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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (66-71) vs. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (68-69)

August 30, 2026 - Busch Stadium - St. Louis, MO - 1:15 CDT - Game #138/Road #72

RHP Braxton Ashcraft (13-5, 3.59 ERA) vs. LHP Matthew Liberatore (5-12, 5.44 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have gone 3-5 in the first eight games of this season-long, nine-game/11-day road trip to Los Angeles-NL (0-3, August 21-23), San Diego (2-1, August 24-26) and St. Louis (1-1, Friday-Sunday), including a 6-2 win against the Cardinals on Saturday at Busch Stadium...Will have the day off on Monday before starting a six-game homestand vs. San Francisco (Tuesday-Thursday) and Los Angeles-AL (September 4-6)...Have hit 160 home runs (they hit 117 home runs all of last season)...Have the most hits (1189) in all of Major League Baseball...Are tied with the Dodgers for the fourth-most runs (664) in all of Major League Baseball, behind Chicago-NL (720), Washington (718) and Milwaukee (679), after scoring a Major League-low 583 runs all of last season (they are looking to become only the fourth team in Major League history to finish top three in the league in runs the year after finishing last in the league in runs and the first since Chicago [AL] in 1915).

FROM THE ASHES: Braxton Ashcraft, who will start for the Pirates in today's series finale at St. Louis, has 13 wins this season, tied for the fifth-most in the National League, behind only Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (16), Cincinnati's Chase Burns (14), Milwaukee's Jacob Misiorowski (14) and Arizona's Eduardo Rodriguez (14)...He is the first Pittsburgh pitcher with 13 wins in a season since Mitch Keller in 2023 (the last Pirates with more than 13 wins in a season were Jameson Taillon and Trevor Williams, who each won 14 games in 2018)...Ashcraft's eight wins since June 17 at the Athletics are tied for the second-most in all of MLB (Eduardo Rodriguez leads the way with nine).

AND THE WHIFF: Pittsburgh's pitching staff comes into today tied for the fifth-most strikeouts (236) in all of MLB during the month of August...The only four pitching staffs with more strikeouts this month are the Phillies (270), Dodgers (256), Brewers (255) and Guardians (245)...Pittsburgh's .217 batting average against this month is the second-lowest in all of MLB, trailing only Milwaukee (.212).

ANOTHER SOUTHPAW SIGHTING: The Pirates will be opposed by a starting left-handed pitcher for the 12th time this month in today's matchup against Matthew Liberatore...Pittsburgh's 43 games against starting lefthanders are tied for the third-most among all National League teams along with the Dodgers...The only two teams to be opposed by more starting southpaws are the Braves (51) and Phillies (47).

SECOND TO NONE: Brandon Lowe connected for his 28th home run of the season on Saturday, including his 26th as a second baseman...That's the most home runs in all of MLB at that position...Lowe is looking to become the first Pirate since Adam LaRoche in 2007 to lead the team in both home runs and RBI in his first season with the team...The only other Pirates to do so since 1946 are Reggie Sanders (2003), Brian Giles (1999), Kevin Young (1997) and Ralph Kiner (1946).

SWITCHING THINGS UP: Bryan Reynolds enters today two hits shy of 1100 for his career...He is one of three switch hitters in team history (since 1887) with at least 1000 hits, along with National Baseball Hall-of-Famer Max Carey (2418) and Johnny Ray (1009)...Reynolds' 132 hits this season are tied for the second-most in MLB among switch hitters along with Ozzie Albies.

FEELING BULLISH: Pittsburgh's bullpen has a 2.71 ERA (109.2ip/33er) in August...That is the second-lowest mark among all Major League bullpens during the month, trailing only Milwaukee (1.61)...The bullpen's 109.2 innings pitched during the month are the fourth-most in all of MLB, behind Chicago-AL (136.0), Toronto (114.1) and San Francisco (111.0)...Their 128 August strikeouts are the most in Major League Baseball.

