RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals, who have opened their 131st season of play in the National League, began the day in 1st place in the NL Central, 1/2-game ahead of the Brewers...the Cardinals went 3-1 on their season-opening homestand and 2-2 in last weekend's series at Milwaukee...the Cardinals continue their 11-day, 10-game roadtrip (2-2 at MIL, 2-0 at MIA, 3-CIN) tonight with the series finale here in Miami. **20 FOR 20:** After spending an off-day in Miami on Monday, the Cardinals began a stretch of 20 games in 20 consecutive days Tue. night - their longest stretch (April 19-May 8) without a day off this season.

REELING IN A BIG ONE: St. Louis swept their season series against the Marlins in 2021 for the first time in franchise history...the last time the Cardinals swept a season series against an opponent of six games or more was 2015 when they were 7-0 against the Arizona Diamondbacks...their best season series sweep against any opponent was a 9-0 mark against San Diego in 2000. **DEEP SEA FISHING:** A win tonight would give the Cardinals a franchise record 9th straight win over the Marlins...St. Louis has won 12 of its last 14 games played at loan-Depot Park.

FISH FRY: The Cardinals' all-time .609 winning percentage (126-81) against the Marlins (1993-present) is their 2nd-best against any National League opponent (since 1901) behind only the Arizona Diamondbacks (.616, 98-61).

THE ONE'S THAT GOT AWAY: Albert Pujols has homered in all but three of the 43 ballparks he has played in during his career with loanDepot Park, TD Ballpark and Veteran's Stadium being the only ones that have held him in. Albert ranks T7th all-time in ballparks homered in, one back of Ellis Burks (41). Sammy Sosa homered in a record 45 ballparks (Elias).

TOP TENS: The Cardinals 7-3 start to the season is their best opening 10-game mark since 2015 (also 7-3)...their best 10-game starts were 8-2 in both 1981 & 1946. **WINNING WAYS:** Dating back to their record 17-game winning streak last September, the Cardinals have posted a 26-6 mark (.813) over their past 32 games (Sept. 11, 2021-present), their best 32-game stretch since 2004 (July 4-August 11) when they also went 26-6.

GAME CHANGER: Nolan Arenado's two-run 9th inning HR last night was the team's first last at-bat HR in a 0-0 road game since Tom Pagnozzi did so in the 9th inning of a 1-0 win vs. San Diego on 7/8/92 (Orf)...it was the 2nd career 9th inning tie-breaking homer for Nolan (also 4/6/17 at MIL).

BEST PEN: The Cardinals relievers have worked 7-1/3 scoreless innings this series. They lead the majors with their 1.76 ERA to go along with a 1.07 WHIP and .186 opponent batting average.

YADI 150: Last night's 2-0 win was the 150th career shutout win caught by Yadier Molina, passing Gary Carter (149) for 2nd all-time (see chart at left).

WINNING HITS: Paul DeJong collected his MLB-leading 3rd GWRBI Tue. night with his 2nd inning double that scored Albert Pujols. Paul had a single-season best 7 GWRBI in both 2018 and 2019.

CLOSING IN ON COLLINS: Albert Pujols collected his 3,307th and 3,308th career hits Tue. night, pulling to within 5 hits of tying Eddie Collins (3,313) for 10th on MLB's all-time hit list.

TOMMY'S RUN: Tommy Edman has hit safely in each of the team's first 10 games...the switch-hitting Edman's hit streak stretches to 12-games dating back to 2021, matching his career-best 12-game hit streak from April 4-17, 2021.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH: Albert Pujols hit career HR #680 on April 12, his first regular season homer in a Cardinals uniform in 3,855 days dating to Sept. 22, 2011...with that homer, he joined Ted Williams (Red Sox), Stan Musial (Cardinals), Carl Yastrzemski (Red Sox) and Willie McCovey (Giants) as the only players to homer at age 21 or younger and age 42 or older for the same franchise.

MOLINA MILESTONES: Yadier Molina is two RBI shy of 1,000 for his career and he currently trails Cardinals Hall of Famer Ken Boyer, who ranks 6th in franchise history with 1,001 RBI...Yadi will tie Hall of Famer Ted Simmons (172) for 9th on the Cardinals all-time home run list with his next round-tripper.

