LONGEST ON-BASE STREAKS, VISITING PLAYERS

Beginning **8/12/16**, **Joey Votto** has reached base safely in **29 consecutive apps** at **Miller Park** (38-105, .362, 9 2b, 6hr, 18rbi, .481obp, 1.100ops)...it is the second-longest on-base streak ever by a visiting player at this ballpark: Albert Pujols, StL 32 games 4/30/07 - 6/12/11

GENO & DOGGIE

Eugenio Suárez leads the team with **27 home runs** and joins National Baseball Hall of Famer **Tony Pérez** (1967, '69-71) as the only Reds third basemen to have at least **3 seasons with 25 or more homers**....Suárez hit **34 HR** last season and **26 HR** in 2017.

MORE SUÁREZ

Eugenio Suárez's **10 HR** this month are the most by a Reds batter in July since **Adam Dunn** went deep 12 times in July 2008...Suárez has homered **8** times in **15** games vs Milwaukee this season, including **7 HR** over his last **8 apps** against the Brewers...his **15** career HR vs Mil rank second only to the **20** HR he's hit against the Cubs.

FIRST IMPRESSION

According to @EliasSports, in Fri's 12-11 loss vs StL **C Ryan Lavanrway** became the **first player with 2 HR** in his first game with the Reds, the first player with **more than 3 RBI** in his first game with the Reds and only the **fourth Major League player**, since RBI became a statistic in 1920, to produce in his debut for a team at least **3 hits, 2 HR and 6 RBI** (list below).

TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (2-0) of a brief 3-game road trip, all at Mil's **Miller Park**, and **Game 10** (4-5) in a stretch of **10 straight games** vs **NL Central Division** rivals (1-2 at Chi, 1-3 vs StL, 2-0 at Mil)...the Redlegs are coming off a **3-1 series loss** vs the Cardinals...following this series and tomorrow's off day, return to **Great American Ball Park** for a 6-game homestand vs the **Rockies** (3g) and **Pirates** (3g).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and Brewers are meeting for the fifth time this season and for the third time at **Miller Park**...Cin has a current **5-game winning streak** vs Mil for the first time since **9/27/12-6/14/13** and for the first time in a single season since winning **7** straight from **7/27-9/21, 2010**...the Reds' **3-1 series win** at **Great American Ball Park** from **7/1-7/4** was their first series win vs Mil since **9/4-9/6, 2017** (3-0 at GABP) and their first 4-game series win vs Mil since **4/30-4/23, 2015** (3-1 at Miller Park).

ROCKIES UP NEXT: This weekend at **Great American Ball Park**, the Reds and Rockies will meet for the second time this season...coming out of the All-Star break, the Reds suffered a **2-1 series loss** at **Coors Field**...that series included a **17-9 win** in which the Reds became the first Major League team in the **modern era** to produce in a game at least **5 triples** and at least **3 HR**...beginning in **2002** and with a minimum of 40 games played, the Reds' **.345 winning percentage** at **Coors Field** (20-38) is their lowest at any current road ballpark in that span...Cin's **3-1 series win** from **5/30-6/2, 2016** is its only series win at **Coors Field** since **8/27-8/29, 2012**.

REHABBING: **C Tucker Barnhart** is expected to begin a rehab assignment tomorrow with **Class AAA Louisville** vs **Gwinnett**...he's been on the injured list since **6/28** with a **right oblique strain**...he last appeared with the Reds on **6/22** at **Mil**...**LHP Alex Wood** on Monday for **Chattanooga** at **Birmingham** made his fourth rehabilitation start and earned the **3-2 victory** (6ip, 4h, 1r, 1er, 0bb, 4k, 1hb, 85 pitches)...in his **4 combined rehab starts** for **Louisville (3g)** and **Chattanooga (1g)** went **1-1, 3.18** (11.1ip, 12h, 5r, 4er, 2bb, 11k)...made his 3 rehab apps for the Bats on **7/6** at **Columbus** (1.1ip, 2h, 1er, 1bb, 2k, 31 pitches), **7/12** vs **Toledo** (2ip, 4h, 3r, 2er, 0bb, 2k, 51 pitches) and last **Wed** at **Pawtucket** (2ip, 2h, 0r, 1bb, 3k, 38 pitches)...has been on the Reds' injured list all season with a **lower back injury**...has been on the 60-day IL since **5/31**...made 1 start for the Reds in spring training, on **2/25** at **Sea** (1ip, 2h, 3er, 1bb, 0k, 1hr).

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP **Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in 62 of the Reds' 99 games so far this season, including 41 times solely as a **pitcher**, twice as a **pinch hitter/pitcher**, once as a **pitcher/LF/RF** (Mon at Mil), once as a **pitcher/LF** (6/2 vs Wsh), 3 times as a **CF**, 3 times as a **LF**, 7 times solely as a **pinch runner**, once as a **pinch runner/CF** (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a **pinch runner/LF** (5/9 at Oak) and once as a **pinch runner/RF** (5/24 at Chi) and **once** as a **CF/P** (7/17 at Chi)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season** (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 300 career innings pitched (378.0) to play center field since **Hal Jeffcoat** in **1958**...**Ron Mahay** was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...**Mahay** played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

