### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 23, 2000:** In a 10-7 Yankees win at Toronto, Jorge Posada and Bernie Williams became the first pair of teammates in Major League history to each hit home runs from both sides of the plate in the same game.

**April 23, 1903:** The Highlanders record the first win in franchise history, a 7-2 victory at Washington-AL. Harry Howell is the winning pitcher.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**April 24, 1960:** The Yankees score eight runs before making their first out of the game during a 15-9 win over Baltimore at Yankee Stadium. The inning is highlighted by a three-run homer from Elston Howard and a solo home run by Tony Kubek.

**April 24, 1923:** The Yankees record the first shutout in Original Yankee Stadium history, a 4-0 win over the Washington Senators. Sad Sam Jones tosses a shutout (9.0IP, 5H, 1BB, 4K) and Babe Ruth goes 3-for-3 with 1HR, 3RBI and 1BB.

**April 24, 1917:** Yankees left-hander George Mogridge pitches the first no-hitter in franchise history in a 2-1 victory at Boston (3BB, 3K). It will mark the last time the Yankees have a lefty throw a no-hitter until Dave Righetti turns the trick on 7/4/83 vs. Boston.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their nine-game road trip tonight with the final game of a three-game series at Boston (2-0 thus far)...will also face the Astros (Fri.-Sun.) and Rangers (4/27-29) in three-game sets.

- **At 15-9 (.625), have the best record in the American League.**
- **Have won a season-high five straight games (since 4/17), their longest single-season winning streak since their eight-game winning streak from 9/20-28/25...have won six of their last seven games (since 4/15) and seven of their last nine games (since 4/13).**
- Including their current series, have won or split six of their eight series this season (5-2-1)...including their current series, have won three of their four road series this year.
- The Yankees' +35 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the fourth-best in the Majors.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees won their season-high fifth straight game with a 4-1 victory against the Red Sox on Wednesday at Fenway Park...**LHP Max Fried** (8.0IP, 3H, OR, 2BB, 9K) started and earned his third win of the season...**3B Amed Rosario** (1-for-1, 1R, 1HR, 4RBI, 1SF) drove in all four of the Yankees' runs, hitting his fourth HR of the year with a three-run shot in the first inning and a sac fly in the third inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-2, 2R, 2BB, 1SB) reached base three times...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 1R, 2 doubles) recorded his second straight multi-hit game and ninth of the season.

**LAND OF THE FRIED:** **LHP Max Fried** earned his third win of the season on Wednesday at Boston after tossing 8.0 scoreless innings (3H, 2BB, 9K)...retired his final 14BF...marked his longest scoreless start as a Yankee and his longest since 9/27/24 vs. Kansas City with Atlanta (8.2IP)...marked the longest scoreless start by a Yankee since Carlos Rodón tossed 8.0 scoreless innings on 7/11/25 vs. Chicago-NL.

► In six starts this season, has gone 3-1 with a 2.40 ERA (41.1IP, 11ER)...has held opponents to a .155/.219/.218 (22-for-142) slash line this year...has not allowed a run in three of his 6GS.

**PITCH PERFECT:** **Yankees pitchers have allowed only 1R over their last three games (since 4/19)**...had their 26.0 scoreless inning streak snapped in the ninth inning on Wednesday at Boston...was their longest since a 26.0 scoreless inning streak from 5/22-25/24.

► **Have allowed 1ER-or-fewer in four of their last five games (since 4/17), posting a 1.20 ERA (45.0IP, 6ER) over that stretch.**

► **Dating back to 2025 ALWCS Game 3, the Yankees have allowed only 1R over their last three games vs. the Red Sox.**

► **Yankees pitchers** lead the Majors in ERA (3.16), opponents' OPS (.624) and opponents' SLG (.336), rank second in WHIP (1.13), first in AL, BB/9.0IP (2.74, second in AL), K/BB (3.29, second in AL) and opponents' OBP (.288, first in AL), fourth in opponents' BA (.222, first in AL) and sixth in HR/9.0IP (0.76, third in AL).

**BRONX BOMBERS:** **Yankees batters** rank second in the Majors in PA/BB (.785, first in AL) and stolen bases (28, first in AL), tied for second in stolen base percentage (87.5%, tied for first in AL), third in walks (115, second in AL), fourth in home runs (34, second in AL) and pitches per PA (4.02, third in AL), sixth in XBH (74, second in AL) and OPS (.732, second in AL), seventh in SLG (.409, second in AL) and 10th in runs scored (118, fourth in AL).

► Have hit 20HR over their last nine games (since 4/13) after hitting only 14HR over their first 15 games from 3/25-4/12.

**HIP HIP JOSÉ:** **INF/OF José Caballero** is batting .325/.357/.475 (13-for-40) with 6R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 7RBI, 2BB and 4SB over his last 11 games (since 4/11).