MIAMI CONNECTIONS

Yadier Molina (and Carlos Martinez) represented St. Louis in the 2017 MLB All-Star Game at Marlins Park...Molina became the 7th Cardinal (14th time) to homer in an All-Star game.

Corey Dickerson played in 63 games for Miami last season before being traded with Adam Cimber, and cash to Toronto for Andrew McInvalle and Joe Panik (June 29, 2021).

Adam Wainwright made his national TV broadcasting debut during the 2020 NLDS between the Marlins and Braves on Fox Sports 1 with Adam Amin and A.J. Pierzynski.

Marlins Quality Control Coach Eric Duncan played for the Springfield Cardinals (AA) in 2011 that was managed that season by Ron "Pop" Warner.

Sandy Alcantara pitched in eight games for St. Louis in 2017...Originally signed with the Cardinals as an International free agent on July 2, 2013 (signed by Moises Rodriguez)...traded to Miami with Daniel Castano, Zac Gallen, and Magneuris Sierra for Marcell Ozuna (Dec. 14, 2017).

Father of Marlins Pitching Coach Mel Stottlemire Jr., Mel Stottlemire, previously served as a Cardinals pitching coach from 1996-98...Mel Jr.'s brother, Todd Stottlemire, pitched parts of three seasons with St. Louis (1996-98).

Nick Wittgren was originally selected by the Marlins in the 9th round of the 2012 MLB Draft...Pitched in 188 games over three seasons in Miami (2016-18) before being traded to Cleveland for Jordan Milbrath (Feb. 4, 2019).

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TONIGHT'S GAME

- Making his first career start in the majors tonight, and his third appearance of 2022.
- Threw 2.0 innings in his most recent outing at MIL (4/17) coming on in relief. Struck out three and walked one. Fired 10 pitches over 100 MPH with a top velocity of 102.1 MPH in a strikeout of Omar Narvaez.
- Earned the win coming in relief of Dakota Hudson vs. KC (4/12) in his first appearance of the season. Threw two scoreless innings with a walk and two strikeouts in 27 pitches.
- The start is his first in professional baseball (aside from injury rehab assignments) since 2017 with Palm Beach (5) and Peoria (14), both at the A-level.
- Last start on an injury rehabilitation assignment was vs. Charlotte with Triple-A Memphis (10/3/21); last in the minor leagues vs. Clearwater with High-A Palm Beach (8/3/17; 5.0 IP, 4 H, 0 R) and last in a Major League setting was the final game of Spring Training is 2018 at Washington (3/25/18; 4.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R).
- Has made a total of 34 professional starts (including three injury rehab starts for Memphis (AAA) last season. Is 14-5 with a 3.13 ERA (57er/163.2ip), 132 K and 75 BB in those 34 starts.
- Made three Grapefruit League appearances this spring, all as a reliever.
- Is making his 15th career appearance against the Brewers, splitting his 14 previous appearances equally with 7 at Busch Stadium and 7 at Milwaukee.
- According to Baseball Savant, has thrown 10 of his 62 pitches (16.1%) over 100 MPH, topping out at 102.1 at MIL (4/17). Hunter Greene (CIN) leads MLB with 59 pitches each over 100 MPH.
- Has not allowed a home run in a regular season Major League game in 1,031 days, last surrendering a longball to Justin Upton vs. LAA (6/22/19).

LAST TIME OUT

- Appeared in relief at Milwaukee on Sunday and threw 2.0 scoreless innings with a season-high three strikeouts. Registered 10 pitches over 100 MPH in the game with a high of 102.1 on a 3-2 strikeout pitch to Omar Narvaez.

