ROSTER MOVES—Last night the Rays optioned RH Chris Mazza to Triple-A Durham, clearing a spot to add DH Nelson Cruz to the active roster...Cruz will wear No. 23, with pitching coach **Kyle Snyder** switching to No. 44...Cruz was acquired from the Twins, along with minor league RH Calvin Faucher, for RH Drew Strotman and minor league RH Joe Rvan.

- + This afternoon the Rays traded LH Rich Hill to the Mets for RH Tommy Hunter and minor league catcher Matt Dyer, who was selected in the fourth round of the 2020 June Draft out of Arizona.. Hunter was placed on the injured list on May 19 (lower back pain) and transferred to the 60-day IL on June 11...the Rays have recalled RH Louis Head in the corresponding move for the 26-man roster.
- + RH Nick Anderson (right elbow sprain) began a rehab assignment with the FCL Rays today, throwing 20 pitches in a scoreless frame.

RAY MATTER-The Rays have won three straight games, are 4-1 in their last 5 games and 5-2 since the All-Star break...the Rays are 5-27 (.156) this season when trailing after 8 innings but have won back-to-back games in this fashion, overcoming a 4-3 deficit on Wed vs. BAL and a 4-2 deficit last night at CLE...this marks the third time in club history the Rays have won back-to-back games (within the same season) when trailing after 8 innings, following June 1-2, 2010 at TOR and May 19-20, 2006 vs. FLA, according to Stats LLC...with last night's win, the Rays returned to a seasonhigh-tying 19 games over .500 for the first time since June 14 (43-24).

- + The Rays are 11-3 (.786) in their last 14 games, the best record in the majors over that span (since July 4)...this 11-3 stretch has seen them cut their deficit in the AL East from 4 GB to 1 GB of Boston.
- The Rays currently occupy the AL's first Wild Card spot, holding a 2½-game lead over the Athletics...the Rays hold a 7-game cushion over the Mariners and Yankees in regard to a postseason berth.
- The Rays have won four consecutive series beginning July 5-7.
- The Rays are 39-20 (.661) since May 13 and 45-24 (.652) since May 2, both of which are the best records in the AL over those stretches.
- The Rays have held a lead in 78.4 pct. (76 of 97) of their games—they have led in 46.2 pct. (18 of 39) of losses and trailed in 30 of 58 wins... the 30 comeback wins are tied with Boston for 1st in the majors.
- + The Rays have 13 players on the IL including 12 pitchers.

HERE COMES THE BOOM -41-year-old Nelson Cruz has hit 436 HR over 17 seasons in the majors, which ranks 46th in major league history and 3rd among active players behind Albert Pujols (675) and Miguel Cabrera (494)...since 2014, his 279 HR are the most in the majors, ahead of Mike Trout (248) and Nolan Arenado (244)...he has reached 30 HR seven times in his career and 20 HR 11 times in his career, all since 2009-no other player has reached 20 HR more than nine times over that same stretch.

- + Next on the all-time list is **Andre Dawson** (438 HR) in 45th place.
- Cruz hit .294/.370/.537 (87-for-296) with 19 HR and 50 RBI in 85 games with the Twins this season, including .362/.410/.600 (38-for-105) with 6 HR and 17 RBI vs. LHP...he was selected to the All-Star Team for the seventh time (2009, 2013-15, 2017-18) and pinch-hit in the 9th inning...he became the 20th player to appear in an All-Star Game after turning 41, and first since RH Trevor Hoffman (2009).
- At 41 years, 22 days, Cruz is the 3rd-oldest active player in baseball behind LAD Albert Pujols (41.188) and NYM Rich Hill (41.134).. the Rays also have the youngest active player with INF Wander Franco (20.144) and the 2nd-youngest in RH Luis Patiño (21.270).

ROAD BLOCK - The Rays are 28-21 (.571) on the road this season, 6th-best in the majors and 4th in the AL...spanning multiple road trips, they have won back-to-back road games and are 4-1 in their last five road games on the heels of a 10-game road losing streak from June 15-July 3...said another way, the Rays are 4-11 in their last 15 road games since June 15.

- The Rays are 8-14 since the beginning of June after a 20-7 start.
- During this 4-11 stretch the Rays have pitched to a 5.73 ERA (130.1-IP, 83-ER), 9th-highest in the majors since June 15...they have yielded 5+ runs in 11 of 15 games, 6+ in nine of 15 and 8+ in four of 15.
- The Rays have lost in walk-off fashion eight times, most in the AL and tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Marlins (9)...this is tied with 2002 for the most through 97 games in franchise history, and the club record for walk-off losses in a single season is 13 in 2015.
- The Rays lead the AL and rank 2nd in the majors with 259 runs scored on the road behind LAD (265) and rank 5th with 66 HR.
- Since Aug 10, 2020, the Rays are a majors-best 48-27 on the road.