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** **Yankees batters** scored 3R in the first inning on Wednesday at Boston...their 22R in the first inning this season are the most in the AL and the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Washington (29R)...their 7HR in the first inning are tied with Los Angeles-AL and Seattle for the most in the Majors.

- The Yankees are 7-4 this season when scoring in the first inning.
- **The Yankees are 13-3 this season when scoring first.**
- Have scored in the first inning in 11 of their games this season, tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Washington (12).

**FOUR SCORE:** **Yankees batters** have scored at least 4R in each of their last seven games (since 4/15) and 10 of their last 11G (since 4/11)...the Yankees are 13-4 this season when scoring at least 4R.

**GET THE BROOMS OUT:** The Yankees will look to complete their second straight series sweep and third of the season tonight (also 3G at San Francisco from 3/25-28 and 3G vs. Kansas City from 4/17-19)...would mark their first sweep of the Red Sox since a four-game sweep from 9/22-25/22 at Yankee Stadium...would mark their first sweep at Fenway Park since a two-game sweep from 9/13-14/22 and their first of at least three games at Fenway Park since 9/24-26/21 (3G).

**SCHLITT'S CREEK:** **RHP Cam Schlichter** will make his sixth start of the season tonight at Fenway Park...**in five starts this season, has gone 2-1 with a 1.95 ERA (27.2IP, 6ER) and 36K...has not allowed an ER in three of his five starts**...has held opponents to a .178/.202/.238 (18-for-101) slash line...has allowed only 3BB and has not surrendered a HR to 105BF.

- Will be making his first career *regular season* start vs. Boston...made his postseason debut in 2025 ALWCS Game 3 vs. Boston and earned the win after recording 12K over 8.0 scoreless innings...**became the first pitcher in Major League history to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings and record at least 12K without allowing a walk in a postseason game...his 12K were the most by a Yankees rookie in a postseason game** (previous: Dave Righetti - 10K in 1981 ALDS Game 2 at Milwaukee)...**was the fourth rookie in Major League history to record at least 12K in a postseason game**, joining Florida's Liván Hernández (15K in 1997 NLCS Game 5 vs. Atlanta), Baltimore's Mike Boddicker (14K in 1983 ALCS Game 2 vs. Chicago-AL) and Pittsburgh's John Candelaria (14K in 1975 NLCS Game 3 vs. Cincinnati)...**became only the fourth pitcher in franchise history to record at least 12K in a postseason game**, joining Roger Clemens (15K in 2000 ALCS Game 4 at Seattle), Gerrit Cole (13K in 2020 ALWCS Game 1 at Cleveland) and Orlando Hernández (12K in 2000 World Series Game 3 at the Mets).
- **Over his last 13 Major League starts (since 8/20/25), has gone 5-2 with a 2.15 ERA (71.0IP, 45H, 18R/17ER, 20BB, 90K, 2HR)**...the Yankees are 11-2 in those starts.

**STANTON ISLAND:** **DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton** recorded his second straight multi-hit game and ninth of the season on Wednesday at Boston...**each of his last 5H (since 4/16) and six of his last 7H (since 4/13) have gone for extra bases** (4 doubles, 2HR).

► **In 41 career games at Fenway Park, has hit .321/.389/.558 (50-for-156) with 23R, 11 doubles, 1 triple, 8HR, 27RBI, 16BB, 2HP, 1SF and 2SB.**

► Has hit .340/.407/.574 (16-for-47) with 8R, 5 doubles, 2HR, 6RBI, 6BB and 1SF over his last 14G against the Red Sox (since 6/14/24).

**SUPER ROSARIO:** **INF/OF Amed Rosario** drove in all four of the Yankees' runs on Wednesday at Boston, hitting his fourth HR of the year with a three-run shot in the first inning and a sac fly in the third inning...his 4RBI on Wednesday matched his season high (also 4/7 vs. the Athletics) and his second-most in a single game, trailing only his career-high 5RBI on 8/31/21 at Kansas City with Cleveland.

- **Has hit .417/.438/1.167 (5-for-12) with 3HR, 11RBI, 2BB and 2SF with RISP this season.**
- Has hit 2HR and recorded 7RBI over his last four games (since 4/18).
- Has hit .283/.333/.609 (13-for-46) with 6R, 1 double, 1 triple, 4HR, 12RBI, 4BB and 1SF over his last 15 games (since 4/1).

**FOR STARTERS:** **Yankees starters have posted a 2.67 ERA (138.0IP, 41ER) and 144K in 24 starts this season...have not allowed a run in their last 21.2 innings (since 4/19)...have not allowed an ER in four of their last five starts (since 4/17), posting a 0.52 ERA (34.2IP, 2ER) and 36K over that span.**

► Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 21 of their 24 starts, matching their third-most through their first 24 games of a season since ER became an official stat in 1913, trailing only their 23 starts in 2022 and 22 starts in 1919 (also had 21 in 1972 and 2024).