BLACK & BLUE: **Derek Dietrich** has been hit by a pitch **22 times**, the most in the Major Leagues and third-most in Reds history (Shin-Soo Choo, 26, 2013 & Jason LaRue, 24, 2004)...was hit **4 times** in a 3-game series at Chi from **7/15-7/17** and was hit by a pitch **6 times** in the 4-game series at Mil from **6/20-6/23**...he is the only player in **modern Major League history** to get **hit by a pitch 6 times** in a series of any length...was hit by a pitch twice in that series opener vs the Brewers, a 7-1 Reds win...in the 11-7 win in Game 2 became the first Reds batter in the modern era to be **hit by a pitch 3 times** in a game, tying the **Major League record** accomplished many times, and the first Reds batter ever to be hit at least twice in consecutive apps...in 9 apps this season vs the Brewers, **Dietrich** has been **hit by a pitch 8 times**...he has been hit by a pitch **115 times in his career**...notes courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: RHP **Luis Castillo** was the National League's **Pitcher of the Month** for **March/April**...in 7 starts he went **3-1, 1.45** while ranking second in the National League and third in the Major Leagues in **ERA**, second in the NL and sixth in the majors in **strikeouts** (50) and third in the NL and T6th in the majors in **innings pitched** (43.1)...is the first Reds player to win a monthly award since **2B Scooter Gennett** won it in **May** of last year, the first Reds pitcher to win it since **LHP Denny Neagle** in **September 1999** and the first Reds righthanded starter recognized since **Jose Rijo** in **September 1992**.

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the **150th anniversary** of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the **1869 Red Stockings**...this season, the team will wear **15 uniforms** from various periods throughout the team's history...the Reds already wore uniforms from **1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956 and 1961**...**Sun vs Col** will wear replica uniforms from **1967**...the Reds are 2-7 wearing **throwback uniforms**...as part of the season-long celebration, the **Reds Hall of Fame and Museum** underwent a comprehensive modification, while the **1869 Pavilion** at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on **May 4**, the **150th anniversary** of the **Red Stockings'** 45-9 win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game...more than **20 anniversary park benches**, featuring Reds mascots wearing the **15 throwback uniforms**, are on display at locations across **Greater Cincinnati** and **Northern Kentucky**.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster **Marty Brennaman** is in his 46th and final season calling Reds games for **700 WLW Radio**...joined the Reds radio team in **1974** and for **31 seasons** (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher **Joe Nuxhall**.

Today's Pitcher - #39 Lucas Sims, RHP

RED HOTS

Lucas Sims this afternoon is making his second start of the season for the Reds and his first career appearance vs the Brewers...is filling the spot in the rotation vacated by injured RHP Tyler Mahle (left hamstring strain)...is 1 of only 6 Reds pitchers to start a game this season...Luis Castillo, Anthony DeSclafani, Sonny Gray, Tanner Roark and Mahle started all but one of the Reds' games so far, and Sims the other...made his start in the 11-6 win on 5/28 vs Pit, in the club's 55th game of this season...was the latest in a season the Reds used a sixth starting pitcher since 2012, when in that year's 121st game (on 8/18), RHP Todd Redmond started the night game of a DH vs the Cubs...in that 2012 NL Central Division championship season, Homer Bailey (33), Johnny Cueto (33), Mat Latos (33), Bronson Arroyo (32) and Mike Leake (30) made 161 of the team's 162 starts...Sims was optioned back to Louisville following the next afternoon's game, on 5/29, and pitched for the Bats until his second promotion on 7/18...in that start and 11-6 win on 5/8 vs Pit threw 7.1 innings with 9 strikeouts, both career highs...was the longest outing by a Reds pitcher until Gray threw 8.0 innings on 7/3 in the club's 84th game...took a 3-hit shutout into the eighth inning before Kevin Newman hit his 100th and final pitch for a grand slam, the first homer of Newman's career...is a 2019 International League All-Star and IL Pitcher of the Week for 7/1-7/7.

Friday vs Rockies - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo in his his third **Major League season** at just **26 years old**, is a **2019 National League All-Star**...in his last **4 starts** is **2-1, 1.69**...in Sat's 3-2 win vs StL, allowed only a solo HR by **Matt Wieters** leading off the top of the sixth inning...in the third inning on **7/15 at Wrigley Field** allowed a 2-out, solo HR to **Kyle Schwarber** than snapped his **career-high 14.2-inning scoreless streak**...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...selected by his peers, he joined **RHP Sonny Gray** as the first pair of **Reds starting pitchers** named to the **All-Star team** since **Johnny Cueto** and **Alfredo Simon** in **2014**...threw a perfect fourth inning in the National League's 4-3 loss at Cle's **Progressive Field** (struck out Carlos Santana, struck out J.D. Martinez, Alex Bregman 4-3)...Gray did not pitch...was the National League's **Pitcher of the Month** for **March/April** (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...through his first 7 starts of this season led the Major Leagues in ERA (1.45)...made his first career **Opening Day start**, but in the 5-3 win vs Pit was the victim of a blown save...became the fifth straight different **Opening Day** starter for the Reds (**Johnny Cueto** 2012-2015, **Raisel Iglesias** 2016, **Scott Feldman** in 2017, **Homer Bailey** in 2018)...is the longest stretch of different Opening Day starting pitchers since a **6-year stretch** from **2001-2006** (**Pete Harnisch** 2000-2001, **Joey Hamilton** 2002, **Jimmy Haynes** 2003, **Cory Lidle** 2004, **Paul Wilson** 2005, **Aaron Harang** 2006)...since his **Major League debut** in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including **wins, starts, innings pitched** and **strikeouts**.
