METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Pirates, 5-2, yesterday in Pittsburgh...The victory snapped a three-game skid...New York is in stretch of 17-straight games before the All-Star break.. They are 4-5 in that span... The Mets are in the midst of an eight-game road trip (3-3)...They travel to Washington D.C. for a four-game series (2-2) and to Pittsburgh, PA (1-1) for a four-game series...Following this trip, the Mets head to Citi Field to close out the first-half with a six-game homestand against Nationals (three games) and Rockies (three games).

CONNECT FOUR: Over the last four starts, Sean Manaea is 2-0 with a 1.99 ERA (5 ER/22.2 IP) with 11 walks and 21 strikeouts...The Mets are 2-1 in that span...He has made seven starts on the road, going 3-0 with a 2.82 ERA (12 ER/38.1IP) with 16 walks and 31 strikeouts...This compares to a 2-3 record with a 4.40 ERA (22 ER/45.0 IP) with 20 walks and 50 strikeouts in nine starts at Citi Field in 2024.

JULY! JULY! JULY!: The Mets are 3-3 this month, posting a 5.26 ERA, while batting .217/.256/.411...This compares to 16-8 record with a with a 4.17 ERA and a 280/356/504 slashline in June. The team's 217 average in July is 25th in the majors, while their .256 OBP is 30th...The team's 5.93 ERA in July is 24th in the majors.

I DON'T WANT TO BE A PIRATE: Pete Alonso is a .325 (13-40) hitter with five runs, five doubles, one RBI and five walks in 11 career games at PNC Park. Jose Iglesias has hit .343 (24-70) with five runs, five doubles, seven RBI and 10 walks in 22 career games at the vard...Tyrone Taylor has hit .306 (19-62) with five doubles, two triples, one home run, nine RBI and three walks with a .500 SLG in 18 games in Pittsburgh.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets hit the road for the final time before the All-Star break...New York is 22-19 on the road...Their .537 road winning percentage is the seventh-best in the majors and the third-best in the National League... The Amazins' have hit .268/.329/.446 on the road in 2024...They are second in the majors in AVG, SLG and OPS...They have scored 228 runs on the road, averaging a major league-best 5.56 runs/game...The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023.

**INVADER NIMS:** Entering June, Brandon Nimmo was batting .214/.350/378 with 29 runs, nine doubles, one tsriple, seven home runs, 29 RBI and a .728 OPS...In 27 games since then, he is batting .312/.400/.560 with 26 runs, seven doubles, one triple, six home runs, 23 RBI, 13 walks with a .960 OPS...He has safely reached base in 18 of his last 19 games...He owns a 2.8 fWAR this season, which is 13th in the National League.

ROAD SHOW: Nimmo is batting .291/.412/.560 with 34 runs, nine doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 28 RBI and 22 walks in 37 games on the road this season...He is fifth in the majors with a .412 OBP on the road and is eighth with a .560 SLG...This compares to a .213/.328/.341 with 12 extra-base hits and 24  $\,$ RBI in 45 games on the road.

HOMEGROWN: The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2021 (Christian Scott), 2020 (Eric Orze), 2017 (David Peterson, Mark Vientos), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Jeff McNeil) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts...In addition, the team features several players who signed via International Free Agency including Francisco Alvarez, Jose Quintana, José Buttó and Dedniel Núñez.

RECORD SCRATCH: The Mets are in the midst of 18 straight games against teams who currently have records below .500...The team is 3-3 in this stretch... The Mets are 25-19 this season when facing a team with a record below .500.

MAKERS MARK: In 43 games this season, Mark Vientos is batting .289 (44-152) with 27 runs, eight doubles, 11 home runs, 29 RBI with 13 walks, a .343 OBP, a .559 SLG with a .903 OPS... Entering 2024, Vientos had played a total of 81  $\,$ games and hit .205 (52-254) with six doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 15 walks with a .255 OBP, a .354 SLG and a .610 OPS.