FASHIONABLY LATE—This season the Rays have scored 182 runs in the 7th inning or later, most in the majors ahead of the Astros (173)...they have outscored opponents, 182-114, in these frames, and the +68 differential ranks 1st in the majors...the Rays have scored 56 runs in the 7th inning (tied for 6th in the majors), 58 runs in the 8th (4th), 48 runs in the 9th (1st) and 20 runs in extras (tied for 3rd)...the 114 runs allowed in the 7th inning or later are the 5th-fewest in the majors and 2nd among AL clubs (CLE, 101).

+ Opposing starting pitchers have a 3.96 ERA (500.1-IP, 220-ER) and a .220 opp avg. (413-for-1,879) against the Rays

this season, but opposing relievers have a 5.11 ERA (363-IP, 206-ER) and .246 opp avg. (345-for-1,402) when pitching against the Rays.

Over the last 2 games, the Rays are hitless in 11 with RISP through the 8th inning and 3-for-7 with RISP in the 9th inning and later.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—During this 11-3 stretch the Rays are averaging 5.21 runs per game, totaling 71 runs in the 11 wins and 2 runs in the 3 losses...they have scored 5 runs (or more) in 10 of the 11 wins and 7 runs (or more) in six of the 11 wins...the Rays are batting just .247 (112-for-453) during this 11-3 stretch overall but have a .286 avg. (28-for-98) with RISP.

- This season the Rays are batting .231, 25th in the majors and 12th in the AL...the .231 avg.-which would be the lowest mark in franchise history-includes .236 with RISP and .225 with RISP/2 outs.
- The Rays have scored 191 runs this season with 2 outs, 4th in the majors behind the Red Sox (213), Dodgers (209) and Giants (198).
- The Rays have struck out a major-league-most 980 times and are on pace for 1,636 SO, which would be a major league record ahead of the 2019 Tigers (1,595)...the Rays have a majors-most 59 games of double-digit strikeouts, but have done this in eight of their last 23 games (34.8 pct.) compared to 51 of their first 74 games (68.9 pct.).
- + This season the Rays are batting .277 (145-for-524) with RISP in the 58 wins, compared to .165 (49-for-297) with RISP in the 39 losse

PITCHING PROPERLY—The Rays have a 3.59 ERA this season, 8th in the majors and 2nd in the AL behind the White Sox (3.58)...they have allowed 3 runs (or fewer) 52 times this season—tied for 4th in the majors and most in the AL (Astros, 50)—and are 42-10 (.808) when doing so...the Rays had a 4.85 ERA through the first 13 games of the season but since then have a 3.40 ERA (755.1-IP, 285-ER) in 84 games since April 16, 4th in the majors.

- The bullpen last night pitched 4.2 hitless and scoreless innings.
- + The Rays bullpen has a 1.09 ERA (49.2-IP, 6-ER) in the last 12 games and a 3.13 ERA (411.2-IP, 143-ER) this season, which ranks 1st in the AL and 2nd in the majors behind the Padres (2.94)...the Rays bullpen ranked 26th in the majors with a 5.07 ERA through games of April 21, but since April 22 their 2.65 ERA ranks 1st in the majors.

RAYS vs. INDIANS—The Rays are 4-0 against the Indians this season, including 2 wins when trailing after 8 innings (July 5 at home, last night)... since May 25, 2019, the Rays have won nine straight, the longest winning streak against them in franchise history and tied for the 4th-longest against any single opponent—the club record is 12 straight over the Orioles from April 30-Sep 24, 2008...since 2018, the Rays are 14-3 (.824) against the Indians, their best record against any opponent (2nd: 7-2 vs. NYM).

- Tonight continues the first series at Progressive Field since May 23-26, 2019 (3-1)...the Rays lost 18 straight games at Progressive Field from Sep 29, 2005-July 23, 2010, and it remains the club's longest losing streak at a visiting park...at the end of that losing streak, the Rays were 12-39 (.235) there, but since then they are 19-13 (.594).
- + Nelson Cruz ranks 2nd among actives with 27 HR vs. Cleveland.

ON THE CLOCK—The Rays have signed two more of their selections from the 2021 First-Year Player Draft: 4th-round OF Dru Baker (Texas Tech) and 5th-round OF Mason Auer (San Jacinto North)...this brings their total to 17 of 21 picks signed in advance of the Aug 1 signing deadline...unsigned thus far are 3rd-round INF Ryan Spikes (Parkview HS), 6th-round LH Mason Montgomery (Texas Tech), 8th-round LH Patrick Wicklander (Arkansas) and 16th-round RH Ian Leatherman (Central Michigan)

LAST START—On Sat at ATL, suffered his fifth loss this season after allowing a career-high 7 runs in 4.1 IP...the 7 ER were the most by a Rays pitcher since **Jalen Beeks** (7) on Aug 25, 2019 at BAL and most by a Rays starter since **Yonny Chirinos** (7) on July 28, 2019 at TOR...retired his first 7 BF, and worked around a 2-on, 1-out jam in the 3rd inning...yielded 6 runs on 5 hits in the 4th, including a 2-out, 2-run double by **Max Fried** following an intentional walk in the prior at-bat...the 6 runs in the 4th were the most by a Ray in a single frame since **Ryan Yarbrough**'s 6-run 5th on April 7 at BOS...allowed a **Freddie Freeman** solo homer to start the 5th...his line: L, 4.1 IP, 8 H, 7 R/ER, 1 BB, 1 SO, 2 HR, 72 pitches, 51 strikes.

