STL Review Challenges:	16-11

BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their Antepenultimate homestand tonight when they play the middle game of a three-game series against the Philadelphia Phillies after taking 2-of-3 from Colorado last weekend...this week's series meeting is the first of the season between the Cardinals & Phillies, who will also play later this month (Aug. 21-23) at Citizens Bank Park...including tonight, the Cardinals have 43 games remaining in the regular season with 17 at home and 26 on the road.

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters play today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 15.0 games behind 1st place Milwaukee; 1.5 games ahead of 4th place Pittsburgh and 4.5 games out of the final National League Wild Card position...the Cardinals are 5-5 in their last 10 games, 8-12 in last 20 and 12-18 in last 30...they are 30-35 vs. teams that are currently above .500 and 29-25 vs. sub .500 teams.

CAP COLORS: After receiving overwhelming supporting feedback from Cardinals fans on a recent social media team uniform survey, the team has decided to act immediately, and will begin wearing navy blue caps for the remainder of their road games (aside from wearing red caps on road Saturdays when they wear their Victory Blue uniforms)...since 2013, the Cardinals have only worn their navy blue caps on the road when playing a team that wore red caps and/or listed red as its primary team color...the team previously wore navy caps for all road games from 1940-64 and again from 1992-2012.

BARKING BACK: Several of the the Cardinals regulars are not backing down to baseball's "dog days" of August, with **Jordan Walker** (.344 BA), **Nathan Church** (.333), **Iván Herrera** (.333) and **Alec Burleson** (.313) leading the pack...**Burleson** ranks among NL August leaders in SLG (.750) & OPS (1.186) this month, including 4 HR & 10 RBI, and **Herrera**, who has played in all but one of the team's 119 games this season, is "off the chain" with a league high 7 extra base hits and 6 doubles in his 9 August games played...the Cardinals & Phillies are co-leading the NL with 20 doubles in August while Philly leads the Senior Circuit with a .370 OBP this month and the Cardinals are ranked 3rd (.346).

REDBIRD ROOKIES: Not including pitchers or the designated hitter, the Cardinals position player rookies have totaled a combined 279 games started this season...Cardinals rookies combined for 161 starts all of last season and in 1906 had 657 rookie starts, a team high dating to 1900...**JJ Wetherholt's** 107 starts at 2nd base are the most among Cardinals rookies at 2B since 1960 when Cardinals Hall of Famer **Julián Javier** started 119 and **Blaze Jordan's** 33 starts at the Hot Corner are the most by a Cardinals rookie since **Tommy Edman** (41) in 2019.

IT ALL STARTS HERE: Cardinals starting pitchers have provided the team with excellent stability, pitching to a 3.99 ERA that ranks 4th in the NL behind Division leaders MIL (3.46), LAD (3.56) and ATL (3.77)...the Cardinals 44 Quality Starts rank 3rd in the loop behind just the Dodgers (61) and Phillies (51).

WALKER IS AT IT AGAIN: **Jordan Walker** has hit safely in 10-straight games (.304 BA) dating to July 29, the longest active hit streak in MLB and his 4th hitting streak of 10 or more games this season...he's the 1st Cardinal since **Matt Holliday** in 2010, and the only player in MLB this season, to compile four 10+ game hitting streaks in the same season.

BURLY 365: How about a quick look at what 2025 NL Silver Slugger **Alec Burleson** has done in the past year, dating to August 10, 2025: Burly, who is batting .290 (169-582) in that time, also has 99 RBI, 4th in the NL behind only **Kyle Schwarber** (106), **CJ Abrams** (106) and **Brice Turang** (101) in addition to 36 doubles, (T-5th in NL), 23 HR's and a team-high .834 OPS.

PHILADELPHIA CONNECTIONS

Jordan Walker won the 2026 Home Run Derby at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia with home runs on each of his final six swings to defeat Phillies OF Kyle Schwarber in the finals, 12-11...Walker, **Iván Herrera**, **Riley O'Brien** & **Oliver Marmol** all represented the Cardinals in the 2026 All-Star Game at Citizens Bank Park.

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations **Chaim Bloom** was born in Philadelphia...graduated from Jack M. Barrack Hebrew Academy.

Brant Brown enjoyed a three-homer game on June 18, 1998 vs. the Phillies at Wrigley Field.