► **Lead the Majors in ERA (2.67), opponents' BA (.197), opponents' OBP (.256), opponents' OPS (.568), WHIP (0.97) and K/BB (4.11)**, second in strikeouts (144, second in AL), BB/9.0IP (2.28, second in AL) and opponents' SLG (.312, first in AL), third in strikeout rate (26.3%, third in AL) and sixth in K/9.0IP (9.39, fourth in AL) and HR/9.0IP (0.78, fourth in AL).

**ALL RISE:** **OF Aaron Judge** reached base three times for his second straight game on Wednesday at Boston...has reached base in 17 of his last 18 games (since 4/3), batting .286/.423/.667 (18-for-63) with 19R, 3 doubles, 7HR, 13RBI, 14BB, 1HP and 5SB over that span.

- **Is tied for third in the Majors with 9HR this year, trailing only Yordan Alvarez (11HR) and Munetaka Murakami (10HR).**
- Has batted .314/.446/.676 (33-for-105) with 29R, 5 doubles, 11HR, 27RBI, 25BB/21BB and 4SB over his last 29 games vs. the Red Sox (since 9/14/23-G2)...over his last 15 games at Fenway Park (since 9/14/23-G2), has batted .346/.514/.788 (18-for-52) with 18R, 2 doubles, 7HR, 16RBI, 18BB/21BB and 1SB.

**ON A ROLL:** **OF Randal Grichuk** has hit .385/.357/.615 (5-for-13) with 2R, 3 doubles, 2RBI and 1SF over his last 5G (since 4/14).

**RICE RICE BABY:** **C/INF Ben Rice** has hit .314/.456/.743 (22-for-70) with 21R, 6 doubles, 8HR, 18RBI, 18BB/11BB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB in 23 games this season...has reached base safely in 17 of 19 starts.

► **Ranks second in the Majors in OBP (.456, second in AL), SLG (.743, second in AL) and OPS (1.198, second in AL)**, is tied for fourth in XBH (14, tied for second in AL) and runs scored (21, tied for second in AL), fifth in PA/BB (5.00, fourth in AL), tied for fifth in HR (eight, tied for fourth in AL) and ninth in pitches per PA (4.38, sixth in AL).

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CAM SCHLITTLER (2-1, 1.95 ERA)

**RHP Cam Schlittler** will make his sixth start of the season in tonight's series finale at Boston...the 25-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...made his fifth start of the season on Friday vs. Kansas City and did not record a decision despite allowing 1R/OER in 6.0IP (3H, 2BB, 6K, 0HR)...is 2-1 with a 1.95 ERA (27.2IP, 18H, 7R/6ER, 3BB, 36K, 0HR) in five starts this season...has not allowed a home run to 105BF...made his first career Opening Day roster...**over his last 13 Major League starts (since 8/20/25), has gone 5-2 with a 2.15 ERA (71.0IP, 45H, 18R/17ER, 20BB, 90K, 2HR)**...saw his first Major League action in 2025 with the Yankees, going 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (73.0IP, 58H, 24R/ER, 31BB, 84K, 8HR) in 14 starts...in 19 career Major League starts, has gone 6-4 with a 2.68 ERA (100.2IP, 76H, 31R/30ER, 34BB, 120K, 8HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17-of-19 career starts, 2R-or-fewer in 13 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 10 starts...**his 120K through his first 19 career games are the fourth-most in franchise history**, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (139K), Luis Gil (128K) and Orlando Hernández (125K)...**his 31R allowed are the second-fewest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 19 career starts** (not including openers), trailing only Luis Gil (30R in first 19GS)...the Weymouth, Mass., native was selected by the Yankees in the seventh round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University (Mass.).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Made his fifth start of the season on Friday vs. Kansas City and did not record a decision despite allowing 1R/OER in 6.0IP (3H, 2BB, 6K, 0HR)...retired 19 of his 24BF, including 14 of his first 15BF (1H).

**2026:** In five starts this season, has gone 2-1 with a 1.95 ERA (27.2IP, 18H, 7R/6ER, 3BB, 36K, 0HR)...has held opponents to a .178/.202/.238 (18-for-101) slash line...has allowed only 3BB to 105BF.

