THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

ROSTER MOVES: Yesterday, the D-backs acquired RHP Matt Bowman from the Twins, optioned LHP Blake Walston to Triple-A Reno and transferred RHP Merrill Kelly (strained right shoulder) to the 60-day injured list.

VS. PADRES: Last season, the D-backs took the season series vs. Padres 7-6 (3-4 @ home, 4-2 on the road), outscoring them 26-16 (+10 run differential).
$\checkmark$ The D-backs won 5 of their last 6 games vs. Padres.

LAST GAME: The D-backs fell to the Dodgers $8-0$ on Wednesday night.

- Joc Pederson went 3-for-4 (3 singles) on the night. - Ketel Marte went 1-for-3 with 1 double and 1 walk.

SEEING IT WELL VS. SD: Since 2022, Christian Walker's 8 homers and .541 SLG vs. Padres are third most among all players (min. 100 PA), behind Mookie Betts/LAD (11; .720 SLG) and Ryan McMahon/COL (9; . 603 SLG).

- Since 2022, Ketel Marte's 21 strikeouts in 118 PA vs. Padres are second fewest among all players (min. 100 PA), behind Wilmer Flores/SF (19 in 113 PA).

MARTE'S 1K MILESTONE: Wednesday's start marked career game No. 1,000 for Ketel Marte...over 1,000 career games since 2015, he is batting .280 with 230 doubles, 41 triples, 112 homers, 435 RBI, 355 walks and 55 stolen bases.

- Marte became the 16th Dominican-born switch-hitter to reach 1,000 career games and 1 of 2 who are currently active (also: José Ramírez/CLE).
- On Wednesday, Marte and Chris Taylor/LAD both played their 1,000th career MLB game, marking the fifth time in MLB history where 2 players reached their 1,000 th game in the same game and the first time the 2 were opposing players [@SlangsOnSports].

ALL THE BUZZ: Tuesday night's viral "Bee Delay" at Chase Field swarmed the media locally, nationally and internationally, with features on the the Today Show, Good Morning America and the Dan Patrick Show.

- Blue Sky Pest Control's bee specialist Matt Hilton (Branch Manager - Phoenix Office), who arrived to remove the swarm atop the backstop netting, threw out the ceremonial first pitch following his heroic actions...the following day, TOPPS released that they had signed a deal with Hilton for autograph cards.


## FAQ - WHY DID BEES SWARM \& HOW EXACTLY WERE THEY REMOVED?

Africanized honeybees and swarming are very common in the Phoenix metropolitan area during Spring months...Matt Hilton treated the outside of the swarm of bees with a soapy water solution to lock the bees in place and then carefully removed by vacuuming them.

WALKER CREATING A BUZZ: Since April 22, Christian Walker's 4 homers are tied for the most in the NL (also: Nick Senzel/WSH) and 9 RBI are tied for fourth (also: Francisco Lindor/NYM).

- Walker is currently riding a 9-game on-base streak... he is batting . 323 (10-for-31)/1.152 OPS with 1 double, 4 homers, 9 RBI and 6 walks in the span.
