TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 9-game, 10-day homestand with the last of 3 games against the Detroit Tigers (1-1)...Seattle is coming off a series win against the Minnesota Twins (2-1) on the homestand, and will host the Tampa Bay Rays (3 G, 8/7-8/9) during 50 Seasons Celebration Weekend to close out the homestand...today's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzo** on the call...Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** will serve as an analyst on both Radio (innings 1-3 and 8-9) and TV (innings 4-7)...former Mariners catcher **Dave Valle** will serve as an analyst on Radio (innings 4-7) and TV (innings 1-3 and 8-9).

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners beat the Tigers by a 4-2 score last night, evening the series at one game apiece...the Mariners are 48-27 (.640) when homering, 7th-best record in MLB...they are 8-32 (.200) when they do not record a home run, 3rd-worst record in MLB...only the Tigers (.189/7-30) and Giants (.154/6-33) hold worse records when failing to homer.

- **Take Me Home** - The Mariners are 12-6 (.667) over their last 18 home games since June 21...since June 29, Seattle has won 4 of 5 home series and look to make it 5 of 6 in today's rubber match.
- **Sunny Day** - The Mariners are 24-18 (.571) in day games this season, 4th-best record in the Majors.
- **Programming Note** - Tomorrow's game against the Rays will be televised exclusively on **Apple TV** with **Alex Faust** and **Ryan Spilborghs** on the call and **Tricia Whitaker** serving as field reporter.

HE'S THE MAÑ...closer **Andrés Muñoz** locked down his 20th save of the season in last night's 4-2 win...the right-hander tossed a perfect inning with a pair of strikeouts...for Muñoz, it marks his third consecutive 20+ save campaign, joining Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02) as the only Mariners with three consecutive 20+ save seasons...Muñoz also has 98 saves in his career, inching closer in becoming the 40th pitcher in MLB history to record 100 saves by age 27-or-younger...97 of his 98 saves have come with the Mariners (1 with San Diego), 3 saves shy of becoming the fourth pitcher in Seattle history with 100+ saves and would join Sasaki (129 SV), Edwin Díaz (109) and J.J. Putz (101).

MOUND DOGS...the Mariners pitching staff leads the Majors in fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.51), walk rate (6.7%) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.46)...Mariners pitchers rank T-4th in WHIP (1.19), 4th in FIP (3.73), 8th in fWAR (12.9) and 9th in ERA (3.77).

OPPO JULIO...last night, **Julio Rodríguez** hit his 31st career opposite field home run, tied for 7th-most in MLB since 2022 (*Baseball Savant*)...the 31 are tied with Shohei Ohtani and Gleyber Torres, trailing Aaron Judge (60), Rafael Devers (39), Pete Alonso (35), Juan Soto (34), Yandy Díaz (34) & Giancarlo Stanton (33).

ALUMNI HOME RUN DERBY TOMORROW...the Mariners kick off their 50 Seasons Celebration Weekend with the first-ever **Alumni Home Run Derby**, following tomorrow night's game...there will be 7 Derby participants: Hall of Famer **Ichiro Suzuki**, along with **Mike Cameron**, **Ryan Rowland-Smith**, **Ryon Healy**, **Stefen Romero**, Mariners Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola** and **Bucky Jacobsen**...the Derby will be DJ'd by **Julio Rodríguez** aka "DJ Pleno", with MLB Network studio host **Greg Amsinger** set to host the event...Hall of Famer **Ken Griffey Jr.** will be the event's Commissioner, while the two team captains are Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** and **Nelson Cruz**...Mariners broadcasters **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Gary Hill Jr.** will be on the call as the event is being streamed on **Mariners.TV**.

- **MLB Network On Site** - Friday's festivities will be covered live by **MLB Network's** Amsinger and former Mariners legend **Harold Reynolds**...special Mariners guests set to join the Network **pre-game** include **Rick Rizzo**, **Alvin Davis**, **Raul Ibañez**, **Bret Boone**, **Jay Buhner** and **Ruppert Jones**.

CELEBRATING 50 YEARS OF MARINERS BASEBALL...the 50 Greatest Mariners Players will be revealed this Saturday, August 8 in a pre-game ceremony...more former Mariners spanning multiple generations will be at T-Mobile Park than ever before...for more info, visit [Mariners.com/50Seasons](#).

