RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals and Chicago White Sox play the second game of a three-game weekend Interleague series today at Busch Stadium ... The New York Mets visit St. Louis for three games on Monday ... The Cardinals improved to 8-3 in series openers this season after handing the ChiSox a 3-0 shutout last night, highlighted by 7.0 innings from **Sonny Gray**, three RBI and two doubles by **Nolan Arenado**, and the MLB-leading 11th save by reigning NL Reliever of the Month **Ryan Helsley**.

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis opens today in 4th place in the National League Central, 5.5 games behind first place Milwaukee (20-11) and 1.0 game back of Cincinnati (16-16) for 3rd place.

EARLY BIRD: After his two-run double in the bottom of the first inning last night, **Nolan Arenado** now has nine RBI in the 1st inning this season, tied with **Salvador Perez** for 3rd-most in MLB behind **Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (13) and **Alec Bohm** (13) ... Arenado has 273 RBI in the first inning of his career, leading all active players (41st-most among MLB players since 1974) and his most in any inning.

BRONCO: With three strikeouts today, **Lance Lynn** would reach 951 for his Cardinals career (2011-17, '24) and tie **Steve Carlton** (1965-71) for 8th all-time in Cardinals history ... Lynn is currently 31 strikeouts shy of tying **Jesse Haines** (979) for 7th.

DAY TRIPPERS: The Cardinals play their 18th day game of the season today (5-12 record), T-2nd most in MLB and making up 51.2% of their contests ... Since Busch Stadium III opened in 2006, the Cardinals are 82-42 (.661) all-time in Saturday home day games.

HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENT: St. Louis is home for 15 games in a 22-game stretch from May 3-26 ... So far this season, the Cardinals have played the same amount of games in the Pacific Time Zone (13) as the Central Time Zone (13).

WINN, WINN, WINN, WINN, WINN: Rookie shortstop **MASN Winn** sports the 3rd-highest line drive percentage (37.9%) in Major League Baseball behind **Freddie Freeman** (38.4%) and **Gavin Sheets** (39.7%).

THE MERRY MERRY MONTH OF MAY: Since moving into Busch Stadium III in 2006, the Cardinals have compiled a .500 or better record in the month of May in 13 of 17 full seasons ... Their best May in that time span was a 20-7 mark (.741 win pct.) in 2013, and their worst was a 9-18 (.333) spiral in 2019 on the heels of a strong 19-10 (.655) March/April start ... The 2023 Cardinals started 0-5 in May, but finished the month going 15-8 for a final 15-13 record.

THE NEW GUYS: Since April 9, free agent acquisitions **Sonny Gray**, **Lance Lynn**, and **Kyle Gibson** have combined to go 6-2 with a 1.75 ERA (15 ER/77.1 IP) and eight quality starts in their 13 starting assignments.

CLOSE CALLS: Twenty-four of the Cardinals 32 games (75%) this season have been decided by three or fewer runs, 2nd-most in Major League Baseball to the Yankees (25) ... St. Louis is 13-11 in those games.

JUNIOR CIRCUIT JUGGERNAUTS: St. Louis is 246-240 all-time in Interleague play (1997-present), with a .506 win pct. that trails only Los Angeles (.540) and Atlanta (.509) among NL clubs ... Over that timespan, Cardinals designated hitters have produced a combined .788 OPS, 4th-highest from the designated hitter position behind Boston (.868), Cleveland (.809), and Philadelphia (.793).

REHABBING REDBIRDS: Two Cardinals have started injury rehabilitation assignments with Cardinals minor league affiliates:

- OF **Dylan Carlson** (left shoulder AC sprain) is batting .273 (3-11) with a homer and three walks in four games with the Memphis Redbirds (AAA).
- 1B/DH **Matt Carpenter** (right oblique strain) went 1-for-3 with a double and a walk in his first game with the Springfield Cardinals (AA) at Tulsa (AA-Dodgers) yesterday, playing 5.0 innings at first base.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (May 4, 2022): Adam Wainwright and Yadier Molina tie Warren Spahn and Del Crandall (1949-63 Boston/Milwaukee Braves) for the most team wins by starting batterymates (202) in MLB history in the Cardinals 10-0 shutout win over the cross-state rival Royals at Kauffman Stadium... Waino hurls 7.0 innings of one-hit ball, while **Nolan Arenado** homers and drives in five runs ... **Juan Yopez** also made his MLB debut.

CHICAGO CONNECTIONS

Cardinals broadcaster **John Rooney** spent 18 years (1998-2005) with the White Sox - one in TV followed by 17 seasons in radio...Rooney worked with the World Champion team in back-to-back seasons, following the White Sox win in 2005.

Lance Lynn pitched parts of three seasons with the White Sox (2021-23)...was an AL All-Star and finished 3rd in the Cy Young Award voting in 2021.

Paul DeJong was selected by St. Louis in the 4th round of the 2015 MLB Draft...played parts of his first seven seasons with the Cardinals (2017-23)...finished 2nd in the 2017 NL Rookie of the Year voting and was a 2019 NL All-Star.

Rafael Ortega played two minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization (2014-15).

Keynan Middleton pitched in 39 games for the White Sox in 2023.

Dominic Leone pitched parts of two seasons (2017-18) with the Cardinals.

John Brebbia pitched parts of three seasons (2017-19) for St. Louis after being selected from Arizona in the AAA phase of the 2015 Rule 5 Draft.

