder has posted a career 3.87 ERA while going 7-8 across 28 starts...He is 10-5 with a 4.41 ERA on five days rest and 7-11 with a 5.43 ERA on six or more days rest.
- Pitched to a 3.29 ERA this year in outings without any home runs allowed...Posted a 6.99 ERA when the opposing team homers in a game against Elder.
- His fastball velocity averaged 91.7 mph in 2025...His career average before this season was 90.1 mph.
- Since the start of the 2023 season, the Braves are 38-30 (.558) in his starts.

- Awards:** 2023 National League All-Star
- Completed his first full major league season in 2023, going 12-4 with a 3.81 ERA (74 ER/174.2 IP) in 31 games, all starts.
- Named to the 2023 National League All-Star Team, his first selection.
- Joined Hall-of-Famer John Smoltz and Michael Soroka as the only starters in Atlanta-franchise history to make the All-Star team in their second year playing.
- Atlanta won 21 games started by Elder in his first full season with the Braves, the second most team victories on the season...Trailed only teammate Spencer Strider's 26 team wins that year. Has six starts in his career of at least 6.0 innings without allowing a run, the most such games in Braves franchise history (since 1900) in a player's first 25 starts...Irv Young (1905), Clif Curtis (1909-'10) and Ian Anderson ('20-'21) each had five such starts.
- Was originally drafted by Atlanta in the fifth round of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Texas...Was the fifth member of the 2020 draft class to debut, and the lowest-selected pick to do so.
 - Of the first five members to play in the majors from the 2020 draft class, three were selected with the first 11 picks in the draft - Detroit's Spencer Torkelson (No. 1 overall), the Angels' Reid Detmers (No. 10) and the White Sox's Garrett Crochet (No. 11).
 - The other two were both selected by Atlanta, and chosen with the 126th (Spencer Strider) and 156th (Elder) overall selections.

- Appeared in 42 games in his second season as a Brave, pitching to a 3-2 record and a 3.81 ERA (23 ER/54.1 IP) with 51 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP, his lowest since 2020...Was placed on the injured list on August 24 due to left shoulder inflammation and missed the remainder of the season.
- Ranked in the 99th percentile in baseball with a barrel rate of just 3.2% in 2025...His seven total barrels and 2.3% barrel rate allowed since joining the Braves in 2024 are both the best in the majors (min. 400 batters faced).
- Opponents hit ground balls off him 55.8% of the time last season (league average 42.4%)...Since his debut in 2017, Bummer's career ground ball rate of 64.2% is highest in the majors (min. 350 games).
- Tossed his curveball a career-high 35.1% of the time in 2025, the most of any major league pitcher with at least 900 total pitches last season...Utilized a curveball for the first time in 2024 at a 2.3% clip.

- In his third full season with Atlanta, appeared in a career-high 70 games and went 29-for-34 in save opportunities...Pitched to a 3.21 ERA (24 ER/67.1 IP)...Ranked fourth in the NL and tied for ninth in the majors in saves.
- Among active pitchers with as many appearances since his Braves debut on August 5, 2022 (222 apps.), Iglesias owns the best WHIP (0.94) and second-best ERA (2.35, 57 ER/218.2 IP).
- Ranked second among Braves pitchers in franchise history (min. 100 G) in WHIP and ERA+ (180), third in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.88), fourth in hits-per-nine-innings (6.5) and fifth in ERA and saves (97).
- Did not allow a run in 42 of 45 appearances from June 9 until the end of the season...Led major league pitchers in this span (min. 40.0 IP) in hits-per-nine-innings (4.15) and saves (21), tied for the most fWAR among relievers (1.5) and ranked second in ERA (1.25, 6 ER/43.1 IP) and WHIP (0.69).

- Pitched to a 5-0 record with a 0.72 ERA (2 ER/25.0 IP), a 0.68 WHIP and 22 strikeouts in 24 outings with Atlanta to conclude the 2025 season.
- Allowed a run in his third appearance with the Braves, August 5, and then allowed one additional tally over his final 21 games...Strung together a career-high scoreless streak of 19.1 innings between runs.
- From his Braves debut on July 31 until the end of the season, Kinley led major league pitchers (min. 25.0 IP) in ERA and ranked third in WHIP and opponent's batting average (.126).
- Among Braves pitchers with at least 24 appearances in a season, Kinley holds the second-best ERA, WHIP, hits-per-nine-innings (4.0) and ERA+ (583) marks in a single campaign.

- Set a career high and led the team with 74 appearances, going 2-4 with a 3.29 ERA (25 ER/68.1 IP) and matching a career high with 76 punchouts...Collected the first two saves of his major league career.
- Did not allow a run in 31 of his first 38 appearances through June 29, tying for the sixth-lowest ERA (1.67, 7 ER/37.2 IP) among major league pitchers in that span (min. 35.0 IP).
- Ranked in the 90th percentile or better in baseball in expected ERA (91st, 2.91), walk percentage (92nd, 5.3%), hard-hit percentage (93rd, 33.5%), and whiff percentage (95th, 33.6%).
- Threw his slider 612 times and surrendered just 22 hits on it...Among pitchers that threw as many on the season, those 22 hits were the fewest in MLB...His slider carried a run value of 10, also ranking in the 95th percentile.
- Dating to his first full season in 2022, Lee's 2.76 ERA ranks fourth among all left-handed relievers in baseball to make at least 175 appearances...Among those pitchers, Lee's rate of 4.80 strikeouts-per-walk is best in the majors.