Garrett Jones led the way offensively after going 3-for-4 while falling a triple shy of hitting for the cycle. Jones' home run in the fourth inning off Cardinals starter Shelby Miller was the 100th of his career.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Ashcraft was in line for the win (6.0ip/1r) but had a no-decision in the team’s 3-2, 12-inning win on August 24 at San Diego...He allowed his only run in the sixth inning when Freddy Fermin doubled and later scored on a balk (first of his career).

MR. EFFICIENT: Ashcraft won a 4-1 decision after allowing one run over 8.0 innings (he threw 80 pitches) on August 18 vs. Detroit during his first start since his 9.0-inning complete game on August 13 at Miami (85 pitches)...He was the third Major Leaguer (since pitch counts began being tracked in 1988) to pitch at least 8.0 innings and allow one/zero runs on 85 or fewer pitches in back-to-back starts...He joined Cincinnati’s Tom Browning (June 29-July 4, 1989) & Detroit’s Shane Greene (April 9-14, 2015) on the list.

AGAINST THE CARDINALS: Ashcraft has a 4.24 ERA (17.0ip/8er) in three career starts against St. Louis...He allowed six runs in 4.1 innings while losing an 11-7 decision in his first start against the Cards on April 28 at PNC Park...He also allowed one run in 7.0 innings, struck out nine batters, and won a 6-2 decision on May 21 here at Busch Stadium...His other start against the Cards also came here at Busch last year on August 28 when he allowed one run across 5.2 innings in a no-decision in the team’s 4-1 loss.

GO THE DISTANCE: Ashcraft pitched his first career complete game in Pittsburgh’s 13-1 win on August 13 at Miami...It was the first complete game by a Pirate since Paul Skenes (8.0 innings) on May 18, 2025 at Philadelphia, the first 9.0-inning complete game since Mitch Keller on May 6, 2024 vs. Los Angeles (AL) and the first 9.0-inning road complete game since Johan Oviedo on August 28, 2023 at Kansas City...The 85-pitch complete game was the third 9.0-inning complete game on 85 or fewer pitches by a Pirate (since pitch counts began being tracked in 1988)...It was also done by Doug Drabek (80 pitches, September 30, 1990 at St. Louis) and Jeff Karstens (83 pitches, July 15, 2011 at Houston)...Ashcraft was the first Major Leaguer (since 1988) to throw a 9.0-inning complete game on 85 or fewer pitches while having 10 strikeouts.

ELITE ARM: Ashcraft allowed one run in a 9.0-inning complete game on August 13 at Miami and one run in 8.0 innings on August 18 vs. Detroit...He was the first Pirate to pitch at least 17.0 innings and allow two or fewer runs in a two-start span since A.J. Burnett (two runs in 17.2 innings, July 31-August 5, 2012)...The only other Major Leaguers to do that this year were Miami’s Sandy Alcanatara (two runs in 17.1 innings, April 1-7) and Philadelphia’s Cristopher Sánchez (zero runs in 17.0 innings, May 16-22).

DOUBLE THE FUN: Ashcraft has gotten his opponents to ground into a double play a Major League-high 20 times this season...The only Pittsburgh pitcher since 2018 to induce more GIDP in a single year was Mitch Keller (22 GIDPs) during the 2022 season.

COMING RIGHT AT YOU: Ashcraft’s 14.6 average pitches per inning this season are the third-fewest among all qualified pitchers throughout Major League Baseball...He trails only Tampa Bay’s Nick Martinez (14.0) and Detroit’s Keider Montero (14.4) on the list.

LEADING THE WAY: Ashcraft has a team-high 13 wins this year, the most by a Pirates pitcher since Mitch Keller also earned 13 wins in the 2023 season...The last Pirates with more than 13 wins were Jameson Taillon and Trevor Williams (14 wins each) in 2018.

ROAD RULES: Ashcraft’s seven road wins this season are tied for the second-most in the National League and the fifth-most in all of Major League Baseball...The last Pirate with more than seven road wins in a season was Jameson Taillon (nine wins) in 2018.