- + Both homers came against left-handed hitters...has allowed six "left-on-left" homers this season, tied for 2nd-most in the majors.
- + His avg. exit velocity was 92.5 mph, the highest of his career.
- + Is 2-4 with a 4.85 ERA (39-IP, 21-ER) in 7 starts this season, compared to 5-1 with a 2.88 ERA (34.1-IP, 11-ER) in 8 apps in relief.

LOOKING TO REBOUND—Since June 4, is 2-2 with a 5.46 ERA (28-IP, 17-ER) over his last 6 apps (3 starts), compared to 5-3 with a 2.98 ERA (45.1-IP, 15-ER) through his first 9 apps (4 starts) of the season...has allowed 5 runs (or more) in all 3 starts over this stretch of 6 apps...however, has allowed a combined 1 run (0 ER) in his three relief appearances over that stretch.

- + Is 12-5 with a 3.58 ERA (105.2-IP, 42-ER) in his first 22 career apps (12 starts), and his 12 wins are most in club history through 22 career apps, ahead of Rolando Arrojo (11) and Jeremy Hellickson (11).
- + Has held opponents to 1 run (or fewer) in 12 of his 22 career apps and 3 runs (or fewer) in 17 of 22, including 11 of 15 this season.

SINK OR SWIM—Has used his sinker on 44.6 pct. (485 of 1,088) of pitches this season and is limiting opponents to a .248 avg. (25-for-113) on at-bats ending with the pitch, according to StatCast...however, has allowed a .412 opp avg. (7-for-17) in his last 3 apps (1 start), compared to a .222 avg. (24-for-108) through his first 12 apps (6 starts)...is allowing an avg. exit velocity of 87.0 mph on the pitch, 6th-lowest in the AL (min. 50 batted balls).

+ Min. 50 IP, his 58.3 pct. ground ball rate is 5th-highest in the majors, and he ranks 7th with a 2.68 GB/FB ratio...has 17 assists, tied for 6th among major league pitchers and tied for 2nd among AL pitchers.

CATCH ME IF YOU CAN—Has induced a swing on 40.3 pct. of pitches outside the strike zone, according to FanGraphs, the 2nd-highest in the majors (min. 50 IP) behind NYM Jacob deGrom (43.2 pct.)...while he has allowed a 74.6 pct. contact rate on pitches outside the zone—which is the 7th-highest mark in the majors—he has induced an avg. exit velocity of 87 mph on all batted balls this season, according to StatCast, tied for the 14th-lowest in the majors and 5th-lowest in the AL (min. 150 batted balls).

- + Has thrown 14.8 pitches per inning and 3.66 pitches/BF this season, which are the 2nd and 3rd-lowest rates in the AL (min. 50 IP).
- + Has seen his walk rate (6.1 pct.) rise and strikeout rate (14.5 pct.) fall in comparison to last season (5.4 pct. walk rate, 19.2 pct. SO rate).

2020 RECAP—Went 5-0 with a 2.78 ERA (32.1-IP, 10-ER) in 7 apps (5 starts) for the Rays last season, his first career action...his 5-game winning streak was the longest for a Ray beginning his major league career, breaking a tie with Adam Kolarek (2017-19), Jake Faria (2017), Jeremy Hellickson (2010), Tim Corcoran (2006) and James Shields (2006)...became the second Rays rookie to finish a season with 5 wins (or more) and no losses, joining Jalen Beeks (5-0) in 2018...became the third Rays pitcher to start and win each of his first three major league apps. joining Faria and Hellickson.

- + Went 4-0 with a 3.16 ERA (25.2-IP, 9-ER) in 5 starts and 1-0 with a 1.35 ERA (6.2-IP, 1-ER) in two relief apps...two of his five starts last season were scoreless and one of his two relief apps was scoreless.
- + Min. 20 IP, his groundball rate of 64.6 pct. led the AL and ranked 3rd in the majors...yielded 7 BB in 32.1 IP for a 1.95 BB/9 IP ratio.

AMATEUR CAREER—Selected in the fifth round of the 2017 June Draft out of Webster University, becoming the first drafted player in program history...became the first player in school and league (SLIAC) history to play in the majors...went 8-1 with a 0.68 ERA (92.2-IP, 7-ER) in 13 starts as a junior, leading Division III pitchers in ERA and WHIP (0.71)...missed most of his sophomore season with a sprained UCL in his left elbow.