AM I SEEING DOUBLE?: Francisco Lindor has recorded 25 doubles this  $season... That \, places \, him \, tied \, for \, second \, in \, the \, majors... Lindor \, has \, recorded \, 25$ or more doubles in three straight years...Since he entered the league in 2015, Lindor has collected 290 doubles...His 290 doubles are tied with Vic Power for the 17th-most by a Puerto Rican born player...Next up is Jose Valentin (302).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: In 44 games batting in the leadoff spot the this year, Francisco Lindor is hitting .288/.351/.511 with 33 runs, 17 doubles, eight home runs, 23 RBI, 13 walks, 10 steals with an .862 OPS...He ranks 13th in the majors and seventh in the NL with a 3.3 fWAR...Francisco Lindor has posted a 2.8 fWAR since May 1...That is third in the National League in that span, behind only Bryce Harper (3.2 fWAR) and Shohei Ohtani (3.2 fWAR)...It is seventh in the majors in that period...In 58 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .268/.324/.481 with 10 home runs and 32 RBI.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: RHP Brandon Sproat will represent the New York Mets at the 2024 All-Star Futures Game...Sproat, who was promoted to #98 on MLB Pipeline's Top 100 Prospects, has appeared in 13 games (12 starts) with the Cyclones and Rumble Ponies this season...He is a combined 6-1 with a 1.71 ERA (14 ER/73.2 IP) with 28 walks and 85 strikeouts...In eight starts at Double-A this year, Sproat is 4-0 with a 2.05 ERA (11 ER/48.1 IP) with 12 walks and 52 strikeouts...The right-handed pitcher was selected in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida...The Futures Game will be played on Sunday, July 14 in Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas.

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: In his first career start with the Mets, April 1 vs. Detroit, Manaea did not allow a hit through his first 5.2 innings...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their team debut and the secondlongest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their first career start with team...Tracy Stallard threw 6.0 no-hit in his first career start with the Mets on June 2, 1963 vs. Pittsburgh after making 13 relief appearances to begin his career with New York...He joined Kenny Rogers (7/28/99) as the only Mets pitcher to allow one hit and throw 6.0 or more innings in their team debut...He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied Johan Santana (3/31/08) for the most punch outs by a Mets lefthanded pitcher in their team debut and were tied for the seventh-most by any Mets pitcher int their team debut...Credit Elias.

WRITING A CHECK FOR 10K: On June 1 vs. Arizona, Manaea recorded 10 strikeouts...It was his eighth career game with double-digit strikeouts and his first since May 14, 2022 at Atlanta when he was a member of the Padres...It was the first double-digit strikeout performance by a Mets pitcher this season and the first since Jose Quintana's 10-strikeout performance on September 23, 2023 at Philadelphia.

SUCCESSFUL SEAN: In his first two starts as a Met, Manaea allowed one run over 11.0 innings...He joined Harry Parker, Masato Yoshii, Dillon Gee and Chris Bassitt as the only starters in franchise history to allow one or zero runs through their first two career starts with the Mets...Manaea allowed only four hits in his first two start with the club, tied with Rick Reed, Bruce Chen and Kazuhisa Ishii for the fewest hits allowed by a Met in their first two games with the club (Min. 10.0 IP)...His 14 strikeouts are tied with Bassitt, Steven Matz and Kodai Senga for the fifth-most in franchise history by a pitcher through in their first two games with the club...Only Pedro Martínez (21), Aaron Harang (18), Matt Harvey (18) and Pedro Astacio (16) had more strikeouts through their first two games as a Met.

HOMER HAPPY: Over his last eight starts, Manaea has allowed six home runs over 42.0 innings...In his first eight starts of the season, the southpaw allowed one homer over 41.1 innings...His 0.22 HR/9 rate during his first eight starts of the season, was the sixth-lowest rate in the majors during that span (Min. 40.0 IP).

SWEEPIN SAMOAN: At the end of May 2023, Manaea introduced a sweeper to his arsenal...Last season, the pitch generated a 35.1 percent whiff rate and kept batters to a .140 average and .163 slugging percentage...The southpaw allowed just six hits (five singles and a double) in 49 plate appearances ending with the offering...Through his first 16 starts of the 2024 season, opposing batters are  $8\mbox{-}49$  with 26 strikeouts in at-bats ending with the pitch...His  $48.1\,\mbox{K}\%$  with the pitch is tied the fifth-highest mark with teammate Danny Young, while his 45.2 whiff% is fifth-best mark in the majors this season (Min. 25 Plate Appearances).

SINK OR SWIM: This season, Manaea has held batters to a .217 (28-129) average on his sinker...Manaea has thrown the pitch 40.0% of the time, the highest usage  $\,$ rate of any of his six pitches in his arsenal...The southpaw has a run value of 11 with his sinker, tied for the best mark in the majors and his 28 strikeouts via the sinker are tied for 11th most in the majors.

NO HITS FOR YOU: On April 20, 2018, Manaea threw a no-hiitter against the Red Sox in Oakland...The southpaw walked two and struck out 10...It was the 12th no-hitter in Athletics history and the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Oakland...According to *Elias*, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in major league history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season.

Scott is the first Mets pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings in their debut since Steven Matz did so on June 28, 2015 vs. Cincinnati.