Ryne Stanek earned his first career MLB save on Aug. 25, 2019 vs. Philadelphia with Miami.

Cardinals Assistant Pitching Coach **Kyle Driscoll** is a native of nearby Toms River, N.J.

Gordon Graceffo played college baseball at nearby Villanova Univ. (2019-21)...Graceffo and **Aaron Nola** were teammates on Team Italy in the 2026 WBC.

Jonathan Bowlan's father, **Mark Bowlan**, was selected by St. Louis in the 19th round of the 1989 MLB Draft and played two minor league seasons.

Adolis García signed with St. Louis as an international free agent in 2017 and played in 21 games for the Cardinals in 2018.

Cardinals Hall of Famer and 2026 Buck O'Neil Lifetime Achievement Award winner **Bill White** played three seasons w/ Philadelphia (1966-68)...traded to the Phillies in 1965 and back to St. Louis in 1969.

Edmundo Sosa signed with the Cardinals as an international free agent (July 2, 2012)...played parts of five seasons in St. Louis (2018-22)...traded to Phillies for JoJo Romero (July 30, 2022).

Bryce Harper received a 2021 Stan Musial Award from the St. Louis Sports Commission for his "graciousness, empathy and sportsmanship" after he was struck in the face by a pitch from St. Louis LHP **Génesis Cabrera** (April 28, 2021 at Busch).

Zack Wheeler underwent thoracic outlet decompression surgery on Sept. 23, 2025 in St. Louis.

Phillies Amateur Scouting Director **Brian Barber** was a 1st-round (#22) selection in the 1991 MLB draft by St. Louis from Dr. Phillips (Fla.) High School , same school as **Oliver Marmol**...pitched in 10 games for St. Louis (1995-96).

Hall of Famer **Steve Carlton** signed with St. Louis as an amateur free agent in 1963 and pitched in 190 games (172 starts) for St. Louis for seven seasons from 1965-71 with three All-Star selections ('68, '69, '71)...traded to the Phillies in exchange for **Rick Wise** on Feb. 25, 1972.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Making his 22nd start of the season and his 83rd career start (191st career appearance); Andre has put together three consecutive 20+ start seasons with 31 in 2025 & 20 in 2024.
- Looking to become the NL's 7th starter with 12 or more wins.
- Pallante's 11 wins in his first 21 starts were the most by a Cardinal through their first 21 starts in a season since **Adam Wainwright** (11 in 2017). With a win tonight, would be the most victories in first 22 starts of a season since 2015: **Carlos Martinez** (12-3) and **Michael Wacha** (13-4)
- Andre is the first Cardinal since **Joaquin Andujar** (1983-84) to bounce back from a 15+ loss season and win 10 or more games the very next season; Andujar lost 16 games in 1983 but then produced a 20-win season in 1984 and a 21-win season in 1985.
- Is 11-15 with a 4.39 ERA in 30 career starts (81 appearances) Post All-Star Break.
- Owns an 11.25 Run Support Average on the road (highest in MLB) but just 3.38 at home ... He's received 3 runs or fewer in 12 of his 13 Home starts, yet 5 runs or more in 7 of his 8 Road starts.
- Making his his 191st career appearance tonight to pass **Steve Carlton** for 63rd all-time among Cardinals pitchers. He has joined **Adam Wainwright** (478 starts), **Carlos Martinez** (274), **Lance Lynn** (206), **Miles Mikolas** (204) and **Chris Carpenter** (198) since 2000 to reach both 191 career games pitched for St. Louis while also making 80 or more starts.
- Is 6-0 in eight Road starts (St. Louis is 6-2) and he's 5-6 in Home games with the Cardinals going 6-7 at Busch after starting out 1-4 in his 1st five starts in St. Louis.
- Has made 8 consecutive road starts of 5.0+ IP, two shy of **Kyle Leahy's** 10-straight such starts on the road.
- **Leads all current Cardinals pitchers in career starts (82), wins (35), and innings pitched (578.2).**
- Began the season with 10 consecutive starts of 5.0+ IP (March 31-May 23), first Cardinal to do so since RHP **Sonny Gray** ran off 10 straight such starts to begin 2024.
- Alternated Home & Road starts in first 11 starts to begin the season, but that trend ended on May 29-June 7 homestand after consecutive Home starts. Alternated again through his previous four before making back/back Home starts his last two times out.
- Allowed 2 runs or fewer in five of six starts from May 17 to June 22 (2.88 ERA) and led the Cardinals starting staff with his 3.16 ERA in June.
- Made the Cardinals Opening Day Roster for the 5th time (2022-26), tied with **Lars Nootbaar** for most among active Cardinals.

