THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY
SEPT. 23

1986 - In a 4-0 win over the Dodgers in the Dome, **LHP Jim Deshaies** strikes out the first 8 batters that he faces to set a MLB record. The string of punchouts ends when Dodgers manager Tommy Lasorda pinch-hits for his starting pitcher Dennis Powell with Larry See, who pops up to end the top of the 3rd inning. Deshaies ends up with a 2-hit, shutout, tallying 10 K's overall.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Houston Astros will continue their final road trip of the regular season with the second game of two-game series against the Seattle Mariners...**RHP Ethan Pecko** (1-0) will be on the mound for the Astros, opposite **RHP George Kirby** (9-11).

TONIGHT'S BROADCASTS: Tonight's game will be televised by ESPN with **Mike Ferrin** and **Eduardo Perez** on the call...the Astros English radio broadcast can be heard on SportsTalk 790 with **Robert Ford** and **Steve Sparks** behind the mic... **Francisco Romero** and **Alex Treviño** will call the Astros Spanish broadcast on TUDN 102.9 FM.

THE POSTSEASON CHASE: The Astros and Rangers are locked in a tight race down the stretch for the AL West with the two teams having the same record with five games left to play... the Astros own the tiebreaker over the Rangers with a season series victory (9-4 record).

NEXT GAME

VS. THE M'S: This is the final series between the Astros and Mariners this season, with the two clubs last seeing each other from Aug. 14-16 at Daikin Park...the Astros have gone 3-9 vs. Seattle this season...the Astros also own an overall regular season record of 135-106 against the Mariners, including a 65-48 record at T-Mobile Park.

ROAD WARRIORS: Tonight is the second game of a six-game road trip for the Astros...since going 1-9 on the first road trip of the 2026 season, the Astros have gone 38-28 (.576) on the road since April 14, which ranks third in the AL in that span.

LAST NIGHT'S GAME: The Astros shutout the Mariners, 7-0 at T-Mobile Park last night...**RHP Cristian Javier** made the start for the Astros and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings before leaving due to an injury...**1B Christian Walker** (1x5, HR, 3 RBI), **DH Yordan Alvarez** (2x4, HR, 3 RBI) and **3B Isaac Paredes** (2x4, HR, RBI) each homered for the Astros leading the way offensively...the Astros bullpen combined to toss 7.0 scoreless innings with seven strikeouts.

GOIN' DEEP: The Astros have hit 212 homers as a team this year and have hit 200-plus homers in a single season for the 10th time in franchise history (last, 222 HR in 2023)...the Astros rank second in the AL in home runs this season behind only the Yankees (217).

TWO-OUT MAGIC: The Astros lead the American League in two-out runs with 308 on the season, trailing only the Cubs (329) in the Majors...**3B Isaac Paredes** leads this effort, as he holds the Major League lead with 45 two-out RBI, directly ahead of **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** (44 RBI).

NO. 200: **1B Christian Walker** recorded his 200th home run of his career last night with a three-run home run in the third inning...became the 34th active player in the Majors to record 200 career HRs.

TODAY'S ROSTER MOVES: The Astros have placed **RHP Cristian Javier** on the 15-day IL (right groin strain)...to take his place on the active roster, the Astros have selected **LHP Josh Hendrickson** (#61) from Triple A Sugar Land... to make room for Hendrickson on the 40-man roster, Houston recalled **OF Jake Meyers** (left knee fracture) and placed him on the 60-day IL.

THE CASE FOR THE MVP: **DH Yordan Alvarez** is a solid candidate for the AL MVP Award...Alvarez leads the American League in OPS (1.033), slugging percentage (.601), OBP (.431), batting average (.314), total bases (329), walks (106), IBB (33), wRC+ (180), OPS+ (.190) and extra-base hits (74)...he also ranks tied for first in home runs (41), second in RBI (102), third in hits (172), fifth in runs (99), and tied for fourth in doubles (32).

TRIPLE THREAT: **DH Yordan Alvarez** currently ranks first or second in the AL in all three **Triple Crown** categories...he enters tonight leading the AL in batting avg. (.314), while ranking tied for first in HR (41) and second in RBI (102)...since **Carl Yastrzemski** won the AL Triple Crown in 1967, there has been just one Triple Crown winner in the Majors, **Miguel Cabrera** in 2012 (AL):

THE FIREMAN: **LHP Josh Hader** has converted 26 consecutive save chances to open his season, which is the Astros record...should Hader finish the season without a blown save, he would become the seventh pitcher in MLB history to post 26-plus saves without a blown save...the last Major Leaguer to do so was **RHP Ken Giles** in 2018 (26 SV).

RACKING UP K'S: **RHP Bryan Abreu** has posted 527 career strikeouts, which ranks fourth among relievers in Astros history...he's closing in on third-place **RHP Dave Smith** (529), needing only two strikeouts to match the Astros reliever from the 1980s...**LHP Billy Wagner** (694) and **RHP Brad Lidge** (557) sit atop that all-time list.

STRONG SEPTEMBERS: **3B Isaac Paredes** has a 1.004 OPS this month to go along with a team-leading 18 RBI, which ranks tied for second in the AL...**C Yainer Diaz** is also having a strong September, as he's hitting .361 (22x61) with three homers, seven RBI and a .948 OPS in 18 games (15 starts) this month.

STARTING STRONG: In the Astros 19 games in September, their starters have combined for a 2.83 ERA (28ER/89IP), which is the third-lowest ERA in the American League for the month behind only the Yankees (2.61 ERA) and Rays (2.73 ERA).