2021 SEASON

- Made his first appearances since undergoing Tommy John ligament replacement surgery on his right elbow, June 2019.
- Had an injury-shortened season, beginning the year on the Opening Day roster and appearing in 10 games.
- Hicks (one pitch) and Aroldis Chapman (2 pitches) each topped out at 103 MPH in 2021, fastest in the Majors.
- Threw 52 of 207 total pitches (25.1%) over 100 mph, 20 over 101 mph, four over 102 mph, and one at 103 mph.
- Averaged 99.2 MPH on his sinker, 4th-fastest average sinker speed in MLB behind Aroldis Chapman (100.7), Brusdar Graterol (100.0), and José Alvarado (99.4).
- Involved in the longest at-bat in terms of number of pitches (22) in Major League History during Spring Training at the Mets in Port St. Lucie (3/14).
- Marking his first game appearance since 2019 Tommy John Surgery and only batter faced in the game that dodged the three-batter rule minimum, threw 22 pitches to short-stop Luis Guillorme that ultimately ended in a walk. Guillorme fouled off 16 pitches, including nine in a row with a full count.
- Exited 5/1 appearance at Pittsburgh in the 7th inning due to injury. Placed on the 10-day injured list with right elbow inflammation (5/4). Transferred to the 60-day IL (5/14).
- Split a 30-day injury rehab assignment between Memphis (AAA) and the Glendale Desert Dogs in the Arizona Fall League (9/25-10/25).
- Started three games with the Redbirds during the final week of the minor league season, logging pitch counts of 18, 12, and 31.

CAREER NOTES:

- Jordan, who is a Type 1 diabetic, has missed the majority of the last three seasons (2019-21). Missed time in 2019 and 2021 due to injury and opted out of the 2020 season in accordance with Major League Baseball COVID-19 protocols.
- Has made 12 appearances of 2.0 innings or more in his career (all scoreless) with two already in 2022.
- Has allowed just 10 home runs to 1,239 total batters faced over his professional career.
- Involved in the longest plate appearance in terms of number of pitches (22) in Major League History during 2021 Spring Training at the Mets in Port St. Lucie (3/14) against Luis Guillorme.
- Was shut down in his 102nd career Major League appearance after suffering an injury requiring Ulnar Collateral Ligament surgery on his right elbow in 2019.
- Made the 2018 Opening Day roster as a 21-year old, previously not pitching higher than Class-A (Palm Beach).
- Switched his uniform number from 49 to 12 after 2019.

Pitch Velocity

- Has thrown 1,997 pitches in his Major League career, with 941 (47.1%) clocked at over 100 MPH. Represents the highest percentage of pitches over 100 MPH in MLB among qualified pitchers since he made his debut in 2018.
- Averaged 101.1 MPH on his sinker in 2019, the fastest average pitch in Major League Baseball.
- Threw 29 pitches at 100 MPH or faster at TEX (5/19/19), most by a reliever in a single game since velocity records were kept in 2008.
- Owned MLB's highest average velocity in 2018 with his four-seam fastball (100.5 MPH) & two-seam fastball (100.2 MPH), and 2nd-fastest sinker (100.4 MPH).
- Threw the three fastest pitches in MLB in 2018 (105.1 MPH sinker & 105.0 MPH sinker vs. Philadelphia 5/20 facing Odúbel Herrera; 104.4 MPH sinker at Arizona 7/4 facing A.J. Pollock) and 7-of-the-10 fastest pitches (all 104.1+ MPH).
- Threw the fastest pitch of the 2019 season against Victor Caratini vs. Chicago Cubs (5/31), a 104.3 MPH sinker, and the top 21 fastest pitches of the season overall.
- In 2021, Hicks (one pitch) and Aroldis Chapman (2 pitches) each topped out at 103 MPH, fastest in the Majors.

- Made his Major League debut vs. the Reds on June 28, 2015, throwing 7.2 innings allowing just two runs for his first MLB win leading the Mets to a 7-2 win at Citi Field. Was 3-for-3 at the plate with four RBI and a two-RBI double in his first plate appearance.
- Has only pitched against the Reds twice in his career and hasn't faced them since Sept. 24, 2015, a span of 2,402 days between appearances. Is one of three active pitchers with 2,400+ days between starts against one team and most recent since José Quintana (PIT) vs. Chicago (NL), which was 2,432 days (8/15/15-4/12/22).

LAST TIME OUT

- Earned his first win as a member of the Cardinals with 5.2 scoreless innings. Allowed a 1st inning double to Hunter Renfroe and did not allow another runner past first base the rest of his start.