NAYLZ STREAK SNAPPED...yesterday **Josh Naylor** had his 25-game on-base streak snapped...it was the longest active streak in the Majors...since 2020, only 3 on-base streaks (via H, BB or HBP) by Mariners have been longer: **Randy Arozarena** (34 G in 2025), Teoscar Hernández (30 G in 2023) and **Julio Rodríguez** (27 G in 2023)...for Naylor, it was the longest on-base streak of his career...from July 4-Aug. 4, he hit .298 (28x94) with a .365 on-base percentage.

COLE "COLE YOUNG" YOUNG...in 18 games since the All-Star Break, **Cole Young** is batting .324 (23x71) with 9 runs, 1 double, 2 triples, 3 home runs, 8 RBI and 5 walks, reaching base at a .377 clip and slugging .521 for an .898 OPS over 77 plate appearances...Young ranks as the **best second baseman** in the American League this season by *Baseball-Reference* wins above replacement (3.9).

A FLAIR FOR THE DRAMATIC...the Mariners are tied for the 2nd-most walk-off wins (9) in MLB this season with the White Sox, trailing only the Cubs (10)...since 2021, Seattle's 57 walk-off victories easily pace the Majors, ranking ahead of the Giants (48) and Mets (48).

WE'RE GETTING THE BAND BACK TOGETHER...**Taylor Ward** notched his first hit in a Mariners uniform last night, going 1-for-3 in his second game since being acquired from the Baltimore Orioles...**Brendan Donovan** also went 1-for-3 in his second game since being reinstated from the Injured List...right-handed relief pitcher **Carlos Vargas** threw a bullpen at T-Mobile Park yesterday.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Julio Rodríguez** hit a 3-run home run in the bottom of the sixth in last night's Mariners win...he homered immediately after the Tigers intentionally walked **Dominic Canzone**, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Canzone has been intentionally walked twice this season, and a Mariners batter has followed with a home run on the first pitch of the at-bat in both instances?...in addition to Julio's 3-run homer last night, on July 20 vs. the Cincinnati Reds, Canzone was intentionally walked to load the bases in the seventh inning before **Cal Raleigh** hit a grand slam on the first pitch.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - AUGUST 6

- **1977** - Mariners center fielder **Ruppert Jones** hit the first-ever inside-the-park home run in franchise history at the Kingdome, as the Mariners defeated the Yankees, 9-2.
- **2001** - **Paul Abbott** sets a Mariners record by winning his 10th consecutive decision in an 8-6 win at Cleveland.
- **2016** - The Mariners retired **Ken Griffey Jr.'s** number 24 in a pre-game ceremony. Prior to the game, the current Mariners wore number 24 on their batting practice jerseys, marking the last time a Mariners player wore 24. Griffey was the first Mariners player to have his number retired by the franchise.

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 14th appearance (13th start) of the season and the 88th (87th start) of his career...it marks his 5th career start against the Tigers and 2nd of the season.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller on July 20, 2021.
- Played 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on July 31 vs. MIN, tossed 5.1 innings, allowing only 2 runs (2 ER) on 3 hits (1 HR) and 2 walks while striking out 3 batters...threw 87 pitches and 56 strikes...marks his 9th start of the season with 5-or-fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP... his 9 such outings are tied for 4th most in MLB this season while leading MLB since he made his season debut on May 13.

TAMING THE TIGERS...over 4 regular season starts against the Tigers, has yet to allow a run scored...he is 1-of-2 pitchers since earned runs became an official stat in both leagues in 1913 to own a 0.00 ERA over 4+ regular season games started against a single opponent...has faced the Tigers only once at T-Mobile Park, recording 5.0 IP with 5 hits, 1 walk, and 3 strikeouts... Miller has pitched 7.0+ innings of shutout ball with 3-or-fewer base runners allowed in 2 of his 4 starts, both being at Comerica Park...faced the Tigers in the 2025 ALDS game 4 where he allowed only 2 runs on 4 hits over 4.0 innings of work.