POSTSEASON CREDENTIALS: All media who wish to cover potential Astros postseason home games in the Wild Card Series and ALDS must apply for credentials on MLB's credentialing system...the events are now open with a deadline set for Sunday, Sept. 27...ALCS and World Series credential applications are also live online.

LAST APPEARANCE, SEPT. 17 vs. KC: Worked as the bulk reliever behind opener **RHP Miguel Ullola** in the 6-2 win over the Royals last Thursday...worked 5.2 innings and allowed 1 run on 3 hits with 4 strikeouts without issuing a walk, logging the 1st hold of his career.

ABOUT PECKO: The rookie Pecko has made 4 Major League starts and 2 relief apps. as a bulk reliever since being selected to the Major League roster on Aug. 19...the Astros' 2024 Minor League Pitcher of the Year, Pecko is currently ranked as the Astros No. 3 pitching prospect and the No. 9 overall prospect in the Astros system by MLB.com.

LET'S GET STARTED: Is set to make his 1st start since Aug. 30 at NYM, when he allowed 3 runs (2 ER) on 3 hits with 2 walks and 4 strikeouts through 5.0 innings to pick up the 1st win of his MLB career.

THE BULK GUY: Has posted a 1.59 ERA (2ER/11.1IP), .111 opponent batting average (4x36) and 0.53 WHIP while working as the bulk reliever behind an opener in his last 2 apps. (Sept. 11 at TB; Sept. 17 vs. KC)...worked exactly 5.2 innings in each outing, becoming the 4th reliever in Astros history to log consecutive outings of 5.2+ innings and the 1st since **LHP Jim Crawford** (1975).

ROOKIE LEADERBOARD: Since making his MLB debut on Aug. 19, his .196 opponent batting average ranks 1st among AL rookies and 3rd among all MLB rookies (min. 25 IP).

LET THAT SINK IN: Has held opponents to a .143 batting average (4x28) vs. his sinker, which he's thrown at a 21.8% rate, the 2nd-highest among all his pitches...has induced a 44.2% chase rate with his sinker, with his sweeper (32.3%) inducing the next-best chase rate among all his pitches.

HIS DEBUT: Made his MLB debut on Aug. 19 vs. LAA, allowed 2 runs on 3 hits with 3 walks and 4 strikeouts through 3.2 innings of work vs. the Angels at Daikin Park...recorded his 1st career strikeout against **IF Vaughn Grissom** in the 2nd inning...was scoreless through his first 3.0 innings of the night before allowing a 2-run double to **IF Denzer Guzman** with 1 out in the 4th inning.

2026 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: In minor league action this season, has made 20 appearances, including 18 starts between the FCL Astros (3g) and Triple A Sugar Land (17g)...combined to record a 4.57 ERA (42ER/82.2IP) with 86 strikeouts, a 1.33 WHIP and a .259 opponent batting average.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Named the Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Month for June...for the month he recorded a 2.48 ERA (8ER/29IP) with 29 strikeouts, 6 walks, a 0.93 WHIP and a .206 opponent batting average...tied for the PCL lead in innings for the month and led all qualified pitchers in ERA, WHIP and opponent batting average...has also earned a few other accolades in his minor league career including, All-Spring Breakout Second Team in 2025 and the Carolina League Pitcher of the Month in May of 2024.

PECKO'S CAREER: Has pitched in parts of 4 minor league seasons in the Astros organization (2023-26), recording a 4.08 ERA (124ER/273.2IP) with 323 strikeouts, a 1.28 WHIP and a .241 opponent batting average in 72 minor league appearances, including 55 starts...was named the Astros 2024 Minor League Pitcher of the Year...for the 2024 season, he went 4-6 with a 3.47 ERA (37ER/96IP) in 26 appearances, including 15 starts between Low A Fayetteville, High A Asheville and Double A Corpus Christi...he also recorded 125 strikeouts, a 1.21 WHIP and a .219 opponent batting average.

COLLEGE: In 2023 at Towson, he went 2-2 with a 3.21 ERA and 48 strikeouts across 42.0 innings as the Saturday starter...transferred to Towson in 2022 after redshirting his freshman year at La Salle University due to undergoing Tommy John Surgery...was forced to transfer after La Salle discontinued their baseball program.

LAST APPEARANCE (9/19 vs. ATL): Surrendered a go-ahead grand slam to Ronald Acuña Jr. and was handed his 2nd blown save of the season in Saturday's loss to ATL...allowed 1 run on 2 hits through 0.2 of an inning, also allowing all 3 of his inherited runners to score.

TURNING THE PAGE: Since May 3, he has gone 6-2-7 with a 2.29 ERA (13ER/51IP)...also has recorded 63 strikeouts, a 1.10 WHIP and a .178 opponent average during the stretch...prior to May 3, Abreu had a 12.54 ERA in his first 11 apps. of the season...among AL relievers since May 3 (min. 50 IP), he ranks 5th in SO/9 (11.12) and 6th in opponent batting average.

ASTROS RANKINGS: Enters today with 527 career strikeouts and is 2 strikeouts from matching RHP Dave Smith (529) for the 3rd-most by a reliever in Astros history.

SAVANT SAYS: Ranks in the 97th percentile in whiff perc. (34.5%), 93rd percentile in K rate (30.5%) and 92nd percentile in xBA (.197) per Baseball Savant.

A CUT ABOVE: Began throwing a cutter this season in his outing on June 2 vs. PIT and has tossed the pitch at a 10.8 percent rate on the season...has held opponents to a .200 batting average (4x20) vs. his cutter this year.