Dylan Carlson (Aug. 15, 2020-1 at Guaranteed Rate Field), **José Ferrín** (July 7, 2023 at Guaranteed Rate Field), **Riley O'Brien** (Sept. 21, 2021 at Guaranteed Rate Field), **Kyle Leahy** (July 7, 2023 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and **Turner Ward** (Sept. 10, 1990 at Cleveland Stadium) made MLB debuts vs. the White Sox.

Willie McGee was originally selected by the White Sox in the 7th round of the 1976 MLB Draft, but did not sign.

Brandon Allen was originally drafted by the White Sox in the fifth round of the 2004 MLB Draft out of Montgomery (Texas) High School...played five minor league seasons with the White Sox (2004-09).

Tommy Pham was selected by the Cardinals in the 16th round of the 2006 MLB Draft...played parts of his first five seasons in St. Louis (2014-18).

Hall of Fame Manager **Tony La Russa** managed both the Cardinals (1996-2011) and White Sox (1979-86, 2021-22).

Dan O'Connor Assistant Video Coordinator was born in Chicago and was an usher at the stadium in Section 136/137 by the White Sox dugout during the 2006 season...Dan is the son of longtime Chicago Tribune investigative reporter **Matt O'Connor** Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** pitched in 52 games for the White Sox in 1988...originally traded by the Cardinals with outfielder Lance Johnson and cash to Chicago for pitcher Jose DeLeon.

Cardinals VP/General Manager **Michael Girsch** is a Chicago native...graduated from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Chicago.

White Sox Head Groundskeeper **Roger Bossard** designed and built new playing fields at Busch Stadium II and Busch Stadium III, as well as Roger Dean Stadium in Jupiter, Fla.

NL Rankings: ERA (2.64, 8th).

- Makes his 7th start of the season and the 324th of his career (348th appearance).
- Passed **Bill Doak** (938) and is currently in 9th place all-time in Cardinals history with 948 strikeouts. He's three strikeouts back of **Steve Carlton** (951) for 8th place.
- Needs five strikeouts to achieve 1,000 strikeouts in the National League (A.L. 940, N.L. 995). Is 65 strikeouts shy of 2,000 for his career and 80.1 innings for 2,000.
- Has received seven total runs of support this season with one or zero runs in 4-of-6 starts. His 2.05 Run Support Average ranks 3rd-lowest in the National League ahead of **Cal Quantrill** (1.69, COL) and **Trevor Rogers** (1.72, MIA).
- Was the Cardinals home opening starting pitcher for the first time in his career (April 4 vs. Miami).
- Returns to his original drafting team in 2024 for the first time since 2017 after pitching for the Twins (2018), Yankees (2018), Rangers (2019-20), White Sox (2021-23) and Dodgers (2023).
- Was teammates with current Cardinals manager **Oliver Marmol** in Quad Cities (2008) and Palm Beach (2009).
- Ranks 2nd behind only **Adam Wainwright** (29) with 24 postseason pitching appearances among Cardinals.
- Has five postseason wins as a member of the Cardinals, T-3rd in franchise history behind **Chris Carpenter** (10) and **Bob Gibson** (7).
- Won a career-high 18 games with St. Louis in 2012, his first full season as a starting pitcher.

LAST TIME OUT

- Threw 5.0 or more innings for his 4th consecutive start and received a no decision, the 5th of the season over his six starts. Held the Mets to one run on three hits, a solo home run to Francisco Lindor.

BUSCH STADIUM III (2006-PRESENT)

- Has never pitched at Busch Stadium as a visitor. Before the Home Opener (4/4/23), his previous appearance in St. Louis was Sept. 28, 2017 vs. the Cubs (ND, 5.0 IP, 1 R, 5 K).
- His start today marks the 81st of his career at Busch Stadium III, 2nd-most in stadium history (2006-present) behind only **Adam Wainwright** (214).
- Is seeking his 1st win at Busch III since 9/12/17 vs. CIN (13-4).

2024

- Made his 200th career appearance in the National League at NYM (4/28).
- Surpassed **Carlos Martinez** (927) and **Bill Doak** (939) this season vaulting into 9th place all-time in Cardinals history for strikeouts.
- Recorded his first win as a member of the Cardinals since 2017 coming at OAK (4/16), firing a season-high 7.0 innings allowing two runs (1 ER) and one strikeout. Marked the first time in his career he had thrown 7.0 or more innings in a start and recorded one strikeout or less.

CAREER

- Member of the 2011 Cardinals World Series Championship team and the 2013 National League Champions.
- Two-time All-Star with the National League (2012, did not pitch) and the American League (2021). Pitched a scoreless inning at Coors Field (7/12/21) in relief of starting pitcher **Shohei Ohtani**. Current teammates **Kyle Gibson** and **Andrew Kittredge** also pitched for the A.L. in that game.
- Placed in the Top 10 in the American League Cy Young Award voting in 2019 (5th), 2020 (6th) and 2021 (3rd).
- Recorded 26 double-digit strikeout games, 19th among pitchers since 2012, when he became a starting pitcher.
- Is one of five Cardinals pitchers with five seasons of 150 or more strikeouts joining **Bob Gibson** (11), **Adam Wainwright** (8), **Chris Carpenter** (5), **Steve Carlton** (5) and **Dizzy Dean** (5).