GOOD TO BE HOME...his 1.34 ERA (5 ER, 33.2 IP) at home is tied for the 2nd-lowest ERA through a pitcher's first 6 home starts to start a season in Mariners history, trailing Hisashi Iwakuma's 1.08 ERA (5 ER, 41.2 IP)...it is also tied for the 5th-lowest ERA through a pitcher's first 6 home starts this season, matching Eduardo Rodríguez-ARI...Miller's 24 baserunners at home through his first 5 home starts rank T-2nd fewest through a pitchers first 5 home starts since 2024 (min. 20.0 IP), tied with **Bryan Woo** (2024) and just trailing **Logan Gilbert** (2025), while his 17 hits allowed are the fewest this season.

FOR THE HOME CROWD...has allowed 2-or-fewer earned runs over 5.0+ IP in each of his 6 home starts this season...his 6 consecutive games are the 3rd longest streak recorded this season behind Max Meyer's-MIA 9 straight games...is 1-of-3 active streaks, along with Meyer (9 G) and **Bryan Woo** (7 G)...his 0.654 WHIP in home games leads the league (min. 5 GS) while his 1.34 ERA (5 ER, 33.2 IP) and K/BB (7.4) at home ranks both rank 2nd...is holding opposing batters to a league-leading (min. 5 GS) .147 (17x116) batting average at home.

LIKE PLAYING CATCH...allowed only 3 hits over 5.1 innings of work in his last start on vs. MIN for his 6th outing game of the season...his 6 games to 3-or-fewer hits allowed over 5.0+ innings this season are tied for the 3rd most in MLB since he made his season debut on May 13...Miller has allowed 2-or-fewer hits over 5.0+ IP in 4 outings this season, T-2nd most since he made his debut, and has recorded 5.0+ IP with a single hit allowed in 3 appearances to lead the league appearances with 1-or-fewer hits over 5.0+ IP since May 13...this season marks the first in which he has recorded multiple games of 5.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits allowed...his league-leading 3 such outings are also tied for the 2nd most recorded by a Mariners pitcher in a single season, joining Luis Castillo (2023) and Roy Thomas (1985) and just trailing Bryan Woo's 4 outings in 2025.

KING OF THE HILL...among American League leaders this season (min. 70 IP), he ranks 3rd in WHIP (0.919), 3rd in SO/BB (5.69), T-4th in BB/9 (1.6), and T-4th in BB% (4.6%) despite making his season-debut mid-May...among AL pitchers since 2023 (min. 400 IP), he ranks 6th in WHIP (1.095), 7th in opp. BA (.227), 10th in BB% (6.2%), 10th in BB/9 (2.2), and 10th in SO/BB (3.71).

KEEPING THE PATHS 'CLEAN'...owns a career 10.12 baserunners-per-nine, which ranks 10th in MLB since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP)...his 8.39 BR/9 this season si tied for the lead in the AL and ranks T-3rd in MLB in 2026 (min. 70.0 IP)...his 23 career games with 4-or-fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP (last: 7/2 vs. LAA) rank 4th in MLB since 2023, trailing **Logan Gilbert** (25), **Bryan Woo** (25) and Tarik Skubal-LAD (26)...he is 1-of-5 pitchers with 6+ such games this season.

STELLAR STRETCH...is 1-of-5 pitchers this season to record 74+ strikeouts to 13-or-fewer walks through their first 13 games of the season...is just the 5th Mariners pitcher in franchise history to record 74+ SO with 13-or-fewer walks through a player's first 13 games of a season, along with Logan Gilbert (2023), Hisashi Iwakuma (2013), George Kirby (2024) and Cliff Lee (2010).

HITS DIFFERENT...has dominated right-handed hitters across his career...among pitchers with min. 800 AB vs. RHH since 2023, his 0.957 WHIP ranks 4th-best in MLB, trailing only Zack Wheeler-PHI (0.813), **Bryan Woo** (0.865) and Tarik Skubal-LAD (0.914), while ranking ahead of teammate **Logan Gilbert** (0.965)...also ranks 9th in BB/9 (1.58), T-6th in opponent average (.213), and 11th in SO/BB (5.56) against RHH since 2023.