LAST TIME OUT (Thursday, July 30 vs. Cubs at Busch Stadium): ND, L, 4-2: 6.1 IP, 7 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 2 BB, 3 SO - 90 pitches.

- Took a ND in Cardinals 4-2 loss in 10 innings vs. the Cubs, while receiving just one run in support.
- It was his 8th quality start of the season which ranks 3rd on the team behind McGreevy (13) & May (10).

2026 NOTES:

SLIDE ON IN: Is holding opposing batters to a .197 BA (27-137) with his slider, and 40 of his 86 strikeouts this season have come via the slider ... Boasts a 11 Run Value on his slider, 6th-best slider in MLB according to *Baseball Savant* this season.

COUNT ON ME: Has worked at least 5.0 IP in 20 of his 21 starts this season, allowing 2 runs or fewer in 12 of those games.

RIGHT ON: His .215 Opp. BA vs. RHB leads the team and he and **Kyle Leahy** (.217) are trying to become the 1st pair of Cardinals pitchers since **Lance Lynn** (.203) and **Carlos Martinez** (.204) in 2017 to have a sub .200 Opp. BA vs. right-handers in the same season.

IF AT FIRST: Has had issues with 1st inning, allowing a .768 OPS, 14 runs and 4 HRs in 1st inning ... Batters are hitting .328 (19-58) when contacting the 1st pitch of an at-bat.

WRIGLEY WIPE OUT: Picked up his 10th win of the season with 5.2 scoreless IP on 7/3 at Wrigley Field as the Cardinals rolled to a 17-1 win over the Cubs - their most lop-sided win over the Cubs since a 21-3 mauling on 4/27/77 at the Friendly Confines.

SIX & THIRTY: Snapped a 4-game losing skid in games pitched at Busch Stadium as he matched his season total from 2025 with his 6th win of the season vs. TEX (6/3); also marked his 30th career win.

THE STATE OF WINNING: With a win in Sacramento (May 12), earned his first MLB in his home state of California.

BITTER BREW: Allowed four 1st inning runs, including 3-run HR, in 6-2 loss to MIL (5/6), losing his 3rd straight decision at Busch Stadium.

AHOY MATEY: Pitched then season-best 6.0 IP while allowing 1 run in Cards 5-4 win at PNC Park (4/29) in G3 of a 4-game series sweep of Pittsburgh.

TRI-DENT: Fanned 8 Mariners on 4/24 in 5.1 IP, but took the 3-2 loss after Josh Naylor's solo HR in the 6th snapped a 2-2 tie.

SPACE TRAVELER: Earned his 1st road win since 5/16/25 (at KC) in a 7-5 Space City win over the Astros on 4/18 in Houston.

MARCH MADNESS: Made his 2026 season debut vs. NYM (3/31) and gained a 3-0 win as he worked 5.0 scoreless IP, allowing just 3 hits.

CAREER:

- Has made the Cardinals Opening Day Roster for five consecutive seasons (2022-26) after arriving at 2022 Spring Training as a non-roster invitee, his first official invite to Major League Spring Training.
- Since his 2022 MLB debut, boasts the highest ground ball pct. (62.2%) in Major League Baseball among pitchers with 500.0+ IP.*** As a starting pitcher (447.0 IP), Pallante's 59.1 career groundball pct. currently is the 9th-best in MLB since the stat has been tracked since 1987 (min. 400.0 IP as starter).

PALLANTE vs. PHILLIES:

- Is making just his 2nd career start, and 1st since 7/10/22 at STL, against the Phillies tonight.
- Holds a career mark of 0-1, 7.45 ERA in six career games (1 start) against Philadelphia with all but one of those games coming here at Busch Stadium.
- Appeared in two games in relief against the Phillies last season (April 8 & April 10), allowing 2 runs on 3 hits in just 0.1 IP.
- The Cardinals have lost 5 of the 6 games he has appeared in against Philadelphia, with the lone win (4-3) coming in the game he started on July 10, 2022.
