# PITTSBURGH PIRATES (44-47) vs. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (53-39) July 10, 2024 at American Family Field, Milwaukee, WI - 7:10 CDT - GAME \#92/ROAD \#46 LHP MARTÍN PÉREZ (1-4, 4.85 ERA) vs. RHP TOBIAS MYERS (5-3, 3.52 ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...opened their six-game road trip with a 12-2 win last night against the Brewers...Have scored the fourth-most runs (49) in all of MLB this month behind the Diamondbacks (56), Twins (51) and Athletics (50)...Have gone 15-15 in one-run games... Have won 10 games in their last at-bat, matching their total from all of 2023 (the team won 13 games in the final at-bat of 2022)...Have gone 33-3 (.917 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have not been shut out in 36 straight games, which is the sixth-longest active streak in MLB (the Cardinals have the longest active streak at 68 games)...Have drawn at least one walk in 56 straight games, which is the second-longest active streak in MLB behind the Phillies ( 75 straight)...Have played in 30 one-run games, which are the second-most among National League teams behind the Cubs (33)...Have the fourth-most quality starts (44) in MLB behind the Mariners (54), Phillies (51) and Royals (46)...Have the fifth-best ERA (3.54) among all starting rotations in MLB, trailing only the Phillies (3.19), Mariners (3.45), Royals (3.47) and Orioles (3.49)...Have won two straight and four of their last six games on the road (have not lost more than two straight games on the road since dropping four in a row from April 28 to May 1)...Have posted a 14-13 record against the National League Central, including 8-6 on the road.

IN GRAND FASHION: Last night Joey Bart hit his second grand slam of the season and seventh by the Pirates in 2024...The seven grand slams are tied for the most in a season in Pirates history along with 1978 and 1996...Pittsburgh's seven grand slams are also tied for the most in MLB along with the Brewers... Coming into today, Bryan Reynolds is tied for the second-most RBI (16) in MLB with the bases loaded along with Toronto's
 Vladimir Guerrero Jr...The only player with more RBI with the sacks packed is San Diego's Jurrickson Profar (17).
ALL-STAR ACCOLADES: Bryan Reynolds is hitting .333 with four home runs and 10 RBI in his first eight games of this month...On Tuesday, Reynolds surpassed Bobby Bonilla for the most home runs (115) by a Pirates switch hitter in club history...Reynolds is now two homers away from tying Andy Van Slyke and Dick Stuart for 15th place in Pirates history with 117 home runs.

BEER BATTERS: The Pirates have gone deep in each their last 12

games against Milwaukee dating back to last year...l't's the longest home run streak by the Pirates against a team since also going deep in 12 straight games against the Reds from June 20, 2013 to April 15, 2014...The last time the Pirates homered against a team in more than 12 straight games was from July 9, 1999 to June 17, 2009 against Minnesota.

HOT ROWD: Since the beginning of last month, Rowdy Tellez ranks second in the National League in batting (.352) and third in slugging (.637) and OPS (1.035) among players with at least 90 plate appearances...Tellez is also 10 -for-16 (.625) with runners in scoring position since the beginning of last month...Since June 26, Tellez has hit six home runs, which are the second-most in all of MLB behind Colorado's Brenton Doyle (seven)...Tellez' 11 RBI during that time are also tied for ninth among all National League players.
CALL TO THE PEN: Quinn Priester and Dennis Santana worked the final 8.0 innings in relief on Tuesday while allowing one earned run and recording 12 strikeouts...Since June 25, Pittsburgh's bullpen has recorded the fifth-lowest ERA (2.16) in all of MLB...The only four teams to record a lower bullpen ERA during that time are the Braves (1.13), Cardinals (1.72), Cubs (2.03) and Angels (2.03).

PLAYING THE FIELD: The Pirates have MLB's third-best fielding percentage (.993) since June 26... The only two teams with a higher fielding percentage during that time are the Cardinals (.996) and Rangers (.993)...The Pirates have also turned the second-most double plays (17) during that time, trailing only the Mets (18).

CATCH THIS: Pittsburgh's catchers come into today tied for fourth in the National League and tied for 11th in all of MLB with 44 RBI...The only four National League teams whose catchers have recorded more RBI are the Dodgers (59), Padres (57) and Brewers (56)...Last year Pittsburgh's backstops were tied with the White Sox for the fewest RBI (45) in all of MLB.

STARTING OFF: The 33-year-old lefthander is in his 13th Major League season, having played for the Rangers (2012-18; 2022-23), Twins (2019), Red Sox (2020-21) and Pirates (2024)...He was named an American League All-Star with the Rangers during the 2022 season...Tonight will be his 14th start of the season for the Pirates and his 302nd career appearance on a Major League mound (excluding Postseason)...A native of Guanare, Venezuela, Perez was signed by the Rangers as an international free agent as a 16 -year-old on July 2, 2007.

He made one rehab start with Triple-A Indianapolis on June 22 vs. lowa (CHC), allowing two runs (one earned run) on five hits with four strikeouts and no walks over 5.0 innings of work ( 63 pitches, 41 strikes).

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor into the decision on July 4 vs. St. Louis, allowing one run on seven hits with two strikeouts against one walk in 7.1 innings of work...It marked the second time this season Perez has pitched into the eighth inning, joining an 8.0 -inning effort on April 9 vs. Detroit.

REACHING MILESTONES: In his outing on June 28 at Atlanta, Perez made his 300th career Major League appearance, making him the 15th active player to have made $300+$ appearances and $250+$ starts and the sixth left-hander to do so, joining Clayton Kershaw, Chris Sale, Wade Miley, Patrick Corbin and Jose Quintana.

- Along with 300 appearances, Perez also eclipsed 1,500.0 career innings pitched in that start, making him just the ninth Venezuelan-born pitcher in Major League history to record 300+ appearances and 1,500+ innings pitched, joining Felix Hernandez, Johan Santana, Anibal Sanchez, Carlos Zambrano, Carlos Carrasco, Freddy Garcia, Wilson Alvarez and Kelvim Escobar.

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF: At the time of his injury, Perez ranked among the NL leaders in opponents grounded into double plays per 9.0 IP (1st, 1.41), opponents grounded into double plays (T2nd, 9) and pitches per batter faced (5th, 3.62) [min. 50.0 IP...stats represent start of the season thru May 26].

VS. MILWAUKEE: Perez will be making his fifth career appearance and fourth start against the Brewers tonight, as well as his second start of the season.

- Made the start on May 15 at American Family Field, taking the loss after allowing nine runs on 11 hits with four strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work.

GETTING IT DONE: Perez has allowed three earned runs or fewer in nine of his 13 starts this season, as well as two earned runs or fewer seven times and one or fewer five times (one outing of 0 earned runs on April 27 at SF).

2023 RECAP: Split the season between the starting rotation and bullpen for the World-Champion Rangers...Ranked in the 71st percentile in groundball percentage according to Baseball Savant, inducing opposing hitters into 18 grounded into double plays, which were tied for the seventh-most in the American League (his 1.14 grounded into double plays per 9.0 innings also ranked third among American League pitchers with at least 100.0 innings pitched).

- Appeared in three postseason games for Texas last year, including a relief appearance in Game 2 of the World Series.
- Made two starts while pitching for Venezuela in the World Baseball Classic.