- ✦ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in all five starts, including 1R-or-fewer in three starts (including two scoreless starts)...has not allowed an ER in three of his starts.
- ✦ Has recorded at least 7K in four of his starts, including 8K in two starts.
- ✦ **Has not allowed a home run this season...his 27.2IP are tied for the third-most by a pitcher this season to not allow a home run**, trailing only Seattle's Bryan Woo (32.0IP) and Kansas City's Seth Lugo (31.1IP).
- ✦ Among Major League pitchers this season, ranks first in BB/9.0IP ratio (0.98), second in opponents' OBP (.202, first in AL), fourth in strikeout rate (34.3%, third in AL), WHIP (0.76, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.440, third in AL), sixth in K/9.0IP (11.71, fourth in AL), seventh in opponents' SLG (.238, fourth in AL), tied for seventh in strikeouts (36, tied for fourth in AL), and 10th in ERA (1.95, fifth in AL) and opponents' BA (.178, fourth in AL).
- ✦ **Was only the seventh Yankees starting pitcher in franchise history to not allow a walk in each of his first three appearances of a season**, joining Mike Mussina (first four starts in 2001), Tiny Bonham (first four starts in 1944), Randy Johnson (first three starts in 2006), Jon Lieber (first three starts in 2004), David Wells (first three starts in 2003) and Ed Figueroa (first three starts in 1978).
- ✦ Opened the season with a 13.2 scoreless inning streak from 3/27-4/7...was the second-longest scoreless streak by a Yankees starter to begin the season in the last 15 years (since 2012), trailing only Luis Gil's 18.2 scoreless inning streak in 2021.
- ✦ Did not allow a run in 11.2 innings over his first two starts of the season from 3/27-4/1 (3H, 0BB, 15K)...**was the first pitcher in franchise history to not allow a run or a walk and record at least 15K over a two-game span**.
- ✦ Made his season debut on 3/27 at San Francisco, earning the win after allowing just 1H over 5.1 scoreless innings (0BB, 8K)...allowed his only hit on a second inning double to Heliot Ramos before retiring his next 11BF...became the first pitcher in franchise history to record at least 8K and allow 1H-or-fewer in their first game of the season.
- ✦ Made his second start of the season on 4/1 at Seattle, earning the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 0BB, 7K)...after allowing a second-inning single to Luke Raley, retired his final 15 batters faced.
- ✦ Made his third start of the season on 4/7 vs. the Athletics, allowing 3R/ER over 5.0IP without recording a decision (5H, 0BB, 7K, 0HR).
- ✦ Made his fourth start of the season on 4/12 at Tampa Bay, recording the loss after allowing 3R/ER over 5.0IP (7H, 1BB, 8K, 0HR)...walked his first batter of the season (Yandy Diaz in the third inning)...**had not allowed a walk to his first 70 batters faced this season...according to Elias, was only the fourth Yankees pitcher in the last 21 years (since 2006) to not allow a walk to at least their first 70 batters faced in a season, joining Randy Johnson (first 86BF in 2006), Mariano Rivera (first 74BF in 2008) and Preston Claiborne (first 71BF in 2013)**...was the first Yankees pitcher to not allow a walk to at least 70 consecutive batters faced at any point during a single season since Carlos Rodón in 2024 (90BF between 4/27-5/19/24)...**dating back to his start last season on 9/27/25 vs. Baltimore, had not allowed a walk to 93 consecutive batters faced...was the first Yankees pitcher to not allow a walk to at least 93 consecutive batters faced since Jameson Taillon in 2022 (103BF between 8/8-9/5/22)**.

**ON A ROLL:** Since making his Major League debut on 7/9/25, ranks sixth among Major League pitchers (min. 75.0IP) in opponents' SLG (.310, second in AL), seventh in K/9.0IP (10.73, third in AL), eighth in strikeout rate (29.3%, fourth in AL), ninth in ERA (2.68, fifth in AL), 10th in opponents' OPS (.592, sixth in AL) and tied for 10th in strikeouts (120, tied for sixth in AL)...also ranks eighth among AL pitchers in opponents' BA (.207) over that stretch.

- ✦ Has recorded at least 6K in 15 starts since making his Major League debut, the most in the AL and tied for the third-most starts in the Majors over that stretch.
- ✦ **Over his last 13 Major League starts (since 8/20/25), has gone 5-2 with a 2.15 ERA (71.0IP, 45H, 18R/17ER, 20BB, 90K, 2HR)**...the Yankees are 11-2 in those starts...has tossed at least 6.0 innings in seven of those starts.

**ROAD TRIP:** Has gone 2-1 with a 1.62 ERA (16.2IP, 10H, 3R/ER, 1BB, 23K, 0HR) in three starts on the road this season.

- ✦ Did not allow a run through his first 13.2 innings to begin the season on the road.
- ✦ Made six road starts in 2025, going 0-1 with a 2.76 ERA (32.2IP, 22H, 10R/ER, 14BB, 37K, 4HR)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in five of his six starts, including 1R-or-fewer in three of those starts...recorded at least 6K in five of his six starts last season...the Yankees went 5-1 in his six road starts in 2025.

**VS.
