100 GRAND BAR: Pete Alonso is eight RBI away from 100 this season...He is looking to record his fourth season with 100+ RBI...That would place him second in team history...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Alonso ranks third in team history in RBI...Wright is the leader (970), followed by Darryl Strawberry (733)...Alonso's 92 RBI are second-most in the majors.

ANOTHER MILESTONE: Pete Alonso's 252 home runs since he joined the league in 2019 are the third-most in the majors, trailing only Kyle Schwarber (253) and Aaron Judge (269)...Alonso's 678 RBI are the most in the majors since 2019.

PICK SIX: Pete Alonso has recorded at least 25 home runs in each of his six non-shortened seasons...His six such seasons are the second-most in franchise history, trailing only Strawberry's eight years from 1983-90...Since making his Major League debut in 2019, he is one of four players to record six 25+ homer seasons, joining Aaron Judge, Kyle Schwarber and Juan Soto.

WHEN YOU WISH UPON A STARLING: In 14 games since the start of July, Starling Marte is batting .340 (16-47) with five runs, five doubles, two homers, four RBI, two walks, a steal, a .360 OBP and a .574 SLG...He has homered in back-to-back games after going 21 games without a home run.

THREE'S COMPANY: Juan Soto has homered in three straight games, which ties his career-high...He has done this four previous times, twice with San Diego and twice with Washington...Brandon Nimmo is the last Mets player to record a homer in three straight games, doing so from July 8-10, 2024...Pete Alonso was the last Mets player to hit a homer in four consecutive games, accomplishing that from May 16-19, 2023.

TWO AWAY: Edwin Díaz has 248 saves in 502 career games in the major leagues... According to *Elias*, his 248 saves are the ninth most saves for any pitcher through his first 500 career games and the most for any active pitcher...The most saves in first 500 career MLB games among active pitchers: Díaz (248), Kenly Jansen (244), Aroldis Chapman (240), Josh Hader (227 in 465 games), Raisel Iglesias (212).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 25-33 on the road this season...They have posted a 3.95 ERA away from Citi Field, which is the fourth-lowest mark in the National League.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has allowed just one earned run over his last 34 games, posting a 0.26 ERA (ER/35.0 IP) with 11 walks and 52 strikeouts since April 23...His 0.26 ERA is the lowest by a Mets reliever in any 34-game span in franchise history and is the best 34-game span of his career.

SINCE YOU'VE BEEN BACK: Francisco Alvarez has drawn nine walks in 14 games since he has returned from Triple-A Syracuse...This compares to 13 walks in the previous 35 games...Overall since returning from Triple-A Syracuse, he is batting .268/.400/.463 (11-41) with seven runs, five extra-base hits, four RBI and nine walks.

BLADES OF STEAL: The Mets have safely stolen 32 consecutive bases, the longest active streak in the majors...It's the longest single season for the Mets since they recorded 35 straight steals from May 14-June 29, 2023...They lead the majors with a 90.0% stolen base rate...This is the highest stolen base rate in franchise history...The previous high was set in 2023 (88.7%)...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the majors...Juan Soto has stolen a career-high 16 bases this year...Brandon Nimmo has swiped 12 bases...His career-best is 15 which he accomplished in 2024.

LAST TIME OUT: He was scoreless through 4.0 innings until he allowed five earned runs in the fifth on August 4 against Cleveland...Has allowed one or zero earned runs in four of his five appearances this season...Has recorded five or more strikeouts in three of his five appearances this season and he has struck out 25 batters over his first 23.0 innings this season...He has a 9.78 K/9 over those three appearances.

VS. MILWAUKEE: Made his last start against Milwaukee in the Wild Card round last season and he tossed 5.0 innings and allowed two earned runs...Has made five appearances (four starts) against Milwaukee in the regular season and he has a 1-2 record and a 5.48 ERA (14 ER/23.0 IP) with 24 strikeouts against the Brew Crew.

RIDE THE HOT HAND: In his last 23 games (22 starts) since June 26, 2024, is 9-4 with a 3.11 ERA (46 ER/133.1 IP), a .186 (89-479) opponents' batting average and a 0.95 WHIP...Ranks second in the NL in opponents' batting average, fourth in WHIP and 16th in ERA during that span (min. 400 batters faced)...The Mets are 16-7 in those games.

RIGHTY DOMINATION: So far this season righties are batting .191 (13-68) compared to left-handers who are batting .278 (5-18)...Last season he held right-handed hitters to a .190 batting average, compared to his career average to right-handed hitters being at .250...It was the lowest batting average he's held right handers to in his career (in a season where he appeared in more than five games).

HERE COMES THE HEAT: So far this season, Manaea has thrown his four-seam fastball 65.1% of the time, and he has picked up 16 of his 25 strikeouts with his fastball...His fastball has generated a 22.2% whiff rate this season...He has thrown his fastball at the 10th-highest clip (66.2%) among all pitchers who have thrown their fastball at least 200 times this season.

REHAB STINT: Was originally placed on the 15-day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 29...This season, he has made six rehab appearances (five starts) for Brooklyn, Binghamton, and Syracuse...Over those appearances, he allowed 13 earned runs over 18.2 IP and recorded 23 strikeouts...He made his final rehab start on July 8 with Syracuse, and he allowed three runs over 3.2 IP and struck out five...He threw 73 pitches, 48 for strikes.

2024 A CAREER YEAR: Recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL last season...The southpaw finished with the lowest full-season ERA of his career (3.47), and he was one of eight pitchers who made 32 or more starts and posted an ERA below 3.50...He held right-handed batters to a .190 average, tied for the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...From July 1 until the end of the season, Manaea was first in the majors in innings (105.1), second in quality starts (12) as well as sixth in strikeouts (108) and WHIP (0.93)...Made four Postseason starts, going 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP), eight walks and 19 strikeouts...He earned wins in Game 3 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia and Game 2 of the NLCS at Los Angeles.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Last season, Manaea completed at least 7.0 innings in nine of his 32 starts this season and that was tied for the sixth-most such outings in the National League...Manaea recorded back-to-back starts of 7.0 scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts on 7/30/24 against Minnesota and 8/5/24 at St.Louis...Manaea joined Tyler Glasnow and Spence Schwellenbach as the only pitchers in the majors last season with consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings and double-digit strikeouts...Manaea was the only one of three to not allow a run in both of those starts...He became the first Mets pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings and record 10 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since Max Scherzer (4/19/22 (2) - 4/25/22)...The southpaw joins Dwight Gooden (Two Separate Occasions) and Tom Seaver (Three Separate Occasions) as the only pitchers in franchise history to post back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and double-digit strikeouts...He is just the 10th left-handed pitcher in major league history with back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts (Last: Chris Sale, 6/24/18-6/30/18).

SPECTACULAR DOWN THE STRETCH: From July on last season, Manaea was second in the majors in quality starts (12), first in innings (105.1), sixth in strikeouts (108) and sixth in WHIP (0.93)...Since June 14, Manaea had allowed three or fewer runs 17 times, which was tied for most in the majors during that span with Chris Sale (17).

CAREER: Over the course of 10 Major League Seasons with the Athletics, Padres, Giants, and Mets he has a 78-63 record, a 4.00 ERA (536 ER/1207.1 IP), and 1134 strikeouts in 233 games and 202 starts...His 1134 career strikeouts are the 14th-most among active left-handers...He resigned with the Mets this offseason on a three-year contract in December 2024.

- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning, retiring three straight batters after the leadoff hitter got to third (2 K) on August 4 vs. Cleveland...He has not allowed an earned run in 19 consecutive appearances dating back to June 6, which is tied for the tenth-longest single-season streak in Mets history and his longest such streak since his 21-game span from 6/22-8/17/22.
- On August 4, was named as the NL Reliever of the Month for July after going 2-0 with seven saves and a 0.00 ERA (11.0 IP) over 10 appearances...He held opposing batters to just a .114 average (4-35) and posted four walks compared to 18 strikeouts (14.73 K/9.0 IP)...Marks the 10th Reliever of the Month Award of his career (fifth as a Met), which is the most by any player since the honor was established in 2005...Was also named the NL Reliever of the Month for May...He is the only pitcher to win a monthly award multiple times this year.
- Snapped his season-high 17.1 scoreless inning streak after allowing the free runner to score in the 10th inning on August 1 against San Francisco (L, H, R, BB, K)...It was the longest active scoreless streak in the majors and marked his first loss since September 15, 2024.
- Has made 14 career appearances vs. Milwaukee (including the Postseason), going 2-0 and 7-for-7 in saves with a 1.76 ERA (3 ER/15.1 IP)...Dating back to September 24, 2021, his last 9.1 innings facing the Brewers have been scoreless, recording just three

- walks compared to 19 strikeouts in that span (18.32 K/9.0 IP).
- Has allowed just one earned run over his last 34 games, posting a 0.26 ERA (ER/35.0 IP) with 11 walks and 52 strikeouts since April 23...His 0.26 ERA is the lowest by a Mets reliever in any 34-game span in franchise history and is the best 34-game span of his career...During that same span, his 0.26 ERA is the best in the majors and his .144 opponents' BA is the fourth best (min. 30.0 IP)...The next-best ERA is Nathan Eovaldi's 0.90 ERA in that span...Has not allowed a home run in each of his last 34 outings (since April 23), which is the fourth-longest such streak of his career (most: 52 games from 5/14/22-4/7/24)...Has not allowed a home run to each of his last 159 right-handed batters faced dating back to May 6, 2024...It is the fifth-longest active streak in the majors among RHP vs. RHB, trails Cade Smith (210 BF), Josiah Gray (183 BF), Jhoan Duran (173 BF) and Joe Jimenez (164 BF)...Courtesy of *Elias*.
